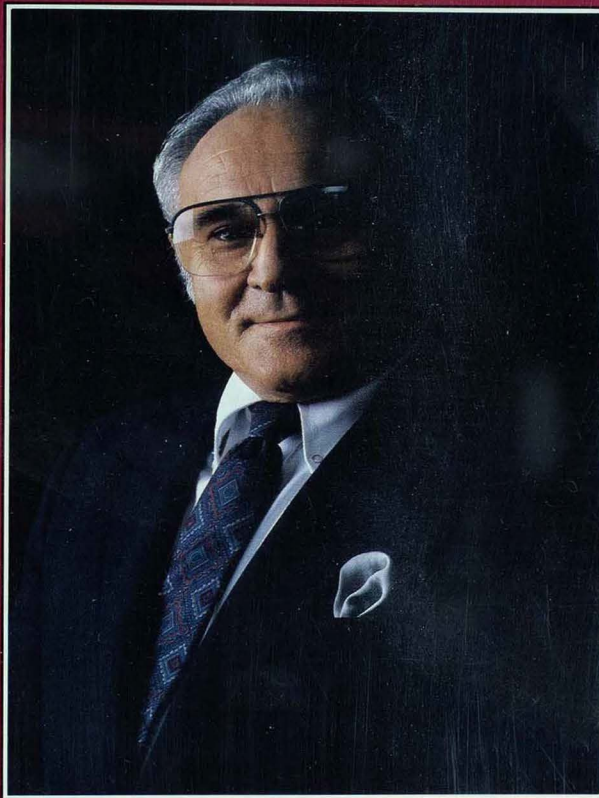

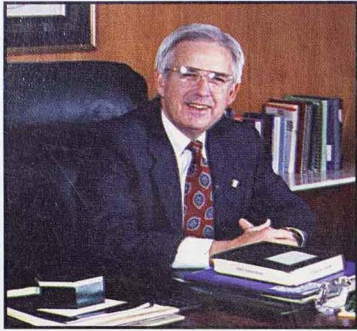

Fritz Lauer’s blood may indeed run purple as a result of his undying dedication to his alma mater. And on the night of Oct. 8, 1993, he was given the royal treatment.

This year’s All-Alumni Banquet recognized **Frederick “Fritz” Lauer** (‘50), the third-annual recipient of the Alumnus of the Year award. Past recipients were **Larry Moore** (‘67) and **Ray** (‘60) and **Mary Cox** (‘60) **Bentele**.

As an undergraduate at Northeast Missouri State University, Frederick C. Lauer had already made the decision to devote a good part of his life to education. He graduated with a bachelor’s degree in education from Northeast in 1950 and was a member of the scholastic teacher’s fraternity.

After leaving Northeast, he went on to earn a Doctor of Dental Surgery degree from the University of Missouri-Kansas City in 1956 and then practiced dentistry for more than 20 years. He also served on the Board of Education in Liberty, Mo., for six years.

To the delight of many, Dr. Lauer returned to Northeast in 1986 to serve on the Board of Governors. During his time on the Board, he served as secretary and then vice president and took part in some of the most important decisions in the history of this University.

His term coincided with a time of great change for the University, with our legislated mission change from a regional university to the statewide liberal arts and sciences university for Missouri. Fritz also served as one of the key decision makers in the Presidential Search Committee, resulting in the choice of President Russell Warren. His term ended in November 1990.

Fritz is one of those special people who excels in all areas necessary to receive the Alumnus of the Year award. The criteria include: time commitments, personal service or personal resources offered to Northeast; monetary donations to the NMSU Development Fund; and personal achievement. All of these qualities together make for a generous and loyal friend of the University.

In addition to honoring Fritz as the Alumnus of the Year, the All-Alumni Banquet also served to recognize members of the John R. Kirk Society, Alumni Association Board, chapter leaders and reunion classes. Special tables were set aside for these groups, which provided an excellent chance for returning alumni to reminisce and catch up on what's currently happening at the University.

Yet another highlight of this important evening was President Warren's State of the University address. Alumni and friends were thrilled to hear of the progress Northeast is making, including our recognition in *Money* magazine as the 8th Best Buy in the nation. Other points of interest were: that we are now the only public university in Missouri that has chosen the highly selective category for its admissions standard; our devotion to active learning, in and out of our classrooms; the ever-increasing opportunities for undergraduates to be involved in research side-by-side with their professors; and the extremely high academic and leadership qualities of our 1993 entering freshman class.

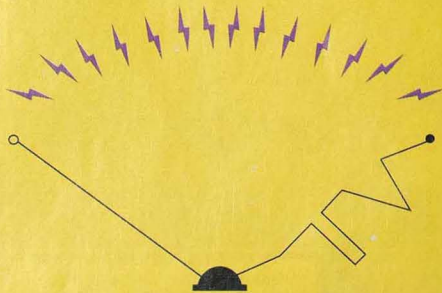
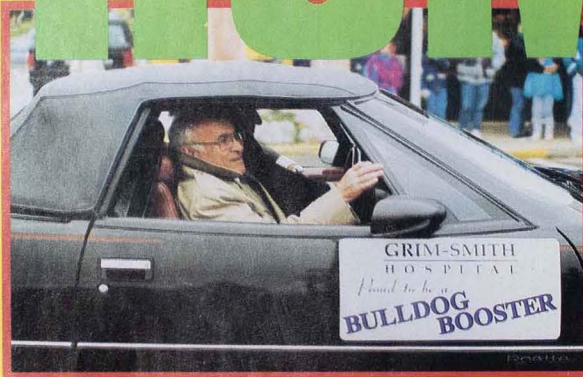

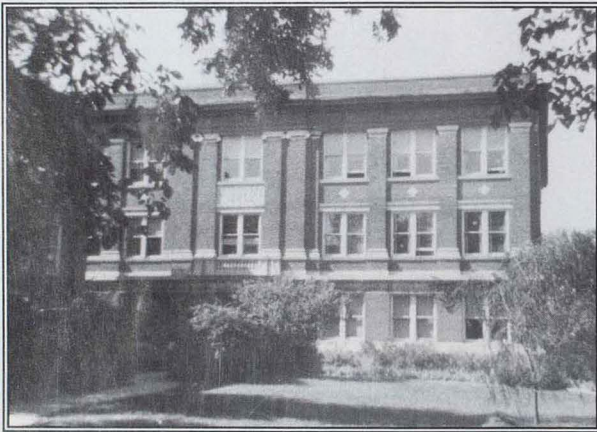

Ceremony Marks Completion of Pickler Memorial Library

For anyone who has spent any time in Pickler Memorial Library, Homecoming 1993 had an extra special significance. At 10:30 a.m. Saturday morning, between the excitement of the parade, chilifest, and the reunions, Pickler Memorial Library was officially dedicated.

