UNDERGRADUATES PLANNING TO GRADUATE THIS SPRING must turn in their applications for graduation to the Registrar's Office by March 1.

"THE BEST TEST," a new accountability test for 8th graders, will be discussed at a meeting of Phi Delta Kappa Wednesday at 7 p.m. in the Conference Room, SUB. The public is invited.

Dr. Jack Roy, director of curriculum implementation with the Missouri State Department of Education, will lead the discussion. BEST (Basic Education Skills Test) will become state law in January, 1978. It will be administered by the State Board of Education and will consist of three parts -- language skills, mathematics, and civics/economics. According to Dr. Joel Kallem, superintendent of the Schuyler R-1 Schools, passing the test could become a requirement for graduation from high school.

TUITION REMISSION CHANGE WITHDRAWN ... U.S. Treasury Secretary William E. Simon withdrew on Jan. 13 the Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) plan to tax tuition remission programs. Had the proposed plan become a reality, scholarships such as the Faculty and Staff Scholarship here at Northeast would have been seen by the IRS as taxable income.

As outlined by the Board of Regents, the Faculty and Staff Scholarship is available to full-time faculty members, college officer, employees, and their spouses and children. Tuition and enrollment fees of the above are to be computed on the basis of 25 percent of the regular charge. The reduction does not apply to charges for course overloads or the additional amount charged for out-of-state tuition.

Applications for the scholarship are available from department heads.
