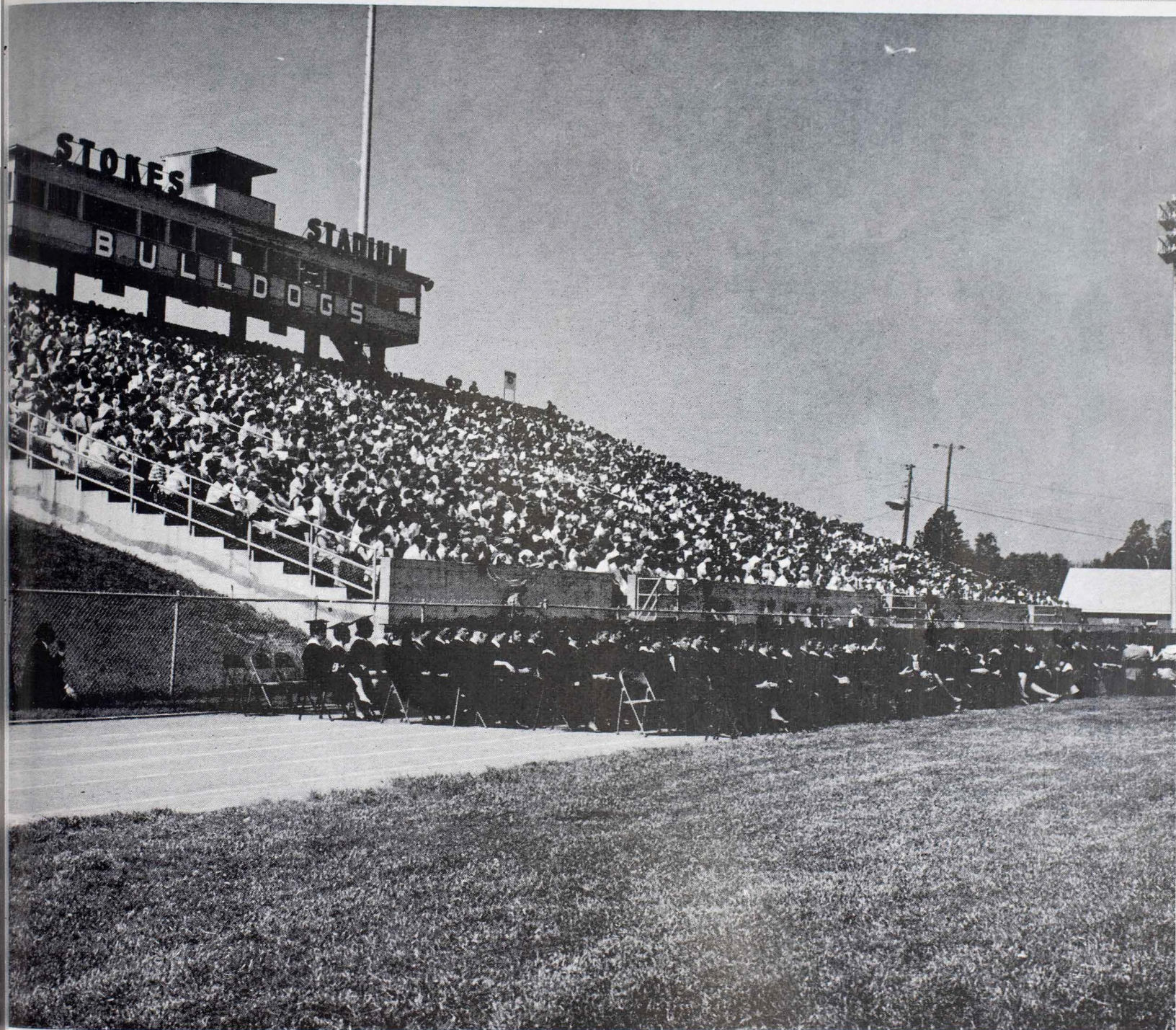

# Board Names Eli F. Mittler Interim President; Assumed Position July 1

Dr. Eli F. Mittler, head of the Division of Extension Services at NMSC, became Interim President of the College effective July 1, 1969. The announcement of the selection of Dr. Mittler by the College Board of Regents came following a joint statement issued on June 20th by the Board and Dr. F. Clark Elkins. The statement announced that Dr. Elkins' service as College President would terminate by mutual agreement on July 1, 1969. It was also announced that Dr. Elkins has agreed that he will perform certain advisory and consultant services for the College after July 1, 1969. In accepting the appointment as Interim President Dr. Mittler announced that he was accepting the position at the request of the Board of Regents. He also announced that he would not be a candidate for the permanent position of College President, which is to be filled at a later date. The new Interim President is continuing to carry out his present duties as an officer of the College and will automatically revert to his former position with the College after a new President is chosen.

