In classrooms, in residence halls, in University offices—active learning is taking place at Northeast Missouri State University. Active learning is not a new concept. In fact, Northeast has used active learning techniques for many years. What is unique at Northeast is how active learning is permeating the entire culture of the University and incorporating those principles in every dimension of University life.

Following, President Russell G. Warren and Vice President for Academic Affairs Jack Magruder answer questions about active learning.

***What motivates Northeast to commit itself to creating an active learning culture?***

**Russell Warren:** Individual faculty members and disciplines have practiced active learning for centuries, but I do not know of any liberal arts and sciences university in the country that has identified active learning as the focus of its culture. We have. We are committed to active learning because we believe that there are many skills and attitudes that can only be learned by students doing things. In short, we believe that optimal learning occurs when students are actively involved. For example, students cannot further develop their interpersonal skills except by having interpersonal interaction of some kind, and one cannot simply read about playing the oboe and then go out and perform with the Saint Louis Symphony.

A university community is a wonderful laboratory for teaching and learning. We want everyone here to teach, including staff and fellow students. We're all going to be engaged in new teaching techniques.

***How will Northeast create an active learning culture?***

**RW:** By involving every member of the University community: faculty, staff and students. To be sure, our faculty will still be our primary teachers, but we believe our gardeners can help students learn about plants and trees, and our financial aid staff can help students learn about budgeting and

financing. We believe, for example, that if a student has a problem in the residence halls, that he or she can get that problem solved while also learning something about the residence hall operation.

**Jack Magruder:** We're talking about involvement, about students really being engaged by the faculty, by other students, and by the staff. We're talking about situations where students are critically involved in the teaching-learning process. Teaching will involve methods that are most appropriate for the subject matter, whether they be laboratory investigation, class discussion, case study, debate, undergraduate research, or study-abroad experience.

There are many exciting examples of active learning at Northeast. I've seen, for instance, Dr. Rodney Taylor (assistant professor of German) take his class on a campus field trip and describe in German what he sees. He then has his students report back to him in German what they see. Students are excited and engaged and they can't hide there's no back row in that kind of class.

**RW:** There is also a technological component to active learning that can enhance the learning process. There are, for example, sophisticated interactive video discs used with computers that simulate case studies in areas ranging from nursing to counseling to business. Students can use this technology outside the classroom to learn not only subject matter material, but also time management and organizational skills, critical thinking

Active learning is the result of processes or procedures that cause the minds of the students to become actively engaged in the learning task. Active learning involves the mind—not just the memory—and will provide a learning environment that causes faculty and students to collaborate in the acquisition of knowledge in an engaged, energizing manner. Active learning promotes quality of understanding as well as quantity of information.

and problem solving skills, and to become more responsible for their own learning. They can take risks in a supportive environment and learn the consequences of their choices immediately.

**JM:** Our Faculty Development Committee has been working to support faculty in active learning efforts by providing information about some of the wonderful active learning techniques that are already being used on campus and elsewhere. A tremendous number of our faculty participated in the Active Learning Workshop this spring, and many more are involved in an ongoing faculty discussion series. Also, in early April, we hosted a distinguished group of business and higher education leaders on campus for two days of meetings with our faculty, staff, and students, focused on ways we can more fully create an active learning culture at Northeast.

## ***What research has been done concerning active learning?***

**JM:** Academic achievement and active learning are not competitive objectives—they are complimentary goals. Our desire to create an active learning culture at Northeast is based upon research that shows how powerful active learning is in attaining the kinds of higher order student outcomes we desire. In short, research studies show that active learning methods are comparable to lectures in promoting knowledge of specific subject matter, but they are superior to lectures in developing higher order skills like critical thinking, problem solving, oral and written communication, interpersonal skills, and leadership.

## ***How will students benefit from an active learning environment?***

**RW:** Active learning stresses that students can learn facts on their own, and we can therefore free up classroom time to help students master more complex subject matter and to develop higher order skills and attitudes.

If you look at studies that ask, “What skills, attitudes and knowledge are important

to success—not just career success, but all success?”, the great majority of the answers describe behavior like working cooperatively with others, accepting responsibility, being committed, and having a good self-image. Active learning reinforces these behaviors and many more positive traits.

Active learning teaches students how to teach themselves. This fact is critical, because for most of their lives they won't have a teacher other than themselves. We want our students to learn how to learn in ways that will cause them to continue those activities throughout their lifetimes.



While they are at Northeast, students will see they are growing in ways that are relevant to their success. They'll know that their speaking, writing and interpersonal skills are getting better, and that these skills will make them better persons.

**JM:** Among many things, active learning helps a student face new problems and situations with more confidence. When it's done appropriately, it reduces fear in classrooms and encourages individuals to take risks, realizing that occasional failures are normal. It builds confidence and competence.

Active learning also builds interpersonal skills and prepares our students to be effective team members. At Northeast and in their later lives, they're going to be working on teams, presenting their ideas and discussing them, and interacting with new technologies. Active learning will increase all opportunities for participation. And I believe that this participation ultimately will result in an increase in satisfaction and a more cooperative spirit among all of us. We're going to learn that it's OK to cooperate, and it's OK to help one another succeed. That's a little different story than when we do things so independently. Active learning promotes a cooperative effort for everybody's good and results in enhanced individual student achievement.

## ***What challenges are involved in establishing an active learning culture?***

**RW:** The challenge we currently face is to communicate to faculty and students that

## Northeast Practices Seven Principles

How can students and faculty improve undergraduate education? An answer to that question has been supplied by Arthur Chickering and Zelda Gamson in their *Seven Principles for Good Practice in Undergraduate Education*. The Seven Principles were compiled in a study supported by the American Association of Higher Education, the Education Commission of the States, and The Johnson Foundation.

The Seven Principles have been accepted by higher education institutions as guidelines for students, faculty and staff to improve teaching and learning. In Northeast's long-range planning document, *A Higher Order of Excellence*, the University has committed itself to exemplifying the Seven Principles.

1. Good practice encourages student-faculty contact.
2. Good practice encourages cooperation among students.
3. **Good practice encourages active learning.**
4. Good practice encourages prompt feedback.
5. Good practice emphasizes time on task.
6. Good practice communicates high expectations.
7. Good practice respects diverse talents and ways of learning.

### 3. ... Encourages Active Learning

As Chickering and Gamson write about students and active learning: "Learning is not a spectator sport. They must talk about what they are learning, write about it, relate it to past experiences, and apply it to their daily lives. They must make what they learn part of themselves."

there is not one magical way to promote active learning. Active learning is far more individualized than the lecture method, and each faculty member will have to explore the methods that best work for him or her. The answer may differ depending on what each faculty member is teaching. That's one of the reasons that we are so happy to have the generous grant from the Robert S. and Alice A. Jepson Foundation. (See related story page 5.)

A second challenge we face is to communicate to students that they're going to have to evaluate faculty in a new way—that the brilliant, entertaining lecture will not be the only style that they encounter in their classes. They're going to see more faculty members working as classroom managers or leaders. Many of our students may be used to lectures from K-12, and hence may not be comfortable with active learning techniques. We have to help students get accustomed to looking for something different and to becoming more engaged in their learning. We have to show them that the payoff is increased for their whole life.



Also, we need to help our students be part of this transition. Our goal is for students and faculty to work together, in a mutually supportive way as we try these new methods.

The biggest challenge we face is that there are many of us who are pretty good at lecturing, and it's hard for us to leave that mode. We may have gotten good student evaluations each year, and to let go of the lecture and try something else where we don't know how well we will do, where the outcome isn't as predictable, can be scary. That's a major challenge we all face.

