Graham Resigns as Athletic Director

Alan Graham, who has served as athletic director since September 1990, is resigning the position to become athletic director at Seattle Pacific University (Wash.). Graham's resignation is effective July 31.

Graham indicated that he expected some strong years for Northeast athletics in the near future, so it was a tough decision for him to make.

"It's really difficult for me and my family to leave Kirksville," he said. "However, after talking to Seattle Pacific officials about their needs, it became obvious to us that this was the right move to make. Northeast has been a wonderful experience for us. The lifestyle here has

Before coming to Northeast, the 41-year-old Graham served three years as assistant athletic director for external activities at James Madison University (Va.).

Graham and his wife, Sally, have two sons, Joshua and Tyler.