Dr. Mittler is a native of Marthasville in Warren County, Missouri. He was educated in the elementary and secondary schools of Missouri and is a graduate of Central Wesleyan Academy, and attended Central Wesleyan College. He received the Bachelor of Science in Education degree from Central Missouri State Teachers College at Warrensburg, and the Masters and Ed. D degrees from the University of Missouri. He has done additional post-graduate work at the University of Minnesota and Columbia University, New York. The Interim President has had numerous articles published in the "National Professional Journals" and holds membership in a number of national honorary and professional fraternities and societies. He is a life member of the Missouri State Teachers Association and the National Education Association. He has served as a member of the Advisory Committee of the Educational Policy and Plans Committee of the NEA. He is a state director of the rural division of the National Education Association, president of the Northeast Missouri Credit Union, secretary-treasurer of

the Northeast Missouri Teachers Association and is listed in "Who's Who in American Education" and "Who's What and Why" in the publication of the Historical Record Association. He is also listed in "Personalities of the Midwest and West." He is a Mason and a Shriner.

Dr. Mittler has served as president of the Churchmen's Brotherhood, the Warrenton Chamber of Commerce, the Kirksville Rotary Club, Missouri Adult Education Association, Midwest Conference on Education and the Missouri Valley Adult Education Association. He was secretary and a charter member of the Warrenton

Rotary Club, and an executive board member of the National Adult Educational Association of the USA. He has served on accrediting committees for NCATE and NCA. He is married to the former Charlotte West, who is a member of the College Social Science faculty. They have one son, Ted, who teaches in St. Charles, Missouri.

Dr. Mittler has taught in rural, elementary and secondary schools. He served as county superintendent of schools and city superintendent of schools before joining the faculty of the College. He has served as head of the Division of Extension Services for the past 22 years.

## Bunney and Hoffmaster Named to Board of Regents By Gov. Hearnes; Reinhard Re-elected President

Mrs. Mary Alice Bunney, Shelbyville, and Howard L. Hoffmaster, Hannibal, have been appointed to the Northeast Missouri State College Board of Regents by Missouri Governor Warren E. Hearnes. The appointments are for six year terms.

Mrs. Bunney, who became the first woman to serve on the Board of Regents in 1963, was appointed for a second term, and is the only member presently serving a second term.

She is a native of Shelbyville, and a teacher at the Shelbyville Elementary School. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in education from the College in 1938 and is married to George H. Bunney, Shelby County Conservation technician.

She is the mother of one daughter, Mrs. Roy (Mary Margaret) Hazelrig, who will graduate with the August division of the class of 1969 from NMSC.

Mrs. Bunney has served as Republican committeewoman for Shelby county, county chairman and District Republican chairman. She is a member of the Methodist Church, the Missouri Federation of Women's Clubs, and Chapter M of PEO.

Howard L. Hoffmaster, 32, the editor of the Hannibal *Courier-Post*, has lived in Hannibal since December, 1966, when he became editor.

A Republican, he has previously served as telegraph and regional editor of the Ottumwa, Iowa, *Courier* since 1963, and as telegraph editor of the Fort Dodge, Iowa, *Messenger* before joining the *Courier* staff.

Hoffmaster had served as president of the Iowa Associated Press Telegraph Editors' Association, as continuing study chairman of Iowa wire news operations, and in 1966 was named first place winner in the feature division of the Iowa Associated Press Managing Editors news writing contest.

He has been featured speaker at the University of Iowa journalism workshop.

In 1968, Hoffmaster won three first place awards in the "Better Newspaper Contest" of the Missouri Press Association. He was cited for the best editorial, the best editorial page, and the best news story, in collaboration with *Courier-Post* staffer, Herb Powell.

A graduate of Park College in Parkville, Mo., Hoffmaster is married and he and his wife, Nancy, have five children. The Hoffmasters are members of the First Presbyterian Church in Hannibal.

He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Hannibal Historic Foundation, which sponsors Hannibal's Ice House Theater in cooperation with NMSC.

Hoffmaster was born on October 9, 1936, in South Saint Paul, Minn., and lived in Winona, Minn., and St. Joseph, Mo., before attending college. Mrs. Hoffmaster is a native of Binghams, New York.

