



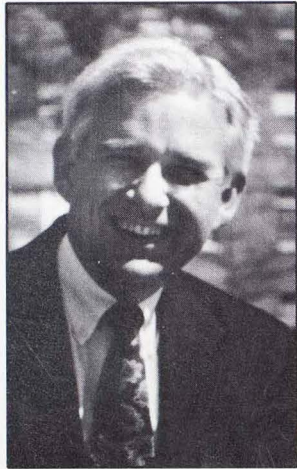

From the President . . .



Dear Friends of Northeast,

We are concluding a very exciting year at Northeast and preparing to begin in July a new year, the University's 125th. It promises to be a year of great celebration and achievement, because the efforts toward excellence at this University throughout the year have brought us to national prominence and a leadership role today.

The current year concludes the Five-Year Plan which guided the mission change at Northeast. In February, a visiting team of national experts appointed by the Coordinating Board for Higher Education conducted a comprehensive on-site exploration into our progress. In the words of the visiting team's report, "Northeast Missouri State University has undergone a remarkable and highly successful transformation into a nationally competitive liberal arts institution."

The team also endorsed *A Higher Order of Excellence*, Northeast's next planning document. We could not have come so far without the vision and leadership of highly motivated faculty, staff and students; students who are now alumni.

Because they are nearby, our faculty, staff and current students are recognized and applauded for their progress regularly. Alumni and friends, on the other hand, are not so easily thanked and acknowledged for their tremendous efforts and support.

So, I thought I would take the opportunity to highlight a few of your accomplishments this year:

First, seven alumni chapters have been formed in areas where Northeast has a large concentration of graduates and friends: St. Louis, Kansas City, Mid-Missouri, Houston, Dallas, Phoenix, and, of course, Kirksville. Next year, you will form three more in Atlanta, Tampa and Des Moines. Indeed, it is you, not us, who have done this, because the energy of the volunteers creates and sustains these efforts.

Second, your generosity has also brought to Northeast an all-time record year of fundraising, and challenged us to raise more in the future. Although the final numbers will not be in until the end of June, I can tell you that alumni and friends gave approximately 50 percent more than in any previous year. You shattered the University's goals in the Tel-Alumni campaign and in overall fundraising. Our thanks to you is deep and abiding, as our reliance on your continuing generosity grows.

Third, in my extensive travels the past two years to meet alumni, I have found a willingness to share not only wealth, but also wisdom and connections. The University's friends have offered to help establish networks for the sake of the institution, but especially for the sake of our students. You have made possible internships and job opportunities, and this year many of you participated in a highly successful Career Symposium held in Kirksville.

Finally, your good works have been echoed by your good words. You have created a context for the growth and advancement of Northeast Missouri State University that would not be possible without you. This summer I will begin a statewide tour to discuss *A Higher Order of Excellence*, and my ability to gain an audience will be possible only because you have prepared the way.

We truly have accomplished much together in the current year. I thank you for your help, and invite you to join all of us at the University in making our Quasquicentennial year even more successful. With your assistance, Northeast will achieve a higher order of excellence each and every year.

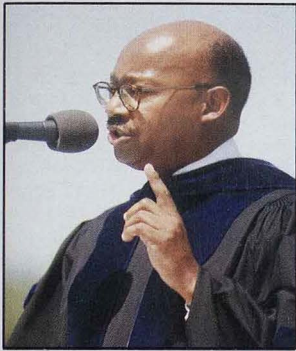

Stadium.

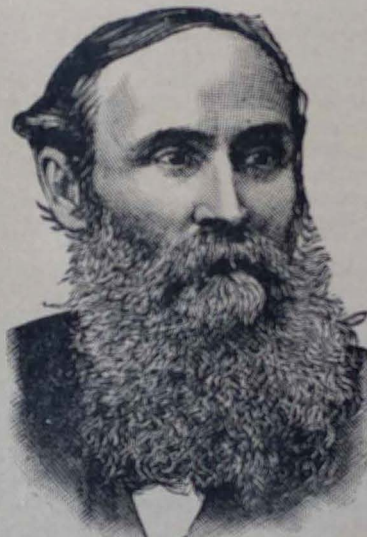
A significant event in the University's 125-year history took place almost 16 years to the date after Joseph Baldwin first arrived in Kirksville. It was on June 13, 1893, that the University President, faculty, staff, students, and alumni gathered in his honor to celebrate

Baldwin Day

Shortly after he took charge of the Normal School, President Dobson sensed a lack of interest among the alumni. . . . He realized that the School had lost something valuable. He had not been in office long until he made an effort to restore some of the ideals and philosophy of the School in former days. He conceived a plan to have President Baldwin visit the campus and to make that visit the occasion of a special demonstration that he hoped would bring about a rebirth of Baldwin ideals of a dynamic force in the life of the institution. Dobson's original plan was to have President Baldwin attend the commencement of 1892. . . . Along with President Dobson's invitation went letters from fifty of Baldwin's graduates who expressed, with much enthusiasm, the wish that he would accept the invitation. President Baldwin was unable to accept at that time because of previous commitments, but he promised to attend the commencement the following year. . . .

The Alumni Association was enthusiastic over the possibilities of having President Baldwin with them in June, 1893. In their meeting of June, 1892, they passed a resolution endorsing the plan of President Dobson, the Board of Regents, and the faculty to bring about a rebirth of the interest of the alumni in the work of the Normal School and pledged their full cooperation in the plans for the visit of President Baldwin. . . .

The faculty set Tuesday, June 13, [1893], as "Baldwin Day." A committee was appointed by the Alumni Association, made up of faculty, students, and alumni, and charged with the responsibility of organizing and implementing the program honoring President Baldwin. A committee composed of people in Kirksville was also appointed to cooperate with the "Baldwin Day" committee of the Normal School. This event became an affair not only of the Normal School, but of Kirksville and of the towns wherever the alumni and former students were located. . . .

. . . a large number of students of former years gathered in Kirksville to honor their former teacher and president who had meant so much to them. . . .

People began to gather in the Normal Chapel early in the morning, and before ten o'clock, standing room was premium. . . . Samuel M. Pickler . . . acted as master of ceremonies. . . . The rostrum was occupied chiefly by students and alumni. On the front row were: President Baldwin, President Dobson, W.P. Nason, J.U. Barnard, and Samuel M. Pickler. . . . Professor Nason, in an excellent speech, welcomed President Baldwin on behalf of the "old" students and the citizens of Kirksville and Adair County. President Dobson, in an "eloquent and fervent" address, welcomed President Baldwin on behalf of the present faculty and students of the Normal School. When President Baldwin arose to respond, he said he felt this was no time for him to make a speech, but he confessed it was the proudest moment of his life. During his

speech, he reminisced about the early days. . . . There are a number of references to the fact that, "During [all] the speeches nearly every eye grew dim." Elaborate plans had been made for an old-time picnic under the trees on the Normal School campus, but about noon it began to rain, making a change in this part of the program necessary. Tables were quickly moved into the classrooms on the first floor, and dinner was spread there.