#### **How will Northeast measure the effectiveness of Active Learning?**

**JM:** It's going to be difficult because most standardized tests don't easily measure one's interpersonal skills or leadership skills, or one's ability to take risks or accept responsibility. Therefore, in many instances, we will need to develop measures ourselves.

Dr. Dennis Peacock, our new Director of Assessment and Testing, will work closely with our faculty to develop these measures. We will probably find that the measures will be less standardized and will rely more on student portfolios, self-assessment, interviews, techniques used in evaluations of internships, the types of evaluations that artists and musicians utilize, and longitudinal studies based on surveys of our graduates, concerning their satisfaction with the experiences they had at Northeast.

#### **What will happen to Northeast's current testing program?**

**RW:** We will continue to use our current assessment techniques, while building an even stronger assessment system for the future. Our long-range plan, *A Higher Order of Excellence*, is a higher order of excellence not a different order. We need to keep building. This institution, as great as it is, will lose in a relative sense if it rests on its laurels. Many universities now are emulating our approach to liberal arts and assessment. If we sit here for five years, we could be behind the pack. We've got to keep using our tradition of innovation to continue to improve.

#### **How will Northeast support active learning?**

**RW:** There are several ways we can assist. When a faculty member is trying something new, we should show a lot of latitude in how we evaluate that faculty member and we should allow experiments to fail without penalizing the faculty who are trying them. We need to share the risk with the faculty.

An attitude of support is important and so is money. The Jepson gift will allow us to make competitive grants of \$4,000 each to 20 professors a year for the next five years. Those grants will allow faculty to develop specific active learning strategies for their classes and to share what they have learned with their colleagues.

In addition to the Jepson gift, we are going to try to raise two and a half million dollars to help faculty and staff implement an active learning culture. We will seek funding from public and private foundations. We will also be reaching out to alumni for some financial assistance, and we will undertake a faculty and staff campaign.

Northeast has an excellent faculty already, one that many schools would envy. Our faculty are dedicated, hard-working professionals who care about their disciplines and about their students. Our efforts in active learning will build on those strengths and help Northeast maintain its reputation for innovation and accountability.

# Fund Supports Active Learning Initiatives: First Jepson Fellows Named

**T**he Jepson Fellows will form the nucleus of the Center for Teaching of Liberal Learning, . . . developing active learning culture on campus and the foundation for the exchange of information about effective active learning techniques.

President Russell G. Warren announced in January 1993 the first recipients of the Robert S. and Alice A. Jepson Fellowships for Active Learning Initiatives. The 20 Northeast faculty members will each be awarded a \$4,000 grant to support a variety of active learning initiatives.

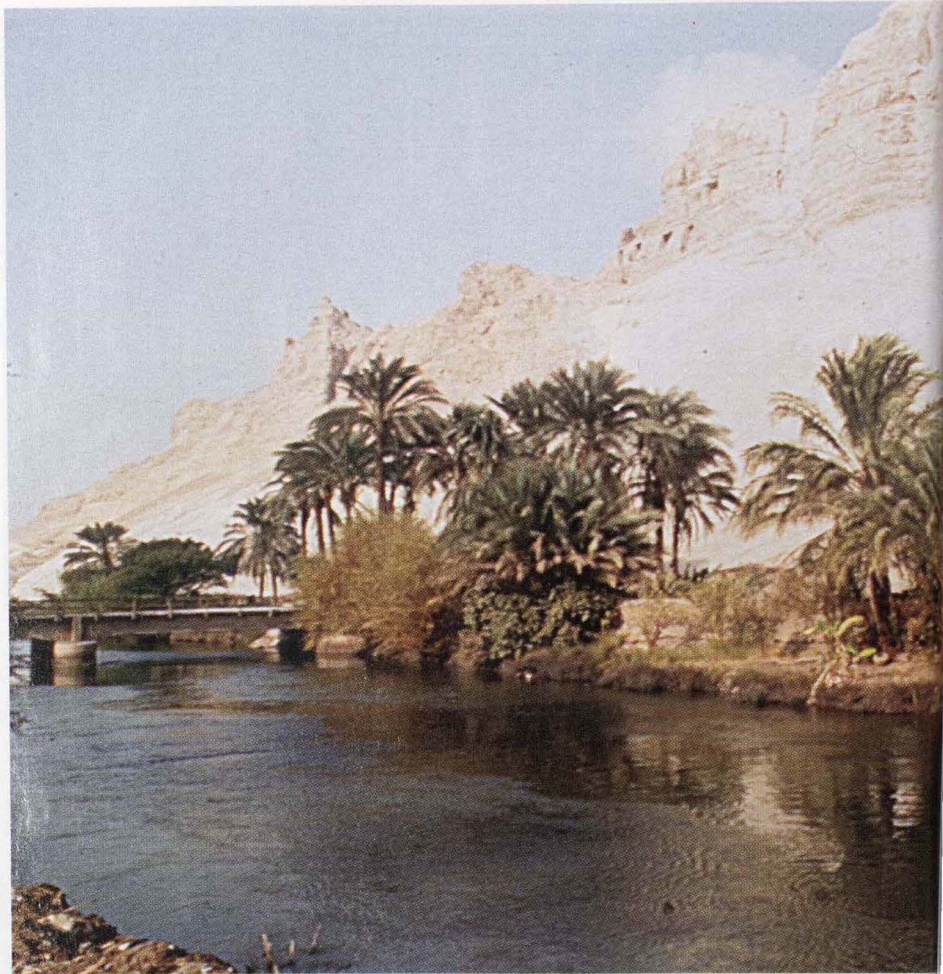
The Jepson Fellowship program was established in October 1992 through a \$500,000 gift from Georgia businessman Robert S. Jepson Jr. and his wife, Alice A. Jepson. The funds will support active learning initiatives over a five-year period, particularly in the areas of classroom and co-curricular learning.

The Jepson Fellows will form the nucleus of the Center for Teaching of Liberal Learning, a program goal articulated in the University's long-range planning document, *A Higher Order of Excellence*. The work of the Fellows will form the basis of a developing active learning culture on campus and the foundation for the exchange of information about effective active learning techniques.

During summer 1993, the Jepson Fellows will plan their active learning strategies for the upcoming academic year and will meet to discuss progress and challenges. Their initiatives will emphasize direct participation in learning and will focus on critical thinking, decision making, and programs intended to broaden student perspective beyond the classroom.

