# THE HONORABLE RICHARD J. CHAMIER

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER, MAY 22, 1952

Today's commencement speaker is the Honorable Richard J. Chamier of Moberly, Missouri, majority floor leader of the Missouri Senate and chairman of the Judiciary Committee. Senator Chamier is also a member of a number of other senate committees including the Senate Rules and Joint Rules Committee; the Senate Criminal Law Revision Committee; the Senate Committee to Study Defective-Minded Children's Institutions; the joint Legislative Committee on Election Law Revision; the Senate Committee on Education, University, State Teacher Colleges, and Libraries; the Committee on Legislative Research; the Committee on Municipal Corporations; the Committee on Agriculture; the Committee on Criminal Jurisprudence; and the Committee on Interstate Cooperation.

Born in Moberly, June 22, 1910, Senator Chamier was educated in the public schools of Moberly. He holds the associate in arts degree from Moberly Junior College and the bachelor of arts and the bachelor of laws degrees from the University of Missouri. He also attended the Command and General Staff School from which he was graduated with honors in September, 1942. Senator Chamier has been a successful practicing lawyer in the state of Missouri for many years, having been a member of the Randolph County Bar, the Missouri Bar, the American Law Institute, and a partner in the law firm of Hunter, Chamier, and Motley. He is a member of the professional legal fraternity, Phi Delta Phi; a director in the American Judicature Society; and former Prosecuting Attorney of Randolph County.

Senator Chamier saw service in World War II with the 85th Infantry Division in North Africa and Italy and with the 339th Infantry Regiment. His World War II decorations include the Combat Infantry Badge, the Legion of Merit, the Order of the British Empire, and the Italian Cross of Valor.

In bringing Senator Chamier to the college today we feel that the members of the graduating class and their friends have an unusual opportunity to hear one of the outstanding civic and political leaders of Northeast Missouri. His subject today is timely and with his experience he speaks with authority.
