**REPORT OF THE GENTRY-PARRISH
MEMORIAL FUND COMMITTEE**

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

In the fall of 1915 the Kirksville State Normal School lost by death two of its oldest and most beloved members of its faculty. Miss Ophelia A. Parrish died on October 29 after an illness of several weeks, and Professor B. P. Gentry died on November 4 as the result of a fall from a street car in Kansas City a few days previous.

Miss Parrish had been a member of the faculty since 1899, serving first as head of the Training School as it was then called from 1899 to 1903, and then as librarian until her death. Professor Gentry came to the institution in 1882. For the first nine years he taught a variety of subjects, including music and Latin. From 1891 on, his work was confined to Latin exclusively.

The passing of these two highly honored members of the faculty within ten days of each other, made a very deep impression upon the students, the faculty and the entire community in which they had lived. Almost spontaneously a movement was started to do something that would be a permanent commemoration of their lives and work in the school. A joint committee, consisting of President Kirk, Grace Lyle, W. J. Bray and E. M. Violette from the faculty and M. B. Platz, Mabel Nulton, and Phradie Wells from the students, was appointed to consider the matter, and upon their recommendation the faculty and the students decided to raise a fund to be known as the Gentry-Parrish Memorial Fund. The plan was to set aside the greater part of this fund as a permanent fund and invest it in such a way as to bring in a steady annual income which should be used in short time loans to students who might be in need of financial assistance while attending the Normal School. It was hoped that \$1000 would be raised for this permanent fund. Whatever might be raised beyond that amount would be used in erecting bronze tablets or some other kind of material memorial in honor of Miss Parrish and Professor Gentry.

The committee began at once a vigorous campaign for subscriptions not only among the faculty and students but also among the former students and faculty members. The plan was to get a great many small subscriptions instead of a few large subscriptions. In that respect the work of the committee succeeded admirably. The personal subscriptions ranged from 5 cents to \$10. Only six individuals and three organizations gave \$10 each, and only twenty-one individuals gave \$5.00 each (The net proceeds from two different funds amounting to \$13.40 and \$5.26 were contributed). Most of the subscriptions ranged from 25 cents to \$1.00. The total subscriptions amounted to \$605.52; the number of subscriptions was 581; the average subscription amounted to \$1.04.

The expectations of the committee as to the sum total of the subscriptions fell short by \$400. Moreover the expenses of printing and postage ran up considerably. All who contributed did so gladly, but many did not do so

until the second circular had been sent out. The net proceeds of the fund amounts to only \$526.47.

The committee therefore decided to set aside \$500 of the net proceeds as a permanent fund, the income of which should be used for making loans to students without interest. This fund was invested in liberty bonds. The remainder of the net proceeds was invested in war savings certificates and is being held with the expectation of using it sometime in placing bronze tablets in honor of Professor Gentry and Miss Parrish on the walls of the assembly hall, or the chapel as former students are fond of calling it. This amount will have to be supplemented before the tablets can be erected.

The liberty bands and the war savings certificates are in the custody of the secretary-treasurer of the committee.

At the present time, Sept. 1, 1920, the permanent fund has earned \$69.27. Loans have been made from the income to four different persons.

A list of the subscribers and the amount of their subscriptions, and a detailed financial statement follow.
