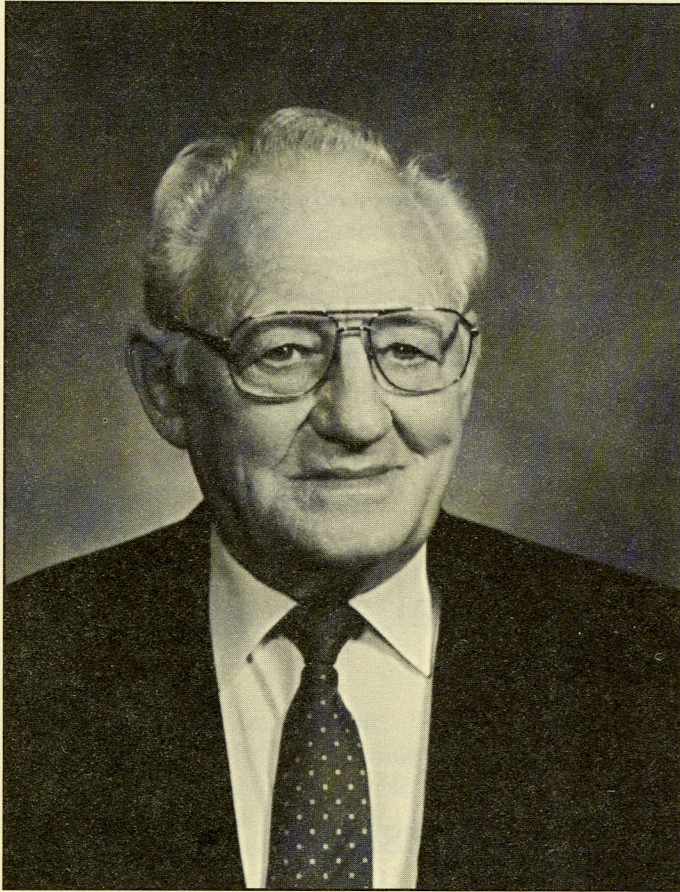

## Norman Merrell

1924-1994

The state of Missouri lost a true leader and Northeast Missouri State University a true friend when Senator Norman Merrell died June 14, 1994. Born and raised on a farm in Lewis County, where he attended a one-room school, Merrell never forgot his roots. He is noted especially for protecting the interests of northeast Missouri and education in particular.

Although Northeast Missouri State University was not in Merrell's senatorial district, his commitment to the University was constant throughout his 24 years in the Missouri Senate. His support of House Bill 196 ultimately resulted in Northeast becoming Missouri's liberal arts and sciences university. He also helped secure millions of dollars to support various campus buildings and renovations.

Merrell was first elected to the Missouri Senate in 1970 and served there until his death. He served as president pro tem of the Senate for six years and also served two different times as chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee. Previously, Merrell taught school for 21 years in Lewis County and was the only state senator to have served as a teacher, school principal and school superintendent.

Merrell attended Northeast Missouri State University. He held a bachelor's degree from Culver-Stockton College and his master's from the University of Colorado. Merrell also served three years in the Army Air Force during World War II.

He received numerous awards and recognition for his public service, including the Pioneer Award, the highest honor in the field of education. The Pioneer Award is presented annually to outstanding Missourians who are considered "pioneers" in the education field.

Merrell resided with his wife, Carlene, in Monticello, Missouri. He is survived by his wife, and their two children and five grandchildren.



## Susan Plassmeyer

Susan Plassmeyer is the director of marketing and operations for the Environmental Law and Policy Center (ELPC) of the Midwest. ELPC provides legal and technical resources and generates and promotes ideas to grass roots environmental organizations throughout the Midwest on how to solve environmental problems. In addition to her ELPC responsibilities, Plassmeyer teaches business finance part time at National-Louis University.

An experienced public policy analyst, Plassmeyer holds a Master in Business Administration degree from the University of Chicago. She graduated summa cum laude from Northeast Missouri State University in 1986 with Bachelor of Science degrees in economics and business administration (finance and marketing) and a Bachelor of Arts degree in economics and was the class valedictorian. In 1993, she was a White House Fellowship Program national finalist.

Northeast's first student representative to the Board of Governors, Plassmeyer was a member of the Pershing Society, Student Activities Board, Delta Sigma Pi and the Newman Center.