He succeeds board member, Glen Bolton, Lancaster, whose term expired from his 1963 appointment. Bolton was a Republican.

Members of the Board of Regents of all state colleges are appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

State law also requires the six-member board to be bi-partisan, that is equally divided between Republicans and Democrats.

James R. Reinhard of Paris was re-elected as president of the Board of Regents of Northeast Missouri State College at its organization meeting on the campus recently.

Raymond E. Baker of Brookfield was elected vice-president and Bruce H. Hunt of Kirksville was elected secretary. John Bartow, Brunswick, completes the board.

The action followed the recent appointment by Governor Warren E. Hearnes of Mrs. Mary Alice Bunney of Shelbyville to a second six year term and Howard L. Hoffmaster of Hannibal also for a six year term.

# U. S. Senator Thomas F. Eagleton Delivers Spring Commencement Address at College

A record breaking 950 degrees were conferred during the 1969 Spring Commencement held Wednesday, May 28. The outdoor ceremony was held at 10:00 a.m. in Stokes Stadium with an estimated 5,000 parents, relatives and friends of graduates in attendance. The Honorable Thomas F. Eagleton, United States Senator from Missouri presented the traditional commencement address prior to the conferring of degrees.

The ceremonies opened with the traditional processional from Baldwin Hall to the stadium and with the placing of a wreath at the Baldwin Statue by Billy Dean Reed, senior class president. The text of Senator Eagleton's address follows:

The American public received a violent shock in the summer of 1965 when the Watts area of Los Angeles exploded. We were appalled at the arson, the looting, the sniping. The shock was intensified in succeeding summers as rioting mobs ravaged Detroit, Newark, Chicago, Washington and other cities.

Many thoughtful but complacent Americans were equally shocked by the revelations of the Kerner Commission on the causes and origins of

the riots. The report spelled out in painstaking, and often painful, detail the hunger, poverty, despair, frustration and isolation that are the everyday lot of the residents of America's urban ghettos. For those who took the time to read it, the Kerner Commission report transformed the understandable, immediate reaction of repression to a recognition of the grave problems underlying the riots and a concern for their solutions.

Today, we are experiencing another phenomenon which is equally as shocking to many Americans as the urban riots, but far less easy to understand. The university riot of 1969 has replaced the ghetto riot of Watts, 1965 and Newark, 1967 as the current subject of public dismay.

While the inner city violence usually sprang from a climate of deprivation, campus violence often springs from a climate of relative opulence. The environment at Watts or Hough is far different from the environment of Harvard and Cornell.

Despite the obvious external differences between the nature of urban and campus violence, I think we should recognize a basic ingredient, a factor common to both. In the ghetto and on

the campus there is a pervasive feeling of discontent, uneasiness and frustration which can be triggered into unrestrained, even illegal, conduct.

At the time of the various ghetto riots, many suggested, myself included, that two simultaneous approaches were needed.

First, of course, violence and illegal conduct had to be checked. Life and property had to be protected. Law had to be enforced.

Second, and more difficult, the conditions which gave rise to the violence had to be recognized and dealt with. Sadly, I must confess . . . despite massive evidence of need . . . despite the Kerner Commission Report. . . despite squalid, inhumane conditions of human existence which can no longer be ignored, our movement in this second area has been exceedingly slow and has been retarded both by a less than decisive national will and by a blood and dollar draining war that drones on endlessly.

I believe today with respect to the campus as I did with respect to the ghetto that we have to cope with the disturbance on two levels simultaneously.

First, our institutions of higher learning must be preserved. They must be permitted to function. The faculty and administration must not be intimidated.

