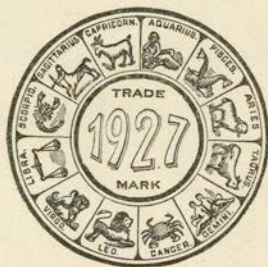


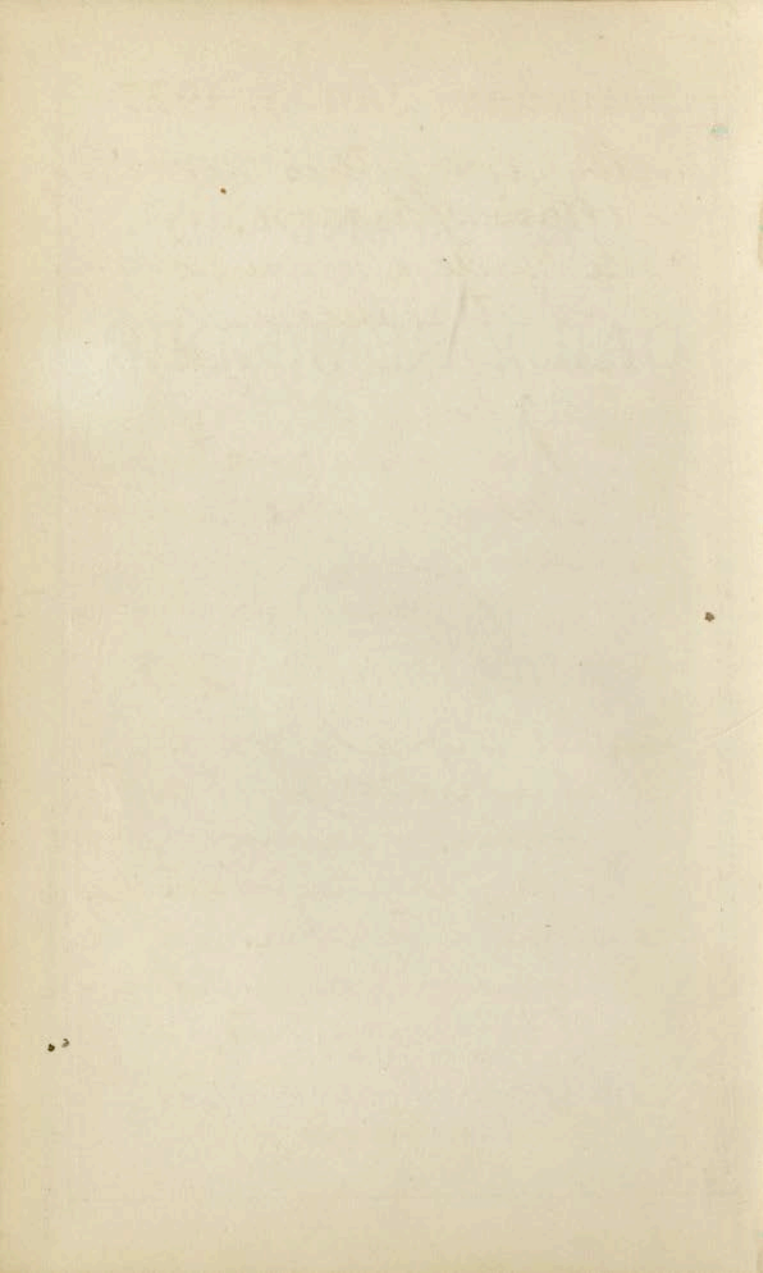

Saturday, Jan. 1, 1927

Partly cloudy this morning.  
Clear this afternoon.

We made a manger in the  
east box stall this A.M.

Russell and I went to a  
shooting match at Pine Air  
this P.M. I won a rooster valued  
at \$1.00. We sold some rabbits  
at 10 each.

Heard Macormac and other artists.

Sunday, Jan. 2, 1927

Clear today. Warmer.

Russell and I went hunting  
this morning. Dad and Mother  
went to uncle Bills this P.M.  
Carl came afternoon.

Dad, Mother, Mildred and  
I went to Boons after supper.