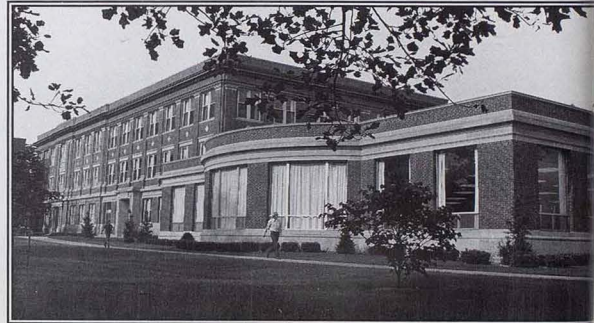
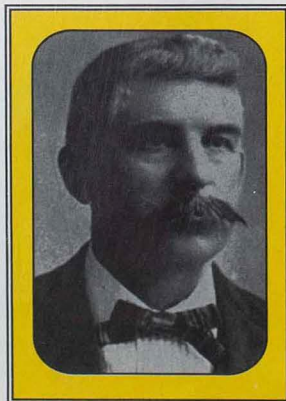
Due to the chill in the air and the chance of rain, the ceremony was held inside the library. A large crowd of alumni, students, legislators and friends of Northeast gathered to hear comments by President

Russell G. Warren, State Senator Norman Merrell, Virginia Stanton (granddaughter of Sam Pickler) and Board of Governors President Larry Rutledge. The ceremony concluded with an unveiling of a plaque, which will hang just inside the entrance of the library, and a ribbon-cutting ceremony.



On January 28, 1924, fire destroyed both Library Hall and Baldwin Hall. Only those books that had been checked out were saved.

A new building, Pickler Memorial Library (above) was constructed the following year. The total cost of the building was \$103,000.



A new addition (above) to Pickler Memorial Library was dedicated in 1967. It provided seating for 1,100 students and space for 250,000 volumes. In less than six years the building's capacity was already reached and plans were begun to add more space.

It was because of Sam Pickler's (left) generosity that it was possible to build a new library immediately after the fire. He donated \$25,000 for the new building and another \$10,000 for furnishings. The Board of Regents in turn named the building after the library benefactor.

Pickler was a strong supporter of Northeast. His association began early, as he was in the first graduating class from the Normal School and he went on to serve on the faculty from 1868-1873. He also served on the Board of Regents from 1899 to 1905.

In addition, Pickler's long list of occupations included teacher, editor and proprietor of the Kirksville Journal, merchant, lumber contractor, land owner, money lender, banker, commissioner of Adair County, mayor of Kirksville and Adair County representative to the state legislature.

In 1985, the 83rd Missouri General Assembly appropriated \$12 million for an addition to and renovation of the library. The University agreed to contribute \$2 million for the total project cost of more than \$14 million.

Charged with bridging the past and the present, the architectural firm of Ittner and Bowersox (St. Louis) designed a building with an atrium connecting the old and new (above), and incorporating the facade of the 1925 structure.

More than 50 years after G.E. Grossnickle was to have gone through Northeast Missouri State Teachers College graduation ceremonies, he officially received his diploma during the summer 1993 commencement at Northeast.

When Gerald Elijah Grossnickle was a boy, he would play softball with his older brothers. They would always send him to the outfield where he would “shag” fly balls. Thus, the nickname Shag.

“I honestly thought I would lose that nickname when I headed off to World War II, but soon after I enlisted, I ran into a friend who immediately called me Shag. Needless to say, it never went away,” said Shag.

At 78 years of age, Shag still hasn’t outgrown his nickname or his love of baseball. In the 1930s, it was softball that brought him to Kirksville. The Carlisle, Iowa, native was recruited to pitch on a local softball team by Dr. Ralph Stickler (’20). Stickler convinced Shag of the importance of continuing his education. Shag had graduated from high school four years earlier and had not given much thought to his future or going on to school.

“After talking with Dr. Stickler, I realized that furthering my education was important. Now I am the first to admit my education at Northeast made all the difference in the world. It afforded me the opportunity to have something better for my family and that is, after all, the most important thing!”

Like many students during that time, money was an issue; Shag could not afford to go to Northeast Missouri State Teachers College on his own. Stickler came through again and provided a room for Shag in the local hospital downtown, more commonly known as Stickler Apartments.

Shag enrolled at Northeast in the fall of 1938 and was a member of the football team. During his freshman year, Shag happened upon the May commencement exercises in Kirk Gym. As he watched each graduate walk across the stage being handed his sheepskin, chills ran down his spine. He decided then and there he was going to work hard and earn his diploma.

“Knowing I would be walking across that stage is what sustained me throughout my four years,” Shag said.

Ironically, Shag attended every graduation during his four years but his own. Two weeks before he was to graduate, Shag was called to serve in World War II.

When Shag first learned he would be leaving to serve in the war, he was told he must have a degree to get into the Navy. He and the Navy worked out an agreement that would allow him to go through the graduation ceremony and then immediately enlist. Much to Shag’s disappointment, the Navy called him up

soner and he was forced to take his exams early and head to Virginia. For a young man who had dreamed of nothing more than walking across that stage and receiving his diploma, this was a hard lesson.

"It's kind of funny, but it was something I never quite got over. All these years I have felt that there was a dream I never fulfilled," Shag said. "Now, thanks to some caring and thoughtful people at Northeast, my dream has become a reality, and I am deeply grateful."

Fortunately for Shag he was able to attend one very special ceremony before he headed out to serve his country. On April 2, 1942, he and Sarah Rose Maize, the catcher on the local women's baseball team, were married.

Upon returning to Kirksville, Shag taught history and coached football and basketball at the Kirksville Senior High School. After one year he left teaching to become the owner and operator of a restaurant called "Snappy Service." Three years after he opened his restaurant, the public service bug bit him and he became the sheriff of Adair County.

At that time, the sheriff and his family were required to live in the jail house, a two-story facility. While Shag was out keeping the peace, Sarah was cooking for all the prisoners and caring for their two sons, Gary and John Benjamin ('76). They later had a daughter Rebecca, who attended Northeast.

During his eight years as sheriff, Shag never carried a gun, rarely wore a uniform and kept his badge in his pocket, even when several of his cases attracted national attention.

"I never wanted my jail full. I always believed in trying to talk to them first and help them understand where they went wrong. Fortunately, it usually worked. There were cases where they went too far, but more often than not, they listened to reason," Shag said.

Through the years, Shag has helped many people, especially

young Northeast athletes, through difficult times. Many of them come back to Kirksville just to say hello and let him know they are doing well. Shag is still known for giving sound advice.

His advice is simple, "Keep your self respect—it is one of the most important things you will ever have."

Shag remained in public service after leaving the sheriff's office, first as the Adair County assessor and finally as the Adair County public administrator. In 1966, Shag achieved an important career goal by entering the insurance business. He became co-owner of Grossnickle-Orwiler Insurance, Inc., and in 1975, Shag became the full owner and operator of Grossnickle Insurance.

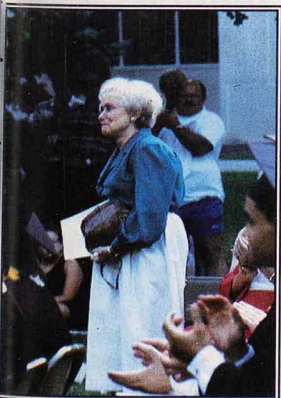
Shag's persistence has been one of the keys to his success, personally and professionally. This persistence earned him the credit for bringing the wild turkey back to northeast Missouri.