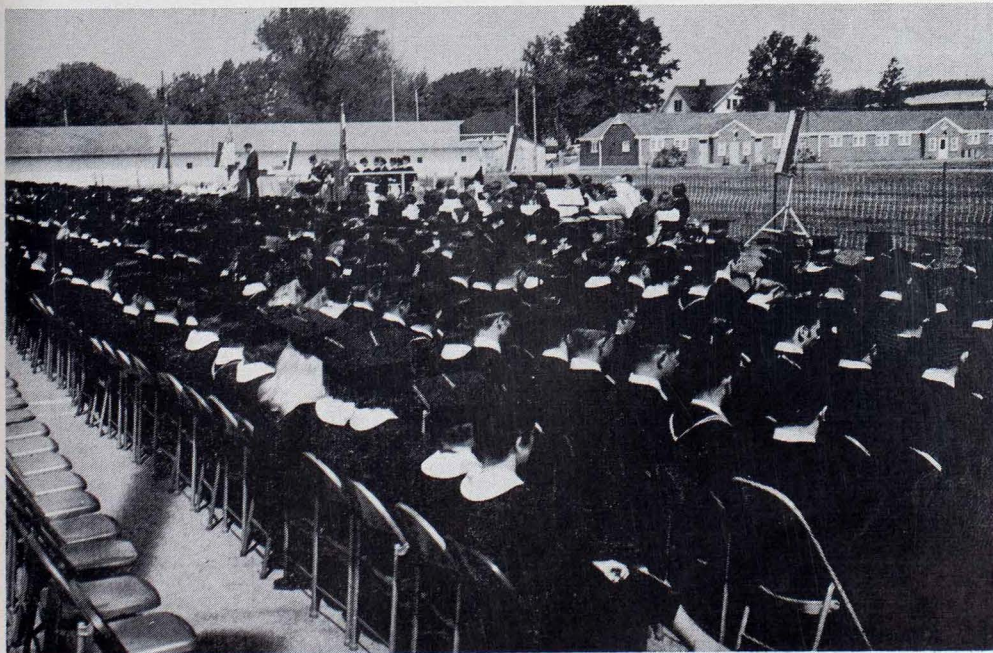
Second, and again more difficult, the root causes of the eruptions must be recognized and treated.

In taking such an approach we must be careful that the tip of the iceberg—the immediate disorder—does not so provoke our passions as to prevent us from attempting to cope with that which is obscure, but massively present below the surface.

The tip of the iceberg in Watts and Hough was violence—unrestrained, often deadly, always unconscionable.

The tip of the iceberg on the campus is sometimes violence and intimidation, often disruption and mindless confrontation.

It is a group of armed Cornell students arrogantly marching in triumph from a seized building.

It is the eviction of deans from their offices and the destruction of college records.

It is the burning of a Student Union building.

It is the curious inconsistency of students loudly proclaiming that the military has too great an influence on our society, but demanding the total expulsion of ROTC from the campus, even though the ROTC program serves as the principal check on the establishment of a professional officer caste in our military.

It is the clamorous demand for autonomous black studies departments to be administered and run, not by the universities, but by black students, and not to meet the long neglected and legitimate need for increased education and research in black culture, but rather as monuments to racial pride.

It is the fulminations of the SDS who are bent on substituting chaos for order, who believe in disruption for disruption's sake.

It is the boisterous catcalls of a student group who would shout down a speaker while at the same time bemoaning the fact that they are not being listened to.

The surface manifestations are numerous. Some are silly. Some are reprehensible. Some are dangerous.

But as in the case of Watts and Hough, these disquieting events reflect some far deeper and darker currents in American life.

Just as the riots in Watts and Hough were rooted in frustration, hopelessness, a sense of not belonging, so too is there on many of our college campuses a frustration, a hopelessness, a sense of not belonging.

Today's students were born in the era of the Cold War. Most were small youngsters in the era of the Korean War. Now, they are approaching adulthood in the era of the Vietnam War. It is a war which had obscure beginnings, fought for obscure purposes. It is a war in which these students will be called upon to fight under a draft system that is inequitable.

Today's students are acutely aware of a society which promises great promises and dreams great dreams. . . and invites great disappointments by leaving so much unfulfilled. The slogans of the recent past—New Deal, New Frontier, Great Society—all seem pretty shallow in a nation riven by the poverty gap, the culture gap, the racial

gap and all the other separations that divide us. There is a gnawing frustration in seeing the Kerner Commission Report become, not a summons to action, but just another volume on the sociologists' bookshelf.

Today's students find it difficult to comprehend how the President and the Congress can devote much time and debate to cutting millions of dollars from a Job Corps budget or an educational program and at the same time shrug off with seeming indifference a two billion dollar cost over-run on a new airplane.

Today's students find themselves being educated in an environment . . . under a methodology . . . and for purposes which many college administrators themselves find inadequate. HEW Secretary Finch pointed out recently that: "We cannot assume, out of hand, that campus conflict is simply conflict for its own sake: in many instances it is solidly based on legitimate grievances."

In a speech which President Nixon describes as "the most significant and perceptive analysis of what is wrong with our approach to higher education," Professor S. J. Tonsor said this:

"Until there is a restoration of genuine educational purpose, there will be no restoration of confidence by society in its institutions of higher education. The educational purpose does not lie in the first place in pure or applied research, in problem solving or in pro-

viding revolutionary change or defending traditional values in the society, though all of these may result from the legitimate endeavors of higher education. Higher education has as its chief goals the education of young men and women in such a way as to make them capable participants in our complicated technological civilization, sophisticated and creative members of our common culture and active and concerned citizens."

