Friday, Jan. 22, 1926

Clear this morning and colder than yesterday. Nursing the mumps. Swollen pretty good today. Still feel fine. Don't work at all.

Russell and Mildred went to Carls this evening. Donnie Zeigler and family were here until 11. Had music on the radio.

Saturday, Jan. 23, 1926

Clear today. Government thermometer at Kirksville registered 10° below zero yesterday. Probably colder here. Almost as cold today.

Still feel good. No work. Russell went to Carls. Mildred stayed there all night last night.

Sunday, Jan. 24, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Warmer. Jaws still swelling but feel as good as I ever did.

Mildred came home from Carls this afternoon.

Had no company.
Snowing at bedtime.

Monday, Jan. 25, 1926

Cloudy most all day.
About $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches snow fell
last night. Didn't thaw
much today.

Dad and Russell are
hauling wood.

Resting as usual.

Russell went to Carls.

Tuesday, Jan. 26, 1926

Snowed some last night.
Clear day. Has thawed all
day with flurries of snow
this evening. Colder about
nightfall.

Dad and Russell are
hauling wood.

Wednesday, Jan. 27, 1926

Snowed some last night.
Clear most of the day today.

gone this evening.

Dad and mother went
to town. Eggs \$3.48

W. O. S. Jefferson City Mo.
Russell went to Carls.

Friday, Jan. 29, 1926

Partly cloudy, warmer.
Dad and Russell hauled
wood this morning. Too
slick this afternoon.

My jaws are almost
normal now but am still
taking care of myself.

Paper says, "Senate Votes
To Enter World Court."

Saturday, Jan. 30, 1926

Partly cloudy today.
Mildred went to Frank
Bureseth's evening to
stay tonight.

Russell went to Carls.
Heard President Cool-
idge speak over radio.

Sunday, Jan. 31, 1926

Rained last night and is cloudy this morning. The roads are very muddy.

Rained this afternoon.

Russell went to Carls this morning. Mildred came home this afternoon.

Heard Madam Schumann ^{Heintz} sing over radio.

Monday, Feb. 1, 1926

Cloudy and foggy today.

Big old time fiddling contest at Omaha Nebraska. Heard it over radio. about 48 fiddlers competed.

Gabe Stevens won the contest. Was sure a good fiddler almost a violinist.

Russell went to Carls. Roads are very bad.

Tuesday, Feb. 2, 1926

Cloudy and foggy all day. Not cold but very damp and disagreeable. Weather forecast says probably snow tonight.

Am not working any yet but my jaws are almost normal.

Wednesday, Feb. 3, 1926

Still Damp and foggy this morning. Did not rain or snow last night.

Charles Simler had a sale today.

Cleared off and froze up this evening.

Russell and Mildred went to Lee Fortneys this evening to play cards.

Thursday, Feb. 4, 1926

Clear and Colder today.

Dad went to Novinger to order a car for cattle. He took our fur to send by express to, Percys Fur House, we had nine hides.

Was out doors some today first to amount to anything since two weeks ago today when I took the mumps.

Friday, Feb. 5, 1926

Clear today. Helped do the chores this morning for the first time in two weeks.

Mother and I drove to Carls this afternoon.

Dad went to Yarrow to bill out the car of cattle. The car will be set at Youngstown and go out Sunday morning.

Saturday, Feb. 6, 1926

Clear and warmer today. Took cattle to Youngstown this morning. 17 calves, 5 yearlings and 1 cow. Lee Fortney took one cow.

Went to a dance at Sidney Osbornes he lives on the Holman place. Carl, Delmas and Katherine Bregg and Leta Muir went with us.

Sunday, Feb. 7, 1926

Partly cloudy and warmer. Dad and Russell went to Youngstown early this morning to load the cattle. They go to St. Louis. The cattle made a small load.

Grandpa came home yesterday. He, Mildred and Mother and Dad went to Carl's this afternoon. A bunch came to play cards this evening.

Monday, Feb. 8, 1926

Partly cloudy today with a little rain this afternoon.

Dad hauled wood today.

Russell and I shucked shock corn this morning and transplanted peach trees this afternoon. The trees are some which we budded ourselves.

Russell went to Carl's this evening to do his chores.

Tuesday, Feb. 9, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Dad hauled wood this morning and posts this afternoon.

Russell and I shucked corn.

I went to Carl's to do his chores.

Luella Bress came home from school with Mildred. We all went to Harry Zeigler's this evening to a party. Today is Beryl's birthday he is seventeen.

Wednesday, Feb. 10, 1926

Coleber and partly cloudy today. Butchered today. Dredged roads this evening.

Russell went to Carls to do his chores. He thinks he is taking the mumps. Has been about 3 weeks since I took them.

Killed two hogs weight about two hundred.

Thursday, Feb. 11, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Returns from furs came day before yesterday, \$6.05

Returns from cattle came yesterday netted a little over \$1100.

Sawed wood this afternoon. Christopher Hediger, Lee Fortney and Elmer ^{and} Uncle Bill Pinkerton helped.

Went to Carls this afternoon. Russell has the mumps.

Friday, Feb. 12, 1926

Clear and warmer today.
Mother, Dad and I went
to Kirksville today.

Had my teeth cleaned and
five filled.

Eggs # 4.20.

Carl did not take mail today
as he has a bad cold. His sub-
stitute, Eugene Boen took the
mail for him.

Saturday, Feb. 13, 1926

Cloudy today. Split wood this
morning. Dad went to Harry
Zeigler and Donnie Zeigler
to see about fencing the west
eighty. Mildred went to
Kirksville with Ben Bures.

Flora and Stella Zeigler were
here this morning.

I went to Abbie Braggs
this morning.

Got a comic valentine.

Sunday, Feb. 14, 1926

Cloudy and misty this morning. Snowed some this afternoon. Still cloudy this evening. Dad, mother, Mildred and Grandpa went to Carls this afternoon. Gene Boen called this afternoon.

Monday, Feb. 15, 1926

Clear and Colder today. Went to Christopher Hedigers this morning to see about getting a wagon. Took Mildred to school. Helped wash this morning. Dad hauled posts from Wm Johnson. He bought 300. Got wagon from Hedigers this afternoon and fixed to take hogsto Kirksville tomorrow.

Tuesday, Feb. 16, 1926

Clear and cold this morning.
Took hogs to Kirksville.

Had 3 loads 20 head. Beryl Zeigler took one load for us as Russell has the mumps. The hogs will be shipped tomorrow from Kirksville to St. Louis. They weighed 4260 lbs.

Cloudy and drizzly this morn.

Wednesday, Feb. 17, 1926

Cloudy and raining this morning. Took Christophers wagon home and got a wagon bed from Carls.

Has rained steadily all day. Went to Carls to do his chores. Heard 14th Cavalry band from Ft. des Moines last night over radio. From Station W. H. O.

Thursday, Feb. 18, 1926

Started snowing about 7 o'clock this morning and snowed until about 5 this evening. The wind is strong and is very stormy. Freezing some this evening.

Took Mildred to school this morning and got her this evening.

Carl did not take mail today.

Friday, Feb. 19, 1926

Clear today. Snow drifted badly. Took Mildred to school today. Went to Carl's this evening to do his chores.

Heard Miss Marion Talley a Kansas City girl sing over radio from New York City where she sang in Metropolitan Opera Co. day before yesterday for first time. Has a good Soprano voice.

Big fiddling contest at W.O.S. to bed at 1.30

Saturday, Feb. 20, 1926

Clear and warm today. Very muddy.

Did not work much today. Split a little wood was all. Went to Carl's this evening to do his chores.

Russell is practically over the mumps but does not work any yet. He only has had them on one side.

Sunday, Feb. 21, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Warm.

Did not do much today.

Have been reading "The Wit and Humor of America", put out by the "Literary Digest". It is very good. Borrowed it from Carl.

Mildred and I went to Lee Fortney's this evening. Stayed until bedtime.

Monday, Feb. 22, 1926

Cloudy and colder today.
Split wood today.

Have had our radio a little over a year. Henry Field is having a big celebration today and tomorrow. We heard his male quartet contest this afternoon. Fiddling contest this evening. Heard K.F.R.Z. at Kirksville with Hal Scott's trio broadcasting. Clear at night.

Tuesday, Feb. 23, 1926

Clear today. Snow almost gone.
Split wood and listened to Henry Field's fiddling and accordion contests.

Mother and I went to Carls this afternoon mother to stay all night. Isabelle Fortney and Leota Muir came home with me. About a dozen young folks came this evening to listen to radio and play cards. Took Isabelle and Leota to Fortneys about 11.30.

Wednesday, Feb. 24, 1926

Cloudy and foggy today.

Split wood this morning.

Russell split some, about the first work he has done for two weeks on account of the mumps.

Has rained almost all afternoon and is still raining at bedtime.

Went to Carls this evening.

Mother did not come home this evening.

Thursday, Feb. 25, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Split wood today. Russell is working some now. I went to Carls this evening to do his chores. Mother came home with me. The baby is pretty sick.

Friday, Feb. 26, 1926

Snowed this morning and have had occasional flurries all day. The snow has melted almost as fast as it fell.

Split wood today. Russell went to the school house this evening. I took Mildred to Carl's this evening. She is going to stay all night and help Leota over the week end.

Saturday, Feb. 27, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Finished splitting wood this morning. Went to Carl's this evening to get Mildred.

Dad and mother went to Abbie Bragg's to a birthday party this evening. Russell, Mildred and I went to a dance at Sidney Osbornes. Leota Muir and Isabelle Fortney went with us. Had a good time and got home about 2.30.