Shag began talking with the Missouri Department of Conservation to find out how wild turkey could be revived in northeast Missouri. Initially, the Conservation Department felt skeptical. Shag persisted and the two sides finally agreed to give it a try. The pilot program began with only 23 turkeys. Every day Shag would carry corn out to the field to feed the birds. Despite the fact it was one of the hardest winters the northern region had experienced, the turkeys survived and five years later Adair County had its first open season.

Today, Shag enjoys working and spending time with his family.

"I always thought that when I retired I would like nothing better than spending my days at my cabin duck hunting, but my first week of "retirement" hunting ducks about did me in," Shag said. "I knew then I could never retire and I would die working."

AROUND THE QUAD

Northeast Ranked Eighth in the Nation by Money

Northeast Missouri State University is ranked in the top 10 on *Money Guide's* honor roll of four-year colleges. The 1994 edition features the 100 schools that "are bargains when their prices are measured against the quality of education they offer." Northeast was named eighth in the nation.

Money's fourth annual ranking of leading colleges and universities measured quality by a number of factors including faculty resources, faculty deployment, core faculty, library resources, instructional budget, student services budget, entrance examination results, (class rank), high school grade point average, freshman retention rate, graduation rate, advanced study, default rate on student loans, number of graduates who earn doctorates and business success.

"While no ranking can tell you whether a school is suitable for your child, our top 10 list is the best place to start looking," said *Money Guide*.

In addition, Northeast was listed second among schools in the Midwest. The schools featured in the six U.S. regions earned high scores in the magazine's value-oriented analysis and charged less in tuition and fees than institutions that offer educations of similar quality.

Northeast's tuition and fees are \$2,456 for Missourians and \$4,336 for others; room and board, \$3,080.

Northeast was also recognized as number three among highly selective schools in the country.

More Good News

For the seventh consecutive year, Northeast has been selected for inclusion in *Peterson's Competitive Colleges*. The 1993-94 guide features 359 colleges and universities that consistently attract the most accomplished students.

Northeast was the only school in Missouri included in *The National Review College Guide of America's Top Liberal Arts Schools*. "It is no exaggeration to say that Northeast is one of the nation's most innovative public universities—a school that has remade itself into an image of what a university should be," wrote *The National Review*.

Most recently, *U.S. News & World Report's 1994 College Guide* ranked Northeast

sixth in academic reputation among midwestern colleges and universities.

Freshman Class Bucks National Trend

At the same time American high schools are producing the smallest pool of graduates since World War II, Northeast's freshman enrollment has risen to the level of the late 1980s. Even with the larger number, the quality indicators are slightly higher than last year.

On the average, the class earned a high school grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; a class rank of 82 percent; and the middle 50 percent of the class scored between a 23 and a 28 on the ACT. (See Freshman Profile.)

Northeast's fall 1993 freshman class is in excess of 1,600, approximately 200 students more than last year.

This year's entering class balances a smaller senior class. Total enrollment remains approximately 6,000 which provides a student/faculty ratio of 16/1.

While the number of admission applications rose by 21 percent this year, Dean of Admission and Records Kathy Rieck cites other possible reasons for the surprisingly large freshman class.

"Northeast is a unique institution. Where else can you find a public liberal arts and sciences university with competitive admission standards at our price and size?" Rieck asked.

She further pointed out that Northeast's decision to pursue the "highly selective" mission category with Missouri's Coordinating Board for Higher Education caused cancellations to decrease last spring.

These unique qualities attracted the attention of more than 6,500 high school seniors who applied for admission. They also garnered a feature article in *The Chicago Tribune*, among others.

Rieck said interest in Northeast's 1994 freshman class is a repeat of this year's. She expects the admission process to close as early as February and she emphasized if you know of anyone interested in attending, have them apply immediately.

Northeast Recognized by CBHE

Missouri's Coordinating Board of Higher Education, at their Oct. 14 meeting, formally recognized Northeast Missouri State University for the completion of a five-year plan to transform the institution from a regional comprehensive university to Missouri's public liberal arts and sciences university.

Northeast's mission change was authorized by the Missouri Legislature and Gov. John Ashcroft in 1985. As a part of the mission change, Northeast was directed to develop a five-year plan, with performance objectives, to be used as a blue print for the changeover. The five-year plan was approved by the CBHE and implemented in 1987.

Through this action, the CBHE fully recognized Northeast Missouri State University as the state's liberal arts and sciences university. Further, the Coordinating Board publicly commended Northeast President Russell G. Warren, the Board of Governors, faculty, staff, and students for their fine achievement.

Update on the Study of the University Name

In a unanimous decision, the Commission to Study the University Name agreed that Northeast Missouri State University's name is not reflective of its mission and recommended that Northeast's Board of Governors consider a name change for the University. The motion was made by Rep. Carson Ross, District 55 State Representative from Blue Springs, Mo., and seconded by Louise Gardner ('62), mayor of Jefferson City, Mo. Commission chair Gale Bartow ('49) informed the Board of the recommendation at their meeting Sept. 25.

The Commission's final report includes four main reasons for the recommendation. The report first points out that the mission of Northeast changed dramatically when the Missouri legislature voted in 1985 to make Northeast a statewide university. "Before 1985, Northeast was a multipurpose regional school, mainly serving students from the northeast quadrant of Missouri. Now that Northeast is the designated statewide liberal arts and sciences university, it serves students from all over the state of Missouri. It is no longer a regional school as the name implies. A more distinct name would provide an opportunity to educate and inform the public and legislature that Northeast is a statewide university with a unique mission."

The Commission noted that with the mission change came changes in curriculum, admission requirements and emphasis on the quality of education. Northeast is the only university in Missouri opting to achieve the Coordinating Board for Higher Education's highly selective admission category.

"Students at Northeast are among the brightest and most tal-

ented in the state. Northeast has a very specific mission, admission standards that are among the highest in the state, and is nationally recognized for providing a high quality education."

The Commission also cited confusion surrounding Northeast's 'regional' sounding name. "Despite increased recognition, the University suffers from considerable confusion among other Missouri institutions of higher learning that have 'regional' sounding names.

Northeast is also frequently confused with other regional universities nationwide."

Finally, the Commission also believes that there is a lack of clarity among legislators concerning our statewide mission. "If legislators perceive Northeast as a 'regional' university, it is likely they will fund Northeast as a 'regional' university. The state's investment should be clearly identified. Their investment in our unique mission would be enhanced by a distinctive name."

The Board took the recommendation under advisement and immediately referred it to the Advancement and Governmental Relations Committee.

The Committee met Oct. 9 to review the Commission's report. The Committee voted unanimously to recommend to the full Board at its Dec. 3 meeting that the

Commission's report has sufficient evidence to warrant further study of this question. In their discussions, the Committee members stressed this process can be reversed at any time and does not mean a name change is imminent.

One of the reasons the Committee felt this matter should be studied further was because most people, when asked if they supported a name change, replied, "It depends on what name is chosen."

In order to get this question into the open, the Committee tentatively adopted the following criteria for a new name, should one be chosen at a later date:

- 1.) It is unique;
- 2.) It conveys the University's statewide liberal arts and sciences mission;
- 3.) It is easy to say, spell and remember; and
- 4.) It is broadly supported by various university publics.