To return to where I began—to the analogy between ghetto and campus disturbances: It seems to me that, despite additional police and improved police training and despite the most professional riot control techniques, we shall continue to live under the cloud of urban revolt so long as the black ghetto and all it represents exists.

So too on the campus. As much as I would like to consider the current wave of disorders as nothing more than a passing adolescent escapade similar to the panty raid of the past, I cannot do so. There are fundamental conditions on the campus which must be attended.

All of us—government, the college administrations, the public, the students—have a rightful part to play in the process of curing these conditions and restoring a genuine educational purpose.

Government has the responsibility to negotiate an end to a war, to revise

the draft, to be about the business of redressing the inequities that pervade American life. Insofar as college disturbances are concerned, government should be wary of being taunted into a momentary, emotional, vindictive response which, in the words of Attorney General Mitchell, "would certainly play right into the hand of the militants."

University administrators have the obligation to take an in-depth look at their own system and methodology.

In a world which has changed so enormously in the past two decades, the educational process cannot remain transfixed and immutable.

The public at large has the difficult but necessary task of differentiating between legitimate student needs and illegitimate student violence. Just as the illegal invasion by several clergymen into a Dow Chemical building does not accurately represent the entire religious community, so too, the

rantings of a Mark Rudd do not represent the totality of student thinking.

Finally, and perhaps most importantly, the student has a role to play. He should freely express his concern for change. He must question. But he must also summon a degree of sophistication, and be guided by the processes of reason—not just emotion—that befit an inquiring intellect so that he may discern the difference between those who would build and those who would destroy.

Today's college student is intellectually dishonest if he expects others to display a more measured and enlightened response to his actions than the student himself is willing to display in pursuit of his goals.

Students must leave government, the college administration, and the citizenry as a whole some alternative to repression.

In essence what I am asking for is a pledge to maturity. The maturity to see that change is accomplished, not ignored. The maturity to see through the symptoms on the surface to the subsurface causes. The maturity to seek reform without ruination.

The campus revolt of 1969 is a test for us all. It constitutes an examination of ourselves and our nation which we dare not flunk.

## Spring Sports Bring College National Honors

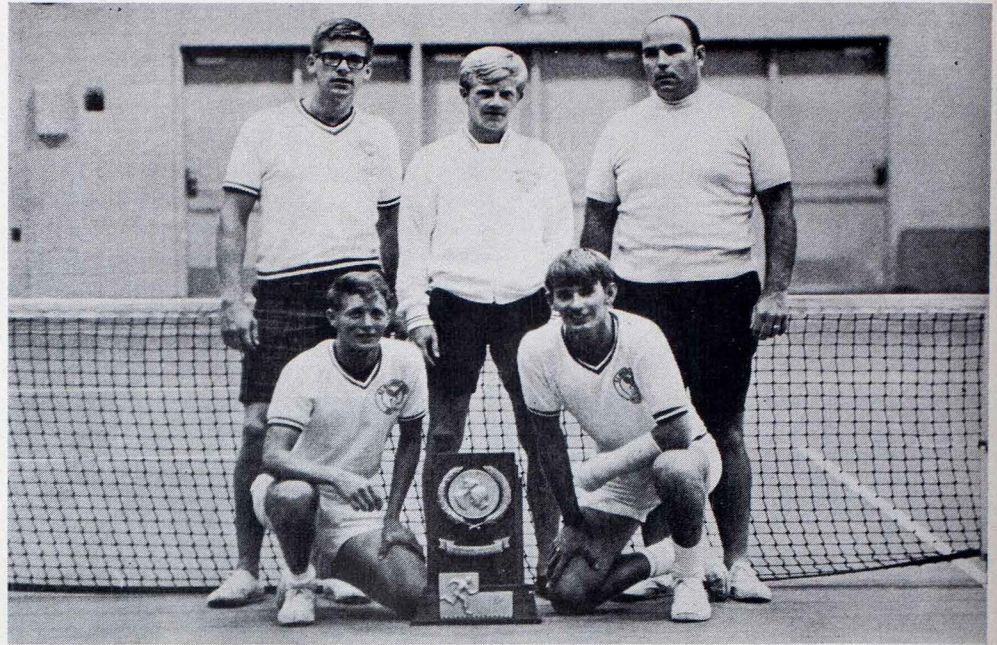
Overall, 1969 spring sports teams at the State College experienced success, with the tennis and track squads gaining considerable national recognition.