Sunday, Feb. 28, 1926

Clear and warm today.
Roads are drying fast but no
cars are running yet.

Leota Muir and Isabelle Frutney
came this morning. Carl, Golda
and Catherine Braag came this
evening.

Heard the London String quart-
et play over radio from New
York City.

Monday, March 1, 1926

Very windy all day. Mostly
fair, with snow flurries this
morning.

Dragged the roads this
morning. Dad hauled posts.
Dad and mother went to Carl's this after-
noon. Carl and Velda both have
bad colds. The baby is better.

Tuesday, March 2, 1926

Clear and colder today. Still windy. Dad hauled posts today. Russell and I sawed corner posts this afternoon. We are getting them from Harry Zeigler.

Mildred did not go to school today as she is sick. A kind of Flu. Something like Carl's folks are having.

Wednesday, March 3, 1926

Cloudy this morning. Clear this afternoon.

Went to Kirksville with Carl and Leota this morning. They took the baby to Dr. Ellis. Mother stayed with Velela who has a bad cold. Carl has not taken the mail since last Friday.

Dad and Russell hauled posts today. I got license tags for our car today. Cost \$10.50.

Thursday, March 4, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Dad and I hauled posts this morning. Russell and Dad set corner posts this afternoon while I scattered line posts.

Mother is not feeling well today. Has something like the flu. Has been in bed most all day. Mildred has not gone to school since Monday.

Friday, March 5, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Made troughs to feed sheep in this evening.

Mother has been in bed almost all day but feels better this evening.

Russell went to cars after supper.

One year ago yesterday we heard Calvin Coolidge inaugurated president over radio. A few days later received a newspaper from my cousin in Los Angeles containing photographs of the ceremony, transmitted by wire from Washington.

Saturday, March 6, 1926

Cloudy and raining all day. Much colder this evening. Roads which were good are very muddy. Dad went to Kirksville with team.

I went hunting on Hog Creek this afternoon. No game.

Eggs \$9.90.

Got returns from Hags shipped.
#489.

Sunday, March 7, 1926

Windy and very cold this morning with a little snow. Partly cloudy and cold this afternoon.

Heard Josef Hoffman pianist, and Elisabeth Day soprano, over radio from New York.

Am taking quite a cold.

Monday, March 8, 1926

Clear today, still cold.

Cleaned out fence row between us and affie Bragg.

Today is Grandpas birthday he is 87.

Russell, Mildred and I went to uncle Bill Pinkertons this evening. Elmer is preparing to go to Montana.

Tuesday, March 9, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Took out fence and set posts between our north west forty and Hedigers place.

Russell, Mildred and I went to Ben Bireses this evening.

Wednesday, March 10, 1926

Rained last night and is still raining this morning.

Grandpa received two cakes from Kansas through the mail.

Has rained steadily all day, changing to snow about sundown.

Thursday, March 11, 1926

Some snow on the ground this morning, but did not last long. Cloudy most all day but practically clear at nightfall. Not much colder. Did not work much today. Only cleaned out the chicken houses.

Russell went to Carls after supper. Had a good radio program.

Friday, March 12, 1926

Cloudy this morning. Started snowing about 10 A.M. and has snowed all day but there is not much on the ground. Freezing some. Did not work any today.

Saturday, March 13, 1926

Clear and lots colder this morning. 12° above zero.

Took out fence between wheat ground and cornfield this morning.

Warming up lots.

Fixed fence around barn lot this evening.

Russell and I went to Donnie Zeiglers after supper.

Sunday, March 14, 1926

Snowing this morning, snowed until about 4 P.M. Not much snow on ground.

Mildred and Dad went to Carls this afternoon. Russell went to Dee Cooks.

Beryl Zeigler came this afternoon. Russell and Mildred went to Abbie Braggs after supper.

Monday, March 15, 1926

Snowed last night and some this forenoon. About all melted before night.

Worked on fence today. Finished putting in posts of north string of west eighty.

Tuesday, March 16, 1926

Clear and some warmer today.

Worked on fence between our place and Donnie Zeiglers.

Started to read "The Doom Trail" in the "Globe Democrat." am reading another story by the same author in the "Daily Express". It is "Porto Bello Gold."

Wednesday, March 17, 1926

Clear and warm today. Heard frogs for first time this Spring.

Set posts in fence between our place and Donnie Zeiglers. We have the south half, but are putting the woven wire on almost all of the half mile. He already has woven wire on the extreme north end.

Thursday, March 18, 1926

Clear most of the day today and very warm.

Dad went to Kirksville today to get a load of wire. It is 32 inches high 10-10-12. 12 inch stay. Cost 30¢ per rod. Got it at Farmers Exchange.

Russell and I run ^{posts} bags and took out fence between wheat and corn this morning. Washed the Chevrolet this evening. Eggs \$10.08.

Friday, March 19, 1926

Cloudy today but still warm.

Put in posts and worked on fence between our place and Zeigler Bros.

Mother and I went to Carl's this evening after supper. Earl Bures and Nellie Page are working there.

Saturday, March 20, 1926

Clear and warm today.
 Dad went to Kirksville for more wire. He bought 400 rods.
 Russell and I policed up and down the roads this morning.
 Got out rocks for deadmen this afternoon. Isabell Fortney came this evening and went with Russell, Mildred and I to a dance at Dee Cooks. Got home about 1.30.

Sunday, March 21, 1926

Some cooler and partly cloudy.
 Carmie and Ruth niece stopped this afternoon. Ruth applied for the school. Dad is a director and has recieved one other application from a miss Hamilton.
 Dad, mother, Grandpa and Mildred went to Eugene Boens ~~the~~ after supper.

Heard 14th Cabelry band from Ft. Des Moines. over radio.

Monday, March 22, 1926

Cloudy this morning. Partly clear
this afternoon. Rained a little night
Still warm today.

Put in posts in string east of
other place.

Uncle Bill Pinkerton came this
afternoon.

Tuesday, March 23, 1926

Clear and warm today.
Worked on fence along road by the
creek.

Wednesday, March 24, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Cooler this evening.

Finished putting in posts today. Put in some "deadmen" this afternoon. Russell, Mildred and I went to Lee Fortneys after supper.

Thursday, March 25, 1926

Partly clear today and colder.

Sowed oats in field west of wheat and orchard.

Russell, Mildred and I went to Carl's this evening after supper. Isabell Fortney and Leta Muir went with us. Delmas and Catharine came. Belle Jones and Earl Bress are working there. Had strawberries and cake, the baby is better.

Friday, March 26, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Ground is frozen. Put in "Deadmen" this A.M. Russell and I went to Kirksville with Carl after supper. Earland "Senie" went too. I went to the opening of the new theater, "The Kennedy". Had a fine show. The rest went to a wrestling match between Jake Reed, state champion, and Gust Karras. Reed won the third fall when Karras was hurt.

Saturday, March 27, 1926

Partly cloudy. Some warmer. Still cool. Russell and I fixed fence around lot east of barn lot. Found first calf today.

Dad, Mother Mildred and grandpa went to Kirksville. Grandpa did not come home. Eggs 13. 41.

Marellis Johnson came this afternoon. They are having a party tonight.

Sunday, March 28, 1926

Snowed some this morning. Partly cloudy all day.

Carl and family came this morning and were here all day. Eugene Boen and Beryl Zigler came this afternoon.

Russell, Mildred, and I went to Christopher Hedigers with Beryl after supper.

Monday, March 29, 1926

Cloudy and raw today. Froze some last night.

Put woven and barb wire on fence between our west eighty and Hedigers place.

Four lambs today. The first this spring.

Snowing some at bedtime.

Tuesday, March 30, 1926

Snowed last night and all day today. Very windy but not very cold. Still snowing at bedtime. About the biggest snow we have had this winter. Drifting badly.

Took Mildred to school this morning. Delmas Bragg came this evening. Russell and I went to school with him.

Found another calf.

Wednesday, March 31, 1926

Still snowing and drifting this morning. Snowed until almost noon. Biggest snow and worst drifts we have had this winter. Clear late this evening.

Went to school with Mildred this morning. The roads are drifted shut.

Delmas Bragg brought books home this afternoon.

Five lambs today.

Thursday, April 1, 1926

Cloudy this morning. Started snowing about noon, snowed steadily all day. Still snowing at 10.30 P.M.

Dad, Russell and I broke the roads this morning. Drifted worst I ever saw. Dad and Mother went to Lee Fortneys this afternoon to see new girl about three days old.

I went to Carls after supper.

Friday, April 2, 1926

Snowed all night last night and until about 9.30 A.M. today. About 1 ft of snow fell. Did not drift so bad as the other snow.

Cloudy this afternoon. Started snowing about dark.

Did not work much today. Only took care of stock.

Heard big inter state fiddling contest over radio from W.O.S. Jefferson City Mo.

Saturday, April 3, 1926

Clear today. Russell and I broke the roads this morning.

The mail came today for first time since Tuesday. The roads have been drifted so badly he could not make the route.

Heard big pageant, "America" broadcast from W. O. A. W. at Omaha.

Sunday, April 4, 1926

Partly cloudy today and warm. The snow has melted quite a bit yesterday and today.

Today is Easter Sunday. It is also Dads birthday. He is fifty-five years old.

Russell went to Carls this afternoon.

Monday, April 5, 1926

Cloudy today with sprinkles of rain and sleet at different times.

Hauled two loads of baled clover hay from the other place to feed the sheep.

Hauled a load of wood from Harry Zeiglers to the school house. This is the last week of school. The roads are very bad. The snow is melting rapidly but ground is still covered.

