S. E. GERARD PRIESTLEY

Dr. Priestley was born in the borough of Windsor, England; had his undergraduate education at New College, University of London, and has the master's and doctor's degrees from the Graduate School of Arts and Science, New York University. He holds the degrees of Bachelor of Divinity from the Hartford Theological Seminary, Master of Sacred Theology from the Hartford Theological Seminary, Master of Sacred Social Science in International Relations. He has done postgraduate work at the Universidad Nacional de Mexico and Union Theological Seminary, New York. He has taught European History at Springfield College and at New York University.

Dr. Priestley has written on the Agrarian Problem in Mexico, The Proposed Federation of the British West Indies, The Role of Agriculture in the Argentine, and Some Problems and Achievements of Pan-Americanism.

His travels have taken him to Turkey, the Holy Land, Greece, Spain, Yugoslavia and Italy, across the Andes in Peru, the Pampas of Argentina, the forests and lakes of Chile, to Brazil and the West Indies, and into rural Mexico.