Coach H. A. Walmsley's netmen came within a whisker of capturing the first national team title for the school. They were edged by San Fernando Valley (Calif.) State, 17-16, on the final day of the NCAA College Division Championships at East Stroudsburg, Pa. Ron Selkirk (Alton, Ill.) and Dave Romberg (Quincy, Ill.) climaxed brilliant collegiate careers by finishing second in doubles competition at the National. Other accomplishments of a group Walmsley termed "the best since tennis became a team sport 10 years ago" included the second consecutive NCAA Midwest Regional crown, the sixth straight MIAA Conference title (with a perfect score of 54 points), championships of the Drake University Invitational and State College invitational, and a 12-2 dual ledger.

Coach Kenneth Gardner's thinclads concluded their campaign on a bright note by finishing eighth in the NCAA College Division meet at Ashland, Ohio. Freshman Don Allbritton (Rock Island, Ill.), who won the pole vault at Ashland, advanced to the University Division competition the following week to finish in a tie for seventh. He became the first Bulldog trackman to ever place in a University Division meet.

Co-captain Ron Davis (Perry, Ia.) culminated a star-studded career by finishing third in the 440-yard dash and carrying the baton on the fourth-place mile relay team in the College Division encounter. He was named the outstanding performer at the MIAA Conference outdoor in May. The Bulldogs failed in an attempt to notch their eleventh straight Conference Indoor and Outdoor championships this year.

State College golfers, not regarded as strong contenders for the league crown, finished second, only six strokes behind Missouri of Rolla. Senior Mike Brake (Washington, Ia.) paced the linksmen with an average score of 75 per match. Coach Boyd King's crew posted a 10-4 dual record.



Tennis Standouts

Again this year, Coach Sam Nugent's baseballers were impotent at the plate, losing nine low scoring contests during a campaign that saw them record a 9-18 standard. However, they registered more victories than any team since the revival of the diamond game in 1966. Freshman Jack Sapp (Donnelson, Ia.) topped the hitters with a .284 mark. The pitching staff, which spun a respectable 3.13 earned-run average, was led by Bob Miller's (St. Louis) 1.15.

"So close, but yet, so far!" That's about the way Tennis Coach H. A. Walmsley of Northeast Missouri State summed up the NCAA College Division Tourney, June 10-14, at East Stroudsburg (Pa.) State College.

The Bulldogs were shaded, 17-16, by San Fernando Valley (Calif.) State College for the team championship. "Nevertheless, I was extremely proud of our four boys who competed in the tourney," praised Walmsley. "They played as well or better than I could expect." He was referring to Ron Selkirk (Alton, Ill.), Dave Romberg (Quincy, Ill.), Kurt Marin (St. Louis) and Ken Clow (Ottumwa, Ia.). Selkirk continued to play with a cast on his left arm, as he had been doing since breaking his wrist in mid-April.

The NCAA finish was the closest an intercollegiate athletic aggregation from Northeast Missouri State has ever come to claiming a national crown. In 1964, the cross-country team was

second, 10 points behind Kentucky State, for the only other runnerup standing.

"Overall, I'd have to say this was probably our best team since tennis became a team sport in 1959," declared the mentor. "The caliber of our competition has improved each year, and it was the stiffest this season. I believe our schedule definitely helped us when the going got tough at East Stroudsburg."

The Bulldogs compiled a 12-2 dual ledger, losing only to Notre Dame and Bradley. They captured the MIAA Conference title for the sixth consecutive year and the NCAA College Division Midwest Regional for the second straight time. In the league encounter, they posted a perfect score of 54 points. Walmsley's racquet men also took their own Invitational Tourney and the Drake University Invitational.

What about next season and another shot at the national title? Marin and Clow, plus two other top performers, Mike Derr (Keokuk, Ia.) and Ron Sterchi (Olney, Ill.), will be back. "However, we'll be considerably weaker without Selkirk and Romberg, unless able replacements are recruited," moaned the coach.

Ironically, he pointed out, the 1968 Bulldogs, fourth in the Nationals, found themselves a mere point behind the third-place finisher. Who was third? Why San Fernando, of course!

## Grid Prospects To Include 26 1968 Lettermen

Although the Bulldogs will field basically the same defense as last fall, Russ Sloan, the new head coach, feels he will have to devote considerable time to improving the offense, especially the ground attack. Northeast Missouri's running game averaged only 117 yards per contest in 1968, so Sloan will be taking a close look at prospective ball carriers.