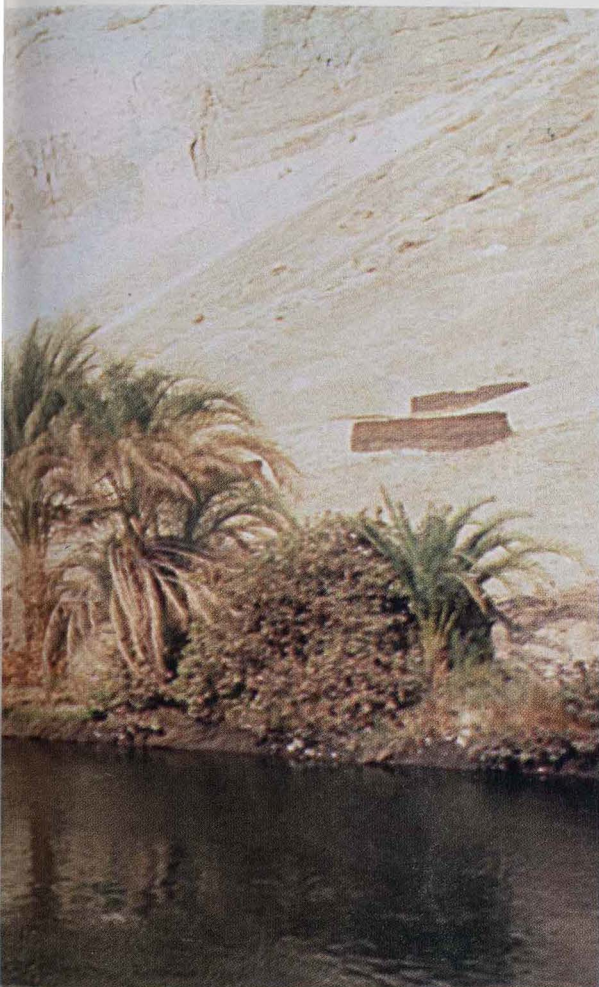

Most of Egypt is not as well-known, and I spent Christmas 1991 as the co-director of an archaeological expedition whose purpose was the study of one of these lesser-known areas. My trip, with a plane ticket courtesy of the NMSU Development Fund<sup>1</sup>, was to participate in the Egypt Exploration Society Gebel el-Haridi Project (a "gebel" is an area of cliffs rather like a mesa).*



# ERS OF THE NILE

An archaeologist is often asked “How do you know where to dig?” In Egypt this is not a problem, as the inhabited area of the country is limited to a narrow band along either side of the Nile, just as it has been throughout Egyptian history. Anywhere you look in Egypt are the remains of ancient times. The Gebel el-Haridi is particularly interesting because nineteenth century travellers recommended visiting the site for its dramatic remains, including Graeco/Roman quarries, tombs of the Old and New Kingdoms, a Roman statue, and Coptic (Egyptian Christian) buildings. Since the nineteenth century, however, the area has dropped out of the travel guides, and no archaeologists had ever methodically investigated the area.

The necessity of recording the archaeological remains in the area of the Gebel el-Haridi has become pressing in the last several years. The Egyptian Antiquities Organization stopped modern quarrying on the site only six years ago, but much was destroyed before the ban went into effect. Recent visitors to the area have also reported extensive clandestine excavation and looting has become a problem, as the price of antiquities has risen on the world market. In addition, environmental factors have speeded the disappearance of ancient remains in Egypt. The increase in humidity and the rising water table, due to the construction of the Aswan High Dam, as well as the dramatic increases in airborne pollution, have contributed to the rapid deterioration of the archaeological remains here as elsewhere in Egypt.

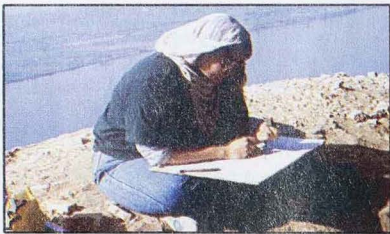
The Egyptian Antiquities Organization granted us a concession to survey, map, and study the pottery of the Gebel el-Haridi from the edge of the cultivation back to the cliffs along a 10-kilometer stretch. This large an area was impossible to cover in the three short weeks we spent in Egypt, so we spent much of the season walking the cliffs in several areas, identifying some which seemed to have well-preserved and interesting remains, both pharaonic and Coptic. The place we selected for the most intensive study was on the cliffs above the small hamlet of Abul Nasr where in a small area there were quarries, tombs, and the mud-brick walls of domestic buildings.

The Gebel slope at Abul Nasr runs steeply up from a canal at its foot to some 400 feet above the Nile, at which point the cliffs become vertical and tower another 400 feet directly above the lower slope. The view from the base of the upper cliffs is incredible. On a clear day you can see 10-15 miles to the north and south and across the Nile to desert cliffs some 10 miles away. In antiquity this view was one of the most attractive features of the whole site. The cliffs here provided the border between two provinces of pharaonic Egypt and a huge mud-brick platform at the base of the upper cliffs indicates that it may have served as a guard post during the Roman Period as well.

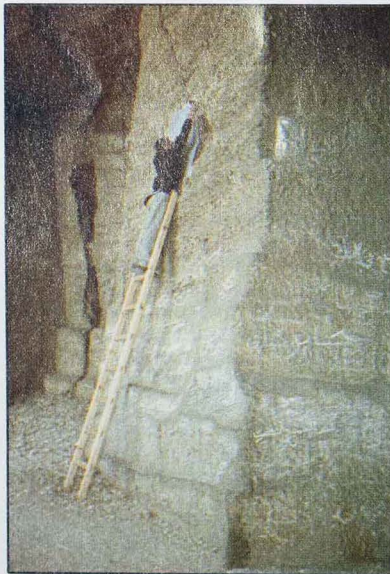
Here, as elsewhere in the concession, quarries were the most visible feature of the cliffs from the river. The

quarries cut at the top of the slope of Abul Nasr all are dated by royal inscriptions to the Ptolemaic Period, when Egypt was ruled by Greek pharaohs (304 - 30 B.C.). One of the major goals of the project was to record surface remains before they disintegrate, and we traced several royal inscriptions which had not been previously copied.

In addition to these large quarries, many of the tombs had been used as a source of stone and are in rather poor condition. We were able to identify a series of tombs which date to the end of the Old Kingdom (sometime between 2250 and 2000 B.C.). The best-preserved exterior among the tombs has life-size figures cut in the walls and in front of one is



(above) Orel studies pottery samples on site. She is an assistant professor of art at Northeast. (below) Exploring sometimes requires the archeologist to aspire to great heights.



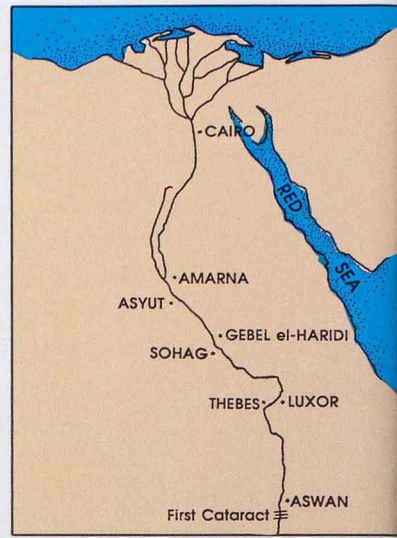
an inscription identifying him as a priest. The interior of this tomb is badly quarried so any tomb paintings once there are now lost. However we hope that the unquarried side-chambers, which are still partially filled with large blocking stones, may have some of the original grave goods still in them. These two chambers were not entered this season because of their large bat population.

Because of the restrictions in our permit from the Egyptian Antiquities Organization, we were not allowed to do any excavation on the site. The one artifact we did pick up from the surface was a copper coin from the interior of this Old Kingdom tomb. It has the portrait of a Ptolemaic king on one side and probably dates to the period when the tomb was quarried.

One of the other tombs nearby has very fragmentary remains of painted scenes of pharaonic date. We spent much of the season recording these scenes, examples of the typical "daily life" scenes of bird-catching and fishing, which were painted in tombs of the upper classes from the Old Kingdom onward in order to insure that the deceased would be fed and clothed and have a chance for recreation in the afterlife. The ceiling of this tomb is painted with stars.

Our day started with breakfast around 7 a.m.. We left for the site by 8 a.m., and started work between 8:30 and 9. Lunches were short, at most half an hour, and over bread, cheese, tuna, and tomatoes we talked over the morning's activities and rearranged duties in order to accomplish as much as possible in the short season. My primary duty on the project was the study of pottery, an essential part of any study in Egypt because pottery can provide information not only on the date of the occupation, but also about what sort of activity was going on there. Others helped draw the pottery, copy inscriptions, make a topographic map of the cliff above Abul Nasr and also draw plans of the tombs and quarries we found. We had only five people on site and everyone did a variety of jobs.

