## Seats still available for Super Summer Saturday

How much would it cost you to drive to Kansas City, spend eight hours at Worlds of Fun on the day that Suzanne Somers is appearing in person, attend a baseball game between the Kansas City Royals and Boston Red Sox, and then drive back home? If you sign up for the SAB Super Summer Saturday Kansas City Excursion, it would cost you \$92.50.

SAB Summer Chairman Cindy Moore said 40 seats are available for the trip with a minimum of 25 people needed by Friday. Anyone interested in the excursion can sign up in the Student Activities Office, 204 Administration/Humanities Building. The day of the excursion will be Thursday, July 18, and the group will leave Kirksville about 7 a.m. and return about 2 a.m.

Moore said trip participants must pay the full price when they sign up in order to reserve a space. If the baseball strike continues or tickets are unavailable, the ticket price will be refunded and the trip will revolve around at Worlds of Fun.

Included in the cost of the excursion is transportation by University bus or vans, a Worlds of Fun ticket and a ticket to the Royals game. Those planning on going on the trip should bring their own food or money for meals in Kansas City. A partial refund of the \$92.50 is possible if the group size is large enough to reduce the cost per person for transportation, Moore said.

The tentative itinerary for the Kansas City trip calls for the group to arrive at Worlds of Fun about 10:30 a.m. Suzanne Somers will appear at 5 p.m., and the group will leave the amusement park soon after her show, about 6:40 p.m. The Royals are scheduled to play the Red Sox at 7:35