Prior to joining ELPC, Plassmeyer was assistant vice president of corporate and community affairs for the First National Bank of Chicago. She was responsible for awarding grants to and developing programs with many non-profit economic development organizations in Chicago. She also led a consortium of corporations in a study of the Chicago health care market while working at the Bank. She participated in the Bank's First Scholar Program, the Bank's most selective management training program.

Currently, Plassmeyer serves on the Northeast National Alumni Association Board of Directors and is a member of the NMSU Chicago Alumni Chapter. She has volunteered for the American Cancer Society and served on the state advisory board for the CanSurmount Program. She continues to work with the CHESSTutoring program for eighth-grade Chicago Public School students, a program she founded and coordinated in 1991.

# Board of Governors

The Honorable Larry K. Rutledge, president

A self-employed farmer for the past 31 years, Mr. Rutledge also serves on the board of directors of the URSA Farmers Co-op. He is a resident of Monticello, Missouri. Mr. Rutledge was appointed to the Board in April 1989.

The Honorable William V. North, vice president (out-of-state member)

A 1953 graduate of Northeast Missouri State University, Mr. North is a trial lawyer and a director and shareholder of Shugart, Thomson, and Kilroy, P.C., in the Kansas City area. He is a member of the firm's executive committee and manages its Overland Park, Kansas, office. Mr. North earned his Juris Doctorate from the University of Iowa College of Law. He was appointed to the Board in August 1990.

The Honorable Thomas R. Shroul Jr., secretary

Mr. Shroul is the executive director of the St. Louis Citizens for Modern Transit. Previously, he was director of academic marketing for the Response Marketing Group of St. Louis. From 1971-86, Shroul was director of external affairs at Northeast Missouri State University. He is a graduate of the University of Missouri-Columbia. He was appointed to the Board in May 1990.

The Honorable Gary L. Ball

Mr. Ball, a certified public accountant, is the chief financial officer for Brookfield Fabricating Company in Brookfield, Missouri. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Missouri Society of Certified Public Accountants, the New Mexico Society of Certified Public Accountants and the National Association of Tax Practitioners. Ball, a 1978 graduate of Northeast, was appointed to the Board in June 1989.

The Honorable Alphonso Jackson (out-of-state member)

A 1968 and 1969 graduate of Northeast Missouri State University, Mr. Jackson is the executive director of the Dallas Housing Authority. Previously, he was the director of public safety for St. Louis. He has also served as executive director for the St. Louis Housing Authority, special assistant to the chancellor and assistant professor of criminal justice at the University of Missouri-St. Louis, and director of the Department of Public and Assisted Housing in Washington, D.C. Jackson serves on the Regional Selection Panel for the White House Fellowship Program. He also holds a law degree from Washington University School of Law. He was appointed to the Board in January 1994.

The Honorable Wilma Maddox

Mrs. Maddox is the manager and bookkeeper for Vision Care Associates in Macon, Missouri. She serves on the Board of Education of the Macon County R-I School District and is a member of the American Foundation for Vision Awareness. She is also the coordinator of Children's Ministries for the Macon United Methodist Church. A 1979 graduate of Northeast Missouri State University, Maddox was appointed to the Board in January 1994.

The Honorable Richard S. Pryor

Mr. Pryor is past president and chief executive officer of the Bank of Jacomo in Blue Springs, Missouri, and past president of the Missouri Bankers Association. He is on the board of directors of Kansas Bankers Surety Company. Pryor and his wife, Linda, were recently named "Civic Citizens of the Year" by the West Gate Division of the Missouri Municipal League. He is a graduate of Columbia College, American Institute of Banking and the Graduate School of Banking at the University of Wisconsin. He was appointed to the Board in April 1986.

The Honorable Mary L. Rhodes

A 1980 graduate of Northeast Missouri State University, Ms. Rhodes is a partner in the law firm of Clayton and Rhodes in Hannibal, Missouri. She received her Juris Doctorate from the University of Missouri-Columbia School of Law. She has served as a law clerk, legislative intern and administrative aide in Jefferson City, Missouri, and Washington, D.C. She has served as the Marion County Port Authority Commissioner, the Young Lawyers Section Council district representative and on the Foresight Committee-Family Law Section for the Missouri Council on Women's Economic Development and Job Training. Rhodes was appointed to the Board in February 1993.

The Honorable Kyle B. Cope, student representative

Mr. Cope is a sophomore English and political science major from Bertrand, Missouri. He is a student representative on Student Senate, chairman of the academic affairs committee, and was a student representative to the Undergraduate Council. He is also involved with the Showboat Gamblers Marching Band and Lambda Chi Alpha. He is a Presidents Honorary Scholar. He was appointed to the Board in April 1994.