**Monday, Jan. 3, 1927**

Partly cloudy today.

Did not freeze last night.

Russell and I shucked shock corn this morning. We all worked on mangers in the barn this P.M.

Dad received a notice to report for petit jury service January 7.

A part of a nailhead which I got in my eye Saturday A.M. is bothering me quite a lot.

**Tuesday, Jan. 4, 1927**

Clear and warm today.

Dad and I took cream to Pine Air this morning.

The doctor gave me some medicine for my eye which still hurts tonight.

We worked in the barn a little this afternoon.

Mildred and Russell went to Hedigers with Beryl, Lora and Raymond tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 5, 1927

Clear and warm today.

Russell and I shucked shock corn this A. M. and dragged the roads this P. M.

We raked about 4 bu. of seed corn today.

Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Eschmans this P. M. Their baby is sick.

Carl and family came after supper.

We got Mexico City on radio.

Thursday, Jan. 6, 1927

Clear this morning. Partly cloudy this afternoon.

Russell and I shucked shock corn this A. M. It is very dry.

We put kick boards in the shed this afternoon.

Dad, Mother, Mildred and Russell went to Ben Buress after supper. I did not go on account of my eye which still hurts some.

Friday, Jan. 7, 1927

Cloudy today.

Russell and I shucked corn this A.M. Dad and Mother went to Kirksville this A.M. Mildred stayed at Bens last night. Aunt Nell came home with the folks. Harry Zeigler and family came after supper.

Saturday, Jan. 8, 1927

Clear today still warm.

We cleaned out the barn and hauled scrap lumber today.

Leora and Aunt Nell stayed here last night. Dad and Mother took Aunt Nell to Uncle Bills this afternoon. We sold two civet cat hides this P.M. for \$1.75

Uncle Ed. and Aunt Eliza came late this afternoon.

Sunday, Jan. 9, 1927

Cloudy and colder today with flurries of snow. Very windy. Uncle Ed and aunt Eliza stayed here last night.

Jim Bures and Ben and family, Carl and family and Forest Jones were here for dinner today. Uncle Ed and aunt Eliza went home this afternoon.

Monday, Jan. 10, 1927

Clear today.

We sharpened the axes this morning and Dad Russell and I cut wood in Zeigler's timber this afternoon.

Uncle Ira and Carl were here this afternoon.

Christopher Hediger brought a sow this afternoon.

**Tuesday, Jan. 11, 1927**

Clear most of the day today.  
 Russell and I cut wood today.  
 Carl and uncle Ira came this  
 afternoon. Carl butchered this P.M.

**Wednesday, Jan. 12, 1927**

Cloudy today. Snowed some  
 this afternoon.

Uncle Ira stayed all night here  
 last night.

Mother and I took Mildred to Carl's  
 this morning. Christopher got his hog.  
 I cut some wood and went hunting  
 this P.M. Russell and I got an ax handle  
 stick this P.M. Luella and Hubert  
 went to a dance at Ray Bragg's  
 with me. Top slick to get the car home  
 without chains.

Thursday, Jan. 13, 1927

Snowed all last night and until about 3.30 P.M. today.

Russell and I pulled the car home this morning.

We fed the stock corn fodder today for the first time this winter.

No mail today on account of the storm. The snow is about 8 inches deep.

Friday, Jan. 14, 1927

Clear and some colder today.

We broke the roads this morning as the snow is drifting some.

We put soles on the sled this afternoon.

Saturday, Jan. 15, 1927

Clear and cold today.  
Thermometers registered from  
22° to 32° below zero.

I helped Zeiglers drive  
cattle to Youngstown this after-  
noon. We shipped 5 cows with  
them, they weighed 5965 lbs.

Mildred came home this  
afternoon.

Sunday, Jan. 16, 1927

Mostly clear today. Lots of warm.

We heard that Albert Eschmann's  
baby which has been very sick  
died this morning.

Beryl, Russell and I went  
hunting this afternoon we killed  
25 rabbits.

Our cattle were shipped from  
Youngstown this morning.

Monday, Jan. 17, 1927

Mostly clear today. Warmer.  
Dad went to Kirksville in the  
car this morning to report for jury  
service. I took him through the  
drifts to Hedigers.