We returned to our hotel in Sohag late every afternoon and ate dinner around 7 p.m.. The Egyptian government allows a project to work six days a week, so on the seventh day

(Fridays) we visited the known Coptic sites in the area. Particularly interesting were the Red and White Monasteries, where Coptic Christianity began. Our trip was in part to do some research, because we knew much of the material on the site is Coptic, but both are interesting buildings in their own right, filled with fading frescoes and reused blocks from pharaonic monuments.

We do not yet know all of what we will find at the Gebel el-Haridi. We have actually walked over only a portion of the concession and even the small area that we studied intensively has posed more questions than it answered in the short time we were there. We are making plans to return to the site and do more surveying at Abul Nasr as well as look at more of the concession. The northern part of the Gebel el-Haridi, according to the head of the Egyptian Antiquities Organization in Asyut, has some nice Old Kingdom tombs. Our concession should be even more productive in the years to come.

# Translation: An American Poet in Paris

To be in Paris is enough, but it is even more special to be there to perform your work. Along with a number of other poet-translators, I was invited to give a reading of some of my poems on November 4, 1991, in the crypt of La Madeleine, a church that traces its origin back to the 13th century. I have read my work in some strange places during my career, but never before had I been scheduled for a crypt. I looked forward to the reading with some anticipation, imagining everything from a grandiose setting (such as the crypt of the Pantheon where the sarcophagi of Voltaire and Rousseau are in full view) to a dank wine cellar or the catacombs where one might view the bones of Jean Valjean for a modest fee.

The poetry reading was a spinoff from the 13th Annual Anglo-Français Festival de Poésie, directed by Jacques Rancourt and held in the spring of 1990 (June 6-9), to which I was an invited participant. What happened prior to the Festival and also during the conference was a mutual translation of poems. English speaking poets translated French speaking poets and vice versa. Between classes and on free days at Northeast Missouri State University during the winter of 1989-90, I spent several weeks translating from six to eight poems for each of several French poets who were to participate in the Festival. I translated poems by Max Alhau (France), Daniel Biga (France), Fulvio Caccia (Canada), Nina Cassian (Romania), William Cliff (Belgium), Héléne Dorion (Canada), Hughes Labrusse (France), and Claire-Sara Roux (France).

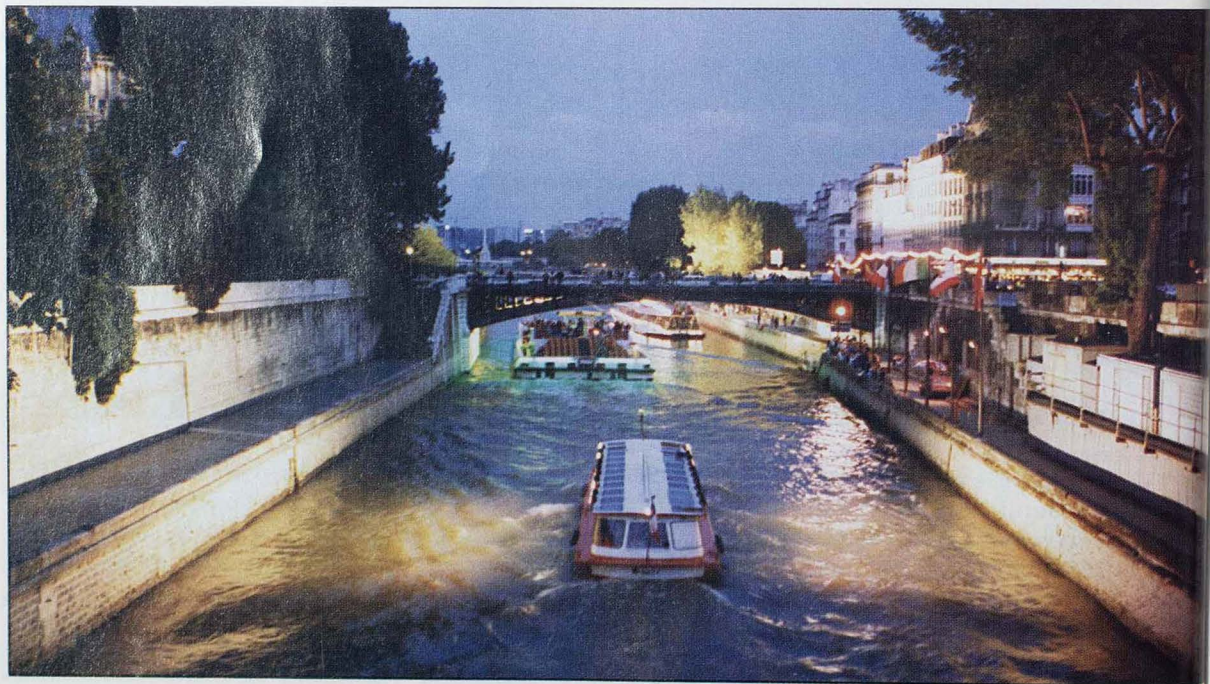
The Festival de Poésie turned out to be a true international workshop devoted to an exchange of ideas, to the best translation possible of a number of poets whose work is known beyond the borders of their own countries.

**All the talk I have heard about liberal education and all the media coverage NMSU has had over the past few years remained vague to me, . . . until I was fortunate enough to participate in the international conferences. . . . We are lost without change, lost without a global view.**

Besides those poets whose work I was translating, also present were other notable poets with international reputations—Hilary Davies (United Kingdom), John Deane (Ireland), Lorand Gaspar (France), Erin Mouré (United Kingdom), Peter Riley (United Kingdom), Jacques Rancourt (France), Leslie Ullman (United States), and C. K. Williams (United States). The beauty of such a festival as this was that you were face to face with the poets whose work you were translating, and at the same time you were face to face with the poets who were translating your work.

In addition to the writers at work at the Festival, a number of other writers stopped by to talk about translating in general or to offer advice. Jean Migrene, who has translated the poetry of Henry Taylor (a Pulitzer Prize winner a few years ago) and Richard Wilbur (a recent U.S. poet laureate), graciously worked with the group for three days. I had first met Jean in Grenoble in November of 1989 where we both were participating in a similar festival devoted to poetry and translation. He is presently translating my work into French. Also stopping by one day was Charles Juliet, who is working with Louis Olivier (Illinois State University) to translate a group of my poems into French. Charles Juliet's novel *L'année de l'éveil* was the premier literary event in Paris in 1990. He has long been revered for his poetry and journals as well.

I cannot overestimate the importance of the years 1989 through 1990. I think the development of my work (poetry and fiction) will reflect the international influence in days to come. I am now at work on a volume of poems set in Europe, mainly Paris, and have already published one short story on a Paris theme ("In Père Lachaise," *The*

*North American Review*, September 1991). The spring of 1990 was doubly important to me. Not only did the Festival open up a literary door that had formerly remained closed, but also a Rockefeller Bellagio Study Center Residency gave me five uninterrupted weeks in northern Italy in which to translate from the French and German. Thus prior to the 1990 Festival, I had had an extended period in which to translate, to retranslate, to think, to rest.

I do not forget for a moment that behind all this literary activity Northeast Missouri State University stands as a bastion of support. Without its help, its willingness to nurture my art, I would not have gotten to participate in either the Festival or the Bellagio residency. It is gratifying to know that NMSU understands that state and national boundaries are meaningless anymore in terms of learning and culture. The day of regionalism and narrow-mindedness is past. I am sure that the future of universities, businesses, and individual careers lies in an international exchange of ideas more than anything else. That is why I feel language and language use are so very important these days, whether in poetry, literary translation, or daily speech.