Tuesday, April 6, 1926

Rained and froze last night. Cloudy and raining all day today. Snow is not melting much it is so cold.

I went to Pure Air this morning. Mildred, Mother and I went to Carl's this afternoon. Stopped at Hediger and Boens.

Dad went to school election. Abbie Bragg was re-elected director Ben Bures and Dad are the other two. Beryl Zeigler came this morning. No mail today.

5 Wednesday, April 7, 1926

Cloudy today. Damp and raw. Dad and I hauled a load of wood from Harry Zeiglers this ~~morning~~ ^{afternoon}. Russell, Mildred and I went to Ben Buresses after supper. We played pitch and rook until about 11 o'clock.

Thursday, April 8, 1926

Clear and warm. Snow melted a lot today but there is still lots on the ground.

Dad went to Kirksville today the roads are bad. Eggs \$16.40.

Russell and I cleaned out hog house this morning. I helped mother wash this morning.

Friday, April 9, 1926

Cloudy this morning. Clear this afternoon. Worked on fence this afternoon. Last day of this term of school.

About thirty young folks came after supper. We played cards, made music, and danced some. We served coffee, cake, fruit and candy.

Went to Fortnays with Isabelle and Leta. To bed at 1:30.

Saturday, April 10, 1926

Partly clear this morning.

Cloudy and sprinkling rain this afternoon. Most of the snow is gone but still some drifts.

Fed last of hay in stack today. Put woven wire on fence between our place and Donnie Zeiglers.

Carl borrowed Dex to ride on route as one of his horses is lame.

Sunday, April 11, 1926

Cloudy today. Still some snow in drifts.

Carl brought Dex home this morning. Dad and Mother went to Carl's afternoon.

Russell and Mildred went to Harry Zeiglers after dinner.

Have 30 lambs.

Heard Madam Temple sing over radio.

Monday, April 12, 1926

Clear today.

I went to Pure Air this morning after staples. Russell and Dad fixed fence. Cashed check from Frank Bures. Pay for shucking corn. Russell, Dad and I went to Carl's afternoon to help get Cow out of ditch. Finished fence between our place and Donnie Zeiglers this afternoon.

Tuesday, April 13, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Put woven wire on fence from
Creek to the other place today.

Wednesday, April 14, 1926

Cloudy today. Cool and
disagreeable.

Finished putting woven and
barb wire on fence around west
lighty.

Sold Harry Zeigler half of wheat
straw stack. Feed is very
scarce.

Thursday, April 15, 1926

Clear and warmer today.
Brilliant Northern lights last night.

Drug the roads and docked 32 lambs this morning. 31 ~~we~~ have had lambs.

Russell and I cleaned out the barn this afternoon. Dad piled old posts out of fence on west eighty.

Friday, April 16, 1926

Clear and warm.

Sowed clover on and harrowed the ground we sowed in oats before the snow. Russell and I sowed oats and clover on the soy bean field this afternoon. Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Kirksville this afternoon.

Russell, Mildred and I went to a dance at Byrd Daniels. Belle Jones went with us.
Took at 1.30 Eggs 3.00

Saturday, April 17, 1926

Partly cloudy this morning.
Dad plowed some patches on the creek.
Russell and I finished piling the
old posts.

Planted potatoes and plowed
some this afternoon.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went
to Carls after supper. Sprinkled
rain a little about dark. A few
drifts of snow yet.

Sunday, April 18, 1926

Clear and cool today.

Russell Dad and I went to Carls
this morning. Carl and family came
this afternoon. Albert Boen came
this evening. He stayed for supper
and until almost 1/8.

Monday, April 19, 1926

Clear and warmer today.

I plowed on the creek this morning.

Dad went to Alex Bozarth's sawmill, on Jimmie Hedigers place for lumber to make gates.

Russell, Dad and I helped Ray Bragg with Mare this afternoon. She died. Eighth calf came this afternoon.

Tuesday, April 20, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Plowed the garden and harrowed stalks this morning.

Mother and I went to Carlo's to get strawberry plants this afternoon. Made garden and set out strawberry plants this afternoon.

Wednesday, April 21, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

I burned stalks this morning. Russell and Dad fixed the harrow and made a gate. I harrowed stalks this afternoon. Russell and Dad hung the gate.

Alfred Olson came this afternoon. One of our cows died. She had been weak. She got fast under a fence with her head down till.

Thursday, April 22, 1926

Rained a big rain last night and until about noon today.

We fed the cattle first feed of hay out of the barn.

Russell and I took Ira Cooks male hog home. We have had him since Jan. 3.

Friday, April 23, 1926

Foggy this morning. Rained hard about an hour at 4⁰⁰ clock. And later about dark.

Russell and dad went to Kirksville with the team.

I went to the woods this morning and helped clean house some.

Saturday, April 24, 1926

Cloudy today. Cool and Windy with sprinkles of rain this morning.

I went to Annie Braggs this morning. Russell, Dad and I worked on the barn lot fence today. worked in the shop some this afternoon.

Sunday, April 25, 1926

Mostly clear today.

Donnie Zeigler came this morning. He and I went to Boens to find a place to play ball. We also went to Carl's.

I took Mother and Mildred to Carl's this afternoon. Russell and I played baseball with about a dozen others on Boens place. The first time we have practiced this spring.

Monday, April 26, 1926

Clear and some warmer today.

Russell and I fixed fence and dragged the roads this morning. Dad and Harry Zeigler went to Norwinger this morning. Russell and I fixed fence in ditches on west eighty this afternoon. Dad and Mildred went to Kirksville to see Henry Hediger about renting pasture for some horses.

Tuesday, April 27, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

We fixed water gaps in the fence on west eighty this morning.

Helped Carl saw wood this afternoon.

Albert Born sawed for him.

One sow found pigs today. She is the first. Three more will probably find pigs. Four should have.

Wednesday, April 28, 1926

Clear and cool today.

I plowed in the hog pasture today. Russell and Dad scattered manure which was piled on the ground.

Dad went to look at pasture on Henry Hedigers place. Velda came home with him. Abbie Bragg and Catherine came after supper. Russell, Mildred and I took Velda home and went to a dance at Lester Zeiglers. Belle Jones went with us. Got home about 1.

Thursday, April 29, 1926

Clear and some warmer today.

I disced the ground in the hog pasture which was not plowed. Jim Ribler stopped this afternoon. I took a plowshare to Albert Boens to have it sharpened late this afternoon. Did not get it sharpened. Dad, Mother and Mildred went to uncle Bill Pinkertons after supper. Ruth Niece came to see about getting school. They decided to hire a miss McDonald yesterday.

Friday, April 30, 1926

Clear and much warmer today.

We planted a small potato patch this morning. Russell and Dad fixed harness this morning and sheared the mules this afternoon.

Russell went to Carl's just after dinner to get a baseball. Dad went to Boens early this morning to get a plowshare which Albert had sharpened. I plowed in the hog pasture all day.

Saturday, May 1, 1926

Clear and warm today.

I plowed all day. Dad, mother, and Mildred went to Kirkville this morning. Mildred took her first music lesson today. Harry Farris barn burned about 1 P. M. They were not at home. Russell and I went to the fire with Harry Zeiglers. Russell and Dad went to Christopher Hedigers to help cut calves. Harry and Roy came ^{this} V. M.

Sunday, May 2, 1926

Clear and warm today. Sprinkled rain some today.

Russell and I went to Boens this morning. We were there for dinner. I brought the car home after dinner and Dad went to Harry Farris. I went to the ball ground with Harry Zeiglers. Several were there to practice.

Russell sprained his ankle. Grandpa went to Christopher Hedigers this morning.

Monday, May 3, 1926

Clear and warm today.

I plowed in the hog pasture today. Russell, Dad and Mildred took three horses and one mule to pasture on Henry Hedigers place this A.M. I ordered a pair of baseball shoes and athletic supporter from Sears Roebuck & Co. Dad harrowed stalks this afternoon. He used one mule. Russell has not worked much today.

Tuesday, May 4, 1926

Clear and warm today.

I finished plowing the hog pasture today. Dad harrowed stalks.

Carl and Velda came this afternoon after shingles.

Carl has matched a game with the Youngstown nine for next Sunday. He is manager of our team. Donnie Zeigler is Captain.

Wednesday, May 5, 1926

Clear and warm today.
Dad started plowing with the riding plow. We plowed the sand patch on the east side of the creek.

Leonard Bozarth came just before supper. Ben Bures and family and Beryl Zeigler and Paul Johnson came after supper. They stayed until bedtime.

Thursday, May 6, 1926

Warm today. Clear this morning. Partly cloudy this afternoon.

We cut the colt "Ebie" and seven calves this morning. We have nine calves.

Dad and I plowed all day did not quite finish the field west of the creek north of the road.

Grandpa went some place this afternoon. We don't know where.

Friday, May 7, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Rained some about 6 P.M.

We tagged and tarred the sheep this morning. We docked five lambs and cut twelve. We have thirty six.

I disked and plowed this afternoon. Dad plowed with the mules.

Saturday, May 8, 1926

Clear this morning. Rained quite a bit this afternoon.

My baseball shoes came this morning. I plowed this morning. Russell finished the field this P.M. Dad harrowed in the hog pasture all day. Mother, Mildred and I went to Kirkeville this afternoon. We got caught in the rain as we came home. We stopped at Tony Farris. Saw Grandpa in town.

Sunday, May 9, 1926

Cloudy today. Rained a heavy shower about 2 P. M.

I went to the pasture to salt the horses this morning. Russell and I helped clean off the ball diamond. Russell went to Carl's for dinner.

