# Students go "Barefoot in the Park"

"Summerplay provides summer theater entertainment for the residents and visitors to Kirksville and provides a semi-professional atmosphere for training students," J. G. Severns, professor of dramatics and producer of Summerplay productions, said.

In its fourth season at NMSU, Summerplay opens this week with Neil Simon's romantic comedy, "Barefoot in the Park." "The Passion of Dracula" and "Equus" will also be performed by the Summerplay company this summer.

The acting company for Summerplay productions consists of NMSU students, acting students from other universities and several professional actors.

Severns conducted auditions in St. Louis and Kirksville in choosing the company. He included professional actors "to enrich the company. It's very common to have a mixed company of students and more experienced actors," he said.

Julia Carter, a 1983 NMSU graduate, is returning for her third season of Summerplay after working behind the curtain for the past year doing puppet theater. She said she has benefitted from working with students again and is anxious about her return to the stage.

"I feel sometimes that I'm learning from them. I haven't been on the stage for a year, and it's going to be rough getting back into it," she said.

Keith Oliver, also a 1983 NMSU graduate, enjoys the opportunity to work with acting students from other schools.

"They bring different variations or approaches to acting techniques, and you learn from that," Oliver said.

The comedy stars Oliver as Paul Bratter, a very proper and stuffy young lawyer, and DeeNita Klocke as his young, very confused bride, Corie. The action revolves around the difficulties they encounter as newlyweds in their romantic

loft apartment and the complications that arise due to their eccentric neighbor, Victor Velasco, played by Alan Pease, and Corie's widowed mother, Mrs. Banks, played by Carter. The comedy also includes Mason Scandridge as the telephone man and Steven Sissel as the delivery man.

Performances of "Barefoot in the Park" will be at 8 p.m. Thursday through Saturday and June 28-30 in the Little Theater in Baldwin Hall. Al Srnka, director, is looking forward to good attendance. "We draw our audience from both the campus community and the community at large.

Tickets for Summerplay performances are \$4 and \$3 for general admission, and \$1 for NMSU students, faculty and staff. Reservations may be made by calling 785-4515 or by visiting the Baldwin Hall Box Office. The office is open from 12:30 to 2:30 p.m. and 6 to 8 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