Student Senate President Attends National Forum

Matthew Barnes, president of Student Senate, attended the National Leadership Forum on Faith and Values in Washington

D.C., on Sept. 23-26. The four-day conference taught student leaders how to include their Christian values in leadership positions. Five-hundred students attended from 45 states and 14 countries.

Many prominent speakers, such as Vice President Al Gore, former Missouri Governor John Ashcroft and Georgia Congressman John Lewis, presented programs dealing with social issues leaders face everyday. Some topics covered were ethics in leadership, dealing with the poor, and racial issues. Small groups were formed to discuss the programs of the day.

Community service was an important topic at the forum. The idea of servanthood, an important value in Christianity, was discussed and students participated in public service projects to experience the rewards of being a servant. A full day was devoted to visiting nursing homes and cleaning underprivileged schools.

Barnes attended the Governor's Leadership Conference in January and was then invited to the National Leadership Forum on Faith and Values.

"It was a fantastic experience. I was able to learn from very prominent leaders of our country how to be a leader and keep my Christian values," said Barnes.

After meeting with many student leaders from schools across the country, Barnes expressed his feelings about Northeast.

"The atmosphere on other campuses is not as good (as Northeast's) - the administrators aren't as concerned about student's views, academics is not as stressed and the quality of students does not compare. It made me proud to be going to NMSU."

Barnes is a senior health major from Florissant, Mo. He plans to work in health administration after he graduates next August.

Gooch has Musical Score Recorded

During the recording, Gooch sat with the recording engineers and provided input as the session progressed.

"It was such an incredible thrill to be sitting there as they performed music I had written," said Gooch.

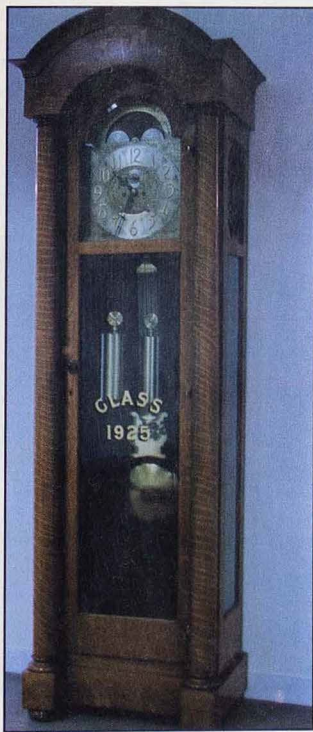
The opportunity to compose a new orchestral work was made possible by a newly formed organization, the Master Musicians Collective. This organization allows select composers the opportunity to have their new orchestral works performed and recorded by a full orchestra. Gooch said this is significant because concert audiences typically prefer to hear music of the 18th and 19th centuries, which pressures the orchestra to focus largely on this repertoire.

Because the costs of producing these recordings are considerable, the composers must help with funding. Gooch was able to help fund his recording with monies from a Faculty Research Grant and the NMSU Development Fund. "I am so grateful to Northeast for its belief in me and my work, and especially its commitment of funding my project," Gooch said.

The compact disc, produced this fall, will be distributed free of charge by the Master Musicians Collective to educational and cultural institutions, libraries and public radio stations. It will also be available to the general public through various retail outlets in Europe.

Clock Restored

Blue Key honor fraternity presented the University the 1917 Hersuhede clock that the organization had restored. The clock was a gift to the University from the Class of 1925. Blue Key funded the project, which began two years ago. According to former Blue Key president **Joe Mesmer ('93)**, before the restoration the clock had an estimated value of \$1,000; it is now appraised at \$10,000. The clock is housed in Pickler Memorial Library.



Fund-raising Effort for Gardner Track Now in Its Ninth Month

An effort to raise funds to remodel the NMSU track at Stokes Stadium is now in its ninth month, with a target date of January 1994 for completion of the campaign.

The track, which will be repaired and resurfaced with an all-weather, eight-lane product, has been renamed in memory of Kenneth L. Gardner, former NMSU track coach and athletic director. Gardner died in February 1992.

Athletic Director Alan Graham said the project will cost \$220,000. Thus far, \$80,000 has been pledged by 30 alumni, friends of NMSU, members of Gardner's track teams and members of Bulldog football teams during the time when Gardner was an assistant coach.

"The University has committed an additional \$60,000," said Graham. "That leaves \$80,000 to be raised before construction can start, hopefully in May 1994."

The track, which encircles the football field, has been the site of historic football and track events, which have carved a national recognition for Bulldog athletics.

Anyone interested in supporting this effort should contact Graham at the athletic office, (816) 785-4236. Persons who pledge \$500 or more can take up to three years to fulfill their gift.

Thirteen Persons Inducted into NMSU Hall of Fame

Thirteen contributors to NMSU intercollegiate sports were inducted into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame on Oct. 23. This year was the 10th anniversary of the Hall of Fame.

Members of the 1993 induction class were recognized at halftime during the NMSU football game with University of Missouri-Rolla and then were inducted at a banquet and formal ceremony that evening, hosted by the University Alumni Association.

The 13 inductees were:

Stanley Barker†, a two-time all-conference football lineman for NMSU in the mid-1920s, also made the all-state team once. He worked for 25 years for an aluminum company in Chicago. Barker died in 1973.

Bruce Berenyi pitched for the NMSU baseball team one year before launching a professional career. He played for the Cincinnati Reds from 1981-84 and the New York Mets from 1985-86. Berenyi works for a resort/golf course in North Miami, Fla.

John Bringer, an all-conference lineman for NMSU in the late 1960s, has been a member of the Hannibal School System since the early 1970s, serving as a coach and school administrator. He is currently the assistant superintendent.

Darrell Fouch was a second-team all-conference football end for NMSU in the early 1950s. He has been a certified corrective therapist for a veteran's administration

hospital and an owner of a food mart. At present, he and his son, David, manage Fouch's Christmas Tree Farm, near La Plata.

Deborah (Carter) Graves, the first NMSU female athlete to earn All-American honors, is the second woman to be inducted into the University Hall of Fame. Graves was a sprinter on the Lady Bulldog track team. She coached track and field hockey until 1984 at Kirkwood High School and is now a guidance counselor at Kirkwood.

Jerome Krumeich, a sprinter and relay performer at NMSU, collected All-American track honors in the mid-1960s. He is a partner in Human Resource Management, Inc. in Florham Park, N.J.

Dennis Littrell earned All-American track accolades as a high jumper in the early 1970s at NMSU and was a two-time conference indoor and outdoor champion. Littrell is teaching and coaching at Lawson Public Schools.

Paul Ozug was an all-conference and all-district basketball forward for NMSU between 1967-69. Ozug has taught for 20 years and is currently on the staff in the Fayette County School System, near Atlanta, Ga.

Russell Sloan amassed a 22-5-1 record (.804) as head coach between 1969-71, the second best winning percentage among NMSU football taskmasters. He guided the Bulldogs to a conference title and two championships. Sloan is president of the

Muncie (Ind.)-Delaware County Chamber of Commerce.

Mark Sobol, an honorable mention All-American football defensive lineman for NMSU in the late 1970s, has coached football and wrestling on the Kansas and Missouri high school level the past 11 years. He is currently on the football staff at Herculaneum, Mo.

