Student Senate petitions for 1990-91 positions are available at the Student Senate Information Counter, SUB. Petitions are due at 5 p.m., March 25.

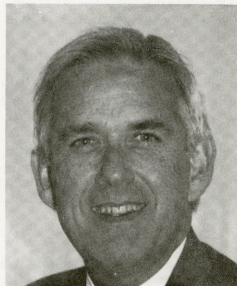
