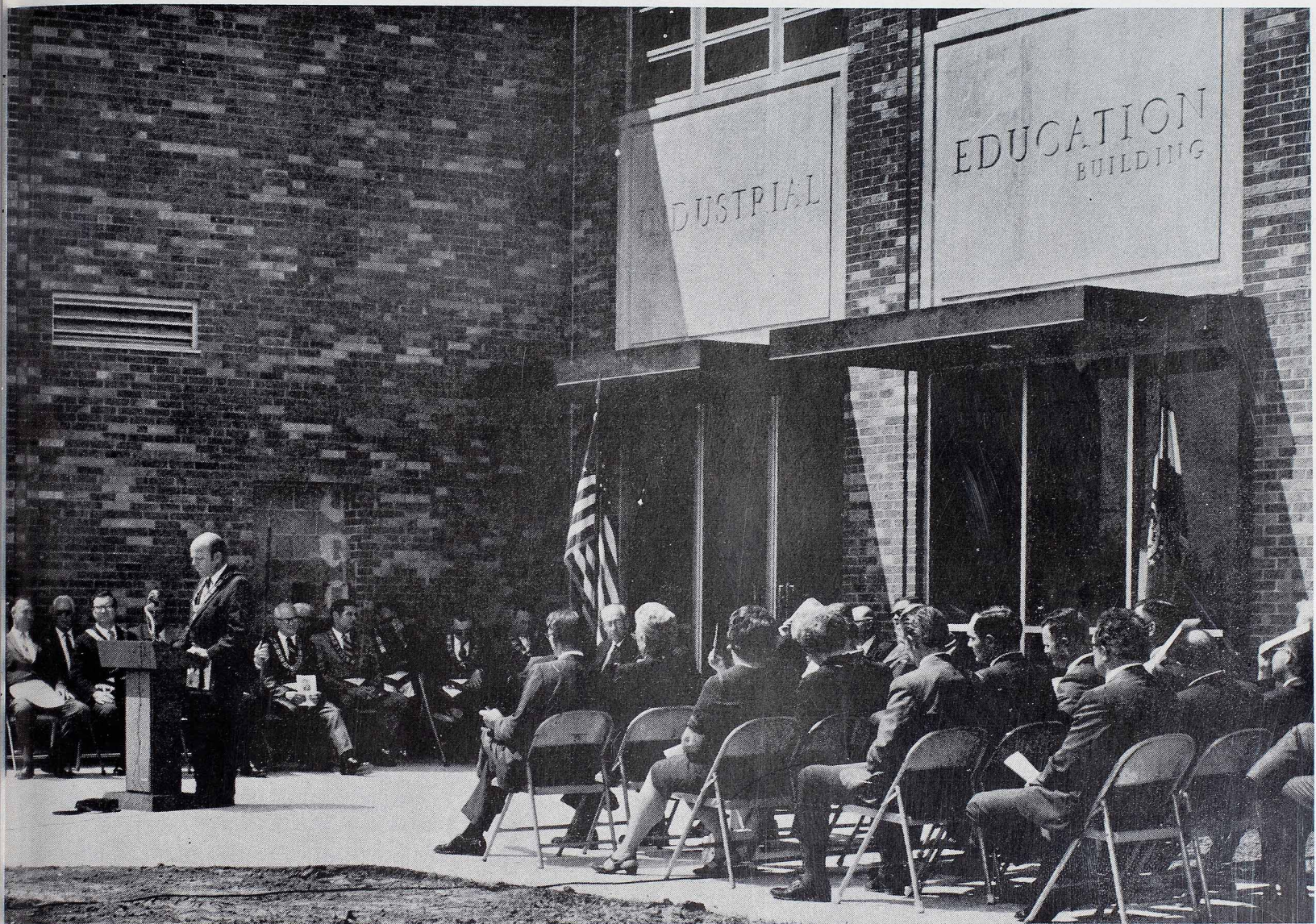

## *Comments from the College President*

Traditionally, the end of a college year is a time for reflection on the events of the year; academic matters, athletic events, dramatic and musical productions, extra-curricular activities, and social occasions. The reflections this year are both pleasing and satisfactory, and the memories of these events will remain with us, particularly for the new graduates and those of us who remain on the campus.

But reflections should not remain in the realm of nostalgia; rather, they should be directed into positive areas with an emphasis on the needs of the College. Then each of us should ask "What can be done to strengthen the already strong aspects of Northeast Missouri State College?" Let me suggest three areas for your attention.

Of prime importance to the College is the ratio between enrollment and the number of graduates. At the spring commencement over 900 degrees were awarded. For the fall semester of 1970 we anticipate an eight to ten per cent increase in the student body. These figures compare well with the other state colleges. During 1968-69, NMSC was second from the bottom in full-time equivalent enrollment of the five state colleges and Lincoln University. During that same year, however, NMSC was second from the top in total number of degrees awarded at the same institutions, with NMSC granting the largest number of graduate degrees.

With increased enrollment comes the need for new and expanded programs of study. Throughout the year, our faculty and staff have been concerned with this need and are exploring various methods by which we can strengthen our curriculum and better serve the needs of our constituents.

To implement these programs and care for the increased enrollment, the College will need additional financial support. For 1970-71, the Missouri Commission on Higher Education recommended a budget of \$6,538,188; the Governor's recommendation is \$5,564,416 (the same for 1969-70), showing a difference of \$973,772. Of the proposed increase in appropriations, \$892,536 is requested from the State's General Revenue Fund. The balance of the increase, \$81,236, would be from the Northeast Missouri State College Fund. Therefore, the net cost to the State would be less than \$900,000. Without this increase, we will be unable to expand our current programs of study or add the proposed ones.

You can help in each of these areas: (1) Enrollment—continue to send us your best high school graduates; alumni are our best recruiters, for you know the College; (2) Programs of study—let us know what revisions might be beneficial to our current curriculum and advise us concerning possible additions to the curriculum; and (3) Financial needs—write state representatives and senators indicating your concern for the College, thereby undergirding our requests for increased financial support. Then visit the campus at your convenience so that you may visualize the progress that is being made at your College.