Windorf "Doc" Sooter played basketball in the late 1930s and early 1940s at NMSU. Sooter coached high school basketball for 31 years and was the winningest, active high school basketball coach in the nation (654--177, .787) when he retired in 1974. He has been the golf coach at Cuesta (Calif.) College since 1978.

Dr. Wayne Ventling was a three-time NMSU track All-American in the mile relay in the early 1970s, helping the Bulldogs win three indoor and three outdoor conference titles. He is an osteopathic physician radiologist in Corpus Christi, Texas.

Johnnie Wesley † received second-team recognition on two 1981-82 All-American basketball teams for NMSU. Wesley played professionally for one year in Spain and five years in Australia before he died in an automobile accident four years ago in Australia.

Since its inception, 135 persons have been inducted into the Hall of Fame, which was started in 1983 through the support and efforts of alumni to recognize outstanding contributors to the University athletic program.

Beattie Epitomizes Northeast Academics and Athletics

A year from now, many of those attending the 1993 NMSU May commencement exercises may not remember the names of the senior class valedictorians, or for that matter, that one of the valedictorians earned bachelor's and master's degrees at the same time with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average.

That valedictorian's name is **Scott Beattie ('93)** and the good news doesn't stop there. Last spring, he received GTE Academic All-America accolades by virtue of competing in Bulldog sports - cross country and track.



Beattie, who grew up in Greeley, Colo., is currently working on a doctoral degree in statistics at Penn State University.

Making a decision to become a runner was not an easy one for Beattie since his high school did not have either a cross-country or a track team.

However, Beattie still wanted to become a runner. "I didn't know who to talk to and what to do," he recalled. "I did some fun runs. Several people said I could be a runner, but I wasn't pushed."

Beattie, who was valedictorian of his senior class, ended up at Northeast due to a scholarship.

He was impressed with Northeast's academic quality and enrolled in the fall of 1988 at the University

One day in his freshman year, Beattie mentioned to an instructor, Sam Nugent, that he was interested in running. Nugent recommended that Beattie talk to Ed Schneider, the Bulldog cross-country and track coach. Schneider suggested that the youngster come out the following fall for cross country.

In his sophomore cross-country campaign, he was the seventh runner for NMSU. However, he finished fifth among NMSU performers at the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Championships. The Bulldogs finished third as a team in the regional, but they were not selected to

compete in the Division II National Championships.

"SEMO finished third, and Southern Indiana was ninth in the national meet," Beattie recalled. "We felt that we should've been picked and could've finished in the top 10 nationally that year."

Beattie indicated that his junior year of athletic participation was a strange one for him. Three of the cross-country veterans were redshirted that year, so he and six freshmen comprised the nucleus of the team. Beattie had to assume a leadership role.

"We didn't do very well, and I had never run in the conference meet," he said. "But I was consistently getting better."

Then, Beattie suffered a setback in his running career. In February 1992 during the indoor track campaign, he suffered a stress fracture.

"It was very frustrating," he recalled. "I was anticipating good things in track that season, but I had to take the next few months off until the injury healed."

When the 1992 cross-country campaign started, Beattie had been training just one week. So, he was forced to miss several meets. The Notre Dame Invitational was his first competition as a senior. He didn't perform well, developing a cramp that stayed with him a couple of weeks. Then, he ran a personal-best time in the University of Missouri-Rolla Invitational.

Beattie said the Bulldogs' goal was to win the 1992 Division II national championship, so they were disappointed with seventh place. Individually, he finished 58th over the 10-mile course at Slippery Rock (Pa.).

The 1992-93 track campaign was "a lot of fun," according to Beattie. He experienced a "new feeling" by winning a race in NMSU's first indoor meet at the University of Missouri-Columbia.

After competing in a meet over the Christmas

break, Beattie won his third consecutive race in early January.

At the end of the 1993 indoor season, he finished second in the 5,000-meter run at the MIAA Championships in Warrensburg. He followed up that performance with a successful campaign outside, winning the 5,000- and 10,000-meter events at the conference outdoor meet in Warrensburg.

"I couldn't understand why I was winning," he said. "I believe that I made myself into a runner, and I hope that I have motivated and encouraged others."

"When Scott asked if he could come out for the team, I was apprehensive," Schneider recalled. "At first, he didn't set the world on fire, but he worked hard and had great determination. Once he made up his mind to achieve something, he went full speed ahead."

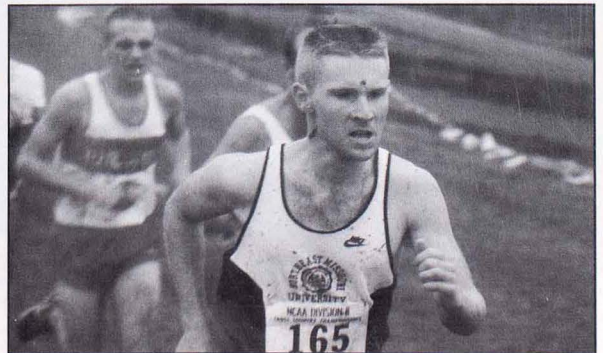
Beattie's last year at NMSU was exceedingly intense for him. Running became important to him as a form of release from pressures. Beattie said discipline has been an important key to his success in the classroom and in athletic endeavors since his high school days.

NMSU provided him with an academic scholarship and the willingness to make sure that he learned while on campus.

"My career goal in statistics is to work in industry, helping conduct research and testing new drugs."

Perhaps, some day, he might help determine whether a new drug could cure such diseases as cancer.

If that happens, someone attending last May's commencement might remember him and say, "Oh yes, I watched Scott Beattie receive two degrees one afternoon at NMSU."

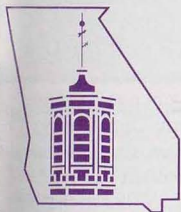

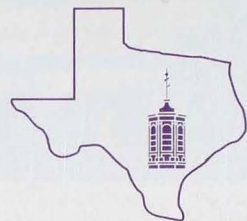

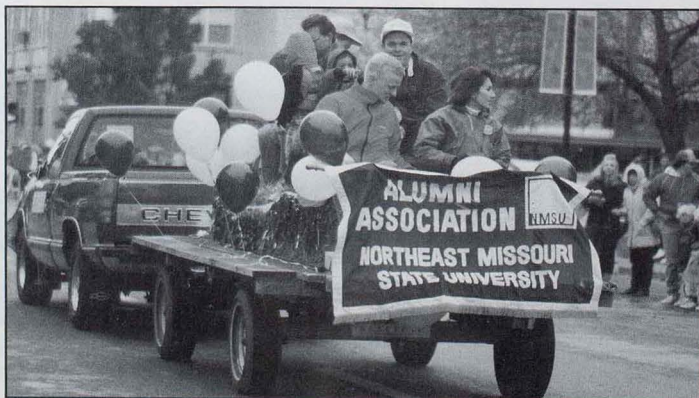

Ye Scores Second in Nation

Greg Ye ('93) won national recognition among accountants when he scored highest in the state and second highest in the nation on the May '93 Certified Public Accountant (CPA) exam making him the Elijah Watt Sells Silver Medalist and the Gold Medalist in Missouri. Ye scored second out of 65,000 on an exam well-known for its difficulty.

"Over 130,000 candidates sit for two CPA exams each year," said Professor Sandra Weber, who taught a CPA preparatory course that Ye participated in.

