Most of the conflicts are humorous while some are poignantly sad; but all depict life around the family table remaining virtually unchanged from generation to generation. Show times are Thursday through Saturday and July 18-20, in the Little Theater in Baldwin Hall. All Summerplay performances begin at 8 p.m. and admission is \$4 and \$3. 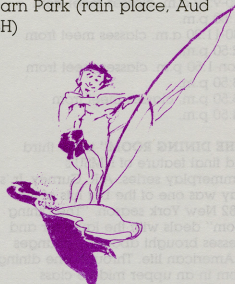
