She exhibited watercolors and acrylic collages March 5-6 in the "Art for Heart" exhibit at the West Des Moines Shopping Mall....Elizabeth Evans, Education, has been invited to serve as a research consultant to student branch advisers and state province student branch coordinators at the Association for Childhood Education International Study Conference April 10-15 in Minneapolis, Minn....Mary Farwell, Health, Physical Education and Recreation, received notification that she was nominated for inclusion in the 1977 publication of the World Who's Who of Women in Education. The book is compiled by the International Biographical Centre, Cambridge, England....The National Association of Teachers of Singing recently published a volume of "English Singing Translations of Foreign Language Art Songs." More than half of the material (translations of 77 songs, including five complete song cycles) is the work of Frederic Kirchner of the Fine Arts Division.