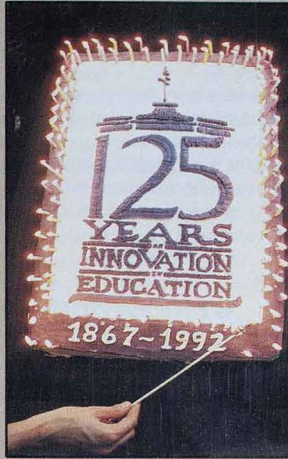
At two o'clock the people again assembled in the chapel for the afternoon program which consisted of short speeches from old friends, now residents of various states and occupying important positions in life.

Among those who made speeches were four of the fifteen members of the first class to graduate. They were G.W. Barnett, Dr. A.J. Hynds, Professor S.S. Sturgess, and H.W. Beatty. It was late in the evening when the reminiscences ended, but returned students agreed that it had been a great day. . . .

Feb. 13, 1992

The University kicked off its Quasiquintennial Celebration on the 125th anniversary of Joseph Baldwin's arrival in Kirksville. On Feb. 13, 1992, a rededication of the presidential portraits was held in the Student Union Building's Quiet Lounge. More than 300 members of the University and Kirksville area communities attended the celebration.

On Wednesday evening, June 14, President Baldwin delivered the annual address to the Alumni Association. . . . In front of him was a large audience of former students and friends, on either side of him were his old colleagues, Nason, Dutcher, Barnard, and Pickler. Behind him was a large number of the alumni of the school. B.F. Carroll, president of the Alumni Association, presided. . . .

After the address, the alumni banquet . . . was held in the Masonic Temple. The Alumni Association put forth special effort in making this banquet outstanding . . .

On Thursday morning, June 15, President Baldwin left Kirksville by train . . . Before boarding the train, he bade farewell to his friends and former associates, many of whom he never saw again.

Centennial History of Northeast Missouri State Teachers College
Walter H. Ryle III

The following letter, from Normal School Alumni in San Francisco, was opened and read to the congregation during Baldwin Day.

Beloved Friends:

We acknowledge the receipt of the invitation of the Committee to attend the exercises on this occasion. We hereby express our regret at being unable to accept your invitation and be present. While we cannot be with you this evening, we are holding a meeting of our own in the "Golden City" and enclose for you a program of the exercises, all being performed by the "Normalites" while the old folks look on, comment and enjoy.

In reply to the question, "Where are we at?" we respond, cheerfully, that our homes are in the city of San Francisco, that city that sits so majestically beside the Golden Gate to the great Pacific highway of the world. We have an organization of the Normalites which meets at our respective residences at stated times . . .

We close by earnestly wishing you, not only a very pleasant and profitable evening's exercises, but that the afternoon and evening of your lives may be on the sunny side of the hill, so that joy and peace may lighten your pathway, and that if we meet not before we shall meet again in joy after we have crossed the silent river.

We must especially express our earnest desire for the continued happiness and prosperity of our honored former president, Dr. J. Baldwin, and to express the hope that the remaining years of his life will be full of joy and usefulness, and when his great labors in life are finished, it will be out to enter in to the rich reward of the faithful.

With heart and hand, in hope of a useful and glorious future, we subscribe ourselves, and enroll our names among the Normalites of the Seventies.

I was the President of the Spring class of 1942... I plan to attend this year's Homecoming and help our class celebrate its 50th year reunion...

My maternal grandfather was Gerald A. Sparling, M.D..... he practiced in the office building across the street from the old Post Office until 1931. He introduced the first automobile to Kirksville in 1905 (a Maxwell) and served as coroner of Adair County for several terms... He met at the college my grandmother, Mary Ellen Iles, who later taught school near Kirksville... They had six children, three of which received degrees from the University... John N. Sparling flew one of the first airplanes that came up to Kirksville from St. Louis...

I was born at 402 East Pierce Street, delivered by my grandfather, in the front bedroom on Christmas Day, 1921. One of my earliest recollections is the bil-

lowing clouds of smoke and fire when the Baldwin Hall burned in 1924. I grew up at 502 S. Osteopathy Avenue on five acres which was a very idyllic arrangement for a young boy. In my childhood, I heard many stories about the 'old days' at the college... I well remember Dr. John R. Kirk as a very distinguished old gentleman walking between his home and the college. I remember when the sunken garden was first designed and constructed in the old basement site of Baldwin Hall. As a paper boy for the Kirksville Daily Express, I had the privilege of throwing the paper for Coach Don Faurot... No one would think of missing a football game during those championship years.

In our graduating year of 1942, the class presented to the University the portrait of Pres. Dobson. World War II had just begun and our ranks were somewhat thinned already, as many fellows had left for the service.

All in all, the Northeast Missouri State University has meant a lot to the Sparling and Reeves families. I am still a firm believer in the smaller university education.

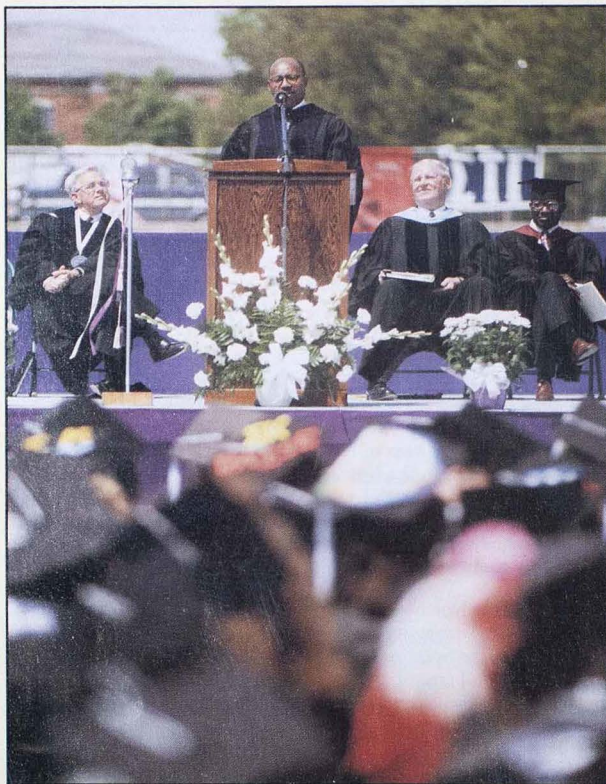

Alumnus Brings Message of Hope



Northeast's 1992 spring graduates received a final lesson of their college careers from commencement speaker and Northeast alumnus Alphonso Jackson, May 9. Jackson, executive director of the Dallas Housing Authority, urged the graduates to develop a positive attitude about life, to set goals and to have big dreams.

"It might be insane to live with a dream, but it's madness to live without one," he said.

