SUMMER SCHOLARSHIPS for German language study in Germany are being offered by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). The scholarships provide tuition and fees for two months of study at a Goethe Institute, room and partial board. Applicants must be juniors, seniors or graduate students and must have completed one year of college-level German. Scholarships for German studies and language courses at German universities are also available from DAAD. Scholarships provide tuition and fees for three-week summer courses, partial living expenses and a travel subsidy. Applicants must be juniors, seniors or graduate students (from all disciplines) and must have completed at least two years of college-level German. Application deadline is Jan. 31.