Returning offensive lettermen are: tight ends Steve Jurkins and Mike Hooker; tackle George Kaleta; guards Boyce Wooley, Greg Wilson, Tom Kelly, and Gary Lacey; center John Bringer; quarterback Don Cummings; tailbacks Lloyd Wiese and Mike Berentes; slotback Charles Blakley; and fullback Tom Gruening. Bringer was an MIAA All-Conference selection, and Blakley, leading 1968 aerial target with 502 yards and three touchdowns, made the alternate unit. Cummings passed for 1421 yards and seven touchdowns last fall. However, one of his chief targets, split end Steve Garrett, will have to be replaced. Other departures include tackle Ron Lillquist, drafted by the AFL Denver Broncos, and fullback Pete Cirrintano.

Defensive stalwarts include two all-conference selections, middle guard Frank Wagner and tackle John Suell. Wagner was also chosen to AP's honorable mention listing for the College Division All-American squad. End Ken Bebermeyer, who won all-league honors two years ago as a freshman, was hampered last season by a knee injury. Other defensive men returning are: terminals Jerry Smith and Ron Belew; tackle Greg Skinner; linebackers Bob Levy and Aubrey Johnson; rambler Gary Newcomb; halfbacks Charles Brown and Bob Hepker; and safety Larry McGlaughlin. Sloan must replace all-conference linebacker Jerry Lybarger, all-conference safety Jerry Meyer, and end Rich Stallings.

Nevertheless, the mentor will have 25 of 36 1968 lettermen and some 20 squadmen back for the new campaign.

Sloan will be assisted by Ron Toman, who was on the staff at Wichita State the last two years, and Bill Richerson, who was on a leave of absence the past year to work on his doctorate.

## Don Allbritton, Freshman Pole Vault, Wins National Recognition

Don Allbritton has accomplished quite a bit as a collegiate pole vaulter when considering he has only been at Northeast Missouri State since the spring quarter.

On June 21, he climaxed a successful freshman campaign by finishing in a tie for seventh at the NCAA University Division pole vault finals in Knoxville, Tenn. with a height of 15'6". "And Don barely missed clearing the bar at 16 feet on two tries," stressed Coach Kenneth Gardner. If the Rock Island, Ill. youngster had reached that mark with the fewest number of misses, he would have placed third behind Southern California's Bob Seagren and UCLA's Jon Vaughn. "I firmly believe Don would have cleared 16 feet if he hadn't slipped and hurt his knee the night before," declared the mentor. Gardner felt Allbritton didn't have as much power as usual in his leg while sprinting down the runway. "Needless to say, it was quite an accomplishment, one all of us at the school can be very proud of."

As a matter of fact, the quiet, but likeable athlete is the first Bulldog trackman to place in the NCAA University Division Meet. He competed with 27 vaulters, but the field was narrowed to 14 by the final day.

The week before, he captured the pole vault at the NCAA College Division Meet with 15'8", breaking his own school mark of 15'6". By virtue of this achievement, Allbritton became only the fourth Northeast Missouri athlete to claim an individual national title.

"Until I was contacted about Don during this school year, I didn't know much about him," relates the veteran pilot. Allbritton was second in the Illinois prep meet with a height of 14'8". But he thought he would work for a while to earn money before enrolling in college. Preferring a small school instead of a university, he considered St. Ambrose College in Davenport, Ia. at first. However, Coach Roy Owen, a good friend of Gardner, recommended the promising performer to the Northeast Missouri mentor.

Another accomplishment by the Rock Island yearling this season was finally finishing ahead of Jan Johnson, vaulter at Kansas University. Johnson defeated Allbritton in high school and again at the Kansas Relays this April before the Bulldog performer turned the tables on him at Knoxville.

"Don improved his height one foot during the past year, so I asked him on the way back from Knoxville if his goal for next season was 16'8"," commented Gardner. "He replied, 'Coach, I just want to be the best!'" With that attitude, the hard-working lad might very well realize his dream before climaxing his track career.