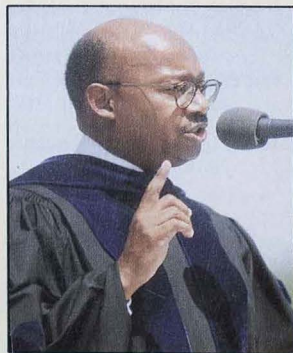
If people want to succeed in life and live their dreams, Jackson said, they must be self-motivated, have drive, and learn to be self-reliant.

"Today you are greater than you think you are, you have unlimited potential within you to be an element of change. You can change the quality of life in America. You have something to give. Whatever you are seeking, it is seeking you also."

Jackson told the 980 graduates that his message was not one of what is

wrong with America, because there is too much right with America.

"I bring you a message of hope, a message of challenge, a message that, hopefully, will inspire you to go out

and do what is right, to keep this country strong, and to make it a better place for all of us to live in," he said.

"Life states in exact ways, what you give is what you get," he said. "What you withhold from life, life withholds from you. Thus, it's important to know that you are in charge of your own life and to learn how to think and to be your own person.

"Life isn't supposed to be easy, and don't demand that life always be fair. You must deal with what is. The genius of success is to be able to see the good in everything and in every situation.

"Create something worthwhile so that when you get to the end of the line, you can look up and say, 'I made a contribution to my city, to my country and to my world,'" Jackson said.

Before coming to the DHA in January 1989, Jackson was director of the Department of Public and Assisted Housing in Washington, D.C., director of public safety for the city of St. Louis and executive director for the St. Louis Housing Authority. Jackson, who has served as an advisor to three presidents, was recently appointed a member of President Bush's National Commission on America's Urban Families.

One student led the spring graduating class with a perfect 4.0 grade point average. Salvatore Montalbano, an accounting major from Kansas City, Mo., received valedictorian honors. Montalbano, the son of Phillip and Esther Montalbano also received this year's *Wall Street Journal* Award and the Delta Sigma Pi Scholarship Key. He plans to study law at Washington University.

New Division Combines Three Areas

In February 1992, President Warren announced the formation of a new academic division. The new unit, the Division of Human Potential and Performance, is comprised of three related academic areas already in existence: Communication Disorders, Health and Exercise Science, and Nursing.

"Our University has built a national reputation for educational innovation based on solid achievement," Warren said. "We are combining the strengths

of three excellent programs in one forward-looking unit that will serve present and future students' needs."

The new division combines scientific inquiry and practical application to prepare students for professional careers centered on human welfare.

Assistant Professor of Nursing Constance Ayers feels the new division will strengthen the nursing program because it will eliminate the problems that small programs have statewide.

"The changes in structure are an indication of support for the quality nursing program at Northeast. The combination of the programs should provide possibilities for interdisciplinary courses which will enhance opportunities for students to make connections across disciplines. Increased opportunities will also exist for collaboration among students as well as faculty in the disciplines," Ayers said.

Larry Boleach, associate professor of exercise science, agrees with Ayers that by the three areas working together students will benefit.

"There are so many ways that we do things in common, but through a different approach. If we can combine those in some sort of concerted effort, certainly the student will profit from that," Boleach said.

According to Warren, existing degree programs will remain the same and academic disciplines in the new division will be responsible for their own curricula and program accreditations. Current faculty in those areas will staff the new division.

John Applegate, associate professor of communication disorders, sees the consolidation as promoting cooperative efforts and an increased awareness of curricula among faculty.

Cornelis Koutstaal, director of the Communication Disorders Department will assume leadership of the new division July 1, 1992. Division heads William Richerson (Health and Exercise Science) and Elsie Simms (Nursing) will be retiring within the next year.

Koutstaal brings experience from education administration as well as the corporate sector. Prior to coming to Northeast in 1991, Koutstaal held teaching and administrative positions at Bowling Green State University, Brooklyn College and Ithaca College and was vice president and executive director of the Central California Foundation for Health.

AROUND THE QUAD

University Receives Good Grades

In February, a nine-member team conducted a comprehensive institutional review. The review was designated by the Coordinating Board for Higher Education in agreement with Northeast. The team studied academic programs; evaluated how well the

University is accomplishing the new mission as defined by the goals of the Five-year plan; evaluated how effectively the human, financial and physical resources are being utilized to accomplish those purposes and offered recommendations for strengthening the continued implementation of the new mission. The final report of the team members was forwarded to the CBHE.

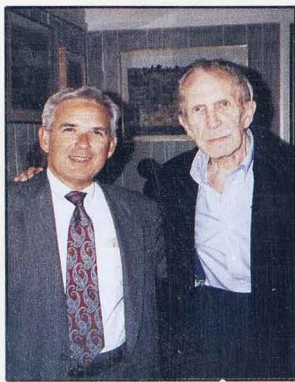

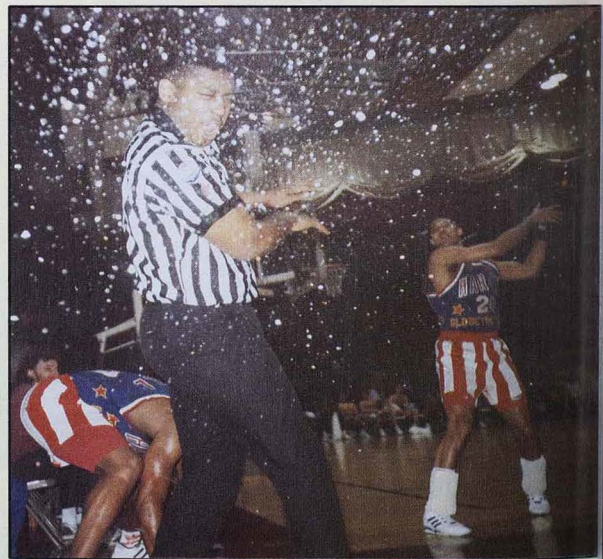

One Kid at a Time

With discipline and compassion, this principal had turned around a tough school...

"It's Andre again," came the call on the intercom in Milton McPike's office at Madison East High School. As the first black high-school principal in Madison, Wis., McPike had dealt with difficult kids over the past 12 years, but few as troubling as Andre Lomack.

In the doorway stood a teen-ager dressed in hooded sweat-shirt and jeans. He had racked up several suspensions for disrupting or cutting classes. Now he was in trouble for ignoring a teacher's order to take his seat.

McPike stood to usher him in. At a trim six-foot-six, the former pro-football player towered over the slightly built boy. "Andre, why did you act up in class?" McPike asked sternly.

"I didn't," mumbled the sullen 15-year-old. "I just forgot my book."

McPike knew all about Andre's past. He had a juvenile record. He had skipped hundreds of classes at his previous high school and was suspended three times. His parents were divorced, and his father didn't see him much. The courts had sentenced Andre to a group home near Madison East High for the 1990-91 school year.