The process of translation is always more than a mere exchange of words. The same thing may be said about *liberal arts and sciences education* in general, a term we are fond of using at Northeast. For at the heart of liberal education lies a mutual exchange of ideas, a student-teacher investigation of life's perplexities, a mutual search for Truth and Beauty and Virtue, the humanity within. Liberal education has nothing to do with mere transmission of facts. Liberal education is in a broad sense a translation of existing knowledge and a discovery of the new. Everything I have said in the last five sentences somehow describes what the 1990 Festival helped me realize. All the talk I have heard about liberal education and all the media coverage NMSU has had over the past few years remained vague to me, even vaporous, until I was fortunate enough to participate in the international conferences. It was then I began to understand the abstractions. Not only do we need constant innovation (a paradox we must endeavor to preserve) and an ever-flowing river of ideas from home and abroad, but also we absolutely must have them. We are lost without change, lost without a global view.

And now a year and a half after the 13th Annual Anglo-Francais Festival de Poésie, under a heavy Paris sky with a cold wind off the Seine, my wife and I, having been fortified by an *express* at the Café de Peny across the plaza, dutifully made our way to the crypt of La Madeleine. Although we were a few minutes early, I began to doubt we had found the right entrance, though the sign clearly read *crypt*. Several others joined us. Clearly someone was late: the door was still locked. Perhaps a half hour after the scheduled time, a kindly French matron appeared and led us around the church to the opposite side, where the reading, she explained, was to

be held in the room reserved for cultural events and they were waiting for us. When I asked why we were told the reading was to be in the crypt, she answered that they were sure we could find the crypt. Good French logic, of course: American writers can find their way to the chambers of the dead but not to cultural events. Let us hope that we can change this view.

The Festival de Poésie and the subsequent reading at La Madeleine are just two events that have helped convince me that if we do not place great emphasis on the arts in our schools we will, as educators and artists, be depriving our students of that one civilizing passion without which history is meaningless and the world is lost. The love of art is a civilizing passion. It was never the politician, the general, or the teacher who was the true nurturer of that thing we call civilization. The fostering parent of civilization is the artist. If we forget art, we are doomed to a very dull and deadly life.

I was quite pleased and honored to have been invited to return to Paris for such a special event. Just after the close of the 1990 Festival de Poésie, I had read at the Georges Pompidou National Center for Art and Culture. I was on the same Pompidou program as a poet from Cuba, one from Canada, and one other from Spain—and therefore knew beforehand the French love of cultural events, especially poetry readings. The importance of international cultural exchange is becoming more evident each day, and events such as the Festival de Poésie and the subsequent Madeleine gathering of poets do much to help us reach a wider audience and hopefully continue to proclaim the importance of the arts in all our lives. The importance lies in the transmission (translation) of ideas and the innovation that almost always comes with such a transmission, in the preservation of tradition, and in the establishing of new traditions. In the arts it is important, as it is in liberal education, to differentiate between what is fad and what is fabulous. What is fabulous is mythic, and myth as patterns of human existence is what we base our lives on. And poetry is the voice of myth.

## Rhodes Named to Board

In February 1988, Rhodes became the second woman president of the Hannibal Chamber of Commerce. Rhodes' other activities include the Hannibal Industrial Council, the Business and Professional Women's Club and PEO Chapter BR. She has served as the Marion County Port Authority commissioner, the Young Lawyers Section Council district representative and as secretary of the United Way Board and chairperson of its Professional Division. She has served on the Foresight Committee-Family Law Section for the Missouri

Council on Women's Economic Development and Job Training and on the Missouri State Senate Reapportionment Commission. Currently, she is a member of the Missouri Job Training Council.

## 1993 Board Officers Elected

◆ Northeast's Board of Governors elected officers for the 1993 calendar year at the Dec. 11 meeting held in Kansas City. Elected were: Larry Rutledge, president; **William North ('53)**, vice president; Thomas R. Shrout Jr., secretary.

Rutledge owns and operates a 2,000-acre farm near Monticello, Mo. He was appointed in 1986.

North is a trial attorney and a director and shareholder of Shugart, Thomson, and Kilroy, P.C., in the Kansas City area. North was appointed to the Board as an out-of-state member in 1990.

Shrout is the executive director of the St. Louis Citizens for Modern Transit. He was appointed in 1990.

## Commission to Study University Name

◆ Northeast's name has been a topic since the Missouri Legislature changed Northeast's mission from that of a regional university to that of the statewide liberal arts and sciences university in 1985.

Although Northeast is designated to serve the entire state of Missouri, there are many people across the state who do not fully understand this distinction and continue to put Northeast into the same category as the other regional universities.

A Commission to Study the University Name, which is comprised of Northeast alumni, students, faculty, staff, legislators and local community members, was appointed by President Russell Warren in January. The Commission's first meeting was held Feb. 19. At that

meeting the Commission's chair, **Gale Bartow ('49)**, former superintendent of the Blue Springs School District, gave the group its charge.

"We are not here today to decide or discuss what new name should be chosen. Instead we are here to determine if the name Northeast Missouri State University continues to represent the statewide mission of the University," Bartow said.

With this goal in mind, the Commission established subcommittees: alumni and local community relations, student and media relations, legislative and coordinating board relations and potential costs. These committees began the process of randomly surveying alumni, students (current and potential), faculty, staff, media, and local community leaders to determine their perceptions and feelings about the current name.

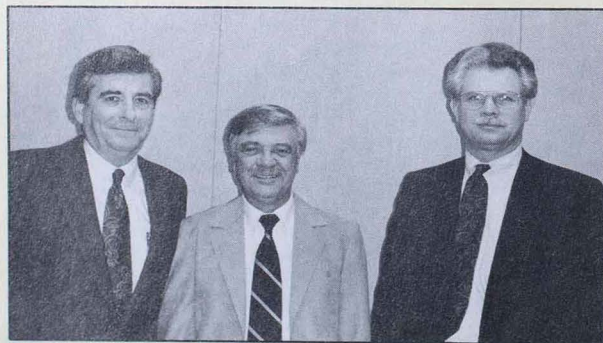
The Commission met again May 21 to review the data and discuss other information the Commission felt it needed before making a final decision. Each subcommittee will submit a written report with its conclusion to President Warren by late summer.

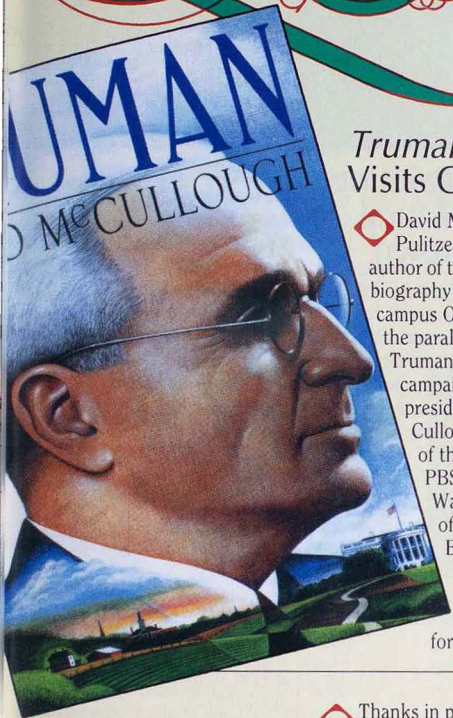

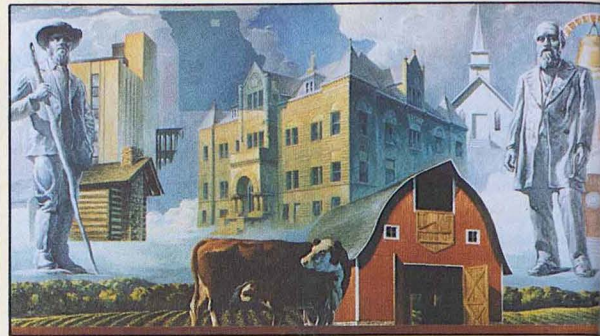
## MLK Remembered

Northeast's student literary magazine *Windfall* has captured the voice of students through a collection of their art, fiction and poetry since 1976.