Ye was flown to New Orleans on Sept. 20 to receive a silver medal from the American Institute of CPA's. He received a gold medal from the Missouri Society of CPA's. Northeast has had graduates who placed statewide before, but Ye is the first alum to place nationally. The last time a person from Missouri won such an honor was in 1948.

"I think it indicates the quality of students coming to NMSU," Weber said. She said Ye found her course helpful, but that he was a very bright student.

Northeast's Oldest Alumna

Sina Cochran Vaughn's story is much like the rest of Northeast's alumni. Her parents moved to Kirksville to provide their daughters with an education. Sina received degrees in 1912 and 1916 from what was then called First District Normal School of Missouri and later came back to teach at what is now Northeast. She is now retired and living with her daughter.

So what is so unusual about Sina Vaughn? At 102 years old, she is one of Northeast's oldest, known, living alumni. Sina graduated in 1912, only 45 years after the school was established.

The Cochran family, consisting of Sina's parents, Leander and Anna, and her sisters, Ada, Lois and Velda, moved to Kirksville from Cainsville, Mo., in 1906. Sina's home later, after her husband passed away, was located in what is now the parking lot between the Department of Public Safety and McClain Hall. A yucca plant now signifies where the entrance to the home was.

"My sisters and I really enjoyed the college," Sina said. "We learned some very interesting things there."

Sina's father made his living running an implement shop. The aged faint advertisement for "Cochran Implement Co." on one of Kirksville's old downtown buildings has now merged with a sign painted later. It now says, "Cochran & Sons," an obvious joke since the family had only daughters.

The entire Cochran family was musically inclined, and Sina used her talent well during her time at Northeast. She played flute in the orchestra and also danced in the school's operettas. These shows used to be presented by the lake that used to be in front of old Baldwin Hall.

Sina initially received a degree in 1912 from Northeast and followed up in 1916 with a Bachelor of Science degree. She later attended Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore and graduated in 1922 as an R.N.

After returning to Kirksville and serving as a nurse at Grim Smith Hospital for two years, Sina joined the faculty of Kirksville State Teachers College as an Associate Professor of Public Health. She also served on the Missouri State Board of Nursing.

Sina says she has fond memories of her days here in Kirksville and of University presidents Dr. John R. Kirk and Dr. Eugene Fair. She also remembers the days when students spent their days rowing on Owenby Lake, which is now College Park, just like students now visit Forest Lake in Thousand Hills State Park.

On December 25, 1928, Sina married Dr. Robert Edward Vaughn, a 1928 graduate of the Kirksville College of Osteopathy & Surgery. She assisted him in his practice in Kahoka, Mo. and later in Lancaster, Mo.

"My husband and I delivered babies all over the hills and hollows of northeast Missouri," Sina said.

Sina's daughters, Suzanne Vaughn Jagers and Roberta Vaughn, followed in their mother's footsteps as they both attended KSTC.

Robert Vaughn passed away in 1953, and Sina currently lives in St. Louis with her daughter, Roberta. She has three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Sina has stayed young at heart through extensive travelling since retiring in 1953. She has visited every state except Alaska and has visited Europe three times. Most recently, in 1980 when she was 89, she took her grandson on a tour of Germany as a reward for receiving straight "A"s in German.

"I've really led a good life," she said. "I always wanted to be a nurse, and I not only got to be one, but I helped others become nurses, too. I got a lot of enjoyment out of nursing."

Donald Everett Walker

1928-1993

The entire university community was saddened by the passing of Professor Emeritus of Chemistry Donald E. Walker on July 25. Don had retired just a year earlier after 31 years at Northeast.

Don was born in Green Castle, Mo. He graduated from Kirksville High School and served in the United States Army from 1946-48. He received degrees in chemistry and math from Northeast in 1950 and began a career which spanned industrial and academic chemistry. While pursuing graduate studies at the University of Kansas, Don worked as a researcher at Upsher Laboratories in Kansas City. He then headed east, first to Leeds and Northrup in Philadelphia and then to E.I. du Pont de Nemours' Eastern Analytical Laboratory in New Jersey. In 1961, he joined the chemistry faculty at Northeast.

Don's research interests led him to Ohio State University where he studied spectroelectrochemistry. He later invented the alternating-current polarograph capable of feedback control of alternating-current electrode potentials. For the breakthrough, he was cited as one of the significant inventors of 1962 in Analytical Reviews. A few years later, he invented the first solid-state alternating polarograph.

Meanwhile, Don was the chief consultant for Duncan Laboratories, a clinical chemistry group in Kansas City.

Don was a pioneer in computer-assisted instruction in chemistry, developing early software packages and authoring a laboratory manual on analog computer programming, including the computer test-scoring system used at Northeast from 1968-73, which graded up to 40,000 exams each year. Don also co-authored the teachers guide for the 1968 edition of the legendary freshman chemistry text by Nebergall, Holtzclaw, and Schmidt (General Chemistry, Boston: Raytheon, 1968).

He was a member of the American Chemical Society, the Missouri Academy of Science, Phi Delta Kappa, and the American Association of University Professors. Don was also a brother in the Phi Sigma Kappa fraternity.

To honor Professor Walker's memory, the Donald E. Walker Scholarship has been established by his colleagues and administered by the NMSU Development Fund Corporation. Contributions to the scholarship may be sent to the Development Office, McClain Hall 106. In addition, the chemistry faculty has renamed the University's Outstanding Senior in Chemistry Award the Donald E. Walker Award for the Outstanding Senior in Chemistry.

Northeast Surpasses Million Dollar Mark

With the strong support of its alumni, friends, and parents of the University, Northeast Missouri State University's advancement efforts surpassed the \$1 million mark this year.

"Achieving the \$1 million mark is an important milestone in that it shows that individuals and corporations recognize the importance of private giving to a public institution," said Larry Rutledge, Northeast Board of Governors president.

"This is exciting for a University that has received continuous national recognition for being innovative in education," said President Russell G. Warren. "We are so fortunate to have individuals and corporations who believe so strongly in what we are accomplishing at Northeast that they are willing to commit their dollars."

The \$1,047,444 total represents a 65 percent increase over the previous year. It also represents a 78 percent increase over the total from two years ago. Of the money raised, 85 percent came from individuals and 15 percent from corporations.

According to Rutledge, this banner year has enabled the University to begin several new programs and scholarships.

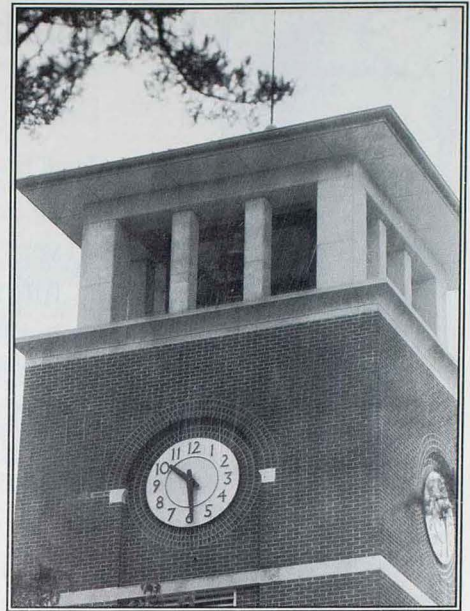
"We had nearly \$360,000 donated by individuals to establish new scholarship opportunities for Northeast students. We also were able to provide 20 grants to faculty members in support of our emphasis on active learning," said Rutledge.

