The picnic will be held in Red Barn Park from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m. Admission price for persons not living in residence halls will be \$1.82. In conjunction with the picnic, the Natatorium will be open from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. Everyone is invited to join in the fun.

"LADIES IN RETIREMENT," a melodramatic mystery by Edward Percy and Reginald Denham, will open Tuesday, July 26, at Hannibal's Ice House Theatre. The plot revolves around a thrilling and clever re-enactment of a crime involving the mysterious disappearance of an ex-actress. The play runs through Sunday, July 31, with nightly performances at 8:15 p.m.

"Godspell," a musical presenting the Gospel according to St. Matthew, is currently being performed nightly at 8:15 p.m. through Friday, July 22, and on Sunday, July 24. In a special additional schedule, two performances of "Godspell" will be given Saturday, July 23, at 7:00 p.m. and at 9:15 p.m. On Sunday, July 24, a matinee of "Godspell" will be presented at 2:00 p.m.

A BUS TRIP to Hannibal's Ice House Theatre will be sponsored by the University on Thursday, July 28. The play, "Ladies In Retirement," will be shown at 8:15 p.m. and the bus will leave campus at 5:30 p.m. An admission fee will cover transportation and reserved tickets.