# Area Alumni Activities Held

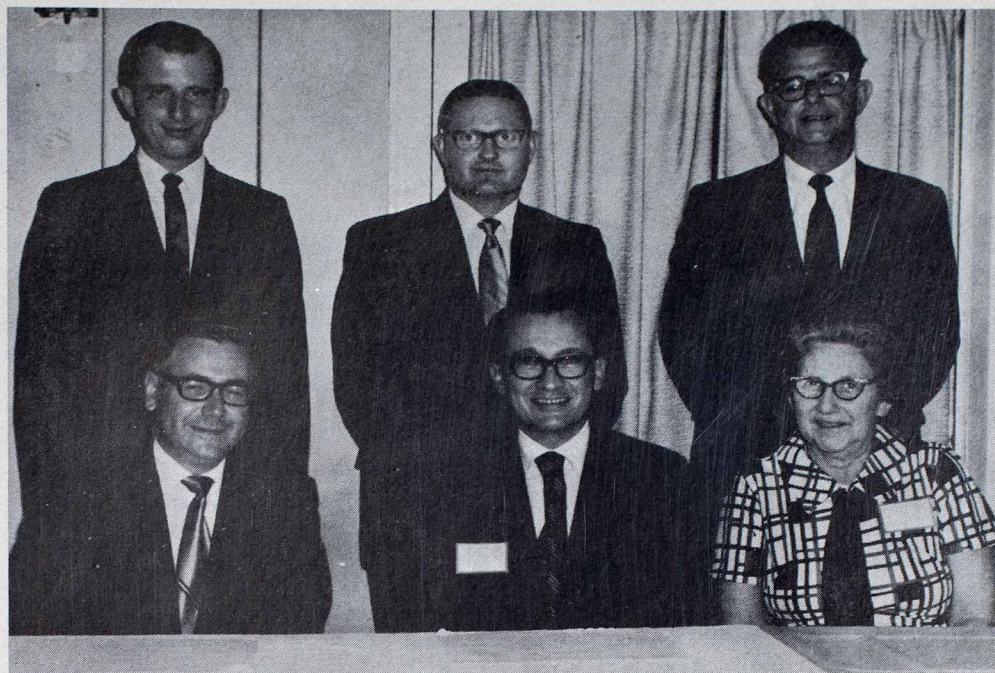

# Cornerstone Ceremonies Held for New Industrial Education Building

Cornerstone laying ceremonies for the nearly completed Industrial Education building on the NMSC campus were held Saturday, May 23rd, 11:00 a.m., at the site of the building. The ceremonies were attended by a large crowd of faculty members, alumni, students and friends of the College.

Senator A. Basey Vanlandingham, 19th District Senator from Columbia, was the principal speaker following the cornerstone ceremonies conducted under the leadership of J. Morgan Donelson, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge A F & A M of Missouri, and 3rd Judicial Circuit Judge from Princeton. James R. Reinhard, President of the College Board of Regents, presided over the program, and Senator Vanlandingham was introduced by Bruce

H. Hunt, Secretary of the Board of Regents, from Kirksville. Platform guests included College President Charles J. McClain, 95th District Representative Cloy Whitney of Kirksville, Mayor L. P. Anesi of Kirksville, President Emeritus Walter H. Ryle, members of the Board of Regents, and members of the Industrial Education faculty.

Grand Lodge officers participating in the ceremonies in addition to the Grand Master were William H. Chapman, Deputy Grand Master of Webster Grover; W. Hugh McLaughlin, Junior Grand Warden of Kansas City; Elmer W. Wagner, Grand Secretary of St. Louis; Freelon K. Hadley, Grand Lecturer of St. Joseph; Robert L. McKinney, Junior Grand Deacon of

Kirksville; and James A. Noland, Jr., Grand Marshal of Osage Beach. They were assisted by members of the two Masonic lodges of Kirksville.

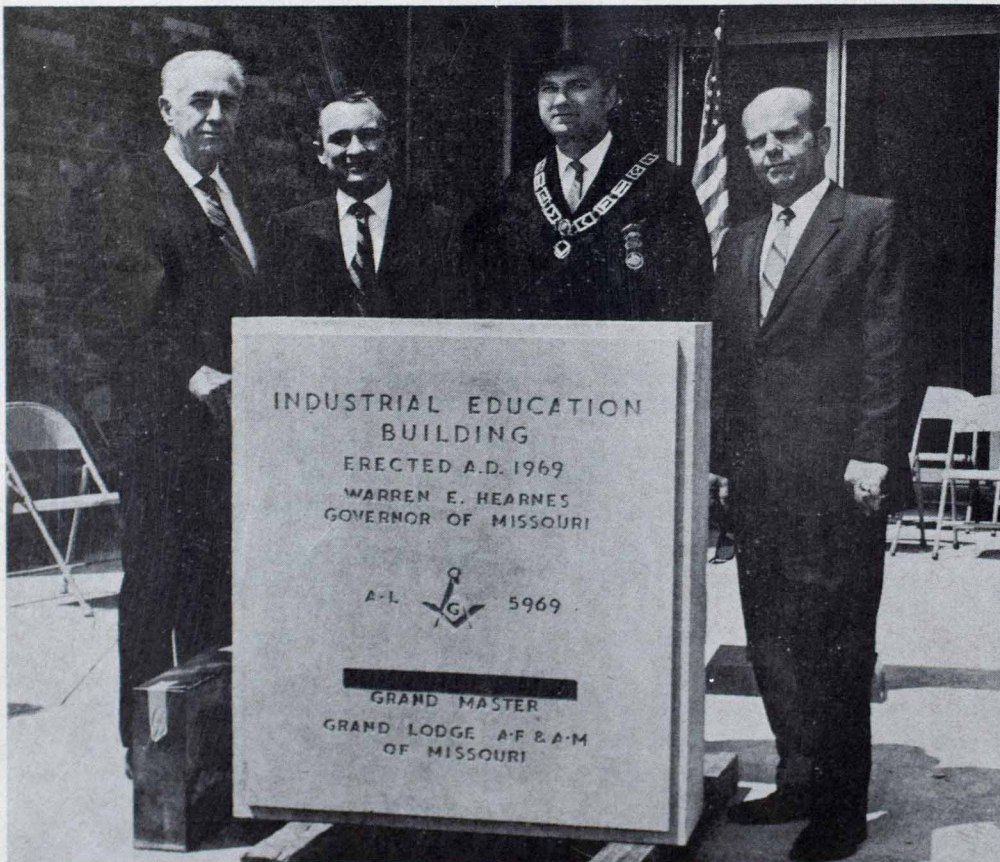
Senator Vanlandingham called for the passage of a 2c sales tax increase for the state of Missouri to finance numerous capital improvements needed by all state agencies, including the final section of the new Industrial Education building. He termed the added revenue a necessity if state institutions were to move forward and keep pace. The Senator also traced the history of the Industrial Education department at the College, and praised retired division head Otho Barnett and the present head of the division, Dr. Roland Nagel, for their leadership roles in building the strong Industrial Education department.

Construction of the building began in late 1968 with completion scheduled in the near future. The new facility is being built at a contract price of \$1,154,746 by the Universal Construction Company, and will provide 46,000 square feet of classroom and office space for the division. All of the funds for the building are state appropriations. The new structure is located on land purchased by the College across Route 63, west of the Pershing building. The building will offer vast improvement in classroom and laboratory facilities.

Designed by Pearce and Pearce Inc., St. Louis, it is of Georgian architecture harmonizing with other campus buildings.

Included in the master plan are seven classrooms, 12 laboratories, 16 auxiliary rooms (for storage and supplies), 18 faculty offices, a reception room, a secretarial office, and a division conference room.

Interior design consists of terrazzo and vinyl asbestos floors, glazed tile and painted haydite masonry walls, built-up roof on light weight insulating concrete deck. Lighting will be surface and recessed fluorescent. A prominent feature will be complete air-conditioning, furnishing a more creative atmosphere on hot summer days, especially in the laboratories.

On the first floor will be: Research and Development, primarily for graduate work; Materials Testing; Metals Technology (including welding); Woods Technology, a new branch of study; and Power Technology.

Second floor will accommodate Electricity, including TV and sound control; Industrial Crafts (plastics); Graphic Arts; two drafting rooms; a model making shop; Driver Education.

Phase I of a two phase building program, the present construction when completed will eventually be doubled in size, possibly to provide improved facilities for agricultural students.

Co-ordinating with the new building are some recent developments and changes in the Industrial Education curricula.

Three plans of pursuit have been added to the curricula; Plan A, Multi-Area Preparation, is designed for teachers of junior high school Industrial Arts, comprehensive general shop teachers, or teachers in four-year or senior high schools which have one shop facility.