The active learning grants were made possible by a gift from Robert S. Jepson, Jr., and his wife Alice. The Jepsons' gift of \$500,000 over five years will support active learning initiatives on campus and create a presidential incentive fund to support special active learning projects.

Just this year, 20 Northeast faculty members were each awarded a \$4,000 grant to pursue active learning teaching methods inside and outside the classroom.

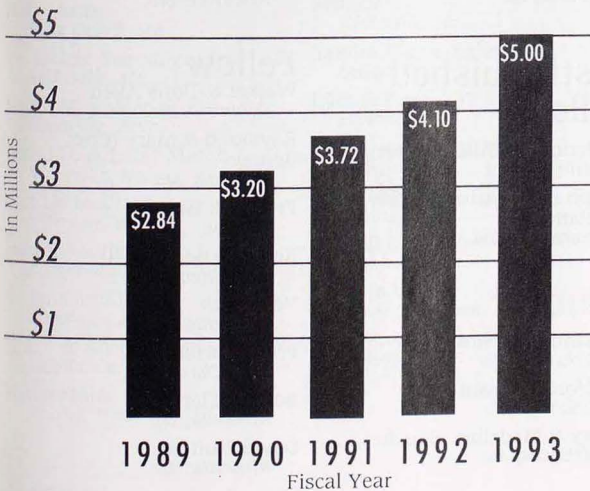
The University also received the generous and unique gift from Dr. Ruth Warner Towne of four bronze bells and a carillon which enabled the University to turn the newly completed clock tower at Pickler Memorial Library into a true campanile. Towne, who has taught history at Northeast since 1952, dedicated the gift in memory of her parents, Frank Warner Towne and Mary E. Towne, whom she credits as the most important teachers she ever had.

"We have had a terrific year in our fund-raising efforts, but it is so important to note that we do have needs relating directly to the implementation of our University planning document, *A Higher Order of Excellence*. Some of the initiatives in this document won't require additional funding, but several will. I am confident that our wonderful supporters will continue to respond as they have this past year, and we will have the opportunity to continue providing the highest quality education available," said Warren.



Development Fund Endowment

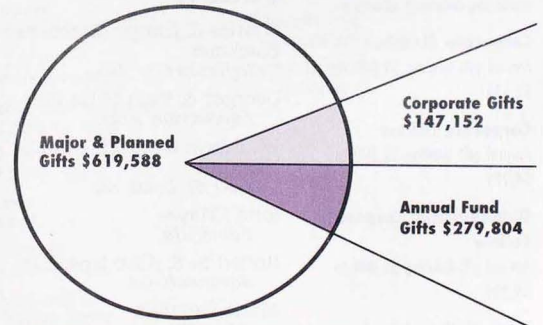
Five-Year Growth (Actual Value)

W. Edwin (Ed) Hartford ('38) recently increased his bequest to establish the W. Edwin Hartford and Hazel Kuhn Hartford Memorial Scholarship fund to the \$200,000 mark. Ed and **Hazel Lee (Kuhn) Hartford ('37)** had previously made an agreement during April 1990 with NMSU for the establishment of the fund and its administration at the \$100,000 level.

There are two reasons Ed increased the bequest. First, following Hazel's death in February 1992, Ed asked NMSU for an estimate of the income from the fund that would be available for disbursement yearly for the scholarships, keeping in mind that eight students (four boys and four girls) would receive the assistance each year. Following this review, Ed took action to increase the bequest to \$200,000 in order to increase the financial assistance to the students.

The second reason for the increase was, "I couldn't think of a better way of spending the money," he said. "Hazel and I had no children and we had previously decided that an investment of this type would help some north-east Missouri high school graduates attend the University for four years that might not otherwise have the opportunity. There really isn't any big philosophical thing about it. It will just be an investment in students that otherwise would not have had a chance."

The Hartfords are both graduates of northeast Missouri high schools—Ed from Kirksville High School and Hazel from LaPlata High School. As a result, they specified that the scholarships be available to high school graduates from counties in northeast Missouri.

While at Northeast, Ed majored in math and Hazel majored in both social studies and physical education.

Hazel started her teaching career in the fall of 1937 at the high school and junior college in Bloomfield, Iowa. In the spring of 1939, Hazel and Ed were married, at which time Hazel gave up her position for the following year to be with her husband at Sikeston, Missouri, where Ed was principal of the Sikeston South Grade School.

World War II brought changes to the Hartfords' lives. Ed entered the Navy and was trained as a Navy air navigator at the PanAm School of Navigation and Aerology. During WW II, Hazel taught in the public schools of Corpus Christi, Texas, while Ed was assigned as an air navigator to the nearby Naval Air Station.

Following WW II, the Hartfords returned to the St. Louis area where Hazel taught in the public schools of O'Fallon, Illinois and Ed taught in the technical school at nearby Scott Air Force Base. In 1948, they moved to Normandy, Missouri, where Hazel taught in the Normandy Public Schools for nineteen and a half years.

By the time Hazel retired from teaching in 1968, she had been certified to teach in four different states—Iowa, Illinois, Missouri and Texas. Except for the state of Iowa, this was all due to her travels to be with her husband.

Following Hazel's retirement, they moved to Lake St. Louis, Mo., where she was active with organizations for the humane treatment of animals.

Ed continued to work with the military through the years and retired in 1975 from the Army Aviation Material Command after having served as the Command's Program Manager for special classified projects. Ed also retired as a Commander in the U.S. Naval Reserve.



Hazel L. Kuhn Hartford ('37) died Feb. 16, 1992, at the Barnes Extended Care Center in Clayton, Mo., where she had been a resident for only six days. She started her teaching career in the fall of 1937 in Bloomfield, Iowa. In 1939, she married **W. Edwin Hartford ('38)** who survives. During World War II, she taught in Corpus Christi, Texas. Following the war, she returned with her husband to the St. Louis area where she taught in O'Fallon, Ill. In 1948, she moved to the Normandy Public School System where she taught for over 19 years. After retiring, she and her husband moved to Lake St. Louis, Mo., where she was active in organizations for the humane treatment of animals. Hartford was a member of the Missouri State Teachers Association and the Retired Teachers Association of Missouri.

Gifts for Students

Alma Kotez ('35) wanted to make sure future students at Northeast would have fewer struggles financing their college educations than she did. It is because of her kindness and desire to help other students that she left more than \$190,000 to the University in her will.

Mrs. Kotez's gift has been used to establish the Alma L. Kotez Scholarship, which is dedicated to helping those students enrolled in business courses at Northeast.

Mrs. Kotez was born Sept. 18, 1912 in Marceline, Mo. to Thomas Harvey and Emma Jane (McCready) Staats. Life was not easy for the Staats. Alma's father was a grocer in Marceline, a job that never allowed them the luxury of buying a car. Her younger brother never fully recovered from injuries he suffered in World War II and died in a Chicago Navy hospital a few years before Mrs. Kotez passed away.

