## ENROLLMENT (CONT.)

Students must pay their fees on these dates at the Business Office, 105 Administration/Humanities Building. The Business Office will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. these days. Absolute deadline is 9 p.m. Friday. Also during these times, financial aid checks will be distributed at the Loans Window.

**STUDENTS WITH ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS** must obtain the validation form from the Athletic Office, 205 Pershing Building, and present that form to the cashiers today.

**ALL INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS** not credited during pre-registration will be assessed in the Financial Aids Office, 100 Administration/Humanities Building, today.

**THE KANSAS CITY PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA** will present a special performance at 8 p.m. Wednesday in Baldwin Auditorium. Tickets will be available today, Tuesday and Wednesday in the Student Union Building. A table will be set up from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The Student Union Office will make tickets available from 8-10 a.m. and from 2-5 p.m. All University faculty, staff and students are eligible to receive two free tickets with an ID. The concert is sponsored by the Lyceum Series and Student Activities Board as well as community groups including the Missouri Council on the Arts.

## INFORMATION FOR PRE-ENROLLED STUDENTS

### 1979 SPRING SEMESTER

The following information is applicable to students who have pre-enrolled for the 1979 Spring Semester at Northeast Missouri State University.

#### Payment of Enrollment Fees

Pre-enrolled students must pay their enrollment fees by 4 p.m. today. If enrollment fees are not paid by that time, the pre-enrollments of the unpaid students will be canceled.

Pre-enrolled students will pay their fees at the Cashiers Window of the Business Office, 105 Administration/Humanities Building. Fees will not be paid at Violette Hall as they have been in past years. The Business Office will be open from 8 a.m. until the payment deadline of 4 p.m.

#### Financial Aid Checks

Pre-enrolled students may pick up their financial aid checks today.

The checks will be distributed in the Administration/Humanities Building at a table in the Lower hallway between the Business Office and the Stenographic Office. The checks for pre-enrolled students will be distributed from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.

#### Payment of Room & Board Charges

Pre-enrolled students who live in the residence halls should pay their room and board charges at the time they pay their enrollment fees. The cashiers at the Business Office will issue meal stickers as room and board charges are paid.

Meal stickers for pre-enrolled students will be required on Tuesday. The Business Office will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 7-9 p.m. today to accept payments and issue meal stickers.

#### Vehicle Registration

Students who wish to park their cars on the campus parking lots should register the cars at the Cashiers Window of the Business Office during the second week of classes, Jan. 15-19. Vehicle license numbers will be needed at the time of registration.

Students must complete the registration of their vehicles by 4 p.m. Friday, Jan. 19.

#### ID Cards

Pictures for new ID cards will be taken at the Safety & Security Office from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and students may have their pictures taken at their own convenience. The ID cards will be ready approximately three days after the pictures are taken.

All students must present their paid fees receipts for the 1979 Spring Semester to have their pictures taken for new ID cards. The ID cards are free to new students. There is a small replacement charge for lost ID cards.