Bessie, Roxie and Mrs. Frank  
Johnson went with Mother, Mildred  
and I to the funeral of Esthman's  
baby at the Pratt cemetery this after-  
noon.

Tuesday, Jan. 18, 1927

Cloudy today. Snowed a  
little last night.

We butchered a big hog today.  
She probably weighed 500.

I borrowed a big kettle from  
Christopher Hedigers this A. M.  
and took it home this afternoon.

Wednesday, Jan. 19, 1927

Cloudy today.

Russell and I cleaned out the barn this morning.

Russell and I took Chickens, Cream and ~~to~~ 30 rabbits to Pure Air. Rabbits sold for 10 Cents each.

Mildred, Russell and I went to a dance at Charley Daniels tonight.

Thursday, Jan. 20, 1927

Cloudy today.

We broke the road through the drifts east of the house today.

We took feed to the chickens at the other place and cleaned out the chicken house this P. M.

Friday, Jan. 21, 1927

Cloudy today. Snowed a little.  
 Dad and Mildred went to  
 Kirksville this morning. Dad  
 to report for petit jury service.  
 Russell and I went hunting  
 this A.M. and killed 10 rabbits.  
 Mother, Russell and I went  
 to a pie supper at our school  
 house tonight

Saturday, Jan. 22, 1927

Cloudy today.  
 Russell and I went hunting  
 this P.M. and killed 13 rabbits.  
 Dad and Mildred came  
 home this evening. They stayed  
 at uncle Eds last night.  
 Has been too cold to thaw  
 any the last few days.

**Sunday, Jan. 23, 1927**

Cloudy today.

Beryl, Leora, Raymond and Carl and family were here for dinner today. Carl, Beryl, Russell and I went hunting this afternoon.

**Monday, Jan. 24, 1927**

Clear and lots warmer today. Thawed some.

Dad went to Kirksville this A.M. but came home this afternoon.

I went hunting this A.M. Russell cleaned out the barn. I took our rabbits (36) to Pure Air this P.M.

We got a check from Jack Zeigler this A.M. for \$368.79 for the cows we shipped.

Tuesday, Jan. 25, 1927

Cloudy and foggy today.  
Thawed some this afternoon.  
Dad went to Peter Sullivans  
this morning.

Russell and I shucked shock  
corn today.

Wednesday, Jan. 26, 1927

Clear and coldest today.

Dad went to Richsvill this  
A.M. but came home about  
noon as they did not need the  
jury. We sheared the mules this P.M.  
Russell Mildred and I went  
to an old fiddlers contest at  
Pine Air put on by the farm club.  
Snell pros., "Turkey" Douglas and  
"Wes" Muir won the prizes.

Thursday, Jan. 27, 1927

Cloudy today.

Dad went to Kirkville this A.M. Mildred went with him to Carls.

We did not work much today.

We heard Aimee Semple McPherson preach over the radio from Henry Fields station.

Friday, Jan. 28, 1927

Clear today. Lots warmer. Thawed a great deal.

I went fox hunting with Eugene Boer this A.M. No luck. Russell and I shucked shock corn this afternoon.

Saturday, Jan. 29, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

Mildred came home early this A.M. and Dad came about noon.

Russell and I cleaned out the barn and henhouse this A.M. and shucked some corn this afternoon.

Sunday, Jan. 30, 1927

Mostly clear today. Still warm most of the snow is gone only in drifts.

No one came today and we were at home. Russell, Mildred and I went to Harry Zeiglers on horseback after supper.

Monday, Jan. 31, 1927

Mostly clear and warm today.

We did not do much this morning only feed, and sharpen the axes and saw.

Russell and I cut wood on Zeiglers place this afternoon.

Tuesday, Feb. 1, 1927

Clear and warm today.

Practically all the snow gone.

I took Dad to Kirksville this morning and he stayed, as he must report tomorrow morning.

I took a set of harness to be fixed and oiled.

Beryl Zeigler was operated on this morning.

Wednesday, Feb. 2, 1927

Mostly cloudy today.  
Russell and I shucked corn  
today.