Mrs. Kotez worked as a waitress in Kirksville in order to pay for her college education and helped out in her father's Marceline grocery store during the summers. After earning her teaching degree, she taught commerce at Canton, Mo., until 1938 when she moved to Sac City, Iowa to continue her teaching career. After that, she taught in Illinois for a few years at East Moline High School before ending up at Moline Senior High School teaching typing and shorthand until the early 1980s.

"Teaching was her love," said John Kotez, her stepson. This is clearly demonstrated by the years she devoted to educating young people.

Kathy Curry, a fellow teacher at Moline and good friend of Mrs. Kotez, said the death of Mrs. Kotez's husband, John, in 1967 was a real test of her will. It was a tremendous strain on her because her husband had done all the driving and handling of their investments.

"When her husband passed away, Alma took driving lessons and bought a new car—another proof of her strong will," Curry said. "When she had to take over the decision-making of her husband's investments, she was very capable of doing so. Alma had a keen business mind.

"When Alma died Jan. 2, 1991, we hadn't gotten together for our Christmas dinner and gift exchange yet, although the upcoming date was on my calendar," Curry said. "My one last Christmas gift, sitting there in bright wrappings, was still waiting to be opened."

Mrs. Kotez's gift is especially appreciated by the first group of nine students to be awarded \$1,100 each from the fund. These students were Michael Catlett, Kirksville, Mo.; Phillip Gnolfo, Downers Grove, Ill.; Jason Goethe, Harrisonville, Mo.; Jayne Hayton, Bellevue, Neb.; Veronica Jacquin, Kirksville, Mo.; Jody Parker, Malcolm, Iowa; Nicole Sheets, Manchester, Mo.; Maureen Slaughter, Queen City, Mo.; and Heather Wilde, Hamilton, Ill.

Helping Hand

Education is an issue about which **James ('26)** and Helen **Heffern** always felt strongly. They spent much of their lives teaching others. Their bequest of more than \$133,000 to Northeast will allow their commitment to education to be carried on and assure students that financial barriers will not keep them from learning.

Before beginning his thriving career in dentistry, James Heffern graduated from high school in Columbia, Mo., and from Northeast (then Northeast Missouri State Teachers College) in

1926 with a triple major in biology, chemistry and health. He went on to teach physical sciences in Barry High School in Illinois for three years, and then he entered the University of Missouri School of Dentistry in Kansas City, Mo., where he received the Doctor of Dental Surgery degree with concentration studies in basic biological sciences.

Dr. Heffern held a private dental practice in Columbia, Mo., until he was called to serve in the military in 1942. By the time of his discharge, he had been promoted to captain in the Army Dental Corps.

James Heffern and Helen Gillis (Garvey) Heffern were married in 1943. At the time of their marriage, Mrs. Heffern was teaching at Stephens College in Columbia, Mo. She had received her bachelor's degree from the University of Kansas in Lawrence, Kan. and her master's degree from Columbia University in New York, N.Y.

In 1953, Dr. Heffern switched to a teaching career at the University of Iowa School of Dentistry in Iowa City, Iowa. He later taught at Creighton University in Omaha, Neb. and was a visiting professor of biology at Milliken University in Decatur, Ill. He then went on to found the biology/zoology department at the new Methodist College in Fayetteville, N.C. and taught zoology there along with his wife until their retirement in 1971.

James and Helen Heffern's commitment to education will continue through the many Northeast students who will benefit from the loan fund made possible by their bequest.

Regional Scholarship

Opportunities Abroad

Donna Crawford shared her gift for teaching as an assistant professor of French at Northeast from 1967 until her death in 1982. At that time, a memorial fund was established in her honor.

Donna's mother, Elsie Smith, passed away Oct. 9, 1991. In her estate, she graciously provided for Northeast's foreign language program by bequeathing more than \$21,000 to the Donna Crawford Memorial Scholarship, bringing her total contribution to the University over the years to nearly \$24,000.

In keeping with her daughter's wishes, Mrs. Smith's gift ensures that Northeast students will be able to enjoy and learn from the experience of studying abroad. The scholarship, including the recent addition, will provide for half of the expense to a French major for one year to study abroad. Previously the scholarship was only able to provide for an annual award of about \$500.

Crawford had spent her life helping others learn French. She made preliminary plans in her will for the scholarship that now bears her name and coordinated a program that brought French students to Northeast for their graduate studies that continued after her death. She was a member of the American Association of Teachers of French and the Foreign Language Association of Missouri. Her dedication to teaching was illustrated when she continued to teach full-time until three weeks before her death.

According to Donna's husband, Don Crawford, she was a teacher who took her job as an educator very seriously.

"I would say she single-handedly started the value-added system of learning," Mr. Crawford said. "She was tough. If she didn't think a student had done the work necessary to pass a class, she had no problems with having them retake it. I should know; she almost failed me when I took her class."

Those who have been awarded this scholarship over the years have been grateful to Mrs. Smith and Donald Crawford, Donna's husband, for establishing this scholarship. Through this assistance, they have been able to further Donna Crawford's vision of nations, especially France and America, sharing languages and cultures.

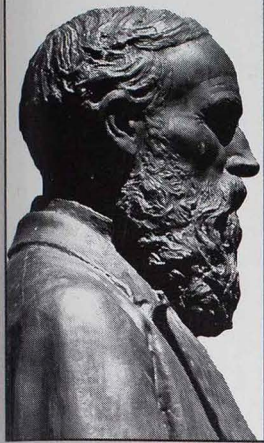

To be eligible for membership in the Joseph Baldwin Society, written verification or documentation for each planned gift is required.

Planned Giving and the John R. Kirk Society

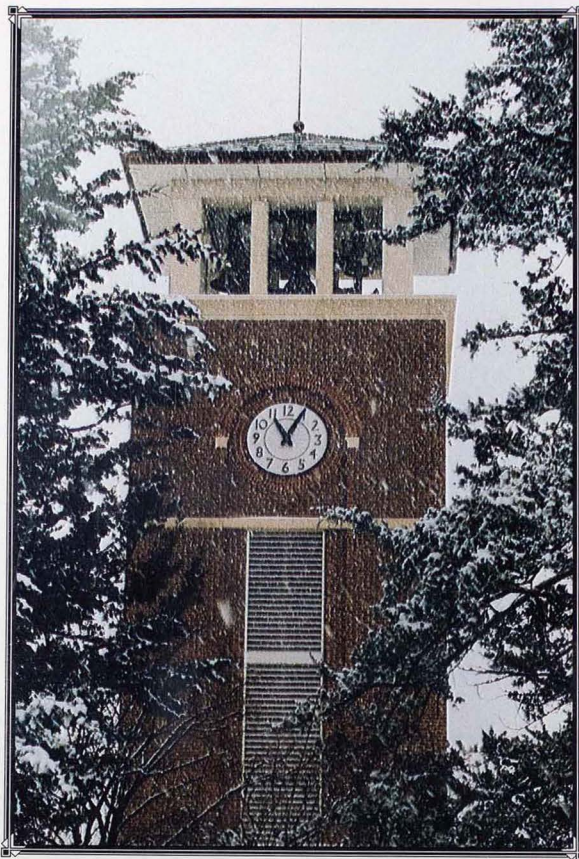