## Travel and Study Tour in Mexico Begins in July

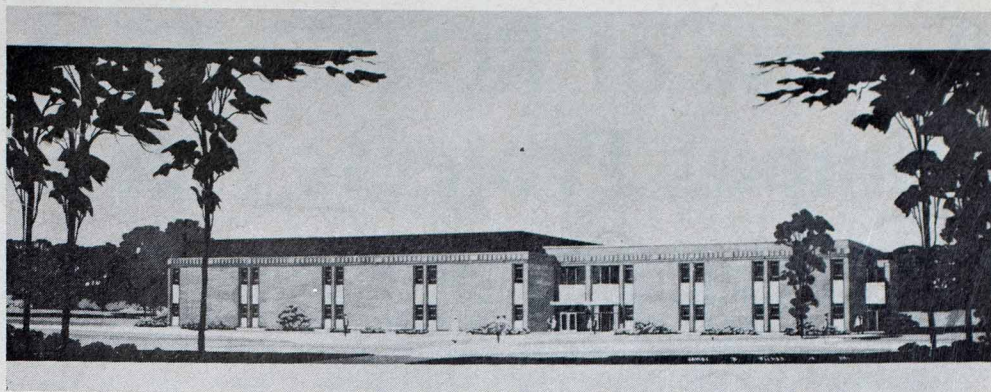
Northeast Missouri State College will again sponsor a travel and six weeks study tour this summer to Monterrey, Mexico according to an announcement by President Charles J. McClain.

The tour, which is under the direction of Walter H. Ryle, IV, associate professor of history, will leave Kirksville on July 10 and arrive at Monterrey, Mexico on July 12. Through a cooperative arrangement with the Mexican University, students of either high school or college will study Spanish and Latin-American subjects for which appropriate high school or college credit will be given.

Among the fields of study are courses in art and folklore, economics, geography, history and sociology, and various levels of Spanish and Spanish literature. Courses for high school students of Spanish range from first through the fifth years.

Transportation from Kirksville and intermediate points will be by college bus.

Plan B, Dual-Area Concentration, is for Industrial Education or Industrial Arts teachers in medium to large schools where courses taught will be in two areas, such as drafting and electricity. The individual would then be qualified on a limited basis to teach general Industrial Arts courses.

Plan C, Area Specialization, concerns the individual desiring in-depth preparation in one industrial area such as industrial arts, vocational-industrial technical education teaching. Stu-

dents following this plan would normally teach in large high schools, technical schools, or community colleges.

Added degrees are: B.S. in Driver and Safety Education; B.S. in Industrial Technology; B.S. Industrial Occupations.

Three new short-range programs including a one-year drafting, a two-year drafting and a two-year technical wood program are included in the expansion curricula.

# Review of ROTC's First Year on Campus Projects Accomplishments

As the spring semester drew to a close, so did the first year of ROTC on the Northeast Missouri State College campus. It was a busy year for the Division of Military Science. It might be well to review some of the highlights of the year, beginning with the arrival of Colonel John F. Gerrity, the Professor of Military Science, on April 1, 1969.

Colonel Gerrity arrived with four members of his staff and began the many faceted duties of establishing offices, classrooms, programs of instruction and effective relations on the campus and in the community. Shortly after their arrival, the Division of Military Science received a liaison visit from Major General John H. Childs, Deputy Commanding General of the Fifth Army, under whose control the unit falls.

On the 9th of June, the Division of Military Science held an open house of its offices for the college staff and faculty. Approximately 150 individuals toured the facilities.

One of the ROTC staff, Major William R. Andrews, was awarded the

Bronze Star for meritorious service in Vietnam. The ceremony was attended by other staff members and Dr. Eli F. Mittler, interim President of Northeast Missouri State College.

On the 7th of July, Colonel Gerrity and Dean A. L. Fritschel visited the Basic ROTC Summer Camp at Fort Benning, Georgia. This camp substitutes for the first two years of on-campus work, allowing a student to complete the ROTC requirements for a commission in the U. S. Army after participating in ROTC as a junior and a senior. Twenty-one Northeast Missouri State College students were attending the camp during this time.

Shortly thereafter, Colonel Gerrity and Robert L. McKinney made a three day visit to Fort Riley, Kansas, to observe the training received by advance cadets between their junior and senior years.

As registration began in mid-September, the freshman ROTC class swelled to well over 600. Uniforms were issued and the advanced cadets who had attended the basic summer

camp were sworn in as members of the United States Army Reserve. One Freshman attending Northeast Missouri State College on an Army 4 year scholarship was also sworn in as a member of the USAR. (The Army ROTC Program offers 5500 scholarships to outstanding students nation-wide).

The first leadership laboratory was held on September 23, 1969. The students were organized into companies, platoons, and squads.

Freshman classes held some surprise for students who were somewhat apprehensive as to the subject matter to be presented. Classes on economics and politics as factors of national power were hardly what they had in mind. Communist revolutionary theory was also revealing to them.

In November, construction of a rifle range was completed and the long process of try-outs and eliminations for a cadet rifle team was begun. By the end of the year the fledgling team had been opened to varsity shooters. As a varsity sport, competitive matches were held with four schools in the MIAA conference. An Athletic letter was authorized for the sport.

1969 was the 150th year of military instruction on the nation's college campuses. To commemorate this event, an ROTC staff member and an advanced cadet attended a ceremony at the state capitol at which Governor Hearns signed a proclamation declaring December 1 through 7 as "ROTC Week" in Missouri.

As the second semester started, a coed enrolled in ROTC, Meg Milder of Ottumwa, Iowa, stated, "Everybody said I would not do it, so I did."

In order to build competence in drill, a twelve hour "Squad Leadership School" was established. Since it was conducted during the students free time, only volunteers were accepted. During the first leadership laboratory of the semester, the 93 students who had successfully completed the school were promoted to cadet corporal, sergeant or staff sergeant. During the same ceremony, the advanced cadets

## Law Enforcement Program Starts In September

A law enforcement program for Northeast Missouri State College has been approved to begin in September 1970 according to recent announcements by James R. Reinhard, president of the Board of Regents.

A four year program which leads to a bachelors degree in law enforcement will be featured as well as a one year certificate program.

Cooperative arrangements with law enforcement agencies throughout northeast Missouri for in-service training are being finalized. These agencies include the police department of cooperating cities as well as the highway patrol and the Medium Security prison in Moberly.

The federal government has announced a program of grants and loans which assist students who enter the program. The grants and loans are made to students pursuing either a one year certificate course or a four year degree program and cover tuition and board costs. For each year the graduate spends in any phase of law enforcement work following course completion, the government will forgive one year of loans. This is also true of those students who pursue a one year certificate program.

Courses which will be offered in the field of law enforcement include: Criminology, Scientific Criminal Investigation, Criminal Law, Procedure & Evidence, Police Organization and Management, Correctional and Rehabilitative Institution Management, Police Identification Techniques, Probation and Parole, Motor Vehicle and Traffic Law, Environmental Quality Law, Law Enforcement Workshop, Directed Studies, Internship in Police Investigation and Administration, and Internship in Correctional and Rehabilitative Institutions.

Cooperative arrangements are pending with the Missouri Highway Patrol Academy, the Kansas City and St. Louis police academies whereby credit for service in those agencies will satisfy some of the requirements for either the degree or certificate programs.

The law enforcement program will be supported by a grant from the federal government which is supervised by the U. S. Department of Justice.

