## State Ballet of Missouri To Perform

The State Ballet of Missouri will perform at 8 p.m., Nov. 11, in Baldwin Auditorium, as a Lyceum Series presentation. The Ballet will be presented under the artistic direction of Todd Bolender, choreographer and dancer with the New York Ballet for more than 15 years.

Founded in 1957, the Ballet has survived many changes, especially in the last few years. Formerly the Kansas City Ballet, the Ballet was renamed in 1986 as a result of expanded operations and the building of a performing calendar in St. Louis. The Ballet is committed to providing high quality ballet performances and education to the entire state of Missouri.

This year, Northeast students have the opportunity to learn first-hand from members of the Ballet. Students with a dance background may attend a jazz dance class instructed by a member of the troupe, at 1:30 p.m., Nov. 11, Pershing Building Small Gym. The evening performance includes four works: "Pas de Dix," "Divertimento," "A Summer's Day" and "Con Amore."

"Pas de Dix," translated from French as "a dance for ten," does not relay a specific story. Rather, it is a series of dances for an ensemble of eight and two soloists. The work was born of Balanchine's fond recollections of his student days in Russia.

Considered a perfect chamber work for the leading couple and four supporting couples, "Divertimento" is a short ballet. Bolender calls the work "a little jewel. It's fun, lovely, light and joyous, and makes no pretense of being elaborate. It's just wonderful dance."

The comic ballet, "A Summer's Day," is about four boys whose worlds of play and romance continually collide

and whose judgment is somewhat flawed. Choreographed by Bolender, the dance collects elements of jazz and sports. The ballet's music is Aaron Copland's "Danzon Cubano."

The last ballet scheduled is "Con Amore," a twentieth century work by choreographer Lew Christensen. "Con Amore's" humorous story is woven from

two seemingly unrelated tales of love.

Free tickets will be available to students, faculty and staff Nov. 9, 10 and 11, in the SAB Office, SUB.

Financial assistance for this event is provided by the Missouri Arts Council, a state agency.

The use of cameras during the performance is prohibited.