Dad came home this P.M.  
He has been excused until  
Monday.

Thursday, Feb. 3, 1927

Mostly clear today. Very warm.  
We did not do much this A.M.  
Russell and I worked on the  
wools this P.M.

**Friday, Feb. 4, 1927**

Cloudy and warm today.  
Rained most of the afternoon.

I borrowed a barrel from  
Harry Zeigler this A.M.

We butchered two 25 pound  
hogs this A.M.

Harry Zeigler borrowed  
our spring wagon late this  
evening.

**Saturday, Feb. 5, 1927**

Cloudy and foggy today. The  
roads are very muddy.

Russell and I cleaned out the  
barn this A.M. Dad rendered food.

Russell and I chopped in the  
timber this afternoon. Milched  
went to Zeiglers this P.M.

Harry Zeigler brought our radio  
batteries from Kirksville this  
evening.

**Sunday, Feb. 6, 1927**

Clear and warm today.  
I got our spring wagon from  
Ziglers this A.M.  
Dad, Mother, Milched and  
Russell went to Carl's this  
A.M. Dad did not come  
home as the roads are very  
bad and he has to report  
at Ricksville tomorrow.  
I was at home all day.

**Monday, Feb. 7, 1927**

Partly cloudy today.

We rang the hogs this morning  
and chopped in the timber this  
afternoon

Tuesday, Feb. 8, 1927

Mostly clear today. Col. Harry Zigler borrowed our spring wagon this A.M.

I went to uncle Ira's sale today. He had a very good sale. Mildred went home with Lesa this afternoon.

Wednesday, Feb. 9, 1927

Snowed some this morning. Cleared off and melted all the snow this afternoon.

We got a letter from the Aladdin hatchery today asking for our eggs.

Russell and I hauled shok corn this P.M.

Russell and I went to auctioneer contest at Puzo's tonight. Mildred is not feeling well.

Thursday, Feb. 10, 1927

Clear and warmer today. Russell and I hauled shocks of corn this morning and chopped in the timber this afternoon.

Dad has not been home this week. I saw him at Uncle Ira's sale.

Friday, Feb. 11, 1927

Clear today.

We made a gate and sharpened the saw and ax this morning. I dragged the woods and Russell shucked shocks of corn this afternoon. Zeigler brought our wagon home this P. M. Dad came home this afternoon.

Saturday, Feb. 12, 1927

Mostly clear today.

Leota went to Kirkville  
with Russell, Mother and  
I today.

Russell and I visited  
Beryl Zigler at the Grim  
hospital today.

We cleaned out the barn  
this morning.

Sunday, Feb. 13, 1927

It has rained sleeted or  
snowed practically all day  
today. Snowing at bedtime.

Uncle Ira and Max and  
Carl Goodwin were here this  
afternoon. We were at home  
all day.

Monday, Feb. 14, 1927

Mostly cloudy today.

Melted all the snow which fell yesterday.

We fixed the cistern which caved in last fall. Took us all day.

Beryl Zeigler came home from the hospital today.

Tuesday, Feb. 15, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

I took Dad to Kirksville this morning. The roads thawed out and it got so muddy I had to leave the car at Harry Farris as I came home.

I took the heavy harness to Kirksville today to be oiled and got the other set.

Wednesday, Feb. 16, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

We cut some dead trees out of the peach orchard this A.M. and worked in the timber this P.M. Dad came home this P.M. He is excused until Mar. 2.

We heard a Shrike at Ira Cooks tonight. Chas. Beagg moved from the Farr place today.

Thursday, Feb. 17, 1927

Started raining between 9 and 10 this A.M. and rained until almost night.

Getting lots colder after night.

Dad ran the car home from Harry Farris early this morning. We did not go much today.

Friday, Feb. 18, 1927

Clear today. Lots colder.  
Russell and I split  
logs in the woods this morning  
and P. M.

Dad has a bad cold and is  
not feeling very well.

Saturday, Feb. 19, 1927

Clear today.

Took eggs to Kirkville this  
morning. Roads were frozen  
and rough.

