- **April 30 is the deadline** for the ACT Family Financial Statement to be received in Iowa City if you wish to be considered for a Missouri Grant. Funds for Perkins Loan, SEOG and Work-Study are limited and awarded to eligible students on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are interested in

only the Pell Grant and Stafford Loan (formerly GSL) your complete application must be received in the Financial Aid Office by May 15 if you wish to have your aid available for the September installment.
