THE BOARD OF REGENTS of Northeast Missouri State University will hold its regular June meeting at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday in the Conference Room of the Student Union. Two new regents will participate in this meeting. Mrs. Mary Erwin of Shelbina and Mrs. Marietta Jayne of Kirksville were appointed to six-year terms by Governor Joseph Teasdale in May. Both women are NMSU graduates. Mrs. Erwin received a B.S.E. degree in 1957; Mrs. Jayne received a B.S. in Social Science in 1942.

A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS BILL which would have appropriated funds to state institutions for improvements did not pass the state legislature this session.