## Joyce Glaser Awarded First Dillinger Scholarship

Mrs. Joyce Glaser, elementary music education major from Huntsville, is the first recipient of the James M. and Robert Glen Dillinger Memorial Music Education Scholarship according to an announcement made recently by Dr. Dale Jorgenson, Head of the Division of Fine Arts.

The scholarship was established in 1969 by family, friends, and former students of the late James M. Dillinger who died March 3, 1969, and his son, the late Robert G. Dillinger who was killed in a car wreck November 2, 1969.

J. M. Dillinger held the B.S. in Education and M.A. degrees from the College and was a well known music educator in Missouri and the mid-west. He was one of the founders of the Missouri Music Education Association (MMEA), organizer and director of the first NMSC College Band, and founded the Mark Twain Marching Band Festival. He taught several summers on the music faculty. Eleven members of the Dillinger family have received degrees from the College.

Robert Glen Dillinger, held both the B.S. in Education and M.A. degrees from the College. He was an active teacher, conductor, and leader in Missouri Music Education and served as an officer in the MMEA and in his Community Teachers' group.

were also promoted and academic awards were presented.

An innovation in the freshman class was the establishment of an Honors Seminar. The top ten (10) students of the over 600 enrolled were offered the opportunity to participate. Due to their superior scholastic ability, they were able to move quickly through the required subjects and go on into areas of specific interest, such as the situation in southeast Asia.

The last major function of the year was the advanced cadet banquet. This was a dinner held by the advanced cadets to which personnel of the Division of Military Science and other members of the college administration were invited.

During the summer, all but two members of the Division of Military Science staff will assist in the formation and conduct of the Advanced ROTC Summer Camp at Fort Riley, Kansas. Seventeen (17) students from Northeast Missouri State College will attend the Advanced ROTC Summer Camp and twenty-five (25) students will attend the Basic ROTC Summer Camp, which is being held this year at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

With an anticipated ROTC enrollment of approximately 900 students next year, the ROTC program ends it's first year as a viable part of campus life.

# IN MEMORIAM

**Arthur M. Swanson, 1905**, head of the old Kansas City Junior College until his retirement in 1952, died January 5, 1970, at a nursing home in Kansas City. Born in Greentop, Missouri, he had lived most of his life in Kansas City, and upon his retirement at 70 years of age he had been associated with the Kansas City schools 46 years. Dean Swanson began teaching mathematics in the school system in 1906 at Manual High School and seven years later went to the old junior college, then called Polytechnic Institute. He was assistant principal at the college until he became vice-president in 1925, then dean in 1937 for 15 years. He was a captain in the Army during World War I. After receiving his degree from NMSC he received a master's degree from the University of Kansas. He was a member of the Country Club Christian church. Mr. Swanson is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Muriel Oldberg, 7324 Jarboe, Kansas City; and Mrs. Madeline Hoover, 5707 Hadley, Merriam, Kansas; two sisters, **Miss Mary Elizabeth Swanson, 1924**, of 121 Ward Parkway, Kansas City; and **Mrs. Pauline Swanson Andrews, 1925** of Albuquerque, New Mexico. Eight grandchildren also survive. Funeral services were held in Kansas City and burial was in Forest Hill cemetery there.

**Mrs. Shelton (Mabel Hutchison) Roberts, 1923**, of Kansas, Illinois, died January 19, 1970. Mrs. Roberts was a member of the NMCS Alumni Association.

**James H. Streeter, 1929**, of Unionville, Missouri, died in January of 1970, in the Putnam County Nursing Home in Unionville, which he had entered shortly after the first of the year. He had been in failing health for some time. Mr. Streeter had taught in the high schools at St. Joseph, Milan, Unionville and Belle. He served as principal for nine years at Unionville, resigning in 1968 to serve as principal with Maries County R-1 School, Belle, Missouri. He is survived by his wife, NaDien; six children: Warren, Roger, Kent, Greg, Mrs. Sherrill Yadon and Mrs. Janie Rockwood. Funeral services were held in Unionville, January 31, and burial was in Plainview cemetery in Sullivan County.

**Ruth Barkley Loft, 1954**, of Liberty, Missouri, died February 13, in North Kansas City Memorial Hospital where she had been a patient three days. Her husband, Harold Loft, preceded her in death in 1952. Also preceding her in death were her father and one brother, **John Barkley, 1937**, who died in 1967. Surviving are her mother, Mrs. Laura Wonderly of Brashear; two sons, Robert H. Loft of Liberty and Richard L. Loft of Odessa; one daughter, Mrs. Fred (Rebecca Sue) Kester of Marysville; one brother, **Clarence E. Barkley, 1940**, of Liberty and an aunt, Mrs. Raymond Ludwig of Kirksville. Mrs. Loft had taught school in Unionville, Cameron, Easton, Lathrop and for the past three years had been employed as a counselor at the Missouri State Employment Service in Kansas City. She was a member of the Methodist Church. Funeral services were held in Brashear, Missouri, with burial in the cemetery there.

**Bertie D. Roderick, 1931**, died in February of 1970 in a Kirksville hospital where she had been a patient for two weeks. She

had been in failing health several months. Funeral services were held in Kirksville, with burial in Highland Park cemetery, Kirksville. Mrs. Roderick is survived by one son, **Dr. John R. Roderick, 1938**, osteopathic physician, who with his wife, **Ruth S. Roderick, 1947**, lives at 708 E. Harrison, Kirksville; one sister, Mrs. Laura Sneed, Kirksville; one brother, Robert J. Davis of Baltimore, Maryland, and three granddaughters, Marjorie, Betty and Jeannie Roderick. A long-time teacher in the Kirksville school system, Mrs. Roderick taught in Washington School and later became a teacher of vocational home economics in the Senior High School until her retirement in 1956. She was a member of the First Christian Church of Kirksville.

**Elton L. Marshall, 1908**, an attorney in Kansas City for many years, died January 20. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mabel Marshall, of 1030 West 59 Terrace, Kansas City, Missouri, and by a daughter, Mrs. Mary Jo Kyger, Fort Worth, Texas, and a son, Robert A. Marshall of Kansas City.

**Betty Louise Mills Lawrence, 1962**, of Novinger, Missouri, died February 13 in a Kirksville hospital where she had been a patient since February 9. She had been in failing health for several months. She is survived by her husband, Gerald Lawrence, and by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Omer Mills of the Lowground community in southeast Putnam county. Mrs. Lawrence taught school at Lone Star, Lowground, Independence, Worthington, Novinger and before her retirement in January had taught two and one-half years in Unionville. She was a member of the Free Will Baptist Church at Lowground and was also a charter member of the Order of the Eastern Star No. 546 at Hartford. Funeral services were held in Unionville with burial in Lone Pine cemetery near Martinstown.

**William Lee Barnard, 1924**, prominent figure in Cedar Rapids (Iowa) athletics, died February 27 after a brief illness. Mr. Barnard lived at 4431 C Avenue N. E., and had lived in Cedar Rapids 40 years. He was married to **Opal Lee Hinton, 1927**, who survives. He was a member of St. Paul's United Methodist Church, Mizpah Lodge No. 639 AF and AM, the Iowa Athletic Officials Association and many other organizations connected with athletics. He received a master's degree in physical education from the University of Missouri in 1931. His teaching and coaching career in Cedar Rapids began in 1929 when he was named physical education teacher at Wilson Jr. High School. When it became a high school, he served as head football, track and basketball coach. In 1951 he became the head football coach at Franklin High School and later was head football coach at Washington High School. His teams brought to Cedar Rapids the first Mississippi Valley football conference championship. In later years he served as assistant football coach at Kennedy High School until his retirement last year from the Cedar Rapids public school system. Since that time he had served as an assistant football coach at Regis High School. In addition to his wife, Mr. Barnard is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Albion Gruber of Rochester, New York, a sister and six grandchildren. Memorial services were held at

St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Cedar Rapids, followed by entombment in Memorial Park.