## The Commencement Ceremony

### The University

---

In 1867, Joseph Baldwin returned to Missouri from Indiana, looking for a location to open a school to educate teachers. On September 2, 1867, Baldwin opened the North Missouri Normal School and Commercial College in Kirksville. In 1870, Baldwin's school became the First District Normal School of Missouri, the first in the state's new normal school system, dedicated to the education of teachers for the public schools.

At the close of the 1869-70 academic year, the Normal School graduated its first class of 15 men. The Commencement program was held in the auditorium of the Cumberland Academy building on Friday, June 24, 1870. President Joseph Baldwin preached the sermon and T.A. Parker, state superintendent of schools, delivered the address.

Today, Missouri's statewide public liberal arts and sciences university celebrates its Summer Commencement with more than 200 men and women graduating with bachelor's and master's degrees. Although the people, the campus and the mission of Northeast Missouri State University have changed during the last 127 years, the traditions of the commencement ceremony have remained intact.

## The Dress

---

The academic costume worn today is the dress of the medieval secular clergy with a few alterations introduced by 16th century Protestant reformers. The intellectual revival of the 12th century gave impetus to the founding of the European universities. Students in these institutions were clerks; thus, they wore the dress of the secular clergy. In the 16th century, Protestant reformers, who associated academic habits with popery, adopted more civilian gowns.

The oldest article of academic wear was the robe, which was a loose gown. The habit, a tunic with short, wide sleeves, was worn over the robe. A hood lined with fur or inexpensive skins could be gathered around the neck or pulled up on the head as a turban. Finally, there were three kinds of caps worn: the round cap, reserved for doctoral dignity; a round cap with strings tied under the chin, worn by jurists; and the square cap. Universities such as Oxford made the square cap official; however, secular universities adopted the Tudor bonnet still worn by doctors of law, medicine and music.

American academic costume was not established until 1895. It consists of three types of gowns, three styles of hoods and two kinds of cap tassels. The bachelor's gown has long, pointed open sleeves with no ornamentation. The master's gown has even longer sleeves, which are closed at the bottom but feature openings about halfway down for the hands. The doctor's gown has full-length lapels of velvet and bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal velvet bars. The color of caps and gowns is usually black; however, some universities feature doctoral gowns of distinctive colors, such as Harvard's crimson and Yale's deep blue. Many schools outside the United States have also adopted colorful gowns.

The doctor's hood is the longest and fullest among the degrees. The major field of study can be determined from the velvet facing on the hood according to the following color scheme: white, the arts; gold-yellow, science; purple, law; apricot, nursing; green, medicine; sapphire, business administration; lemon, librarianship; scarlet, theology; dark blue, doctors of philosophy.

The hood is lined with silk in the colors of the institution which granted the degree. Northeast's masters graduates, for example, wear a purple and white-lined hood. The faculty at Northeast Missouri State University represent doctoral-granting institutions around the world. A few of their hood colors are the blue and white of Duke, the orange and black of Princeton, the crimson of Harvard, and the scarlet of Oxford.

The candidates for graduation wear black caps to which are attached tassels of colors illustrative of their degrees:

White: Bachelor of Arts, Master of Arts, Master of Arts in Education, Master of Science, Master of Accountancy

Brown: Bachelor of Fine Arts

Yellow-Gold: Bachelor of Science

Pink: Bachelor of Music

The gold-tasseled cords worn by some of the undergradu-

ate degree candidates signify the designation of "honor graduate." There are three levels of honor based on cumulative grade point average: cum laude, 3.50-3.74; magna cum laude, 3.75-3.89; summa cum laude, 3.90-4.00.

The academic procession is led by the faculty marshal. The marshal carries the University mace, which symbolizes the academic corporate body of scholars possessing its own jurisdiction and its own legally constituted authority. The mace is decorated with purple and white tassels and ribbons, and is topped with the University seal.

Following the marshal are the platform guests dressed in doctoral robes with hoods featuring the purple and white colors of the University. They are followed by the University faculty who wear the academic dress of their respective degree-granting institutions. The other faculty marshal leads the major portion of the procession, comprised of the degree candidates assembled according to the degree being granted.

Junior marshals appear throughout the procession dressed in white robes and caps. They are University students who help form the procession and seat the commencement participants.
