Lerner is a leading journalist whose syndicated column has world-wide distribution through the Los Angeles Times Syndicate. It appears three times a week in the New York Post. He has spoken to college groups on six continents and is the author of several books including America as a Civilization, The Age of Overkill, and Ideas are Weapons.