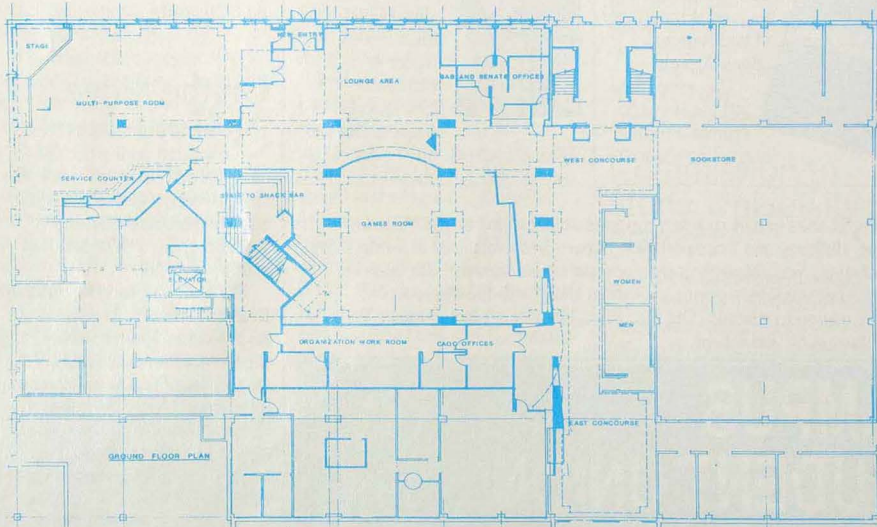

## **K**enneth L. Gardner Track Renovation Project

Shortly before Coach Kenneth L. Gardner died in February 1991, Northeast Missouri State University officials

shared with him their intention to rename the NMSU Track at Stokes Stadium in his honor.

Coach Gardner served the University through five decades as a student athlete, head track coach, assistant football and basketball coach, and as athletic director. His wife, the late Ethelyn Gardner, was affectionately called Mrs. G. by many former Bulldog athletes. Gardner, an outstanding teacher, motivator and mentor, retired in 1988 due to failing health.

Northeast is now in the midst of a long overdue effort to raise funds for the renovation and modernization of the Kenneth L. Gardner Track.

At least 18 years have passed since a competitive track meet was held at Northeast. The cinders and the field event areas have deteriorated. In spite of this, the Bulldog Track Program remains competitive in the MIAA by extensive road training and busing to alternate practice sites. However, many alumni are convinced that the image and reputation of Northeast, as well as the rich tradition of the athletic program, cries out for a modern, all-weather track to encircle the football field.

The entire University community will benefit from the Gardner Track. Lighted, evening hours will be reserved for non-competitive users. Wellness stations, including nutrition and exercise education, will be provided for all to gain a better understanding of lifetime conditioning skills and safety tips.

Northeast has provided a challenge gift of \$60,000 toward the \$180,000 goal for this project. We are now asking alumni and friends to respond to this challenge by pledging to give to the Kenneth L. Gardner Track Renovation Project. Donors of \$1,000 or more may take up to three years to fulfill their pledges.

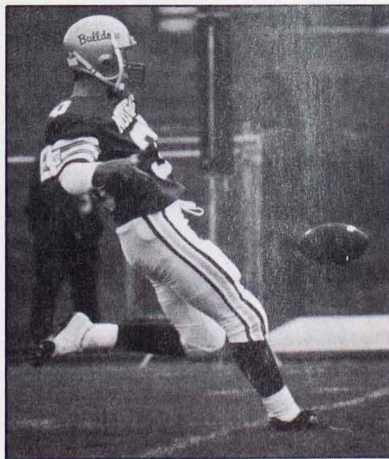
### **K** C. Conaway named to GTE Academic All-America First Team Bulldog senior punter K.C. Conaway



(Wellman, Iowa-Mid-Prairie) has been named to the 1992 GTE Academic All-America Football College Division First Team, chosen by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Conaway, who carried a cumulative 3.69 grade point average in accounting last fall, led the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association in punting with an average of 40.5 yards and was an all-MIAA first-team selection this past season.

During much of the 1992 campaign, he was ranked nationally among punters in NCAA



Division II. His team finished the season with a 9-3 overall record, a second-place finish in the conference and a Division II playoff berth.

Conaway was the Bulldog punter the past three years.

He is the first NMSU football player named by CoSIDA to the number one Academic All-America Team since linebacker Keith Driscoll was a recipient of the award in 1979.

Prior to making the GTE All-America Team, Conaway was named to the GTE All-District 7 first team, along with NMSU junior nose guard Mike Roos (Gladstone-Oak Park), who carried a cumulative GPA of 3.38 in business last fall.



### **N**esbitt takes Head Coaching

#### Job at Columbia Hickman

**Greg Nesbitt ('80)**, defensive coordinator for the Bulldog football team the past three seasons,

resigned in February to accept the position as head football coach at Hickman High School in Columbia.

Nesbitt will remain at NMSU through the end of June to fulfill teaching responsibilities.

Head coach Eric Holm replaced Nesbitt with Kirby Cannon, defensive secondary coach the past four years for the Bulldogs.

Holm made two more changes in his staff.

**Chuck Clemens ('88)**, a member of the NMSU offensive staff since 1989 and former Bulldog player, will be coaching the defensive inside linebackers, an area that Nesbitt handled as defensive coordinator.

**John Busby ('86)**, a volunteer coach last season for the Bulldogs, is a new full-time offensive assistant coach, working with wide receivers. Busby, who has been employed by the NMSU Public Safety Department, will relinquish those duties July 1. Busby was an all-conference wide receiver for NMSU in the early 1980s.

Regarding the loss of Nesbitt as NMSU defensive coordinator, Holm said, "Greg was my first great recruit, and one guy I wanted to bring with me when I was hired as head coach in 1990. He did a great job with the players, the

University community and in the community of Kirksville. However, he wanted to spend more time with his family, and I understand his desires."

"I'm pleased we were able to fill Nesbitt's position from within," Holm continued. "Kirby Cannon has experience as a defensive coordinator and will do a fine job. Chuck Clemens is a great motivator of players, and John Busby proved last season as a volunteer that he can do the job. He'll be a fine addition to our staff."

Nesbitt, an honorable mention all-conference running back during his Bulldog football career in the late 1970s, returned to the University in 1990 after six years as head football coach at Hannibal High School, where he received District Coach of the Year accolades three times.

His Hannibal teams compiled a 44-20 record, captured two North Central Missouri Conference championships and notched district titles in three consecutive playoff appearances.

"This was a very difficult decision for me," said Nesbitt. "My position (with the NMSU staff) has gone well, but I made the decision to take the job at Hickman after looking into the future and my long-range goals. I feel that I need to spend more time with my family than I can as a college coach. Right now, I'm gone from home between Aug. 1 and mid-February."

