## Space Reassignments Proposed Campus Moves Planned

Programmatic changes and available building space in Barnett Hall, Violette Hall and Pickler Memorial Library have prompted several proposed office moves.

The moves stem from a working document based on a composite of input. All areas involved in moves will be provided square footage in keeping with the programmatic needs.

Most of the space made available in Violette Hall will be used to increase the support of academic programs. Wherever possible, faculty will be moved into office space made available.

Much of the work involved with the moves will be done in-house. To date, the Office of Multicultural Affairs has moved from McClain Hall 103 to Missouri Hall and Dr. Lois Korslund has moved to Missouri Hall.

Many of the moves are sequential and have not been assigned completion dates. Other moves are presently in process and are noted below.

### Division of Science

In Barnett Hall, the Science Division will retain the area assigned to the Division previous to these moves.

### Division of Human Potential and Performance—Nursing

The Division of Nursing, now housed in Kirk Building, will be located in Barnett Hall.

### Dean of Students

The area in Missouri Hall which now houses Student Services will be reverted back to residence hall rooms. The Dean of Students Office will move to Kirk Building.

### Division of Fine Arts

The Fine Arts operations in Adair House will be shifted to Barnett Hall. The printmaking facilities in Baldwin Hall will also be relocated to Barnett Hall.

### International Student Office

The International Student Office will be moved from Missouri Hall to Adair House.

### Center for International Education Abroad

The Center for International Education

Abroad will move from Kirk Memorial to the Adair House.

### Academic Planning Services

Academic Planning Services, located in McClain Hall 103, will move to Pickler Memorial Library.

### Public Relations and Alumni/Development

Public Relations and Alumni/Development, McClain 106, will move to McClain Hall 101 and 102.

### Business Office

Most of McClain Hall 106, which houses Public Relations and Alumni/Development, will be added on to the Business Office, McClain Hall 105 (after the final move of Public Relations and Alumni/Development).

### Human Resources

Human Resources, located in McClain Hall 101 will be relocated to the balance of the Business Office addition, McClain Hall 106.

### Division of Human Potential and Performance—Communication Disorders

Communication Disorders will be relocated from Violette Hall to Barnett Hall.

### Testing Services

Currently, Testing Services is moving from McClain Hall 103 to Violette Hall 176.

### Financial Aid

Upon completion of the Testing Services move, Financial Aid, now located in McClain Hall 100, will relocate to the former Testing Office in McClain Hall 103.

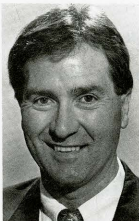
### Chief of Administrative Services

The Chief of Administrative Services will be located in the former Financial Aid area, McClain Hall 100.

### Barnett Hall Labs

The computer lab will relocate within Barnett Hall to a place that will provide opportunity for future expansion. The Science lab will move to the former computer lab. The existing computer lab space will be renovated to provide appropriate facilities to better support the Science program.

## Smith Named Peru State VP



Dean of the Colleges Terry Smith has been named vice president for academic affairs at Peru State College in Nebraska. He begins his position July 1. An acting director of the residential colleges will be named in the future.

Smith came to Northeast in 1975. He said leaving Northeast means leaving some great friends and some terrific memories.

"I have had 18 excellent years at Northeast and I appreciate the support of Dr. Warren and Dr. Magruder," Smith said. "But, academic administration is something I have wanted to do for a long time.

At Peru, Smith will oversee academic programs. Peru is one of three regional colleges and offers bachelor's and master's degree programs.

In 1988, Smith helped implement the residential colleges at Northeast. Last year, he organized the First International Conference of Residential Colleges & Living/Learning Centers on campus.

"I especially enjoyed working with the residential colleges. They are a great thing for Northeast, and I hope they will continue to prosper."

## Morrison's Begins Service

Bulk candy is just one of the improvements students will see with Northeast's new food service, Morrison's Hospitality Group. Dennis Markeson, director of food services, and John Pierce, district manager of Morrison's, are working together to renovate the residential dining halls, make campus food healthier and provide more meal options for students.

"We think of students as our customers, not as just students," Pierce said.



The transition from the former food service company, Professional Food Management (PFM), will continue until the beginning of the fall semester. Under Morrison's the residential dining halls will have different stations for different types of food, such as one for hamburgers, one for deli sandwiches and one for hot food, similar to Mainstreet Market. They will also implement programs to provide nutritional information for each meal and take-out meals for students on the run.