Dad and Russell cleaned  
out the barn this morning.  
Russell and I split logs in  
the woods this afternoon.  
Russell and Mildred and I  
went to a dance at Frank  
Slovers tonight. Small crowd.

Sunday, Feb. 20, 1927

Clear and warm today.  
I went horseback to Cora  
Bozarth this A. M. and  
stayed all day.

Milchred and Russell  
were at Harry Zeiglers  
this afternoon.

Monday, Feb. 21, 1927

Clear today.

We put a big stack of  
hay from the north meadow  
in the barn today.

Lloyd Huff came this  
P. M. and got some lumber.

**Tuesday, Feb. 22, 1927**

I sprinkled a little this morning. Has been partly cloudy all day. We hauled shock corn this A.M. and finished splitting logs this P.M.

We heard president Calvin Coolidge speak on Washington today.

Carl and family were here this afternoon.

**Wednesday, Feb. 23, 1927**

Clear today.

Dad Russell and I piled 10 loads of wood today.

Leora Zeigler went to a dance at Rex Cooks with Russell, Mildred and I tonight.

Thursday, Feb. 24, 1927

Partly cloudy today.  
Sprinkled some this P.M.  
Dad, Russell and I piled  
9 loads of wood today.

Friday, Feb. 25, 1927

Clear today.

Dad, Russell and I  
piled 5 loads of wood this  
A.M. We finished making 24  
loads in all. We split fence  
posts from the old barn posts  
this afternoon.

Russell and Mildred went  
to Harry Zeiglers after supper.

Saturday, Feb. 26, 1927

Mostly cloudy today.  
 Dad, Mother and Mildred  
 went to Kirksville today.  
 Russell and I hauled fodder,  
 split some posts, <sup>and</sup> dragged  
 the roads today.  
 Dad had the car worked on  
 at Kirksville today.

Sunday, Feb. 27, 1927

Cloudy this A. M. Spits snow  
 some. Mostly clear this P. M.  
 We were at home all day.  
 Beryl and Leora came  
 after supper.

Monday, Feb. 28, 1927

Cloudy today.

Russell and I hauled shocks  
corn today.

Dad bought 50 gal. of coal  
oil from the Shell Co. this A.M.

Albert Boen came this P.M.  
and got some lumber.

Russell, Mildred and I  
went to a dance at Harry  
Snyders tonight. Snowing!! P.M.

Tuesday, March 1, 1927

Snowed today until about  
noon. About 3 or four inches of  
snow fell. Thawed some  
this afternoon.

Beryl Zeigler was here  
all day. Carl came this P.M.  
Dad went home with him.  
He is to go to Kirksville  
on the train tomorrow.

Wednesday, March 2, 1927

Clear today.

We did not do much today.  
I dragged the snow off the  
roads this morning.

The first calf of the  
season came today.

Dad did not come home.

Thursday, March 3, 1927

Clear and warm today.

Russell and I finished  
hauling fodder from the  
field east of the creek.

Dad came home about  
noon today.

Friday, March 4, 1927

Clear today. Practically all the snow has gone this afternoon.

We repaired the barn at the other place this A.M. We fixed the rub flocks on the wagon this P.M. Russell and I rode "Toots" this P.M. for the first time.

Saturday, March 5, 1927

Rained some this A.M. and hard this afternoon.

I drove a team to Kirksville today to take eggs to the hatchery. I listed fourteen hogs to ship next Wednesday.

Sunday, March 6, 1927

Clear today.

Derrell and Opal came this morning and stayed all day.

Monday, March 7, 1927

Rained some last night. Cloudy a while this A. M. Soon cleared off.

We hauled about 7 loads of manure from the hog pen east of the barn today.

"Toots" fell with me this P. M. and knocked me unconscious a while. Hurt my neck.

We fed our first feed from the clover stack today.

**Tuesday, March 8, 1927**

Clear today.

I helped feed this morning but did not feel so well later and stayed in bed until about 3:30 I was sick at my stomach yesterday P.M. and some today.

Carl and family came after supper.

**Wednesday, March 9, 1927**

Clear today.

I did not work today as my head ached and felt funny generally.

Russell and Dad fixed to feed the sheep at the other place.