**Sina Faye Fowler, 1927**, died February 20, 1970, in a Kirksville hospital where she had been since February 5. Funeral services were held in the Mary Immaculate Church in Kirksville, with burial in the Catholic Cemetery at Unionville. Miss Fowler was a graduate of the Unionville High School and taught a rural school in Putnam County and grade school in Winterset, Iowa, and Collins, Montana, before receiving her B.S.E. degree in home economics from NMSC in 1927. The same year she was granted a Diploma in Dietetics by the Michael Reese Hospital, Chicago. In 1933 she received a Master of Science degree in home economics from Kansas State University. Miss Fowler joined the staff at Kansas State, teaching Quantity Cookery and Institutional Management, and was the manager of the College Tea Room. She later became associate professor of home economics and manager of the University Cafeteria at Butler University, Indianapolis, Indiana. She also taught at the University of Missouri. During World War II, she served in the United States Army as Medical Department Dietician and had attained the rank of First Lieutenant when she separated from the Army in 1946. The next year she received a civilian appointment as Food and Nutrition Specialist for the U. S. Navy and directed commissary research at the Navy Supply Corps School at Bayonne, New Jersey. Miss Fowler was employed as Restaurant Dietitian for Western Electric Co. in Chicago from 1954 until she retired in 1963 and came to Kirksville to make her home. In 1966 she was at Texas University in Denton to direct the establishment of the cafeteria in the newly-constructed nurses' home. After returning to Kirksville, she served as Dietary Consultant for the Kirksville Osteopathic Hospital Children and Youth Program and the Grim-Smith Hospital. Miss Fowler is widely known professionally as co-author of the book, "Food for Fifty." Since its publication it has been kept up to date and the ninth edition will be released within the next few months. She was a member of the American Legion; an active member of the American, Illinois and Chicago Dietetic Associations; Delta Kappa Gamma, honorary teachers society; Omicron Nu, national home economics honor society; Phi Kappa Phi, national scholarship honor society and a member of Delta Zeta sorority.

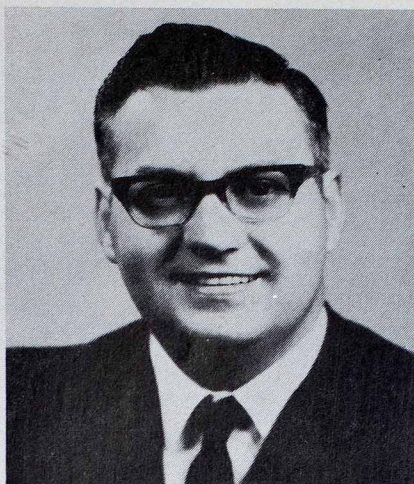

Jay was a 1967 graduate of Parkway High School in St. Louis and attended NMSC until May of 1969, at which time he enlisted in the Army, with plans to complete his education at the College after his military service. Funeral services for **Georgia Turpin Coxwell, 1926**, aged 68, were held April 20, 1970, in De Soto, Missouri. 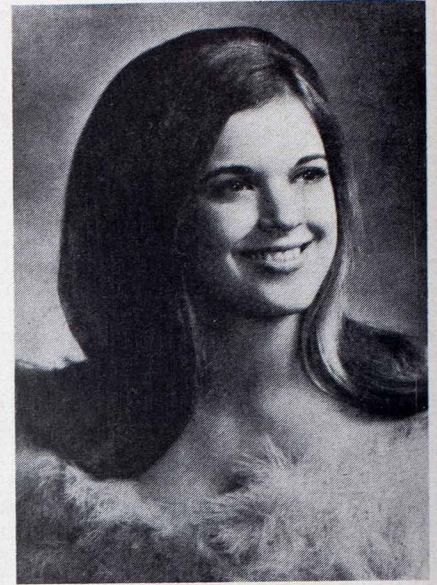
# Len Dawson Selects Freshman as Echo Queen

Miss Smith, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Coleman Smith, was sponsored by the independents. She is a business

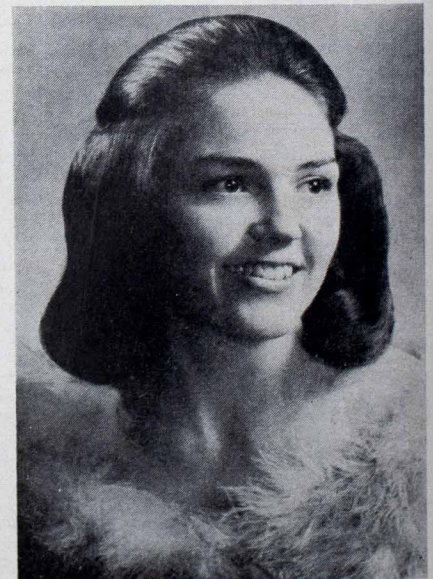

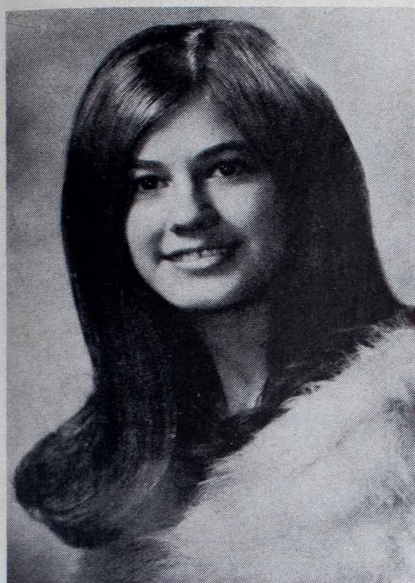
administration major who plans a teaching career.

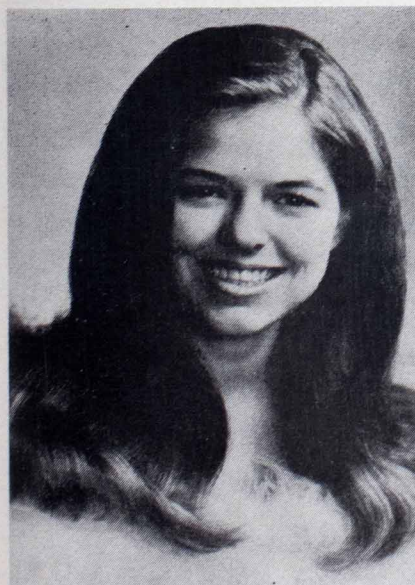

## Proposed Summer Workshops to Aid Northeast Missouri Teachers

Twenty-seven off campus workshops have been proposed for the summer of 1970 according to an announcement by Charles J. McClain, President of Northeast Missouri State College.

The workshops, which will be sponsored by the Extension Division, will be held at local school sites in northeast Missouri during June, July, and August. Most of the workshops will provide two semester hours of credit at a cost of fourteen dollars per semester hour plus the standard ten dollar workshop fee.

In commenting on the summer workshops, Dr. McClain said, "We want to be of maximum service to the teachers of northeast Missouri and believe that by this method we can provide educational opportunity for some who might not otherwise obtain college credit during the summer months."