Another principal might have let this kid slide along for the rest of the year. But McPike thought back to the last time he saw his own father, a shadow in the doorway of a saloon, demanding that Milton come inside. "You want to see me, you can see me at home," he replied, mindful that his mother had told him never to set foot in a bar.

"Don't you walk away from me!" shouted the old man. At 15, Milton was almost as big as his father, and he had been the man of the house since his father had left the family six years earlier. Milton did not turn back as his father continued to yell but, as big as he was, he began to cry. *I'll never be like you, he vowed. I'll never treat a child the way you've treated me.*

"I'm not going to kick you out, Andre," McPike told the teen-ager now. "But I'm going to be watching over you, son, understand?"

Setting kids on the right track has always been what Milton McPike does best. That's why he became a coach and teacher when his pro-football days with the San Francisco 49ers ended. But he had no idea how tough his job would be when he took over Madison East High School.

His first day, he was greeted by five fire trucks and an ambulance at the school's entrance. "False alarm," explained a firefighter. "We get these all the time here."

Inside, McPike found boarded-up windows, floors covered with garbage and spit from kids who chewed tobacco. Students hung out in the stairwells, verbally harassing anyone who walked past.

McPike immediately prohibited chewing tobacco and personal stereos, closed off certain stairwells and forbade the wearing of hats in the building. "It's a sign of disrespect," he told the kids. "Manners are where learning starts."

At first, students didn't believe McPike would enforce his rules. Ten of them were in for a surprise when he found them spitting tobacco on the floor. "Gentleman, you've got a choice," he said. "You can mop these floors or face suspensions."

"You don't have enough mops for ten of us," one teen-ager replied smugly. Minutes later, McPike and several custodians returned with ten mops—and ten buckets too.

But the next time McPike saw the ten young men during a class break, he greeted them warmly, learned their names and asked about their girlfriends. McPike, the kids began to see, wasn't just a rule-maker in a suit; he was more like a father. For many of them, he was the only father figure they had.

It's 10:15 a.m., and the kids are scurrying to their next class. McPike, patrolling the halls as usual, sees Andre—wearing a baseball cap.

"Andre!" barks McPike, snatching the blue Chicago Cubs cap off the boy's head. "You know the rules. The hat's mine now." He expects an argument. The cap is probably the most valuable thing Andre owns.

"But, Mr. McPike," protests the teen-ager, "will you give it back if I come see you later?" McPike stares at him, surprised. Does Andre want to visit the principal's office? "Stop by and we'll discuss it," McPike says gently.

There is something achingly familiar about Andre, a yearning for male attention. As Andre walks away down the hall, McPike sees himself.

Born in Jacksonville, Ill., in a shack without running water or electricity, Milton McPike was nine when his father moved out. His mother worked as a domestic to support him and his two brothers.

As Milt approached adolescence, he envied other boys as they talked and played ball with their dads. Feeling lonely, he often watched the high-school football team practice. Their coach, Al Rosenberger, got used to seeing the 12-year-old. One day the coach asked Milt if he planned to enter the Jaycees' Junior Olympics, being held in town the next day.

Milt groped for words to explain that blacks were never invited to Jaycee events and, besides, his family lived six miles from town and had no car. "It would be too hard for me to make it," he said finally.

"Nonsense," said the coach. "You can do anything you want if you put your mind to it."

That night Milt tied a rope between two trees and practiced jumping. "I'm gonna win the Junior Olympics tomorrow," he told his mother. If a man as important as Al Rosenberger had faith in Milt, certainly Milt could have faith in himself.

He did win—four races and the long jump. For the first time, he understood how encouragement can make an achiever out of a quitter. It was a lesson he would never forget.

By the time Milt reached high school, he and Rosenberger were close friends. The coach taught Milt that athletics is first and foremost about character—and that being someone people look up to and respect is the first step to success. He taught him, too, that successful people use setbacks as ladders, not crutches.

McPike glanced at his watch. It was past 3 p.m., and Chris Romes was late. The sandy-haired East High quarterback had been coming to MCPike's office once a week since the beginning of the school year.

Now, watching the minutes tick by, MCPike grew concerned. He'd seen alcohol and cocaine send the young athlete off the deep end once. MCPike had helped get him into a treatment center and then intervened on his behalf when he went AWOL. Chris had promised his mother and MCPike that he would stay sober. But the empty chair in front of MCPike's desk told a different story.

McPike thought about the boy, whose parents were divorced. There was the public Chris—rowdy, tough, at times callous. But MCPike felt certain that the real Chris was confused about his life.

McPike looked up to see the teen-ager walking through the door. His head was down; his eyes were glazed. "You might think that no one knows you are drinking, but you're not fooling anybody. Kids look up to you as a leader," MCPike told him, recalling something Al Rosenberger had said to him. "You've got to stand up for yourself before you can lead others."

A short time later, Chris was asked to speak at an elementary school. When he finished his talk, an eight-year-old came up to him. "Aren't you number 10?" he asked in awe. "You used to be the quarterback for East High School!"

Chris stared at the child looking up to him. Milton MCPike was right. How could he let this boy down? How could he let himself down?

Chris began going to support-group meetings. "You can win, you're tough," MCPike reminded him. "Leaders never quit." Today, Chris is sober, attending college full time for a business degree and working part time for a building-materials company.

Sophomore Andrea Sorenson was leaning against a locker when MCPike spotted her. A habitual truant, she had even moved away from home. She often hid to avoid going to class.

As MCPike approached her, he saw that her long hair was disheveled. Her skin had lost its color. Her eyes seemed unable to focus. "What's going on?" he asked. Then MCPike was overwhelmed by the smell of alcohol as Sorenson slid to the floor. Scooping her up like a baby in his arms, he ran with her to the nurse's office and called an ambulance.

On the way to the hospital Andrea's heart stopped. Without paramedics there to revive her, she would surely have died.

When Andrea was admitted to a treatment center, MCPike sent notes of encouragement and called her frequently. By the time she came back to East, MCPike had created a support group for students recovering from alcohol and drug addiction, and now he suggested she join it. "Use the past as a ladder, instead of a crutch," he told her, recalling the words of Al Rosenberger. "You can turn bad experiences into good ones if you don't get caught up blaming yourself or others."

McPike seemed to care so much about Andrea that she didn't want to disappoint him. On graduation, as MCPike handed her a diploma and gave her a hug, she realized how much he had taught her. "Without Milton MCPike, I never would have graduated or done anything with my life," says Andrea, now 22 and working for an insurance company. "He believed in me long before I believed in myself."

Now, as Milton MCPike watched Andre Lomack saunter into his office for his cap, he thought about the only times he'd ever seen the teen happy—when he was playing football on the junior-varsity team that MCPike had encouraged him to join.

"You know what makes a good football player?" MCPike asked, handing back the cap. "The same things that make a good student—persistence, hard work, dedication. But you've got to get an education first, or you'll never be anything."

When football season ended, MCPike encouraged Andre to try out for basketball. But a chronic kidney problem landed Andre in the hospital, and he was sure he wouldn't make the team.

