### **WALTER HARRINGTON RYLE**

Walter Harrington Ryle is a native of Yates, Missouri. He received his undergraduate education at the First District Normal School at Kirksville where he was awarded the 90-hour diploma in 1916. After service in the United States Army in World War I, he returned to the Northeast Missouri State Teachers College where he earned the Bachelor of Science in Education degree in history in 1919.

He served as teacher, principal, and superintendent in the public schools of Missouri before joining the faculty of the Teachers College in 1928 as professor of social science. In the meantime he had earned the Master's degree at George Peabody College for Teachers in 1927. In 1930 the Ph.D. was conferred upon him by the same institution.

On August 21, 1937, Dr. Ryle was named Seventh President of the Teachers College following the death of Eugene Fair. During his presidency the College has experienced its greatest growth and improvement due to his unswerving demand for the best in teacher education. The faculty has been greatly enlarged and its academic standards raised; the campus has been transformed into a beautifully landscaped setting for many fine new buildings; and the student body has increased many fold in numbers and in the quality of performance required for graduation. The fifth year of preparation leading to the Master of Arts degree was inaugurated in 1947.

Dr. Ryle is married to the former Maurine Lea who holds two degrees, the Bachelor of Science in Education and Master of Arts, from the Teachers College. Dr. and Mrs. Ryle have one son, Walter Harrington Ryle IV, who is assistant professor of Latin American history at the Teachers College.

Dr. Ryle has written a number of books and articles in the fields of American history, geography, and teacher education. He is a member of many learned societies and has been very active in civic organizations and in the First Baptist Church of Kirksville. He is a past president of the Great Rivers Council of the Boy Scouts of America and the recipient of the Silver Beaver Award for his service to Scouting. He is also a former president of the Missouri Recreation Association. Currently he is chairman of the Conference of State College Presidents of Missouri.



HUBERT WHEELER  
Missouri Commissioner of Education

Hubert Wheeler, Missouri Commissioner of Education was born in Elkland, Missouri. He did his undergraduate study at Southwest Missouri State College in Springfield and received a Bachelor of Science degree there in 1932. He earned the Master of Arts degree from the University of Missouri in 1939.

Mr. Wheeler taught and served in various administrative school positions in several Missouri communities before he became the state's first Commissioner of Education in 1947. Under his leadership the work of the State Department of Education has been reorganized, educational training of teachers improved, and the law for the reorganization of school districts has been implemented.

The Commissioner was recently appointed to the legislative commission of the National Education Association and to the National Educational Policies Commission. He serves on the Board of Regents for five state colleges, is honorary chairman of the Missouri Fulbright Scholarship Committee, and is a member at large of the National Council of Boy Scouts of America.

Mr. Wheeler is a member of the Methodist Church, Phi Delta Kappa, Tau Kappa Epsilon social fraternity, and the Rotary Club. He is married to the former Georgia Hutchison of Aurora and they have a daughter, Georgann.

For his work as commissioner, Mr. Wheeler has been cited by the University of Missouri for distinguished service to education (1959) and he was presented the first outstanding alumnus award from Southwest Missouri State College (1956).

H. Roe Bartle is a native of Virginia and was educated in the Prep School of Fork Union Military Academy. He holds degrees from the University of Chattanooga and Hamilton College along with a number of honorary degrees.

He is founder and administrator of the American Humanics Foundation, a philanthropic foundation investing in desirable educational opportunities for youth planning a career in professional youth leadership. He served as Mayor of Kansas City from 1955 through 1963.

Mr. Bartle is often described as a public speaker, civic leader, educator, philanthropist, lawyer and humanitarian. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Mercantile Bank and Trust Company of Kansas City, a director of several business corporations and a board member of several educational institutions. He is a veteran of World War I, a Rotarian of distinction and for sixteen years was national president of Alpha Phi Omega service fraternity. He is, or has been, an officer in a number of organizations throughout the nation and world.

Mr. Bartle is married and has one daughter. The Bartles reside in Kansas City.
