Missouri Gov. John Ashcroft will declare his candidacy for re-election at 10:30 a.m., March 23, on the steps of Kirk Memorial. In the case of inclement weather, the event will be moved inside the Kirk Memorial rotunda.

The Board of Governors will meet at 10 a.m., Friday, in the Board Room of the President's Office. The meeting has been moved from the SUB Conference Room due to ongoing renovations.

Applications for assistant IFC adviser and assistant Panhellenic adviser are available through March 24 in the Dean of Students Office, A/H 204. The positions run through the 1988-89 academic year and include a \$1,600 stipend for each in return for 15 hours of service per week. An Faculty Art Show reception will be held at 3 p.m., March 24, Baldwin Hall second floor.

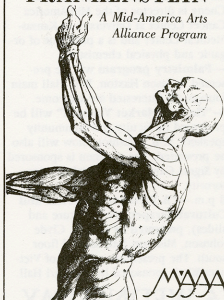