McPike told the basketball coach Andre missed practice because of health problems, not lack of interest. "He's not the best player," admitted the coach. "But he tries hard. Tell him he made the team."

McPike called with the news. "See?" MCPike told him. "You can be whatever you want if you try."

From then on, Andre's schoolwork improved, and when he did especially well MCPike and his wife, Sharon, would invite him home for a weekend. Staying with them meant privileges, like shooting hoops with MCPike, and responsibilities, like mowing the lawn and doing homework.

One day, as the 1990-91 school year ended, MCPike found a letter on his desk. It was from Andre.

"Dear Mr. MCPike: . . . I think I should stay at East, because I want to be someone for once in my life. If I can hear your voice I will think twice about screwing up. If I can put effort and energy into sports, I can do the same thing in school."

McPike stared at the note. Andre, now 16, was a very different boy from the one who stumbled into the principal's office only ten months earlier. He was articulate, polite and motivated. He was beginning to turn around, just as Chris Romes and Andrea Sorenson and so many others had before him.

As he neatly folded Andre's letter and put it in his pocket, he knew that that was what his job was all about—taking stumbling kids and putting them back on their feet, one kid at a time.

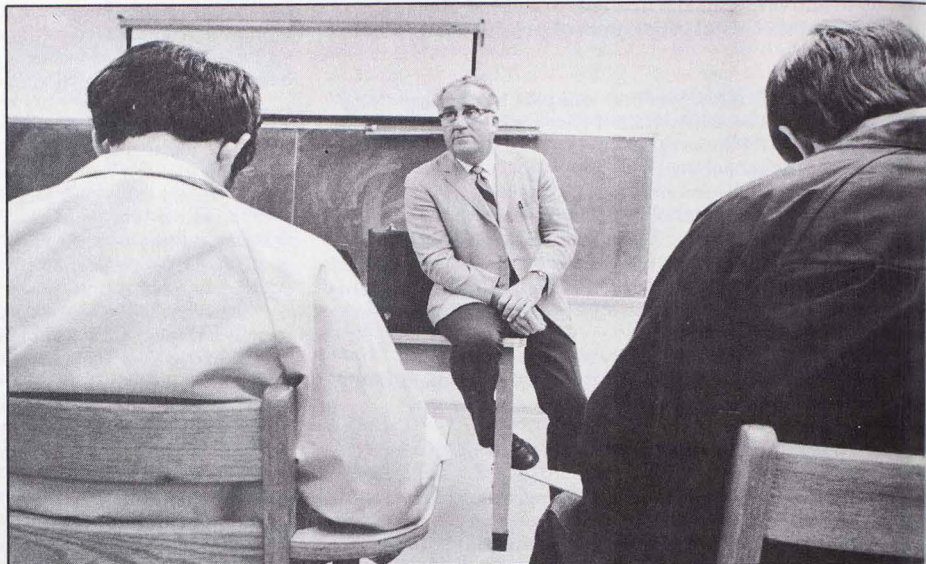

Kenneth L. Gardner

The Legend Remembered



For five decades, Kenneth L. Gardner helped mold the lives of many people. Hundreds of NMSU student-athletes considered him a coach, teacher, father-figure and loyal friend.

On Feb. 8, 1992, Gardner, 72, died in a Columbia, Mo., hospital after a lengthy illness.

Funeral services for the former NMSU coach, athletic director and instructor were held Feb. 11 in Kirksville, and G.E. "Shag" Grossnickle ('42) paid tribute to his long-time friend:

"Last evening when I was asked to say something this morning, the thought crossed my mind that I possess neither the vocabulary nor the eloquence of diction to properly eulogize our friend.

"This isn't easy for me because Kenny Gardner's coming to Kirksville influenced my life, then, and in the years to come.

"When he arrived, he had no place to stay, and I had a room in the basement of the Stickler Hospital. The room had a double bunk bed in it, so I invited him to stay with me. When he moved in, he had one pair of trousers, and I had two, so we shared that extra pair of trousers on many occasions. This was the start of a very close relationship as a teammate and as a friend.

"After college days and a few years, Kenny returned to Kirksville as a coach at our college. He assisted Red Wade on the football field, Boyd King on the basketball court, and of course, we all know what a phenomenal record he had as the head coach in track. Between the three of them, they established a winning record over a long period of time that in all probability will never be equalled in our institution.

"Kenny taught his players to give every ounce of energy they had, and when the going was rough, he taught them to dig down and give a little more.

"I'm sure that until that final day, he carried with him the full knowledge that he had served faithfully and well.

"He taught them not only in sports but gave them something to carry with them the rest of their lives. He was their coach, and he was their chaplain.

They are not with us today, but I must take this opportunity to say that they had a tremendous and significant effect on my life, and on the lives of many graduates of NMSU."

"He was a coach's coach, an excellent instructor, and when it came to a human being, he was 'color blind.' He possessed an uncommon ability to put back into society more than he expected in return.

"He gave reproof when necessary but always followed with much praise. He met with success because he had many assets.

"Sometime back, I was privileged to introduce Don Faurot at a speaking engagement and in so doing, I quoted one of his former players. I had also asked one of Kenny Gardner's former players the same question and received basically the same answer. The question was, 'How did you like your coach?' After a brief hesitation, he replied, 'On many occasions, I have thanked God that I was privileged to meet him and to play for him.'

"Kenny Gardner's shadow will only lengthen as the years go by. We in the community are fortunate in that we were privileged to see a legend and a giant pass this way.

THE KENNETH GARDNER ERA AT NMSU 1939-1988

Kenneth L. Gardner was born Feb. 12, 1919, in Iowa City, Iowa, the son of Homer L. and Helen Hartsock Gardner. He was raised in Iowa City and Warsaw, Ill., and graduated from Warsaw High School. Gardner enrolled in 1939 at Northeast Missouri State Teachers College (now NMSU), where he was an all-conference and All-American football player and a track standout.

During World War II, he served as an Army major in North Africa and Europe, earning the Silver Star, Bronze Star and Purple Heart. After the war, Gardner returned to NMSU, where he completed his athletic and academic career with a degree in 1947. For the next four years, he coached at Marceline High School.

In 1951, he returned to NMSU to serve as head track coach and assistant football and basketball coach. During the next four decades, he directed the Bulldog track teams to 34 indoor and outdoor Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association championships and guided 35 individual NCAA Division II All-Americans. He also coached the cross-country team several years.

Gardner served the final 14 years of his career as athletic director during a period of time that NMSU intercollegiate athletics doubled to the current number of 21 sports.

He was a 1983 charter inductee for the NMSU Athletic Hall of Fame and was inducted into the Missouri Track and Field Hall of Fame in 1984.

Gardner was a two-time recipient of the College Track and Field Coach of the Year award presented by the Missouri Track and Field and Cross-Country Coaches Association. He was named the 1974-75 Outstanding Faculty Member of the Year at NMSU.

