## Lyceum Features Jubilee Singers

The Albert McNeil Jubilee Singers will bring their rich music about Black history to the NMSU campus as the Lyceum Series presents the Los Angeles-based company in concert Wednesday, Feb. 1, at 8 p.m. in Baldwin Auditorium.

The roots of the Jubilee Singers date back more than 100 years to the Emancipation Proclamation in January 1863. This year was called the "Jubilee Year" and a choral group called the First University Jubilee Singers began introducing audiences in America and Europe to Negro spirituals. In 1870, they sang for Queen Victoria at the Court of St. James in London.

Today, founder/director Albert McNeil and his company of 14 singers continue to attract worldwide attention on the vast body of music termed "Afro-American." Featuring a repertoire drawn from the tribal music of the earliest slaves, embodied by their spirituals, to the jargon and calypso of the Caribbean, as well as the work songs, jazz and gospel of more recent times, the Jubilee Singers have become one of the most honored singing ensembles in the world.

McNeil presently heads the Department of Music Education at the University of California-Davis, which trains music teachers for public schools and colleges. In addition, he teaches a course on Afro-American music and directs the University Concert Choir. He believes that there is a need and desire to sing about everything that happens in life.

The Jubilee Singers recorded the sound track to the original film version of "Porgy," and their voices enhanced the films "Carmen Jones," "Cabin in the Sky," "Oh Freedom" and "Lost in the Stars."

In addition, CBS has recorded two albums of their music, "Pilgrimage to Jerusalem" and "Soul Songs of Sorrow and Jubilation." Their album for the education recording company of Bowmar, which combines "Music of the Black Man in America" with narration and historic speeches, has been adopted by schools and colleges throughout the United States.

Free tickets for the Jubilee Singers performance are available for students, faculty and staff at the SAB Office, SUB and at the door.

## Black History Month

February has been designated Black History Month. NMSU will join the nation as it observes the kick off of the annual event by participating in a major telecommunications link-up titled "Beyond the Dream: A Celebration of Black History." The program will be aired at noon, Feb. 1, in the SUB Tangeline Room. All interested are welcome.

The program, which will originate in Washington, D.C., is sponsored by the publishers of *Black Issues in Higher Education*. The program will bring experts together in a two-hour conference on the contributions of Blacks in the areas of education, politics, economics, the military, arts, sports, enter-

tainment and social issues. Audiences at universities, colleges, military installations, national associations and federal and state agencies across the country will be allowed to interact by phone to question and comment among program participants and each other.

Featured scholars include Mary Hatwood Futrell, president and leader of the National Education Association and Gen. Benard Randolph, America's only Black active duty four-star general, among others.
