Summer study in Spain

Nineteen students are participating in Northeast's Spain Study Abroad program this summer under the direction of Silvia Pites, assistant professor of Spanish. During a four-week stay in Salamanca, the students will study at the Universidad Pontificia.

In addition to the seven daily classroom hours, the students will travel to Segovia and Avila. They will also spend two full weeks touring Madrid, Toledo, Barcelona, Cordoba, Seville, Granada and Torremolinos. As part of their itinerary, they will attend a bullfight, a Flamenco show, and a variety of other cultural events; they will visit cathedrals, historical monuments, castles and art museums.