Workshops which have been proposed include: Pupil Teacher Relationships, Elementary School Social Studies Workshop, Elementary Science Workshop (A.A.A.S. Approach), Elementary Science Workshop (E.S.S. Project), Elementary Science Workshop (Minnemast Program), Workshop in Athletic Administration, Junior High Science Workshop (ISCS Program), Workshop in Psychology of Early Childhood, Environmental Science for Elementary Teachers, Environmental Science for Secondary Teachers, Workshop in Teaching Social Science, Workshop in Industrial Education, Environmental Crisis (Open to public), Special Education, Health Education Workshop, Earth Science for Elementary Teachers, Geology of Missouri, Creative Behavior, Related Arts-Humanities, Workshop in Reading, Workshop in Mathematics Curriculum, Secondary Science Workshops (New Innovations-Bio), Secondary Science Workshops (New Innovations-Chem), Secondary Science Workshops (New Innovations-Phy), Workshop in Psychology of Coaching, Teaching Mathematics to the Underachiever, and School Library Workshop.

College officials announced that these workshops are being planned on an experimental first-time basis and the success would have an impact on future off campus workshops. For further information concerning the

# Ice House Troup in Rehearsal For Season Opener July 7th

Alfred Srnka and O. J. Merrell, of the NMSC Faculty, To Manage and Direct Summer Stock Performances

An old ice house built in Hannibal in 1854 is ready for its third season as the home of the Ice House Players. The historical ice house had stood vacant for many years on the Mississippi River levee prior to its conversion three years ago. The semi-professional summer stock company performs American plays in repertory sequence under the sponsorship of the Northeast Missouri State College, the Historic Foundation of Hannibal and the Hannibal Chamber of Commerce.

Alfred Srnka, a member of the NMSC drama faculty for eight years, has been named managing director for the 1970 season, opening July 7 for a six-week run. O. J. Merrell, a member of the faculty of the NMSC Language and Literature Division, is director.

As many as nine hours of college credit per summer can be earned by students associated with the Ice House Theatre. The three-hour courses offered are Rehearsing and Performing a Major Role, Rehearsing and Performing Supporting Roles, Stage Manage-

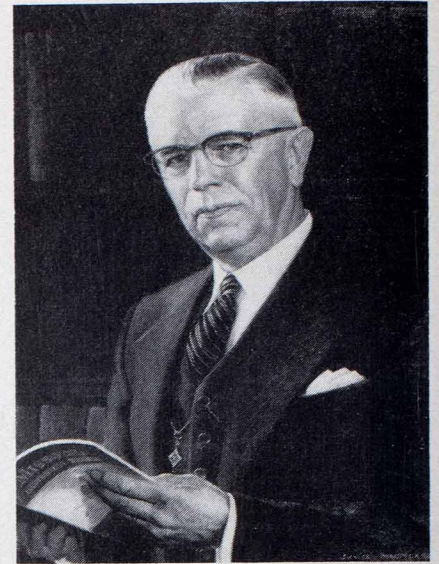
ment, Technical Theatre Procedures, and Theatre Business Practices.

The Ice House Theatre itself was the first ice house west of the Mississippi and has been a part of Hannibal's history since 1854 as the Stillwell Cold Storage Company.

Queen Victoria's table was once bountifully supplied with meat from Hannibal. Most of the crown heads of Europe enjoyed the Stillwell Export Ham, the top quality brand of the company. It was served on transatlantic crossings and on crack passenger trains in the late 1800's.

In the summer of 1912, the storage company was the scene of another type of gala occasion, the Ice House Ball. Called the social event of the season, the ball was famous as the first "air conditioned" party in known history. Liquid refreshments were served from huge hollowed cakes of ice, and the affair received lengthy coverage in both the St. Louis and Kansas City papers.