He served as college division referee at the Drake and Kansas Relays and was on the games committee for the Division II National Track and Field Championships for many years. Gardner was chairman of the Division II Midwest Football Committee and a member of the Division II National Football Committee for several years.

Gardner was preceded in death by his wife, Ethelyn, and a daughter, Barbara Lynn, in infancy. He is survived by a son, Richard Brownlee ('63), of Joplin, Mo.

Berns, a junior who requested to be red-shirted this past season to concentrate on academics, compiled an overall record of

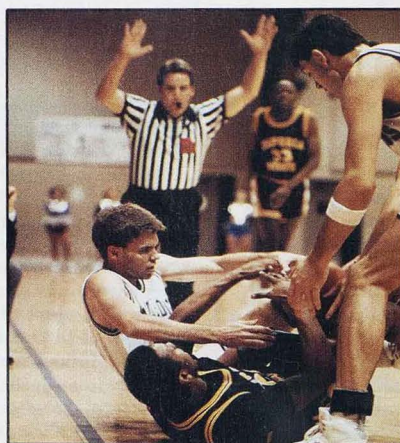

MEN'S BASKETBALL Bulldogs Recruiting Focusing on Backline Prospects

For the first time in a number of years, Willard Sims, men's basketball coach, must replace a large senior group. But despite the exit of seven veterans, who accounted for 1,875 of 2,084 points scored by last winter's 11-17 team, Sims indicates the cupboard is not bare.

The veteran mentor expects to build his 1992-93 club around three juniors, a sophomore and five promising freshmen from the 1991-92 roster.

Next year's nucleus should include three upperclassmen who came off the bench in at least 20 games this past season. The trio consists of 6-8 junior forward/center Dean

Lewis (Geneseo, Ill.-J.D. Darnall), 6-6 junior guard Travis Snelling (Webster Groves, Mo.) and 6-9 junior center Todd McCubbin (Harrisburg, Mo.).

Other holdovers from last winter will be 5-11 sophomore guard Eric Cappel (Richton Park, Ill.-Rich South), 6-6 freshman forward/center Bill Eckholm (Blue Springs, Mo.), 6-5 freshman forward Jason Smith (Festus, Mo.), 6-4 freshman forward Shannon Steele (Sparta, Ill.), 6-4 freshman guard/forward Trygve Kjellsen (Skien, Norway) and 6-4 1/2 freshman forward Scott Linnemeyer (Mexico, Mo.).

Sims' new recruits are 6-8 center/forward Francisco Javier Cargol, a native of Spain, who will transfer from Indian Hills (Iowa) Community College as a sophomore, and two high school players, 5-9 point guard Brian Basich (Wentzville, Mo.) and 6-7 forward Tim Reuschel (Camp Point, Ill.).

Seniors finishing their careers included 6-5 forward Dale Reid (Eolia, Mo.-Clopton), 6-6 guard-forward Justin Matthews (Joliet, Ill.-West), 6-1 guard Boyd Printy (Cedar Rapids, Iowa-Washington), 6-6 center Rick Rigsbee (Inverness, Ill.-Littleton, Colo.-Arapahoe), 6-5 forward/center Matt Clements (Washington, Mo.), 6-1 guard Randy Brock (Marion, Kan.) and 6-1 guard Jeff Linnemeyer (Mexico, Mo.).

Reid led the 1991-92 team in scoring with a 15.8 average. During the past campaign, Matthews, second in point-production with a 14.5 average, climbed to the fifth spot on the NMSU all-time scoring list with 1,283 points.

Although the 1991-92 campaign was disappointing to the team, Sims said they could gain satisfaction from a Feb. 1 upset of Washburn University (Kan.), ranked number one in Division II at that time.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

A year ago, the NMSU Lady Bulldogs posted their first winning basketball season in 10 years. They were looking for even better things in 1991-92, but what they found was frustration.

Injuries and inexperience proved to be too much for Coach Lois Heeren's team, which struggled to a 3-24 overall record. At times, Heeren found it increasingly difficult to put a healthy lineup on the court and was forced to use starters who had no or limited collegiate experience.

The Lady Bulldogs lost their first five games before defeating Culver-Stockton, 74-72, for their first victory. Then, they absorbed five more setbacks before picking up their second win, a 67-60 verdict at the expense of Missouri Western. Their only other victory of the season was a 63-55 decision over Lincoln University in February.

Two senior starters, forward Shelley Picha and guard Kathy Patterson, earned several records before concluding their careers this past winter. Heeren said Picha and Patterson provided strong leadership for her young players.

SWIMMING In their final meet of the past season, the NMSU swimming and diving teams made big waves at the Midwest Championships, shattering 14 school records.

The Lady Bulldogs teeter-tottered with two Division I teams, Eastern Illinois and Northern Iowa, before finishing a close second to EIU in the team standings. The Bulldog men were sixth in a 12-school meet.

For the campaign, the NMSU women compiled a 2-3 record against dual competition, and the men were 1-6.

Despite the loss of eight seniors between the two squads, head coach Andy Johns said the men and women should open next season with a strong nucleus of performers.

WRESTLING The NMSU matmen concluded their 1991-92 season with a 5-13 dual record and a sixth-place finish at the highly competitive NCAA Division II Midwest Regional Tournament.

Central Oklahoma, which captured top team honors in the Midwest Regional, went on to win the Division II national championship.

Sophomore Irving Ward (Kansas City, Kan.-Sumner Academy) placed third in the 158 pound-class at the regional, and sophomore Jeff Mildner (Topeka, Kan.-Columbia, Mo.-Rock Bridge) was fourth at 142 pounds.

For the season, junior Bryant Gaines (New Bloomfield, Mo.-Helias) was the individual victory leader with a record of 31-15 at 150 pounds. Ward was next with a 22-12-2 mark.

Spring Wrap-up

BASEBALL **Bulldogs fall one game shy of tying school season—wins record**

The Northeast Missouri State baseball men fell just one game short of tying the 10-year-old record of most wins in a season (17, set in 1971 and 1982) by dropping a nightcap against Quincy College Hawks on May 1.

The Bulldogs opened their final series of the 1992 campaign by blanking the Hawks 3-0. Sophomore pitcher Chris Schupp (Columbia, Mo.-Hickman) allowed only three hits in the contest.

But the Hawks dashed the Bulldogs' chances at the record by downing them 13-6 in the nightcap capitalizing on two key errors. NMSU concluded the season with a record of 16-26.

Despite missing the last 17 games after undergoing emergency appendectomy surgery, sophomore rightfielder Aaron Royster (Chicago, Ill.-Morgan Park) became the first Bulldog to earn first team all-Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association honors in four years. Royster, who led the team with a .397 batting average, finished the season leading the team in runs batted in (25) and home runs (4). In 78 at bats, Royster posted 31 hits and 19 runs, good for a .641 slugging percentage. Royster joins the ranks of NMSU first team selections that include Al Nipper, Bruce Berenyi, Dave Wehrmeister and Charles Blakley, all former professional players.

