"No," replied Price with a typically evil laugh. "I'm really a pussycat in real life."

Price spoke before a crowded Baldwin Hall Auditorium last night at the University. His appearance was part of the University's Lyceum Series programs.

Price told the audience that villainy is his number one love. Why? He gave three reasons: "I've been connected with some of the most exciting and best actors in the business--Edward G. Robinson, Boris Karloff, John Carridine, Peter ^{LORE}Laurie." Second, villains last. "The older and uglier he (a villain) grows, the better you like him." "The other reason I really like villains is because women identify with them. You ask any married woman in this audience, and if she is honest with you, she will admit that she thinks of her husband as a villain."

SATURDAY'S JAZZ CONCERT, featuring Eddie Daniels, will begin at 7 p.m. in Baldwin Auditorium. Phi Mu Alpha is sponsoring the day's festival which will begin at 8 a.m. with 48 bands competing for trophies in six classes.

Tickets are available through tomorrow in the SUB and at the Baldwin Hall ticket window Saturday. The price of \$1.75 per person will admit the bearer to the competition during the day and to the night concert.
