LYCEUM SERIES ... Maj. Gen. Julius Becton will give a lecture entitled "Leadership: Today's Changing Climate--A Commander's View" tomorrow night at 8 in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. Becton has been with the Army since 1943. His list of decorations include the Silver Star, Purple Heart, Vietnam Gallantry Cross, and the Bronze Star.

Besides serving in World War II the Korean War, his recent assignments include attending the National War College, Washington D.C.; deputy commander of the Army Training Center, Fort Dix, N.J.; and commander of the 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas. Currently Becton is serving as commander of the Army Operational Test and Evaluation Agency in Falls Church, Va.

The Becton lecture is open to the public free of charge.

OVER TWENTY TEAMS will be participating in the annual Blue Key College Bowl tonight-Thursday in the Activities Room of the SUB. The matches will run from 6 p.m.-9 p.m. Team members are urged to check the schedule posted in the SUB concourse for playing times.

DAVE SMITH, CONTEMPORARY AMERICAN POET, will give a reading from his work today at 4:30 in the Tangerine Room of the SUB. Smith is the author of seven volumes of poetry and directs the Creative Writing Workshop at the University of Utah. His honors include a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship and a fellowship in poetry at the Breadloaf Writer's Conference. The reading is open to the public.

Through the use of a slide presentation, Richard Underwood, Supervisory Aerospace Technologist at the Johnson Space Center in Houston, showed the dramatic changes that resulted from the developments of photography in the space program. Underwood was speaking to the Northeast Mo. Teachers Assoc. at their meeting March 4 in Baldwin Hall. Advancement in such areas as medicine, energy, nutrition, agriculture, and pollution control can all be attributed to the space program according to Underwood. His only concern is that society no longer encourages the expansion of the space program, which Underwood believes can answer many of our world's problems.