Lora Zeigler was here for dinner.

We practiced baseball this afternoon. The Youngstown team did not come on account of rain.

Monday, May 10, 1926

Cloudy today. Was misty a while this morning.

Dad took two plowshares to Albert Bolns to have them sharpened. Russell and I riled rock off of the hog pasture. We plowed the sand patch in the south meadow and planted water-melons this afternoon. Carl came to have Dad cut lambs for him. Dad went to Carl's. Ray and Lizzie Farr came late this evening.

Tuesday, May 11, 1926

Cloudy and cool today.

I disked all day in the field south of the wheat. Dad harrowed in the hog pasture this morning and planted some this afternoon. This is the first corn we have planted this year.

Wednesday, May 12, 1926

Clear this morning. Partly cloudy this afternoon.

I disked this morning and harrowed this afternoon. Dad finished planting the hog pasture today.

Lon Daniels graded the roads past here today. L. M. Bowles was here this afternoon.

Russell, Mildred, and I went to Pure Air to a farm club meeting. Belle Jones went with us.

Thursday, May 13, 1926

Partly cloudy and cool today.

Sprinkled rain this afternoon.

Dad planted both fields of corn north of the road. Russell harrowed this A.M. Mother and I went to W. R. Wallace after seed corn this morning. Got 3 bu. at \$2.00 per bu. I plowed this afternoon.

Paper tells of first flight over north pole in Airship. The first flight was made by Byrd in aeroplane on May 9, 1926.

Friday, May 14, 1926

Cloudy and rained some this morning. Clear late this afternoon.

We finished plowing and harrowing the field west of the creek and south of the road this afternoon. I plowed some on the field south of the wheat.

Saturday, May 15, 1926

Clear and warmer today.

I plowed south of the wheat this A.M. Dad planted the piece south of the road west of the creek. Russell plowed and dad harrowed this P.M. Mother, Mildred and I went to Kirksville this afternoon. Forrest Jones rode from town to Carls with us. Russell Mildred and I went to a dance at Emil Habers—.

Sunday, May 16, 1926

Clear today. Dad went to the pasture Russell and I went to Carls. Forrest Jones went to Sunday school at Pure Air with us. We played ball with the Ringos Point team at Boens this afternoon. They beat us 20 to 15.

Harry Zeigler and family came after supper and stayed until bedtime.

Monday, May 17, 1926

Clear today and very warm this afternoon.

Russell plowed this A.M. I broke the riding plow and went to Boeno to have it fixed. L. M. Bowles crunched the sheep this morning for stomach worms. Dad and I both plowed this afternoon.

We all went to Carlo after supper.

Tuesday, May 18, 1926

Rained a good rain this morning. Made it too wet to work. Has been cloudy all day. Cooler this evening.

Did not do much today.

Russell went hunting this morning. Dad went to uncle Bill Pinkertons this afternoon.

Wednesday, May 19, 1926

Clear today.

Dad and I went to Carls early this morning to drench his sheep for worms. Dad and I plowed this morning. Lloyd Huff was here this A.M. to get Dad to go on his bond. He is going to run a medicine wagon. I plowed and harrowed this afternoon. Dad planted some on field south of wheat. Carl came after Velda who came home with us.

Thursday, May 20, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Dad planted a little corn this A.M. We both plowed until about five P.M. Dad, Mother, Russell, Mildred and I went to Kirksville to see the home talent play, "The Goose Hangs High". It was sprinkling rain when we came home about 12.

Friday, May 21, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Sprinkled some this morning.

I plowed this morning and we finished planting corn this afternoon.

Harry Zeigler and wife were here this morning.

Saturday, May 22, 1926

Clear today. I harrowed this morning. John Strachen came to shear sheep today. Dad went to Carlo to plant corn this afternoon. Carl helped shear sheep. Mother Milcher and I went to Kirksville this afternoon. Velda came home with dad. He took her home about bedtime.

Sunday, May 23, 1926

Clear today. Russell Mildred and I went to Pure Air to Sunday school. Mother went to Carls. Dad went to uncle Bill Vinkertons and stayed all day. We were at Carls for dinner. We practiced at ball this afternoon. Leonard Bozarth came home with us from the game and stayed until bedtime. Leora Beryl and Raymond were here after supper.

Monday, May 24, 1926

Clear and warm today.
Dad planted corn at Carls today.
I finished harrowing the field south of the wheat and disked the Cane Patch this morning.
Russell and I planted Cane and washed the car this afternoon.

Tuesday, May 25, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Dad finished planting corn for Carl this morning. Russell and I hoed. I plowed the hoglot this afternoon. Russell and Dad worked on a corn planter. Ira Cook brought our radio batteries from Kirksville. We all went to dads after supper to get plants which he had got for us in Kirksville.

Wednesday, May 26, 1926

Clear today. Clouded up about sundown and is raining at bedtime. We plowed the sweet potato patch, planted soybeans and harrowed corn this morning. Dad went to Carl for more beans about noon.

I harrowed corn in the hog pasture and the sand patch this afternoon. Dad went to Dornie Ziegler to get an old wheel for a corn planter.

Thursday, May 27, 1926

Rained a good rain last night which we needed. Cloudy this morning but cleared off this P.M.

I went to the pasture this A.M. Dad went to Ellen Sanfords this afternoon. He bought an Angus bull for \$60.

Russell and I plowed and hoed the potato patch on the creek.

Friday, May 28, 1926

Clear today.

Dad and I went to Ellen Sanfords this morning to get a bull. We had quite a time.

Dad, Mother and Russell went to Kirksville this afternoon.

I harrowed corn on the west side of the creek north of the road.

Saturday, May 29, 1926

Mostly clear today.

Dad and Mildred went to Kirksville this morning. They took the wool to the Farmers Exchange. We got 37¢ amounted to \$98.50.

Russell harrowed corn west of the creek south of the road this morning. I went to Harry Zeigler to get sand this morning. Did not find any. Replanted watermelons this P.M.

Sunday, May 30, 1926

Rained a little last night. Clear. Heard president Coolidge and the Crown Prince of Sweden speak over radio yesterday. We went to the graveyard this morning. Beryl and Leora went to Sunday school with us.

We beat Youngstown 22 to 4 this afternoon at our ground. Raining some at bedtime.

Monday, May 31, 1926

Did not rain much last night. Cloudy today. Sprinkled some this morning and late this afternoon.

Russell and I plowed the corn in the hog pasture today. Dad replanted corn today. He hurt his arm playing ball yesterday.

Tuesday, June 1, 1926

Clear today.

Russell and I plowed all the rest of the corn north of the road today. Dad replanted corn.

We went to Carl's after supper. I saw Muriel Boag this afternoon. He has been in Iowa.

Wednesday, June 2, 1926

Clear today.

Russell and I plowed corn in the field west of the creek, south of the road, and hoed some this morning.

I hauled a load of sand from Frank Buesses this afternoon. Russell and Dad worked on a vat to dip sheep in.

Engere and Albert Boen stopped.

Thursday, June 3, 1926

Cloudy today. Rained a little this morning.

We worked on the dipping vat all day. Have it all finished but the bottom. It is made of cement.

Friday, June 4, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Russell and I plowed corn in the field south of the wheat.

Dad, Mother, and Mildred went to Kirksville this afternoon.

Carl and family and Belle came after supper.

Heard Brookhart and Cummins speak over radio.

Saturday, June 5, 1926

Fair today.

Russell and I finished plowing the corn south of the wheat this morning. We dragged the baseball diamond this morning.

We all went to a big barn dance at Abbie Bragg's tonight. There was about 4000 out. Donnie Zeigler is having a dance tonight also. Am sorry I could not go to both.

Sunday, June 6, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Russell, Mildred, and I went to Sunday school this morning. We all went to Christopher Kaeligers for dinner.

We played a baseball team from Kirksville on our diamond this afternoon. We got beat 17 to eight. My glove is missing after the game.

Monday, June 7, 1926

Mostly clear today.

We hoed the Cain patch and potatoes today. We put out "Never-fail" feed for the sheep and fixed a pen to use in dipping them.

Grandpa came home this afternoon. He has been to uncle's for quite a visit.

Grandpa, Russell, Mildred, and I went to Carl's a little while after supper.

Tuesday, June 8, 1926

Mostly clear today. We need rain.

Russell, Mildred, Mother and I went to Carls this morning to pick strawberries.

Carls helped us dip our sheep and his this afternoon. We had 81 and he had 47 head.

Delmas and Carl Bragg came after supper.

Wednesday, June 9, 1926

Clear today.

We hoed in the cornfield this morning. Dad, Mother, Grandpa and Mildred went to the funeral of Mrs. Cook at Union Temple Church this afternoon. Russell and I cleaned out the ripe in the pond.

We all picked some gooseberries this P. M. I went to Abbie Bragg's after supper to have him work the roads tomorrow. Lon Daniels graded to our place from the north today.

Thursday, June 10, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Sprinkled something this afternoon.

We cut corner posts in Harry Zeigler's woods this morning and scattered line posts between our place and Abbie Bragg's place.

I plowed the Cain this afternoon and Russell and Dad hoed.

Grandpa went to Frank Buressee's this afternoon.

Friday, June 11, 1926

Mostly clear today.

We took out our quarter of a mile of fence between us and Abbie Bragg and put in a few posts today.

Carl was here a while after dinner. He brought my glove. It had been taken to Kirksville by mistake.

Has been very warm all day. Grandpa came home from Buressee's this morning.

Saturday, June 12, 1926

Rained a good rain this afternoon which was badly needed.

