JIM BARNES, Language and Literature, has a prose poem, "Crow I," appearing in Coyote's Journal, an anthology of Native American literature.

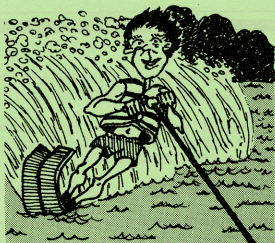

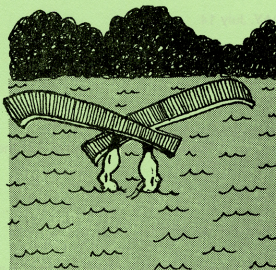
