Dr. Hill was born in Statesville, North Carolina. He attended Davidson College but received the A.B. and A.M. degrees from the University of Virginia. He received the Ph.D. degree from Teachers College, Columbia University. The LL.D. degree has been conferred upon him by Davidson College, University of Pittsburgh, Union University (Tennessee), and the University of Kentucky.

His teaching career began in Arkansas. It was also in Arkansas that he served as State High School Supervisor. He has served as professor of school administration, as a lecturer, and as dean at the University of Kentucky. From 1930-1940 he was superintendent of schools at Lexington, Kentucky. He was superintendent of schools at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, from 1942-1945. In 1945 Dr. Hill became president of George Peabody College for Teachers.

Dr. Hill is a former president of the American Association of School Administrators and the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. In 1946 he served as a member of the United States Education Mission to Germany. He is a former chairman of the Educational Policies Commission. He holds membership in Phi Delta Kappa, Kappa Delta Pi, and Rotary.

Dr. Hill has been and still is especially concerned with the development of fine teaching and great teachers. The college is pleased to welcome him back to the campus.