Junior centerfielder Nate Mudd (Glen Carbon, Ill.-Edwardsville) was named the recipient of the Curtright MVP team award. Mudd finished third in team batting with a .285 average, with three doubles, one triple and one home run. Mudd finished with a .961 fielding average, posting only three errors in 77 chances. The Curtright MVP award is named after Guy Curtright, a former Northeast Missouri State standout in the early 1930s. Curtright held the Major League Baseball record for longest rookie hitting streak, 26 games set in 1943. The record stood for 44 years, until Benito Santiago of the San Diego Padres erased it in 1987.

Statistically speaking, sophomore pitcher Eric Cappel (Richton Park, Ill.-Rich South)

finished at the top of the NMSU bullpen with a 3.47 earned run average. Schupp was second with a 3.86 average.

Only one senior will be leaving the Bulldogs this season. Relief pitcher Shane Williams concluded his career with a 4.91 earned run average and posted four saves this season. In 14.7 innings of work, Williams gave up only nine runs while striking out six batters.

GOLF

A string of championships at the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association Tournament came to an end April 28 for the NMSU men golfers. They reigned as the tournament champions for eight consecutive seasons but fell to a third-place finish this season.

Sophomore Matt SeEVERS (Lincoln, Neb.-Southeast) was the highest finisher for the Bulldogs, tying for fourth place with a 233. Other Bulldog competitors were junior Kevin Fisher (Waterloo, Iowa, Iowa-Columbus), 242, sophomore John Doucette (Camlachie, Ontario, Canada-St. Patrick's), 245, sophomore Todd Stice (Hamilton, Ill.-Cardinal Stritch), 252, and junior Chip Block (Rockford, Ill.-East), 265.

Unfortunately, the Bulldogs' finish in Tan-Tar-A put them out of the race for a trip to the NCAA Division II Tournament (Spartanburg, S.C.) in May. They were chosen to compete in that tournament six of their eight years as conference champions.

The Bulldogs should return for the 1992 fall campaign with a full team, as there were no seniors on this spring's 14-man roster. Only four members of the squad did not participate in any tournaments this past spring, giving NMSU a good deal of experienced golfers for the fall.

For the first time in six years, the Lady Bulldogs were not chosen to compete as a full team at the 1992 National Golf Coaches Association Division II National Championships May 4-6 in Fayetteville, N.C. However, freshman Julie Bettenhausen (Tinley Park, Ill.-Senior) and junior Karin Moore (Jefferson City, Mo.-Senior) represented NMSU in the national tournament.

Bettenhausen finished 19th with a three-day score of 257, and Moore was 28th with a three-day total of 267.

As a full team, Coach Sam Lesseig's players participated in three meets during their spring campaign, finishing 10th in the Southwest Missouri State Tournament, fifth in the Missouri-Kansas City Tournament and fifth in the Bradley University Tournament.

SOFTBALL

Despite adversity which plagued NMSU all season, the Lady Bulldogs, 8-22 overall, rebounded and made the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association softball tournament field.

After winning a playoff game against Northwest Missouri State, 7-6, to determine the tournament qualifier, the Lady 'Dogs faced defending conference champion Missouri Southern. The Lady Lions defeated NMSU 7-0. Then, the Lady 'Dogs were eliminated from the tournament by Missouri-Rolla, 3-2.

NMSU finished the season with a pair of losses to Quincy College, dropping both contests, 5-2 and 6-2.

Injuries to the two starting pitchers, sophomore Mindy Ray (LaPlata, Mo.-Huntsville, Mo.-Westran) and freshman Ally Powers (Manchester Mo.-Parkway South), forced head coach Dan Zimmer to actively recruit a new pitcher midway through the season. Zimmer found Terri Hansel, a junior academically, who had pitched in his softball class. Hansel, who had not competed for three years, made her debut against Lincoln University on April 17.

Sophomore Jennifer Smith (Kansas City, Mo.-Winnetonka) led the team at the plate, with a .306 batting average. Junior first baseman Anne Moe (Davenport, Iowa-North), led the team in several categories, at bats (79), runs batted in (12), hits (20), doubles (three-way tie with 3), triples (6) and home runs (2). She also led the team in total chances with 159, committing only two errors at first base. Moe nursed strained shoulder muscles in her throwing arm for most of the season.

Powers was NMSU's number one pitcher with a 3.41 earned run average. She also led the team in wins with five and strikeouts with 31.

TENNIS

The NMSU men and women both finished their 1992 seasons with third-place finishes at the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association Championships April 23-25 in St. Joseph. Northeast served as host for the 1992 tournament.

Sophomore Anne De LARGY (Kirkwood, Mo.-Nerinx Hall) won the women's No. 6 singles flight, and the No. 3 doubles team of senior Sherry Banez (St. Louis-Ursuline Academy) and freshman Rachel Mestad (Kansas City, Mo.-Blue Valley North) finished first at the conference championships.

For the second straight year, Ramiro Azcui was named as one of the MIAA Men's

Co-Coaches of the Year and MIAA Women's Coach of the Year. At the end of the campaign, Azcui submitted his resignation, effective July 1, to serve as assistant women's tennis coach at Indiana University and to pursue a doctorate at Indiana.

Next season, both NMSU teams should return most of the players from this spring. The only senior on the 1992 women's roster was Banez. Jay Selkirk (St. Joseph, Mo.-Central) at No. 3 singles and Rodney Chilton (Hazel Crest, Ill.-Hillcrest) at No. 4 have finished their collegiate careers at the Bulldog men.

The Lady Bulldogs posted a dual record of 13-7, while the men compiled a 12-7 mark this spring.

T RACK Going into the final weeks of their seasons, the NMSU men's and women's outdoor track teams were attempting to qualify several performers for the NCAA Division II Championships May 28-30 in San Angelo, Texas.

Although both squads were young this year, they recorded strong finishes at the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association Championships April 23-25 in Pittsburg, Kan.

Coach Ed Schneider's men placed fourth, despite the absence of two of their top performers, senior Chadd Lamason (Brashear, Mo.) and sophomore Brandon Truman (St. Louis-Lindbergh). Lamason suffered a foot injury, and Truman became ill the week of the conference meet. Coach John Cochrane's women placed third at the MIAA championships.

Event winners for the men at the conference meet were senior Rob Jensen (Kearney, Mo.), 30:30.51 in the 10,000-meter run and 14:53.53 in the 5,000-meter run, junior Dave Killen (St. Charles, Mo.-Oregon, Ill.), 9:21.6 in the steeplechase, junior Kevin Long (Oregon, Ill.), 1:54.32 in the 800-meter run, and freshman Chad Jansen (Lee's Summit, Mo.), 3:54.96 in the 1,500-meter run.

Individual champions for the Lady Bulldogs were freshman Vicki Perez (Jal, N.M.), 136-09 in the discus, and senior Michelle Coleman (Kearney, Mo.), 18:12.95 in the 5,000-meter run.

