INDEPENDENCE DAY will be celebrated on Tuesday. All classes will be dismissed. All University offices will be closed.

THE HANNIBAL ICE HOUSE THEATRE will begin its 1978 summer season on Wednesday with the musical production of "Tom Sawyer" by Frank Luther. Other highlights of the 11th year of performances will be "Arsenic and Old Lace," a comedy by Joseph Kesselring; "Only an Orphan Girl," a melodrama by Henning Nelms; "She Stoops To Conquer," a comedy by Oliver Goldsmith; "Stop the World--I Want to Get Off," a musical by Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley; and "Veronica's Room," a mystery by Ira Levin. Limited copies of the Ice House schedule, including a calendar of performances and ticket prices, are available in the Public Relations Office, McKinney Center.

A DINNER HONORING Dr. Bing Shao, professor of economics, will be held on Friday at the Shamrock Inn. Dr. Shao will be retiring this summer after 24 years of service to the University. Reservations may be made through the Social Science Office by Wednesday. Cost for a buffet dinner is \$3.75 per person.

REGISTRATION FOR THE SECOND SUMMER SESSION will be Monday, July 10, in the Activities Room of the Student Union Building. These numbers will be admitted at 8 a.m., 7, 8, 9, 0; at 9 a.m., 4, 5, 6; and at 10 a.m., 1, 2, 3. Card distribution will end at 10:30 a.m. Class-work will begin on registration day on a special one day schedule:

- Period 1 (7:30-9:20) meets from 1:00-1:50 p.m.
- Period 2 (9:30-11:20) meets from 2:00-2:50 p.m.
- Period 3 (12:00-1:50) meets from 3:00-3:50 p.m.
- Period 4 (2:00-3:50) meets from 4:00-4:50 p.m.