Russell and Mildred went to Pure Air with Beryl and Lora to a spelling match. Eric Schille won.

Thursday, March 10, 1927

Partly cloudy today.  
 I feel some better today but  
 not well enough to work any.  
 Dad and Russell shucked  
 some shock corn this A.M.  
 Lora and Raymond were  
 here this P.M. Mildred went home  
 with them.

Friday, March 11, 1927

It rained some this A.M.  
 and rained hard this P.M.  
 The creek got bank full.

Mildred came home from  
 Harry's this morning.  
 Dad and Russell shucked  
 a load of corn this A.M.

**Saturday, March 12, 1927**

Clear most of the day.

Denrell Pinkerton went to Kirksville with Russell and I in the spring wagon.

We bought two W. F. B. S. pallets from Whites today.

Russell Milled and I went to uncle Bill Pinkerton's after supper.

**Sunday, March 13, 1927**

Cloudy today.

We were at home all day.

Eugene Boen, Donnie Zeigler and Mike Pope were here this afternoon.

Some cars are running today.

Monday, March 14, 1927

Clear and an extra fine day today. We shucked some shock corn this morning. We pruned the raspberries and roses this P.M.

Mildred and I took some this P.M. The first time since I was hurt a week ago. I feel about all right.

Tuesday, March 15, 1927

Clear today.

Dad and I dragged the woods this morning.

Mildred and I went to see the play "The Cat and the Canary" at the Kennedy theater tonight. Mother went to Carl's with us. Carl is pretty sick with a sore throat.

Jesse Bozarth was married yesterday. Saw him at Kirks.

Wednesday, March 16, 1927

Partly cloudy today.  
Rained some about bed time.

Dad and I took twelve head of hogs to Kirksville today. They weighed 265 pounds each.

I borrowed a wagon from Harry Zeigler this A.M. and returned it this P.M.

Kept from a dance at U.C. Bragg by rain.

Thursday, March 17, 1927

Mostly clear today.

Russell and I finished shucking the shock corn in the field this A.M.

Dad and Mildred took Carl to a doctor at Kirksville this afternoon. He has a very sore throat. Mother went to Carl with them.

Donnie Zeigler and family and Beryl and Leora were here after supper.

Friday, March 18, 1927

Partly cloudy today.  
Sprinkled some about bedtime.  
We sawed wood today.  
Loyad Huff sawed for us.  
Harry and Lloyd Zeigler  
helped us. We had about  
five hours sawing.

Saturday, March 19, 1927

Cloudy and cooler today.  
Rained most of the afternoon.  
Dad, Mother, and Mildred  
went to Kirksville today.  
Mildred stayed at Carls.  
Carl is some better.

Russell and I cleaned  
out the barn this morning.  
We found the first lambs  
of the year today, a pair of  
twins.

**Sunday, March 20, 1927**

Cloudy today.

Russell went to Cozls this A. M. Mildred came home with him this P. M.

Beryl came this A. M. and stayed all day. Leonard Boyarth came this afternoon.

**Monday, March 21, 1927**

Cloudy today. Snowed some last night and this A. M. but all melted later.

We took a load of clover hay to the other place this A. M.

We separated the lambs from the ewes this P. M.

Brought them to the hog pasture.

Mildred went to Harry Zeiglers this P. M.

Tuesday, March 22, 1927

Partly cloudy today.  
Froze pretty hard last night but warmed up today.

Found five lambs this A.M. We split boards into cook wood today.

Derrell Pinkerton invited us to a surprise birthday dinner for uncle Bill Thursday.

Wednesday, March 23, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

I scattered manure from the straw stack bottom today.

Dad and Russell worked on the wood pile today making the scrap lumber from the old barn into wood.

Russell Mildred and I went to a Farm Club meeting at Pure Air tonight.

Thursday, March 24, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

We all went to a surprise birthday dinner for uncle Bill Pinkerton at his place. He is 55 years old.

Uncle Bill gave a dance tonight. We all went. Snell Bros. made the music on the accordion and banjo.