The building has been renovated and air conditioned for the comfort of

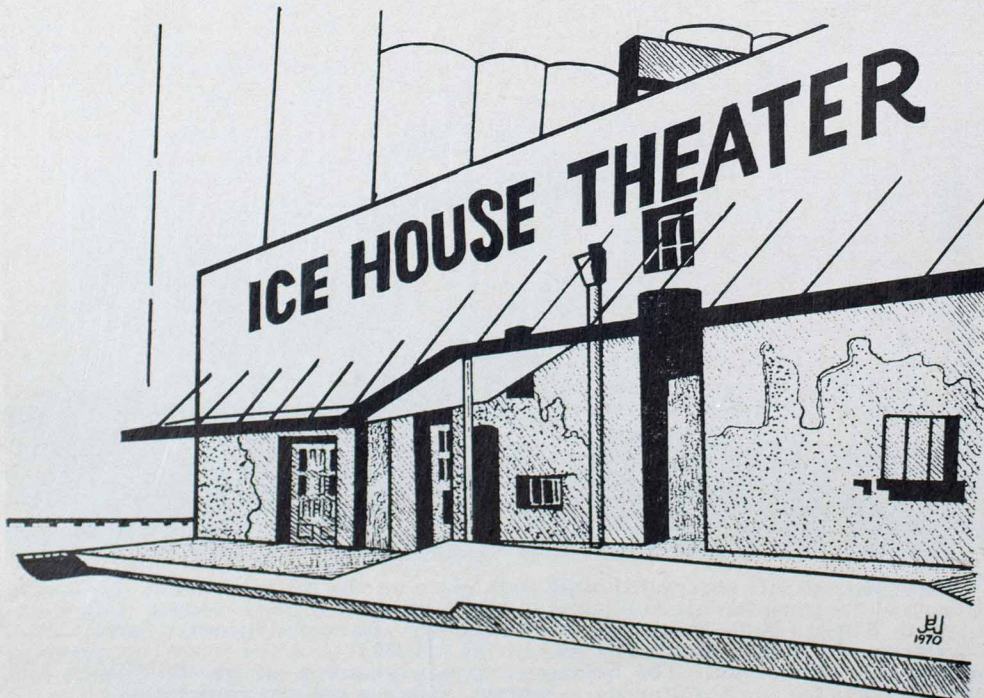


Floyd C. Shoemaker

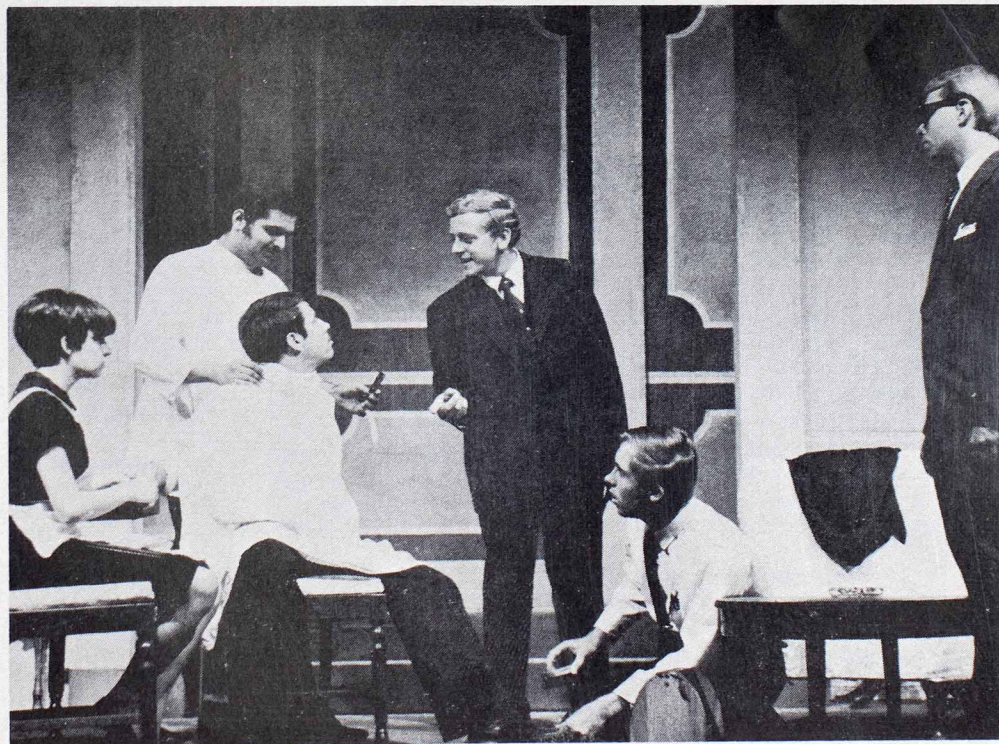

## Bulldog Baseball Squad Improves Batting Statistics in '70 Campaign

Before the start of the 1970 baseball campaign, Northeast Missouri State Coach Sam Nugent knocked on wood, hoping his offense and defense would hold up this spring.

However, the Bulldogs continued to have problems with these departments. When the dust had cleared, they had written a sub-par 8-20-1 ledger, finishing in the MIAA Conference cellar. Final batting statistics would indicate an improvement, as the team average jumped 25 points to .242. Hitters collected eight more extra base blows, and produced 15 more runs than last year. But getting the timely safety still plagued the Purple and White.

A porous defense, especially on the infield, caused Nugent to lose sleep. The mentor, however, thinks with a year of experience under their belts, third baseman Rocky Reimer (Tuscola, Ill.) and second baseman Bob Donahue (St. Louis) could get the job done in 1971. After they were installed as regulars in April, Reimer batted .222, and Donahue, .228. Nugent hopes freshman Garold Ritz (Ottumwa, Ia.), junior varsity player most of the spring, can handle shortstop duties next season. He looked promising in eight varsity trips to the plate, smashing a homer in the final contest.

Another problem facing the Bulldog boss is replacing the top four outfielders, Jim Arico (St. Louis), Howie Rosenbluth (New York, N. Y.), Charles Blazicek (St. Louis), and Mike Gilbert (St. Louis). Harry Van Epps (Burlington, Ia.) and Steve Bettis (Davenport, Ia.) are bright prospects, but they saw only limited action this spring.

Since first baseman-pitcher Mike Hooker (Washington, Pa.) will be the only front-line hurler lost to the squad, it would appear the hill staff might be the strongest category going into the new campaign. "I was pleased with the pitchers after the weather permitted us to maintain a regular rotation," comments Nugent, who had his share of sore arms in the early going. The staff earned-run average this past campaign was 3.66.

Ace righthander Ted Wilson (Florissant), who spun a 2.88 earned-run average while logging 50 innings, the most for any moundman, will be back in 1971. Bill Schnarre (St. Charles),

(2.14), Dick Housley (Davenport, Ia.) (3.24), and Bob Miller (St. Louis) (4.70) are also slated to return.

Another optimistic note is the fact catcher Charles Blakley (St. Joseph), the top batsman with a .362 average, will be behind the plate again next year. Blakley paced the club in five other departments—runs, 19; hits, 34; home runs, six; total bases, 59; and runs batted in, 26. These statistics place the junior backstop in the Bulldog record books since 1965 when the sport was revived at the College.

Before the cancellation of the 1970 finale, a May 21st twinbill with Harris Teachers, the Bulldogs had hoped to shatter the contemporary school mark for most victories in one season, nine.

## Wrestlers Win Third MIAA Championship

State College wrestlers parlayed depth and balance to claim the school's third consecutive MIAA Conference wrestling title on March 7, and then placed 22nd in the NCAA College Division championships the following week at Ashland (O.) College.

Bulldog champions in the MIAA meet were 134-pounder Harry Brown (St. Louis), 177-pounder Stan Huggins (Bloomfield, Ia.), and heavyweight Rich Beard (Ottawa, Ill.). Finishing second in their weight flights were 118-pounder Curd Alexander (Edwardsville, Ill.), 142-pounder Matt Stallings (St. Louis), 158-pounder Steve Miller (Cedar Rapids, Ia.), 167-pounder Dan Klein (Harlan, Ia.), and 190-pounder John Sticht (Roxana, Ill.). Two Harlan grapplers, Larry Kersten and Roger Hodapp, were third in the 126 and 150-pound class, respectively.

Beard closed out four brilliant seasons with a sixth-place finish in the nationals. He was fourth in his flight two years ago. These accomplishments earned him All-American honors.

NMSC compiled a 6-8 dual ledger this past winter against some of the most rugged competition the team has ever faced. The Bulldogs also finished second in the Graceland College Invitational, third in the Southwest Missouri State College Invitational, and fourth in the Northwest Missouri State College Tourney.

## NMSC Takes Second in MIAA All-Sports

Northeast Missouri State College, winner the past two years, finished second behind Southwest Missouri State College in the competition for the 1969-70 Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association All-Sports Championship, according to Conference Commissioner Roy F. Brown.

The Bulldogs accumulated 28½ points, two more than the Bears. Central Missouri State was third with 35; Northwest Missouri, fourth with 36½; Southeast Missouri, fifth with 38½; and Missouri University (Rolla), sixth with 45.

Since 1924-25, NMSC has either won or shared the top spot 12 times; finished second, six times; third, nine; fourth, five; fifth, once; and sixth, nine times. Between 1959 and 1965, the Bulldogs captured seven consecutive championships.

# Tennis Team Wins Seventh Straight Crown

The State College tennis team, which captured an unprecedented seventh straight MIAA Conference tennis title and tied for first in the NCAA Midwest Regional Tourney this spring, was preparing to compete in the NCAA National Championships at Claifornia State College (Hayward) the week of June 7th when the **Nemo-scope** went to press.

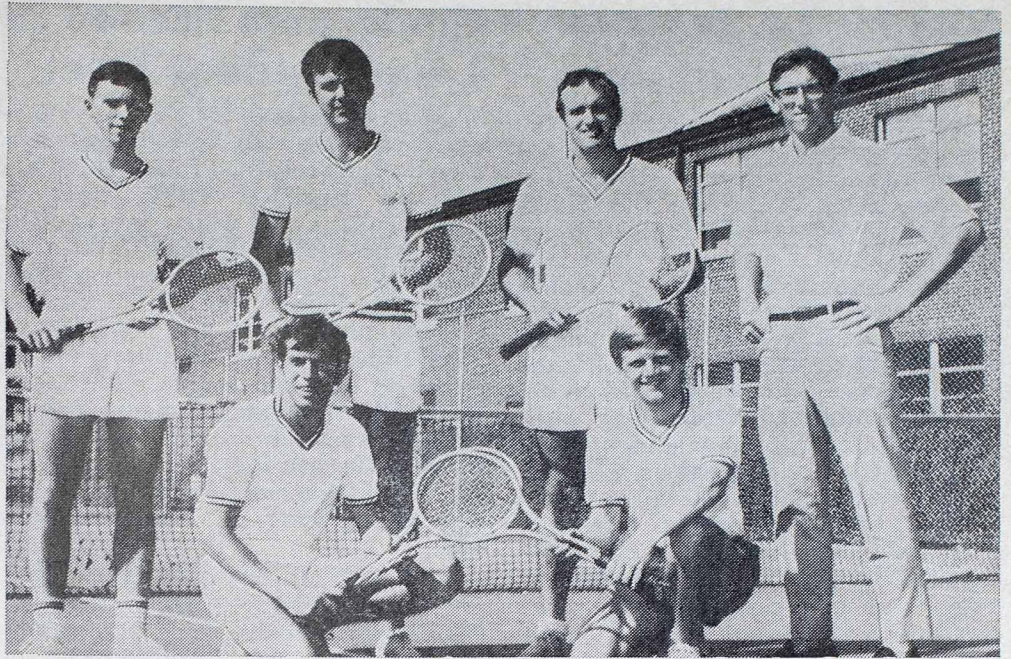
Last year, the Bulldogs came within a whisker of winning the school's first national team title, finishing one point behind San Fernando Valley (Calif.) State.