"Most of the NMSU defensive players will be back next season, so the 1993 defense should be solid."

received postseason honors.

Senior offensive tackle Matt McKnight (Perry, Iowa) was named to the Associated Press Little All-America second team and the *Football Gazette* Division II All-American honorable mention team. Senior strong safety Robert Merriman (St. Louis-Lutheran North) made the *Football Gazette's* second team.

Two other Bulldog seniors were recognized by the *Gazette*. Tailback Chad Guthrie (Newton, Iowa) was selected to the third team, and wide receiver Fontaine Walker (Rock Island, Ill.) was chosen to the honorable mention list.

McKnight, Merriman and senior punter K.C. Conaway (Wellman, Iowa-Mid-Prairie) were named by conference coaches to the 1992 all-Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association first team.

Guthrie, Walker and junior nose guard Mike Roos (Gladstone-Oak Park) were picked for the second all-MIAA unit, while two seniors, split

end Marcus McCoy (Chicago-DeLaSalle) and offensive guard Scott Roberts (Bettendorf, Iowa), landed on the third all-conference list.

McKnight graded out to more than 90 percent and charted an average of five knockdowns per game as a senior.

This past season, Merriman was credited with 45 total tackles, two pass interceptions (one return for a touchdown), a recovered fumble returned for a TD, two forced fumbles and four broken-up passes.

Guthrie, a candidate for the 1992 Harlon Hill Trophy (top Division II player), ranked 10th among Division II rushers (1,458 yards) and fourth among scorers (12.2 points per game). During his career, Guthrie set school records for single-season rushing (1,649 yards), single-season total TDs (22), single-season scoring (134 points) and single-half rushing (213).

Walker, who caught 44 passes for 610 yards and four TDs last fall, is ranked in three NMSU career categories. He is second in receptions (168), tied for second in TD catches (19) and fourth in reception yardage (1,927).

Conaway led MIAA punters with a 40.5-yard average and was ranked nationally part of last season.

Roos led the 'Dogs in total tackles last fall with 84 stops and in tackles for losses with 12.

McCoy was NMSU's second-leading receiver in 1992 with 38 catches for 595 yards and six TDs. He also returned 15 kickoffs for a 19.2-yard average.

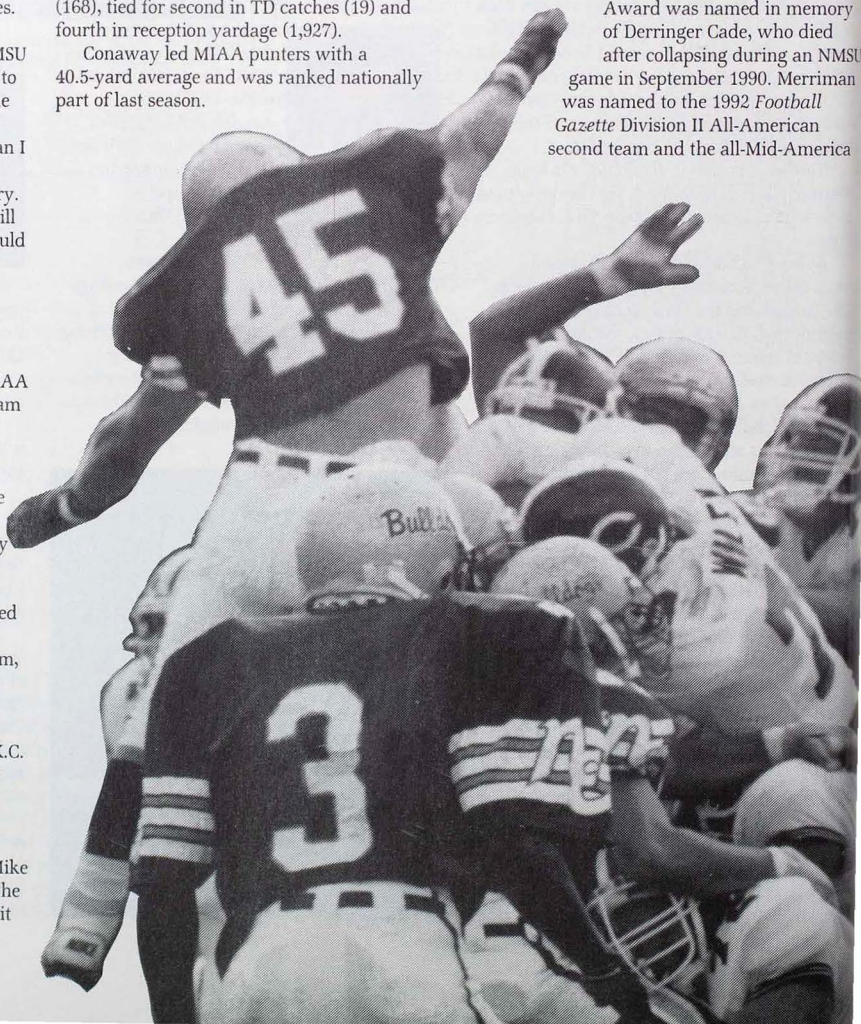
Roberts graded out to more than 90 percent and averaged three knockdowns as an offensive lineman last year.

Conner was appointed as interim coach after Lois Heeren resigned in September to become assistant coach at Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos.

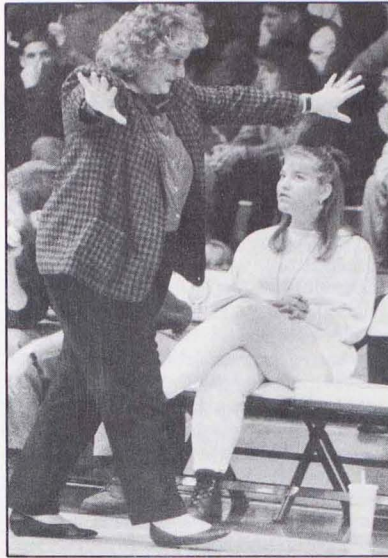
"Since she took over the program last fall, Jan Conner has infused such a great amount of enthusiasm that it was evident she could take Lady Bulldog basketball to a higher level," said athletic director Alan Graham. "I truly believe the community will be behind her."

Before her arrival at NMSU, Conner compiled a record of 337-47 in 17 years as a high school coach in Indiana. She was the first girls' basketball coach in that state to reach the 300-victory plateau.

During a career at Warren Central and Benton Central, she was named ICGSA Coach of the Year, selected twice as District Coach of the Year, chosen six times as Hoosier Conference Coach of the Year and cited as Huntington Tipoff Club Coach of the Year.

Her high school teams finished second in the Indiana State Tournament once, reached the State Tournament Final Four twice, crowned semi-state champions twice, regional champions seven times, sectional champions 13 times and conference champions 14 times.

Conner directed five Indiana teams to undefeated seasons, and she coached 16 girls who played on the college level and eight who became coaches. Four of her players were named Indiana all-stars.



**Cochrane Receives Distinguished Service Award** NMSU's Women's cross-country coach **John Cochran** (82) received the Division II Cross-Country Coaches Association Distinguished Service Award for 1992.

The Distinguished Service Award is presented to persons making significant contributions to NCAA Division II cross country. Cochran was recognized for his work as the Great Lakes Region representative and for his efforts in editing the Great Lakes Region Women's Cross-Country Newsletter the past three years.

Since Cochran came to NMSU in 1980 from Williamsburg (Iowa) Community School, the women's cross-country team has recorded six second-place, three third-place and three fourth-place team finishes at the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association (now the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association) Championships. The Lady Bulldogs recorded their highest finish at the 1990 NCAA Division II Regional Meet with a second-place showing. In 1983, Cochran was voted the MIAA Track Coach of the Year.