I took a plowshare and some corn to Boens this morning. Got 3 gal. of gasoline from Carl.

Grandpa, Mother, Mildred and I went to Kirksville this afternoon. We got caught in the rain. Got home about 10 P.M.

Sunday, June 13, 1926

Rained some last night.

Rained this morning and a big rain this afternoon and evening.

I went to the pasture this morning. Carl went with me. We killed a squirrel. Belle Jones came this morning and stayed all day and night. Beryl Zeigler, Paul Johnson and Max Linder were here a while this evening. Grandpa went home with Beryl to stay all night.

Monday, June 14, 1926

Cloudy and drizzly this A.M. Have had lots of rain will be good on the oats and grass.

Mildred took Belle to Carl's this morning. Dad went to Bgens this afternoon to have the bell fixed.

Mildred and I went fishing in the pond. Russell went hunting. Grandpa came home late this afternoon.

Tuesday, June 15, 1926

Partly cloudy and cool today. Paper says $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches of rain fell!

We fixed the bell pole this morning and dug potatoes.

Carl and family came this afternoon for tomato plants. Uncle Bill came to have some cherries canned.

Grandpa went home with him. We set some posts between our place and Abbie Bragg this afternoon and set out about 100 tomato plants, late this afternoon.

Wednesday, June 16, 1926

Rained early this morning and until about nine. Cloudy all day. Rained again from 6 to 7:30 P.M.

Did not do much today. Picked some cherries (7 or 8 gal) and traced the bell pole.

Peter Sullivan was here yesterday afternoon to get some wire.

Thursday, June 17, 1926

Clear today. Grandpa came home this morning.

We worked on the car this morning. We finished putting posts in our quarter mile of fence between our place and Abbie Braggs this afternoon.

Friday, June 18, 1926

Cloudy today. Rained some this afternoon. Cool.

We dragged the roads this morning. Dad and I took the car to Boens this afternoon to have Albert help us clean the carbon out of it. We got some soy beans from Carls to replant with.

Saturday, June 19, 1926

Mostly clear today. Russell and I dug potatoes and water-melons this morning.

Dad, mother, Grandpa, Russell and Mildred went to Kirkeville this afternoon. Grandpa stayed at uncle Ira's tonight. I went to the pasture this afternoon. Still too wet to plow corn.

Sunday, June 20, 1926

Clear most all day. Threatening rain about bedtime. Could plow corn tomorrow if it does not rain.

Delmas and Carl Bragg went with Russell, Mildred and I to Sunday school at Pure Air this A.M.

Youlgstown did not come to play baseball this P.M. on account of the rivers being out. We practiced. Carl's family was here this afternoon.

Monday, June 21, 1926

Clear today. Rained some last night. We plowed the corn and beans in the hay pasture and most of the sand patch north of the road east of the creek.

Dad hoid all day.

The river is out of its banks. It is higher than it was two or three days ago before it fell.

Heard President Coolidge over radio.

Tuesday, June 22, 1926

Clear this morning and some warmer. Rained a heavy shower about 4.30 P. M.

Russell and I finished the sand patch and plowed some west of the creek. Some of it is too wet. We started on the fig piece south of the wheat but were rained out about 4.30.

Rained again about 7.

Wednesday, June 23, 1926

Clear today. Too wet to plow corn.

We dipped our sheep this a.m. We had 81 head all together. This is the second time we have dipped them this spring. I helped Earl Bures drive Cap's sheep here this afternoon. We dipped them. He has 47 head. Carl was here this P. M.

Dad, Mother ^{and} Mildred went to uncle Bill Pinkertons after supper.

Thursday, June 24, 1926

Sprinkled some this morning and rained a light rain quite a while this afternoon.

Russell and I dragged the roads this morning and plowed corn about an hour and one half. Were rained out after dinner. Carl and Yelda came to wash the car this P. M. We all went to Frank Buesseses after supper. Goldie Ruoff is leaving.

Friday, June 25, 1926

Mostly clear today. Cool.

Russell and I plowed corn in the field south of the wheat. Still wet in spots.

Lee Fortney and family came after supper and stayed until bed time.

Saturday, June 26, 1926

Clear and some warmer today. Russell and I finished plowing all the corn the second time.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Kirksville this afternoon. Russell and I went to Bozantho after supper. Leonard was not there. Mildred stayed at Carl's. Grandpa came home this afternoon.

Sunday, June 27, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Belle Jones went to Sunday school with Russell, Mildred and I.

Brother Paul preached.

We played ball with the Hog Creek "Bears" this afternoon on their diamond. We had a good game but got beat 13 to 11.

Mildred went home with Belle from Sunday school and came home with Grandpa, Dad, Russell and I from the ball game.

Monday, June 28, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Russell plowed corn for Carl today and I worked the road for him. Grandpa went to his place today and did not come back tonight. Mildred went to Fortneys this afternoon. Lee was here and bought 6 gallon of cherries.

Tuesday, June 29, 1926

Partly cloudy this afternoon. Has been very hot all day.

Russell and I plowed the corn and beans in the hog pasture and the cane patch.

Dad worked on the mower. Lon Daniels wants us to help put in a culvert tomorrow. Dad had some chicken feed ground this E.M. at Boers. Russell, Mildred, Mother and I went to Carl's after supper. Went swimming for first time today.

Wednesday, June 30, 1926

Clear and hot today.

Grandpa came home yesterday. Amos Pross was here yesterday afternoon. He is running for judge.

Russell, Dad and I helped put in a culvert east of our place. Lon Daniels and Harrison Walters were here for dinner. We went swimming with Beryl on Hog Creek after supper.

Thursday, July 1, 1926

Partly cloudy and very warm today.

Russell, Dad and I helped fill the culvert east of the house this morning and the one north of the house this evening. Got my first Bell tax receipt this afternoon.

Friday, July 2, 1926

Clear and warm today. We dragged the fills and plowed the corn north of the road east of the creek this morning. Grandpa went somewhere and has not come back. Russell, Milched, Mother and I went to town this afternoon. Payline came home with us. Albert and Genie were here after supper.

Saturday, July 3, 1926

Mostly clear today. Sprinkled some last night. Tony Farns house and barn burned about 3 this morning. No one was at home. Celebrated on the Arlie Dimmitt place today. Had a collision going there. Ruined a wheel. We played ball with the Frog Creek "Bears" this afternoon. Beat them 9 to 5. Eugene Boen came after supper and stayed all night.

Sunday, July 4, 1926

Sprinkled early this A.M. but cleared off later. Dad and I went to Kirksville this A.M. to get a wheel and then to Pure Air. Carl and family and Eugene Boen were here for dinner. Eugene Russell Dad and I went with Carl to Kirksville this P.M. to a ball game between KV. and Macon. Score KV. 8 Macon 2. Grandpa came home this P.M.

Monday, July 5, 1926

Clear and hot today.

Russell and I plowed the corn west of the creek north of the road and the cane patch.

Dad went to Boens this A.M. to put a wheel on the car. He went to Kirksville this P.M. Pauline went home. He could not get a fender.

Grandpa went to Carls this morning.

Tuesday, July 6, 1926

Rained some this morning. We got the binder out of the shed and cleared it this A.M. Russell and I plowed corn west of the creek south of the road this afternoon. Dad went to Boens after a cultivator spring. Grandpa came home this afternoon.

Wednesday, July 7, 1926

Mostly clear today. Warm.

Russell and I plowed corn in the field south of the wheat all day. Dad helped dig a grave this A.M. Dad, Mother, Grandpa and Mildred went to the burial of Pearl Bozarth at the Bozarth Cemetery this afternoon.

Russell Mildred and I went to Carl's after supper.

Thursday, July 8, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Sprinkled some this afternoon. We finished plowing corn this morning and cut the wheat this afternoon. There was about 7 or 8 acres very light on the ground.

Russell brought about a gallon of apricots from the other place. We have had ripe peaches for almost a week.

Friday, July 9, 1926

Had a nice rain last night. Has been partly cloudy today with a small shower this afternoon.

Did not work much today. I went to the pasture this morning. Ben Bunn was here a while after dinner. Have picked up about 5 gal. of apricots.

Saturday, July 10, 1926

Mostly cloudy today.

Dad took Albert's cultivator spring home this morning. We hoes some. Dad, Mother, Mildred and grandpa went to Kirksville this afternoon. Russell and I helped Carl drag the diamond this afternoon. Mildred and I went to a dance at Roy Brails tonight with Cooks. Russell went with Carl Bragg.

Sunday, July 11, 1926

Clear today. Carl Bragg stayed all night here last night.

Russell, Mildred and I went to Sunday School this morning.

We played ball with a team from Novinger this afternoon and beat them in a good game, 11 to 9.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to uncle Bill Pinkertons after supper. Tony Farr has been living with him since his house burned.

Monday, July 12, 1926

Mostly cloudy today. Sprinkled a little this morning.

Russell and I had chicken feed ground at Boens this a.m. and hock some.

Carl and Velda came after dinner for a little while. We cut oats in the field west of the orchard this afternoon. Did not finish. Gathered about 1 bu. of Apricots.

Tuesday, July 13, 1926

Clear and very cool today. We finished binding the oats west of the orchard this morning. We cut some of the clover this a.m. and finished this afternoon. It is new and weedy. Russell and I hock some this afternoon.

Abbie Bragg and Dee Cook came to examine the binder after supper. Abbie is not working right. The binders are alike.

Wednesday, July 14, 1926

Clear and some warmer today. Finished gathering the apricots this a.m. We gathered about 2½ or 3 bu. all together. Dad fixed Abbie's binder this a.m. Carl and Velda brought the hay rake and helped us stack the clover this evening. Albert Boen was here a short time after supper. Has been a nice cool day to work.