The 1970 netmen had little trouble in May notching another league crown for NMSC, registering 46 points and taking seven of nine flights. Southwest Missouri was a distant second with 16 points. Junior Terry Taylor (Marshalltown, Ia.), senior Ken Clow (Ottumwa, Ia.), senior Mike Derr (Keokuk, Ia.), freshman Steve Chase (Keokuk, Ia.), and senior Ron Sterchi (Olney, Ill.) were winners in singles competition. Sterchi and Taylor teamed up to nab No. 1 doubles, and Chase combined with Tim Young (Keokuk, Ia.) to capture No. 3 doubles.

The Bulldogs, however, had to settle for a standoff with host Northern Iowa for top honors in the Midwest Regional Tourney, in which they claimed an undisputed championship the past two years. Taylor finished second in singles. Young and Sam Duncan (Kirksville) were runners-up in doubles.

In other action this season, Jerry Meyer's racquet men compiled a 5-2 dual mark, finished second in the Ninth Annual Northeast Missouri State College Invitational, seventh in the Northern Illinois University Invitational, and second in a triangular with Missouri and Arkansas. Dual setbacks were at the hands of Missouri and Bradley.

Clow, with 16 triumphs in 20 matches, had recorded the best individual ledger before the national encounter. Taylor was next with a 14-8 mark. Clow was the only returnee from NMSC's four-man contingent that participated in the 1969 championships.

Brownlee Track and Field Awards, presented each year to the outstanding athlete or athletes, participating in that sport. Recipients must possess qualities of leadership, scholarship, citizenship and ambition.

Logan and Allen served as co-captains of the 1969 Bulldog cross-country squad, and were selected recently as co-captains of the 1970 track team. They finished second and third, respectively in the Conference Cross-Country Meet last fall. Logan captured first-place honors in the mile run at the 1970 Conference Indoor Track Meet two months ago in Columbia. Allen is a four-year monogram winner in cross-country, and has earned letters in track the past two seasons. Logan has lettered in cross-country four times and track once before this spring.

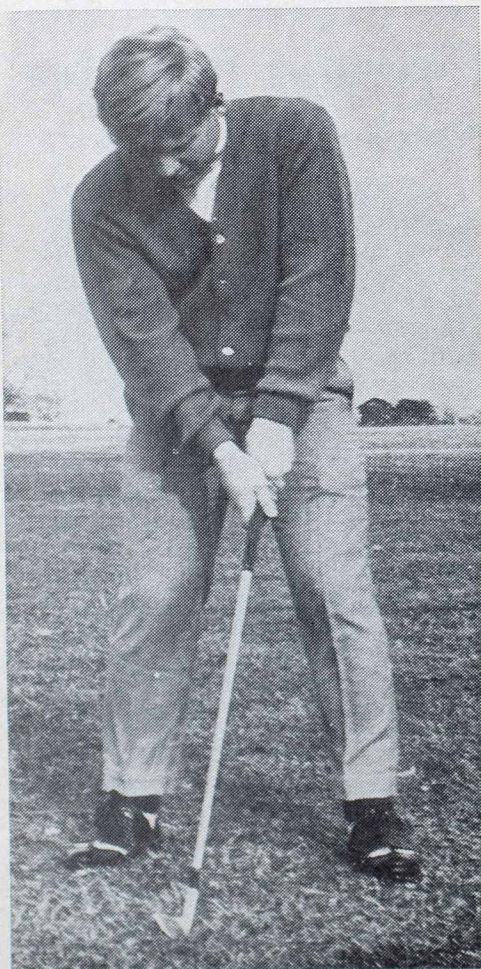

## Cindermen Second in Loop Outdoor Meet

When the Spring issue of the *Nemoscope* went to press, the Bulldog trackmen had just returned from the NCAA Midwest Regional Track Meet at Cedar Falls, Ia., in which they tied for third with Mankato (Minn.) State.

Coach Kenneth Gardner's thin-clads also hosted the MIAA Conference Outdoor meet the weekend of May 16th, failing in a bid for a clean-sweep of the two league encounters. In March, the Bulldogs shaded Southeast Missouri State, 75-73, for the indoor title, but they were outpointed by the Indians, 96½-77½, in the outdoor affair, which was held at Kirksville.

All-American Don Allbritton (Rock Island, Ill.), who won the NCAA College Division pole vault crown last year, re-wrote one league indoor and two league outdoor records. The versatile sophomore cleared the indoor pole vault bar at 14'11" and the outdoor bar at 14'8". He leaped 6'9" in the outdoor high jump, but his best height this spring was a school mark, 6'10", at the Drake University Relay Decathlon competition.

Allbritton also shattered the Midwest Regional pole vault standard he established in 1969 by reaching 15'6" in that event. He holds the school

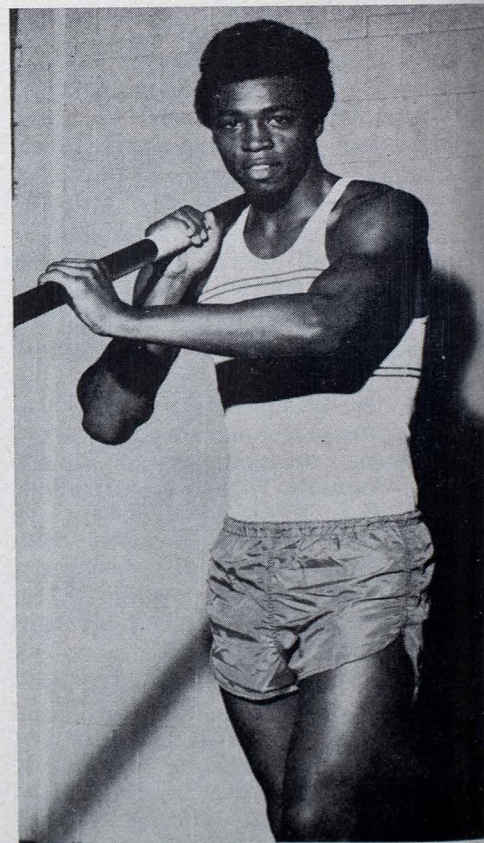

Inside last winter, the Bulldogs competed in the Robert Karnes Invitational at Des Moines, Ia.; finished first in a triangular with Northern Iowa and Western Illinois; second in a triangular with Illinois State and Western Illinois; and first in a five-team meet at Western Illinois.
