SUMMER COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER will be Robert P. Ewing, president of Bankers Life and Casualty Company. Summer Commencement is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Friday August 12 in Stokes Stadium.

A native of Kirksville, Ewing is a 1948 graduate of the University where he received a B.S. in Business Administration.

Bankers, with its home office in Chicago, is the country's second largest writer of individual health insurance. It is also one of the top 50 writers of life insurance nationally. Its policies protect nearly 2 million people.

About 400 students are expected to be graduated at commencement exercises. The traditional academic procession will begin at 7 p.m. in Baldwin Hall.