Thursday, July 15, 1926

Cloudy this morning. Sprinkled a little. Mostly clear this afternoon. We topped out the clover stack with some timothy this morning.

We cut the oats next to Les this afternoon. Oats are a fair crop. Looked for a while like they would be short. Dad went to Pure Air for twine to re-rig Christopher. Leora came home with Mildred. She stayed all night. Grandpa went somewhere. Cows got in Donnie's corn

Friday, July 16, 1926

Mostly clear today.

Dad went to Kirksville with a team this morning. He got 80 rods of 2 bin. wire. Russell and I fixed fence on the west eighty and hoes a little today.

Grandpa came home with Johnny Farr this evening. He had been to town today. Carls, and Harry Zeiglers were here after supper.

Saturday, July 17, 1926

Clear today. Dad and I went to the pasture to see about water.

Dad, Mildred and I went to Kirksville this afternoon.

I saw the show, "The Winds of Chance" at the Kennedy.

Russell and I went to a dance at Earl Barnetts with Beryl Zeigler tonight. Had a big dance. Got home about 1.

Sunday, July 18, 1926

Clear today. Russell, Mildred and I went to Sunday school this morning. Sewells folks came for dinner today. Crawford's came later. They had car trouble.

We played Youngstown on our diamond today. Beat them 19 to 3 in six or seven innings. Not much of a game. Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Lee Forthys after supper.

Monday, July 19, 1926

Clear today. Started making hay at Carl's today. Got 3 loads in the barn. More cut. The hay is light.

Tuesday, July 20, 1926

Clear and pretty hot today.
We put up hay at Carls today.
Put 6 loads in the barn.

Mildred and I went to Glen Sandfords this evening and got some ice. Carls and Belle came and we made ice cream.

Wednesday, July 21, 1926

Clear this A.M. Cloudy and sprinkled some this afternoon.

We put up hay at Carls today.
Put 5 loads in the barn and started a stack.

Carl brought Russell and I home after supper. Arthur Zeigler borrowed our hay hooks this evening.

Grandpa went to Eli Fusselmanns today.

Thursday, July 22, 1926

Rained a nice rain last night. Cloudy this morning. Clear this P.M. Did not do much this morning. Russell, Mildred, Mother and I went to Carl's after dinner. We finished putting up his hay this evening. Dad mowed in the meadow north of the road this P.M. Velda came home with us to stay all night.

Friday, July 23, 1926

Clear and hot today.

Russell was not able to work today. He was sick at his stomach.

Dad finished cutting the north meadow this morning. We raked and stacked some. Carl helped this evening. We got about $\frac{2}{3}$ of the piece put up in two stacks. Neither of them are finished. Velda went home with Carl this evening.

Grandpa came home this morning.

Saturday, July 24, 1926

Clear today.

Finished putting up the hay north of road. About 8 acres.

Made two big stacks.

Carl was here for dinner.

Dad, mother and Mildred went to Kirksville this afternoon.

Mildred stayed all night at Harry Zeiglers.

Sunday, July 25, 1926

Mostly clear today. We went to the pasture this A.M. Uncle Eds and Pauline came this A.M. Pauline, Beryl and Leora went to Sunday school with us this A.M. We played ball at Tiperrary this afternoon. Had an extra good game but lost 2 to 1.

Carls, Donnies, Harries, Rays, Hubert and Luella, Fern and Delmas, Charlie Niece, Leonard and Genies were here after supper. Decided to order ball suits of Montgomery Ward at \$7.65

Monday, July 26, 1926

Clear this morning. Rained a heavy shower late this afternoon.

I helped Christopher Hediger thrash this A.M. and Boens this afternoon, this is the first threshing here this year.

Dad mowed hay in the field next to Abbis today.

Tuesday, July 27, 1926

Clear this A.M. Partly cloudy this afternoon.

Did not do much this A.M. Dad finished mowing the meadow next to Abbis. Carl came and helped us stack hay this P.M. Got it practically all up. It will make two fair sized stacks. Mildred went home with Carl. Robbins Circus was in Kirksville today.

Wednesday, July 28, 1926

Mostly clear today.

Russell and I finished the stacks on the piece next to Alfie's this A.M. Dad mowed in the meadow south of the road. Carl helped us put up part of a stack there this P.M. Fruit tree agent here this P.M.

Russell, Mildred, Mother and I took chicken feed to Carl's after supper.

Thursday, July 29, 1926

Clear this A.M. Partly cloudy this P.M. Finished the stack and started another one this A.M. Carl helped finish it this P.M. about $\frac{2}{3}$ of the piece up.

Started thrashing about 5⁰⁰ this afternoon. Thrashed the wheat and all of the oats in the piece west of the orchard. Had 44 bu. of wheat.

Boens and Zeiglers are helping us.

Friday, July 30, 1926

Had a nice rain early this A.M. Rained again about noon and is raining at bedtime. Has been cloudy and warm all day. We have not worked much.

Russell went to Carls this afternoon. He got our ball suits which came today. Took Beryls to him. They seem satisfactory.

Saturday, July 31, 1926

Rained some last night, a nice shower this morning and again this afternoon.

We did not do much today. The rain is fine on the corn.

Harry Zeigler borrowed our wagon this morning to haul hogs in.

Sunday, Aug. 1, 1926

Rained quite a lot last night and a little this morning. Has been cloudy all day.

I took Carl's team home this a.m. and went to the pasture. Was at Carl's for dinner. It is his birthday. He is 29.

We practiced baseball this afternoon. We had a game with Kirkville but it was too muddy to go.

Monday, Aug. 2, 1926

Cloudy today. Clearer this evening. We mowed weeds with the scythes this morning. Dad finished mowing the hay in the meadow south of the road this afternoon, then he and I dragged the roads.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Christopher Hedigers after supper.

Tuesday, Aug. 3, 1926

Clear and warm today.

Dad, Grandpa and I went to Youngstown this A. M. to Vote. It was my first time.

We finished putting up hay this A. M. Finished thrashing this P. M. and helped Harry Zeigler thrash some. We had 173 bu. of oats, 44 of wheat. Carl and family were here this P. M.

Wednesday, Aug. 4, 1926

Mostly clear today. We helped Harry Zeigler finish thrashing at his place this A. M.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to town this P. M. Mildred stayed at uncle Eds. I took Bolus and Carls wagons home this P. M. Russell helped Affie Bragg thrash this afternoon.

Thursday, Aug. 5, 1926

Clear and warm today. Russell helped thrash today at Charley Braggs and at Uncle Bills. Zeiglers had the oats on his place.

Dad and I hoed this A.M. and worked on the car this P.M. It seems to have something wrong with it in the rear end. Was still running but noisy.

Friday, Aug. 6, 1926

Clear and warm today. Had a small shower last night. Russell helped Harry thrash this A.M. Dad and I worked on the car today. Dad went to Kirksville with Carl to get repairs about noon. Donnie Zeigler was here this P.M. We put the car together this P.M. Dad, Mother, Russell and I went to an ice cream supper at Pure Air this evening.

Saturday, Aug. 7, 1926

Clear today. We hooed some this morning.

Russell, Mother and I went to Kirksville this afternoon. We sold eggs at the Aladdin hatchery today but they buy no more this year. Mildred came home with us. Pauline left for Springfield this A.M.

Sunday, Aug. 8, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

We went to the Pasture this A.M. Leonard Bozarth and I went to K.V. this A.M. to get pop and ice cream. Eddie Huff went with us.

Max Linder and Wm. Youngs boy came this morning.

We played the Hog Creek "Bears" this afternoon. We beat them 4 to 3. All of us but Grandpa went to Donnie Zeiglers after supper.

Monday, Aug. 9, 1926

Sprinkled a little early this morning. Has been clear most of the day.

Dad went to Harry Zeiglers to look for cement sand this M. Albert Milliken was here for dinner and stayed all evening. Russell and I holed in the Cain patch this A.M. We did not do much this afternoon.

Tuesday, Aug. 10, 1926

Clear most of the day.

Albert Milliken stayed here last night.

We mowed weeds in the west road this A.M.

Carl and family were here this afternoon. We did not do much but mowed some weeds in the orchard.

Wednesday, Aug. 11, 1926

Very hot today. Clear.

We mowed weeds along the west road and around the corn field south of the road west of the creek. Also cut some in the orchard this morning.

We, Russell and I, went swimming at Bens with Beryl Zeigler after supper.

Dance at Marion's Nieces tonight.

Thursday, Aug. 12, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Rained some last night. Lots of lightning. The lower barn was struck. Not much damage.

We put the wire on our $\frac{1}{4}$ mile of fence between us and Abbie's place. Dad got Harrie's stretcher at Abbie's this A.M. Russell and I went to the diamond to practice ball about 4 o'clock. Was our first practice during the week.

Friday, Aug. 13, 1926

Partly cloudy today. We had a light shower about noon and a heavy rain is falling at bedtime.

We tagged sheep this morning and fixed the wagon tongue this afternoon.

A Mrs. Sloan and Willie Simlers were here this morning.

Saturday, Aug. 14, 1926

Had a big rain last night. Mostly cloudy today.

Dad went to the school house this A.M. Albert Boen has put a new floor in it. Russell and I built a sheep pen at the other place. We practiced ball this afternoon. Dad and Mildred went to Kirkeville this P.M.

Sunday, Aug. 15, 1926

Mostly cloudy today.

We penned the sheep this A.M. and went to Carl's to help him. I went to the pasture.

