THE NORTHEAST MISSOURI STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION will hold its spring meeting Friday on the University campus. Classes will not meet Friday because of the teachers meeting. Dr. Arthur Mallory, state commissioner of education in the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and ex-officio member of the NMSU Board of Regents, will be guest speaker. The theme of the meeting will be "Proud to Serve."

THE 6TH ANNUAL ALUMNI EXHIBITION featuring Francis Sporer, ceramist and 1961 alumnus of NMSU, will open at 7 tonight with a slide talk by Sporer in 272 Baldwin Hall. Following the slide talk will be a reception for the artist at the University Gallery, 218 BH. These events are open to the public at no admission charge.

Sporer will also present the program for the art departmental session of the Northeast Missouri State Teachers Association meeting at 1:15 p.m. Friday in 252 BH.

THE REPERTORY DANCE THEATRE, a professional modern dance company from Salt Lake City, will be in-residence Monday-Wednesday, March 5-7. Activities, which are open to the public at no charge, are as follows:

Monday, March 5: Lecture-demonstration for elementary school from 9:30-10:30 a.m.; lecture-demonstration for junior high school through adults from 1:30-2:30 p.m.; and a modern dance technique class from 3-4:30 p.m.

Tuesday, March 6: Movement for actors from 10-11:30 a.m.; concert starting at 8 p.m.

Wednesday, March 7: Jazz class from 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon.

All activities are in Baldwin Auditorium. Tickets for the concert are available from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. today and Monday and Tuesday, March 5-6. This program is co-sponsored by the NMSU Lyceum Series, Missouri Council on the Arts, National Endowment for the Arts and the Dance Society of St. Louis.

ROGER RAPHAEL, internationally known violinist of Edinburgh, Scotland, will serve as artist-in-residence for the Fine Arts Division Tuesday and Wednesday, March 6-7. Activities include a class for violinists on campus from 3-5:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 6, in the Activities Room, Student Union Building, and a recital at 8 p.m. Wednesday, March 7, in Baldwin Auditorium. Both events are open to the public without charge.

The residency is jointly sponsored by NMSU; Culver-Stockton College, Canton; Northwest Missouri State University, Maryville; and the Missouri Council on the Arts.

"THE WORLD OF MARK TWAIN" will be discussed in three lectures on Wednesday and Thursday, March 7-8, by Dr. John Hollenbach, professor of English from Hope College in Holland, Mich. Dr. Hollenbach, who taught at Northeast from 1941-45, will discuss "Mark Twain and the Shaping of the Humorous Tale" at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday in 305 Administration/Humanities Building. At 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, he will present a talk on "My Mark Twain" in the Little Theatre of Baldwin Hall. The series will conclude with "Mark Twain's Quarrel with God" at 10:30 a.m. Thursday in 309 A/H. The lectures are sponsored by the Language and Literature Division with a grant from the Missouri Committee for the Humanities, the state-based association of the National Endowment for the Humanities.
