## A License to Show-Me: Northeast Pride

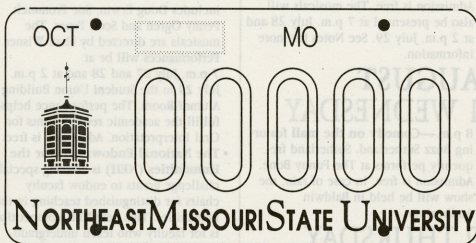
The state of Missouri has authorized the usage of special Collegiate License Plates for community and four-year public and private institutions of higher education. The Collegiate License Plate Program is designed to promote school spirit while raising funds for each college or university.

Northeast has joined the program and will offer personalized Bulldog plates to members of the Alumni Association. The plates will feature the school cupola, name and a five-digit personalized display area.

Under the program guidelines, participating institutions are asked to collect a minimum of \$25 before an individual is given authorization to purchase or renew a Collegiate License Plate. Funds collected by each school are then to be used for scholarships or related academic functions.

To order your Northeast Collegiate License Plate follow these simple steps:

1. Become a member of the Alumni Association. (You do not have to graduate to become a member.)
2. Send a check or money order for \$25 to the Alumni/ Development Office, A/H 101, made payable to NMSU License Plate Program.
3. The Alumni/Development Office will then send you an Emblem



Use Authorization Statement.

4. You must take the Emblem Use Authorization Statement to your local license bureau and make application for your plates, i.e.: complete registration forms, pay state fees, etc. (Personalized plates have an additional \$15 fee.) Collegiate License Plates may be issued for any particular vehicle you own other than commercial vehicles licensed for more than 12,000 pounds. (Other restrictions may apply.)
5. Upon approval of the application, the Department of Revenue will contact you with instructions as to the date and location at which the Collegiate Plates may be obtained.

Collegiate License Plates are renewable each October. Original applications filed between June 30, 1990 and June 30, 1991, will result in the issuance of plates which expire in October of 1991. To renew your plates you must send a minimum of \$25 to Northeast to receive an Emblem Use Authorization Statement.

Funds raised from the Collegiate License Plate program will be used to support the Northeast Alumni Scholarship program.