We all went to a big dinner at Dee Cooks today. Beryl Guigler went with Russell and I to play ~~base~~ ball with Novinger on the "Bears" diamond. We got beat 13 to 2. Leonard and Beryl were ^{here}.

Monday, Aug. 16, 1926

Mostly cloudy today.

We gave Carl's sheep and most of ours, "Eshyburg," this morning.

We hauled three big loads of sand from the creek this P.M. We aim to use the sand in making a foundation for a barn.

Three aeroplanes went over at noon today. They were probably part of Ford's planes on a tour.

Tuesday, Aug. 17, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

We hauled eight (8) big loads of sand from the creek today.

Martin and Mrs. Simler were here yesterday morning after crabs. They got two (2) bushel.

^{were} The planes we saw yesterday on a reliability tour. There were about twenty-one in the group.

Wednesday, Aug. 18, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

We hauled two loads of sand from the creek this morning.

We fixed the wagon hound and bolster. I went to Boens after dinner to get a piece made.

We made about three gallons of crab cider this evening.

Carl and family were here a little while after supper.

Thursday, Aug. 19, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Raining steadily at bedtime.

We hauled two big loads and two small loads of sand this morning. Russell and I went to the diamond to practice this P.M. The folks went to help clean off the Salisbury graveyard this afternoon.

Friday, Aug. 20, 1926

Did not rain much last night. Threatened rain this afternoon but did not.

We hauled four big loads of rock from the west light today. Carl came this afternoon and took our bull home with him. Russell helped. Dad and Mildred went to Carl's after supper to get Russell.

Saturday, Aug. 21, 1926

Mostly clear today.

We hauled two loads of rack this morning.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Kirksville this afternoon.

Russell and I got some Musk melons this P.M. We had only had one before.

Sunday, Aug. 22, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

Uncle Major and Eli Russelmanns came this morning. I went to Kirksville with Beryl to get some ice cream and Ice.

Tixerarray did not come to play ball so we played Youngstown. We beat them in a loose game 16 to 14. Vebta came home with us from the game. Carl and Leota came after her after supper.

Monday, Aug. 23, 1926

Sprinkled some this morning. Cloudy until about noon. Partly clear this afternoon.

We hauled 3 loads of sand and one of rock this A.M. Dad and Russell hauled 2 loads of rock this P.M. Mildred and I went to K.V. this P.M. Carl and I took the pop cases back. Mildred took a musical examination. I had a tooth filled.

Tuesday, Aug. 24, 1926

Clear today. Cool last night. We cleaned out the barn loft and sheds. We aim to tear the barn down soon.

We penned the sheep this evening. Have listed 12 lambs to ship tomorrow.

Grandpa went to Eli Jussekman's yesterday.

Wednesday, Aug. 25, 1926

Clear and warm today.

I took 12 lambs and one old wether to Kirksville today to ship through the M. F. A. The lambs averaged about 71 lbs.

I hauled 25 sacks of cement from the Adair Lumber Co. It cost 60¢ per bag net.

Russell and dad made trestles and started to tear the barn down.

Thursday, Aug. 26, 1926

Clear today.

We worked at tearing down the east barn today. We tore the loft floor out.

Dad and ^{mildred} mother went to Carls after supper. Velda has had a swelling in her throat.

Friday, Aug. 27, 1926

Clear today.

We tore most of the insides out of the barn today. Albert and Eugene Boen were here this afternoon.

Dad and Mother went to Carl after supper to get Miled who stayed there last night.

Saturday, Aug. 28, 1926

We worked on the barn this A.M.

Clear today.

Russell, Miled and I went to Kirksville this afternoon and stayed for the show and hog-calling contest tonight at the "Kennedy". Lora Zeigler went to the show with us and stayed all night with us.

Sunday, Aug. 29, 1926

Partly cloudy today, Sprinkled some this afternoon.

Wester Bragg came this A.M. and went to the ball game at Dimmits this afternoon with Russell dad, and J. Mildred and Leora went with Beryl. Had two games Novinger vs. Tipperary "Bears" vs. Greencastle. Novinger and the "Bears" won.

Monday, Aug. 30, 1926

Partly cloudy today.

We cleaned out the barn this A.M. Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Kirksville this P.M. Carl helped us take the shingles off the east roof of the barn this P.M.

School started this A.M. We got returns from our sheep today. Twelve lamb wethers brought \$99.85.
One old wether brought 7.02.
We have 2 1/2 ewe lambs left.

Tuesday, Aug. 31, 1926

We had a nice rain last night. It rained some before and afternoon today.

Ocie and aunt Marie were here for dinner today.

Russell and I took the two work mules and "Elzie" to Henrys place this morning. We took the shingles off the west side of the barn today.

Wednesday, Sept. 1, 1926

Mostly cloudy today.

Sprinkled some this morning.

Grandpa took sick last night and has ben sick all day.

We started taking down the sheeting and rafters this morning.

Carl helped us this afternoon.

We hauled a load of corn from the hoppers this A.M. Have fed all at the barn.

Thursday, Sept. 2, 1926

Rained quite a lot last night.
Cloudy most all day today.

We worked on the barn all day.
Have all of the sheeting off and
most of the rafters. We are removing
the nails as we go which makes the
work go slow.

Abbie and Delmas Bragg were
here after one of their hogs this evening.
Grandpa is a little better.

Friday, Sept. 3, 1926

Rained some last night and rained
about 3 hours about noon today.

We worked on the barn today
when it was not raining.

Grandpa feels pretty bad but
was up most of the day.

Saturday, Sept. 4, 1926

Rained a big rain last night and another this morning.

I went to Pure Air this A.M. after hog rings. Albert Bowen was here most of the day. We did not do much today but ring^{cut} the shoats.

Sunday, Sept. 5, 1926

Rained a big rain this A.M. Russell went to uncle Bills this A.M. and to Frank Buesses after supper to get his cap which he left there a good while ago.

We separated our lambs and ewes today. We have 24 ewe lambs. Marked them with a fishhook hogring in the front of the left ear.

Monday, Sept. 6, 1926

Cool last night. Clear and
some warmer today.

Mildred went to Carl's this
morning to go with them to the
Rodeo at Kirksville.

We worked on the barn today.
Got it tore down and practically
cleaned up.

Tuesday, Sept. 7, 1926

Mostly clear today.

We went to Kirksville to the
rodeo today. It was Kirksville's
first. Was pretty good.

Albert and Eugene Boen came
to borrow our sand sieve this
morning.

Grandpa went to Carl's as
we went to town.

Were invited to a surprise party for
May Bures Thursday night.

Wednesday, Sept. 8, 1926

Rained three good rains today, early this A.M. just after noon and late this P.M.

Mildred and I took about 2 br. of peaches to Carl's this A.M. Mildred stayed. Grandpa came home with me. I took some tomatoes to H. Zigless this A.M. and borrowed their scraper. Hauled waste lumber from the barn lot this afternoon between showers.

Thursday, Sept. 9, 1926

Clear today. We leveled a barn site today.

We went to a surprise birthday party for May Buess this evening. All took supper and danced some afterwards.

Friday, Sept. 10, 1926

Clear today. Dad Russell and I ~~broke~~ broke rock for cement today.

Charles Fusselman bought 8 bu. of wheat for seed today.

Dad and Mildred went to Pure Air after flour after supper.

The mail did not come today, probably on account of the high water. The river has been out for 2 or 3 days and was still raising today.

Saturday, Sept. 11, 1926

Partly cloudy today. I hauled a load of corn for the chickens this morning. We broke rock all day.

Beryl and Leora were here a little while after supper.

The river raised today and is quite a bit higher than it was this spring. Grandpa feels worse today. He has been feeling almost as well as common since his sick spell last week.

Sunday, Sept. 12, 1926

Rained quite a bit last night. Has been cloudy and foggy all day. Raining at bedtime.

I hunted darts this morning. Russell went to look at the river which was still raising today. Carl and family were here today. The river is extra high and is doing a great amount of damage.

Monday, Sept. 13, 1926

Cloudy today. Sprinkled some this morning. Dad went to Albert Borns this A.M. Russell and finished breaking rock this A.M. Russell Simler came this A.M. Dad helped appraise the estate of George Simler this P.M. Uncle Bill came to get some grapes canned this P.M. Harry and Ocie Zeigler were here after supper. The river still raised last night. Grandpa does not feel any better today. No Mail.

10 **Tuesday, Sept. 14, 1926**

Rained quite a bit this A. M.
And some this P. M.

We worked in the shop this
A. M. Christopher Hediger was here
this P. M. and contracted for one
of our buck sheep.

Lots of peaches and grapes are
ripe now. Grandpa feels about the
same today.

Wednesday, Sept. 15, 1926

Had an extra big rain last night
Sprinkled some this A. M. Hog Creek out
of its banks some and the river raising
fast.

I went to Dee Cooks mill and to
Frank Smiths this A. M. trying to
get our Molasses made. Can not for
a while. Carl was here about noon. He
has no mail to carry as the trains are
waterbound. No mail today. I believe
grandpa feels some better today.

Thursday, Sept. 16, 1926

Rained some last night and early this A. M. Mostly clear today.

Albert and Eugene Boen went to Youngstown with Russell Mildred and I this A. M. We got our mail at Youngstown. Dad and Grandpa went to Dr. Munns this P. M. The Dr. opened an abscess on Grandpa's cheek. He seems to rest easier. River still raising.

Friday, Sept. 17, 1926

Clear and warm today.

We staked off the barn and started digging for the foundation this P. M.

The river started to fall last night. Had been raising steadily for more than a week.

Dad went to Boens this P. M.

