Missouri House Approves Bill Revision

Missouri's House of Representatives approved a Senate revision of House Bill 196 which will designate Northeast as the statewide public liberal arts and sciences institution, in action on the floor last Wednesday.

HB 196, introduced by Rep. Winnie Weber (D-House Springs), passed easily by a 146-5 margin. The proposal was an outgrowth of the Coordinating Board for Higher Education's recommendations released last fall to eliminate duplication of programs among Missouri's public colleges and universities.

The revised bill is expected to receive approval by Gov. John Ashcroft within the next two weeks.
