A \$9,993 GRANT was recently awarded to NMSU by the National Science Foundation in support of a "Summer Pre-College Teacher Development Project" designed to instruct elementary teachers in principals of physics.

Next year, 25 elementary teachers within 150 miles of NMSU will be selected to participate in the project. As participants, teachers will complete a course entitled "Physics for Elementary Teachers."

The project will be under the direction of Dean A. Rosebery, head of the Science Division. Serving as Assistant Director will be Robert R. Nothdurft, professor of industrial education.

TOMORROW EVENING a movie, "Adventures of Sherlock Holmes Smarter Brother" will be shown at 8 p.m. in the Student Activities Room of the Student Union Building. Admission will be \$.50.