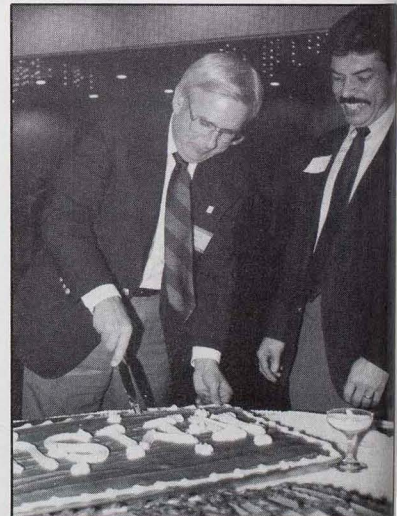

This led to the decentralization of the company in 1989 and the creation of Mallinckrodt Medical, Inc. and Mallinckrodt Specialty Chemicals Company as separate and autonomous units of IMCERA.

# Farewell to a Northeast Supporter

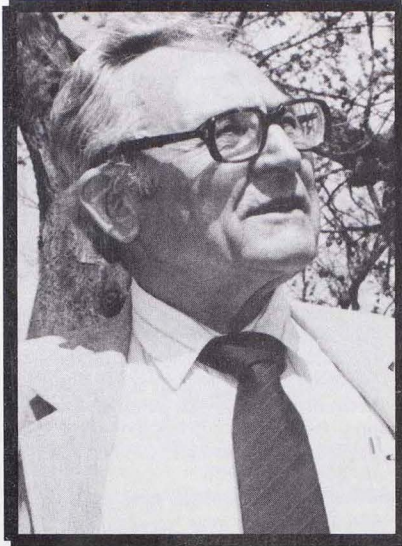
**F**ormer Republican Congressman and Northeast alumnus, **FRED SCHWENDEL ('30)**, died at Arlington Hospital in Virginia on April 1, after a brief illness.

Throughout his long and active life, Congressman Schwengel had two passions—promoting the study of American history, and particularly the history of the U.S. Capitol and the study of the life of Abraham Lincoln. While in Congress, he served the First District of Iowa. His interest in Lincoln stemmed from advice he received from poet Carl Sandburg when Schwengel was a college student. His interest in American history was stimulated by the advice and words of Harry S Truman also given to Schwengel while he was a student at Northeast Missouri State University.

Throughout his life, Schwengel was a great advocate of physical fitness. Chosen as a small college All-American Tackle, he played football under Coach Don Faurot at Northeast in the 1930's.

Schwengel was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives in 1944 and served four terms and to the U.S. Congress in 1954 and served for 16 years. It was as a member of the U.S. House of Representatives, with bi-partisan support of such leaders as Sam Rayburn, Everett Dirksen, Gerald Ford and Hubert H. Humphrey that Schwengel was able to organize the U.S. Capitol Historical Society. Under his guidance the non-profit Historical Society published many authoritative works on the history of the Capitol, donated a significant amount of mural art to embellish the walls of the Capitol and interpreted the rich history of the Capitol through such means as historic tours for hundreds of thousands of visitors, especially school children of all ages.

On the Northeast Missouri State University Campus, Fred and his wife, **Ethel (Cassity) ('32)**, are responsible for the Lincoln-Schwengel Collection in the Pickler Memorial Library. The Collection houses books, art works, various artifacts and memorabilia devoted to Abraham Lincoln. With over 2,000 items in the Collection, the Schwengels began



donating to it in 1976. A regular site for visitors and the University family, the gallery and reading room have been frequented for the last 18 years.

The Schwengel's deep appreciation for the importance of history moved them to assist the University in establishing the Harry S Truman Program for the Importance of History. When this program is fully

funded it will consist of three different components. The first component is a series of symposiums that will feature active dialogue among presenters and participants concerning an issue relating to our history. The second component will be the establishment of the Truman/Schwengel Chair for Distinguished Visiting Historians. While at Northeast, chair holders will devote most of their efforts to research and writing, which is designed to make historical topics more accessible to the general public. The final component involves an annual workshop for middle school and high school history teachers that promotes their own professional development by giving them teaching ideas and techniques to keep the young mind interested in our history. # The NMSU Development Fund Corporation

was established in 1980 to encourage private financial support for Northeast Missouri State University. Gifts received are used to enhance the quality of education and to promote the welfare of the University.

Each year, the importance of private support is magnified as the cost of education increases. Assistance from the state of Missouri has not kept pace with University needs. Although educational costs continue to rise, Northeast Missouri State University takes pride in being able to provide one of the finest liberal arts and sciences education, at a tuition level which is cost effective.

Generally speaking, money given to the Development Fund forms an endowment. This endowment is invested and the interest earned is allocated to various projects which allows your gifts to work today while remaining available for tomorrow. A small percentage of current gifts is used to offset operational expenses and to fund short-term projects.

JOHN R. KIRK WAS THE FIFTH PRESIDENT OF NORTHEAST MISSOURI STATE University. President Kirk was an innovative educator, a national leader for educational excellence and a compelling personality.

In 1981, alumni and friends of Northeast Missouri State University formed a society to honor President Kirk and to perpetuate his commitment to excellence.

The John R. Kirk Society is open to all alumni and friends of the University, exclusive of organizations, societies and other groups. In the case of husband and wife, the membership may be joint.

Four levels of membership—*John R. Kirk Society Member*, *John R. Kirk Society Fellow*, *John R. Kirk Society Distinguished Fellow* and *John R. Kirk Society Very Distinguished Fellow*—are available to individuals who agree to meet one or more of the following conditions:

1. Signify by a pledge the intention to contribute to Northeast Missouri State University \$5,000 payable over a five-year period at a rate of not less than \$1,000 a year, in the case of a *Fellow*; \$25,000 payable over a 10-year period at a rate of not less than \$2,500 a year, in the case of a *Distinguished Fellow*; \$50,000 payable over a 10-year period at a rate not less than \$5,000 per year, in the case of a *Very Distinguished Fellow*.

2. Contribute an outright sum of at least \$300\* (*one-year Member*), \$5,000 (*Fellow*), \$25,000 (*Distinguished Fellow*) or \$50,000 (*Very Distinguished Fellow*) to Northeast Missouri State University.

3. Signify the intention to provide to Northeast Missouri State University by a bequest, funded life insurance program, life income contract or other type of deferred gift at least \$5,000 (*Life Member*), \$10,000 (*Fellow*), \$50,000 (*Distinguished Fellow*) or \$100,000 (*Very Distinguished Fellow*).

Four levels of additional membership—*Corporate Member*, *Corporate Fellow*, *Distinguished Corporate Fellow* and *Very Distinguished Corporate Fellow*—are available to corporations, trusts and foundations that agree to meet one or more of the following conditions:

1. Signify the intention to contribute to Northeast Missouri State University \$10,000 payable over a 10-year period at \$1,000 a year (*Corporate Member*); \$25,000 payable over a 10-year period at \$2,500 a year (*Corporate Fellow*); \$50,000 payable over a 10-year period at \$5,000 a year (*Distinguished Corporate Fellow*); and \$100,000 payable over a 10-year period at \$10,000 a year (*Very Distinguished Corporate Fellow*).

2. Contribute an outright sum of at least \$10,000 (*Corporate Member*), \$25,000 (*Corporate Fellow*), \$50,000 (*Distinguished Corporate Fellow*) or \$100,000 (*Very Distinguished Corporate Fellow*) to Northeast Missouri State University.

The John R. Kirk Society meets annually on campus.
