ROOMS AND MEALS

It is anticipated that a large number of former students returning to attend the Celebration will have their own way of securing rooms and board while here. The commercial hotels—the Pool, the Dockery, and the Central are good hotels. Reservations may be secured in advance by application. The large crowd of visitors will have to be accommodated in the rooming-houses and private homes of the town. There will be room for all here at these prices: Rooms, 50c to \$1 per day; meals, 60c to \$1 per day. Request is made that persons desiring to have room and meals engaged for them write to E. M. THE PROCESSION OF THE CLASSES

At eleven o'clock on Friday morning (August 3) there will occur the procession of the graduates and students by classes. This procession will be the most spectacular feature of the celebration. Plans are being made for a number of floats that will depict the history of the school from earliest times. The committee in charge of the celebration suggests that each class arrange for the procession some sort of a display or stunt which will be representative of the class or of the institution at the time of graduation. Letters are being sent out to certain members of each class regarding the procession with the request that they take the lead in their respective classes in getting something under way that will be appropriate as class displays or stunts in the procession.