R IFLE TEAM Banner Places in Regional, State Competitions This past season, the NMSU rifle team recorded one of its best years, if not its best, since the intercollegiate sport was introduced about two decades ago at the University.

The 1991-92 squad was composed of seven men and one woman. During the season, the NMSU shooters finished first in nine of 13 matches in which they participated and were rated as high as 20th in the NCAA national rankings.

They capped the year by winning the Missouri Intercollegiate Rifle League March 28 at Central Missouri State in Warrensburg.

Members of the 1991-92 team were seniors James George (Chillicothe, Mo.) and

Bryan Heartsfield (Tremont, Ill.), junior Mike Dickow (Spring Grove, Ill.-Marion Central Catholic), sophomores Dawn Goodpasture (Stockton, Mo.) and Sean Nally (Kansas City, Mo.-Rockhurst) and freshmen Dan Schoenekase (St. Louis-St. Louis University High), Jason Palm (Watauga, Ill.-Galesburg) and Shawn Spindel (St. Louis-St. Louis University High)

A highlight of the recently completed season was their performance Feb. 13 in the NRA Collegiate Sectionals at Lincoln, Neb. 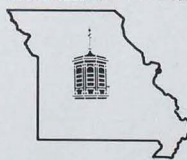

What began with a graduation ceremony of 15 young men on June 24, 1870, has become a growing tradition. Through the years, thousands upon thousands of students have participated in commencement ceremonies at Northeast Missouri State University. In an attempt to create opportunities for alumni to interact with each other and continue to be a part of the University, the Alumni Association was formed.

The NMSU Alumni Association has a history of its own. Formally incorporated in 1967, in celebration of the school's centennial anniversary, the organization was designed for the mutual betterment of the school and its thousands of alumni. In an attempt to make the Association more inclusive and to encourage all graduates to be donors to the Development Fund, the NMSU Alumni Association eliminated dues as a prerequisite for membership in July 1992. As a result of this change, gifts to the Development Fund are anticipated to increase in size and frequency, allowing greater funding of scholarships, divisional support, faculty development and cultural events. Although the Association has experienced changes in leadership and requirements for membership, it remains the largest organization of the University.

As a formally chartered non-profit educational corporation, the NMSU Alumni Association is an alumni-governed body. With leadership from across the country, the Association

works to serve alumni as well as ensure adequate funding to support the needs of the University. Through the Association, alumni are encouraged to support Northeast and participate in the continued growth of the University. While maintaining services for its graduates, Northeast provides a global network of alumni and friends.

All graduates of Northeast Missouri State University are considered members of the Alumni Association, and all current dues-paying graduates are now considered Charter Members. Previous Life Members under the dues-based program will maintain that classification. Any donor of a \$1,000 gift or more will be considered an Honorary Life Member. In addition, each Association member may receive issues of *Northeast Review*, can participate in regional alumni chapters, make use of services at the Career Placement Center, make free use of the Natatorium at designated times, and share in selected discounts made available at the campus bookstore. Other advantages of being an NMSU alumnus/a include the opportunity to participate in Homecoming and class reunions.

The Northeast Missouri State University Alumni Association Presents The Second City National Touring Company

Taking its name from A.J. Liebling's derisive profile of Chicago in *The New Yorker*, THE SECOND CITY opened in 1959. Success was almost instantaneous. Before the startled actors knew it, they were inundated with praise from the press, including *Time* magazine, which called it "a temple of satire." Chicagoans packed the place every night and the small club became a "must-see" stopover for professionals in the acting world.

The concept that is The Second City has always been translated by six or seven actors who enliven an empty stage with topical comedy sketches. Using few props and costumes, punctuating scenes with original music, the

ensemble creates a slice-of-life environment, lampooning our modern lives—political, social and cultural. The Second City develops all of its material in a performance situation, improvising on ideas suggested by the audience during improvisational sets held nightly after the regular show. Then, by refining, culling and amplifying the ideas during rehearsals, the finished pieces become the next revue. The Chicago theatre has averaged two or three reviews a year since opening.

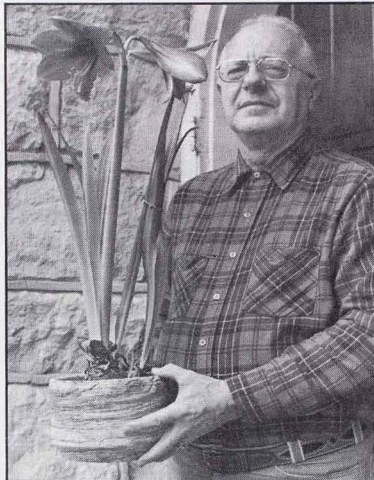

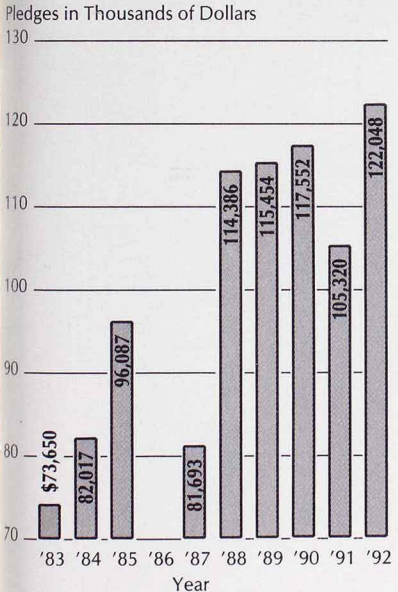

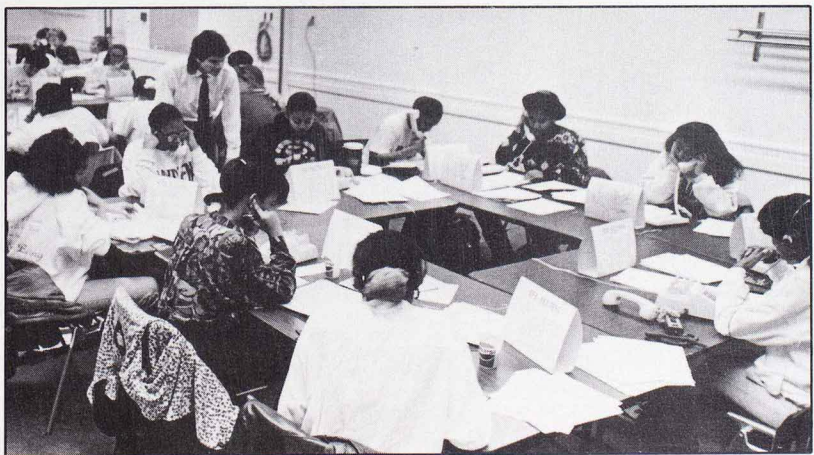
In honor of Northeast's 125th Anniversary, next year's goal is \$125,000.