Allbritton Goes Up . . . and Over

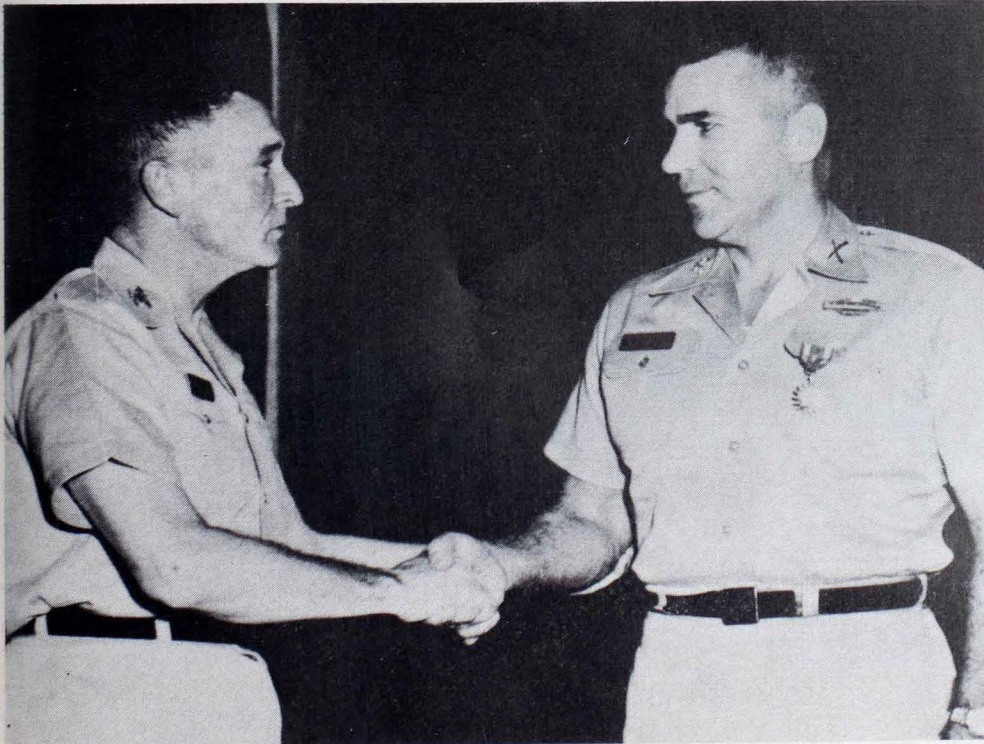

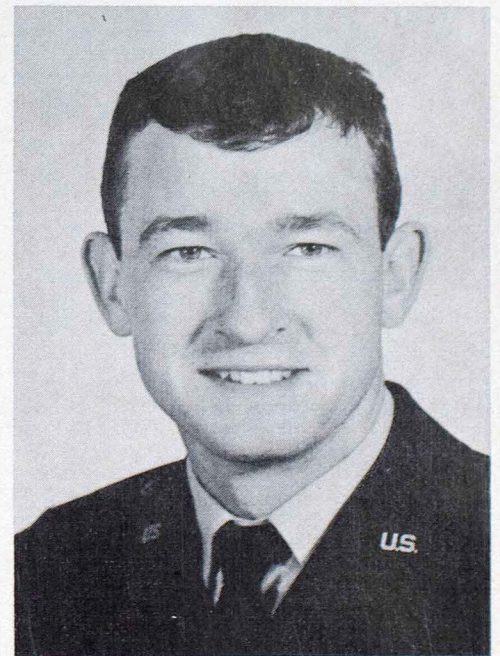

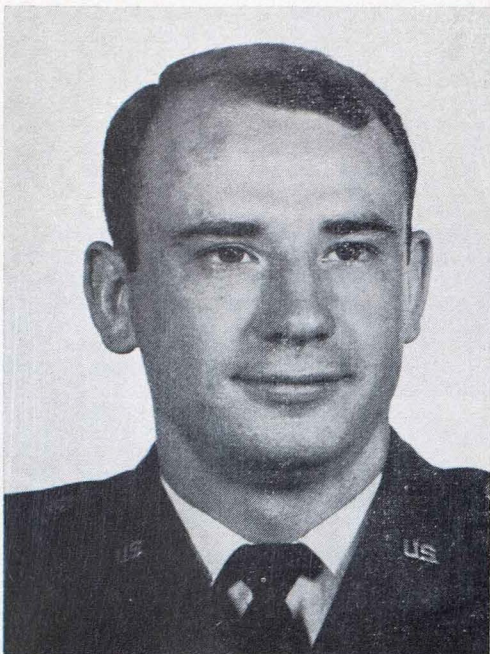

V., and a daughter, Anna Mae. After his graduation from NMSC he instructed at Wyaconda High School, before becoming superintendent of the first consolidated school district in the State of Missouri.
