## NORTHEAST NOTES

A cost reduction idea by **Ron Scott**, Physical Plant, brought NMSU special recognition in late June. The University was among twenty-nine winners at the sixth annual Cost Reduction Incentive Awards, sponsored jointly by the National Association of College and University Business Officers and the U.S. Steel Foundation. Last year, \$5,000 was saved at NMSU through implementation of a manual override for the automatic temperature control. Previously, the automatic control had over-compensated for heat loss during the spring and fall.