Friday, March 25, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

I scattered straw manure this morning. Dad, Mother and Mildred went to Kirksville this afternoon. We got returns from the hogs, \$324.36

John Muir and Leota stopped here awhile this evening. Albert Boen came and listened to a fiddling contest from W. O. S. until about 12.

**Saturday, March 26, 1927**

Partly cloudy today.

Russell and I cleaned out the barn and finished scattering the straw this morning.

I plowed the small patch south of the bridge this P.M.

**Sunday, March 27, 1927**

Partly cloudy today.

Beryl and Leora came this P.M. Beryl went with Russell and I to Boens to practice Ball.

Carl and family came this P.M. and stayed for supper.

Monday, March 28, 1927

Partly cloudy today.

We fed last of the clover this A.M. We sowed oats on the piece west of the creek north of the road. We sowed them with Christophers seeder but did not get them disked  
we.

Carl brought the hay fork home this afternoon.

Tuesday, March 29, 1927

Cloudy today.

I finished diskings the oats in this morning. Russell harrowed this afternoon but did not finish.

I did not work this P.M. as my throat is sore and I feel like I am taking the flu. Russell Dad and Mildred all complain about the same as me this P.M.

Wednesday, March 30, 1927

Partly cloudy today  
Sprinkled some this evening.  
Dad Russell and Mildred  
were all in bed most of the  
day today. just up to do the  
chores. I stayed in bed some  
this afternoon.

Christopher Hediger  
bought 1 1/2 bu. of oats from us  
this P.M. at 60 cents Per bu.

Thursday, March 31, 1927

Cloudy today. Sprinkled  
some this A.M. and rained  
hard this P.M.

Dad and Russell were in bed  
most of the day. I feel quite  
a bit better.

We had a young calf  
drown in a ditch this P.M.  
Lots of wind and rain this  
afternoon.

Friday, April 1, 1927

Cloudy today. Rained both this morning and afternoon. The river is coming out of its banks this afternoon.

We did not do much today only take care of the sheep. We all feel better today. Russells and my throats are still sore.

Saturday, April 2, 1927

Cloudy all day.

Russell and I cleaned out the barn this a. m. Dad and I took a load of oats to the other place for the sheep this P. M. We have over 40 lambs.

Russell went to Dr. Murmud this afternoon to get medicine for his throat which is worse this afternoon.

Sunday, April 3, 1927

Clear today.

Delmas and Carl Bragg were here for dinner today.

We went to Boens to practice baseball this P.M. Mildred went to Harry Ziegler's this P.M.

Monday, April 4, 1927

Partly cloudy today. Rained a little early this morning.

Dad rode horseback to Mike's will early this A.M. for jury service. Today is ~~his~~ his birthday. Mother and I took eggs to the hatchery today.

Velda came home with the folks this P.M.

**Tuesday, April 5, 1927**

Clear today.

Dad went to Kirksville today for jury service. He was finally dismissed. Russell and I did not do much today. My throat is some better this P. M. but Russell has a very sore throat. Dad went to school election this P. M. Dance at Dec Cove tonight.

**Wednesday, April 6, 1927**

Clear today.

Dad and I dragged the roads this A. M.

I plowed some in the garden and a potato patch this P. M.

Lera came to stay all night. Russells throat is some better.

Thursday, April 7, 1927

Has rained steadily all day.

We did not do much today. Zeora went home this morning. The first gilt to find pigs had one today.

Friday, April 8, 1927

Has rained practically all day.

We did not do much today. Today is the last day of the Williams and some other schools.

**Saturday, April 9, 1927**

Cloudy today. Rained quite a bit this A. M.

We finished making wood of the scrap pile this afternoon. We cleared out the barn this A. M.

**Sunday, April 10, 1927**

Rained a little this A. M. Albert Boen came and stayed all day.

Mildred went to Harry Ziegler's this P. M.

Monday, April 11, 1927

Rained some early this  
A.M. Partly clear today.

Mildred and I went to  
Kirksville today.

Dad and Russell put  
the mules in the barn today.

Tuesday, April 12, 1927

Rained last night,  
this A.M. and this P.M.

We hitched the young  
mule up this morning.

Wednesday, April 13, 1927
