CHARLES C. CAMPBELL, assistant dean of the Extension Division of the University of Missouri-Columbia, will give the 1978 Summer Commencement address at 7:30 p.m. Friday, Aug. 11. Campbell served as the first dean of administration at NMSU from 1970-74. The commencement procession will begin at 7 p.m. at Baldwin Hall. Approximately 400 undergraduates and graduate students will march to Stokes Stadium where President Charles McClain will confer the degrees. In case of rain, commencement activities will be held in Pershing Arena.

"SLEUTH," a suspense mystery, will be shown at 7 p.m. Thursday in the Activities Room of the Student Union Building. The movie is part of the Arts in the Park Series sponsored by Student Activities. Admission is 50 cents.