Rev. Wimber and family were here this P. M. He came to examine the phone. No mail.

Saturday, Sept. 18, 1926

Clear and warm today.

We dug trench for foundation and put in some forms today. The river is falling very slowly. Carl has a game matched with the "Bears" tomorrow.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Carl's after supper. The baby is sick. Beryl and Raymond were here after supper.

Sunday, Sept. 19, 1926

No mail today as the river is higher. It has been raising all day.

Grandpa feels about the same.

He is very weak.

Tuesday, Sept. 21, 1926

Clear today.

Dad and I went to Greencastle today to get cement. We could not get to ~~X~~ Kirksville on account of river. We got 40 sacks at 62 $\frac{1}{4}$ net. We took two teams and one wagon. Got home at 8.30 P.M.

The roads were very spongy.

The river fell some today.

Grandpa is about the same.

The paper tells of a big storm in Florida.

Wednesday, Sept. 22, 1926

Clear today.

We run the foundation for the barn today. Eugene and Albert Boen, Carl, Harry Zeigler and Lee Fortney helped us. Made a big days work.

I borrowed a wheelbarrow and barrel from Ben Bures this A.M. and a barrel from Harry Zeigler.

Thursday, Sept. 23, 1926

Partly cloudy today. Sprinkled some early this A.M. and again at bedtime.

I went to Pure Air this A.M. and had Dr. Munn call to see grandpa who is very weak.

We put the pillars in the barn today. I took Bens barrel and wheelbarrow home this P.M. Carl and family, Vera P., and Harry and Ocie were here after supper. We did not get the prize fight as our radio would not work. No mail.

Friday, Sept. 24, 1926

Rained some last night and off and on all day. Very raw and chilly.

We did not do much this morning but gather some peaches and tomatoes.

Ocie was here most of the afternoon. Grandpa feels about the same today. We cut 10 shocks of corn this afternoon. No mail today. The river is falling slowly. Tinney won from Dempsey last night.

Saturday, Sept. 25, 1926

Mostly clear today. Very cool last night and all day.

Grandpa seems to feel stronger today.

Russell and I cut 43 shocks of corn in the field north of the road west of the creek. Dad cut most of the soy beans in the hoglot. Mail came today.

Sunday, Sept. 26, 1926

Cloudy and damp. Sprinkled some this afternoon.

Donnie and Carl were here this A. M. Russell and I went to the pasture. Russell, Mildred and I went to Harry Zeiglers today. We picked about a sackful of hazelnuts. Ocie and children were here after supper. Ocie stayed all night. River about in its banks.

Monday, Sept. 27, 1926

Rained last night and most of the day today. Did not rain hard. I went to Dr. Munns for medicine and to Pure Air this A. M. Grandpa seems weaker. Uncle Major and aunt Eliza came about noon and stayed all night. Uncle Ira came about noon. I stayed all night at Carlo. Ocie and Beryl were here after supper.

Tuesday, Sept. 28, 1926

Cloudy today.

River coming out again.

Saturday, Oct. 2, 1926

Started raining about 8.30 this A.M. and rained steadily until 3 P.M.

Russell went duck hunting. No luck. I worked on a knife.

Uncle Ira brought Uncle "P" out this P.M. and went home. Harry and Ocie came after supper. Grandpa seems about the same.

St. Louis lost to New York.

Sunday, Oct. 3, 1926

Rained hard this A.M. Creek was out for the first time this year. Rained hard again late this P.M. I went to Carls and to the pasture today.

New York lost to St. Louis.

Monday, Oct. 4, 1926

Rained last night and again early this A.M.

I stayed at Carls last night.

Russell and Mildred went to Purcell this A.M. Russell and I cut 36 shocks of corn today. We finished. Uncle Fred and Aunt Libby drove our team to Grants this P.M.

We have 226 shock of corn cut.

Tuesday, Oct. 5, 1926

Rained last night and sprinkled some today.

We dug the sweet potatoes this A.M. did not do much this P.M. Uncle Fred and Aunt Libby came this P.M.

Ocie and Beryl came after supper. We sat up with grandpa tonight. He seems about the same.

New York lost to St. Louis.
John Simley was here for dinner.
Albert Eschman was here this P.M.

Wednesday, Oct. 6, 1926

Clear today. Some cooler.

Cut our sorghum patch for feed.

I went to Dr. Munns this P.M. for medicine. Heard the ball game over the radio. St. Louis lost to New York.

Grandpa seems about the same.

Carl and family and Harry Zeigler and family were here after supper.

Thursday, Oct. 7, 1926

Clear today.

Russell and I dragged the roads and helped dad remove the form from the cement this A.M.

Uncle Fred started home this A.M. Russell and I finished cutting the sorghum this P.M. and I went hunting. Got 4 squirrels at 3 shots.

Mildred was at Harrys a while this evening. Not much change in grandpas condition. Uncle Ira came this P.M. He has a grandson. Yankees won.

Russell Mildred and I went to a pie supper at Salisbury with Beryl. Aunt Eliza and uncle Ira went home this morning. Dr. came.

Saturday, Oct. 9, 1926

Rained a big rain this morning. Cloudy all day.

Russell went to the doctor and to Pure Air this P. M. Grandpa seems a little stronger. Albert Boen was here this A. M. Christopher Hediger came this afternoon and bought our calves. Ocie came late this P. M. We hauled a load of corn this P. M. St. Louis won from New York 10 to 2.

Sunday, Oct. 10, 1926

Grandpa is gradually getting weaker.

I promised Bert Thomas to catch ball for the "Bears" Sunday.

11 **Saturday, Oct. 16, 1926**

We tagged the sheep after noon.

I went to Pure Air and to Dr. Munnis this afternoon, Uncle Ed came out from Kirksville this P.M. Carl came after supper to sit up. Grandpa seems about the same.

Sunday, Oct. 17, 1926

Friday Oct. 22, 1926.

The events of the last few days have made it impossible for me to keep a detailed account of the happenings of each day.

Grandpa died about 4 o'clock Sunday afternoon. We did not expect him to recover but we were not expecting his death so soon.

His funeral was held Tuesday afternoon at 2.30 o'clock. Rev. Thomas conducted the services. He was buried

Monday, Oct. 18, 1926

at the Salisbury cemetery. Everyone has been kind and helpful.

The weather Sunday and Monday was fair and partly cloudy, Tuesday it rained some but not enough to make the roads very muddy.

Monday, Oct. 25, 1926

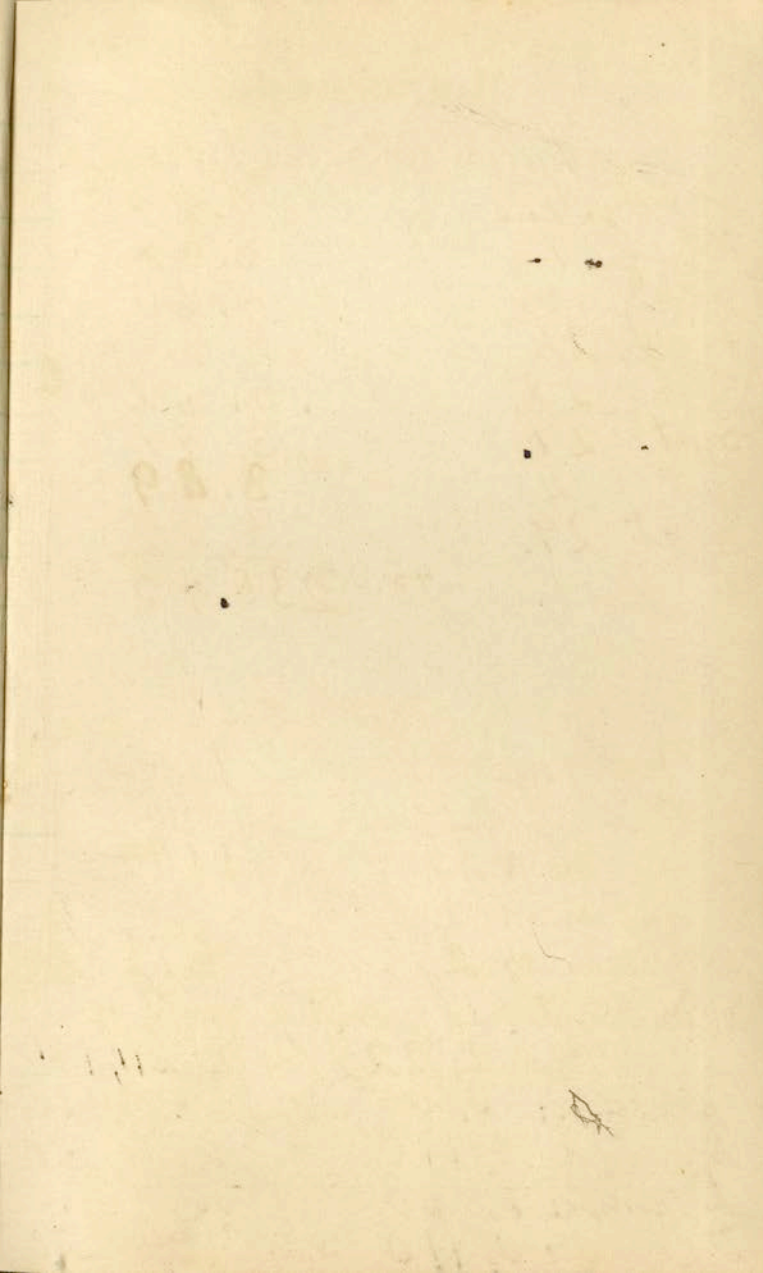
