On Wednesday, Sal Costa, psychology, will discuss his Parapsychology Workshop. Parapsychology is the study of various phenomenon that cannot be explained by natural laws.

On July 29, a taped interview with Psychic Beverly Jaegers of St. Louis tentatively is scheduled. She presented a program on practical applications of extra-sensory perception as part of the Arts in the Park series.

On August 2, also on tape, Arnie Lawrence, jazz musician, will discuss his experiences with Blood, Sweat, and Tears and other bands. He served as guest clinician for the 1000 Hills Summer Youth Program's Jazz Camp.
