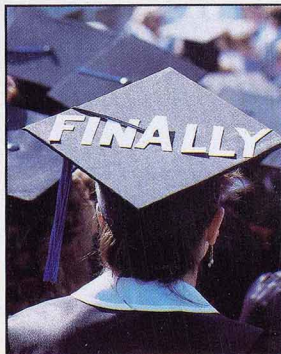


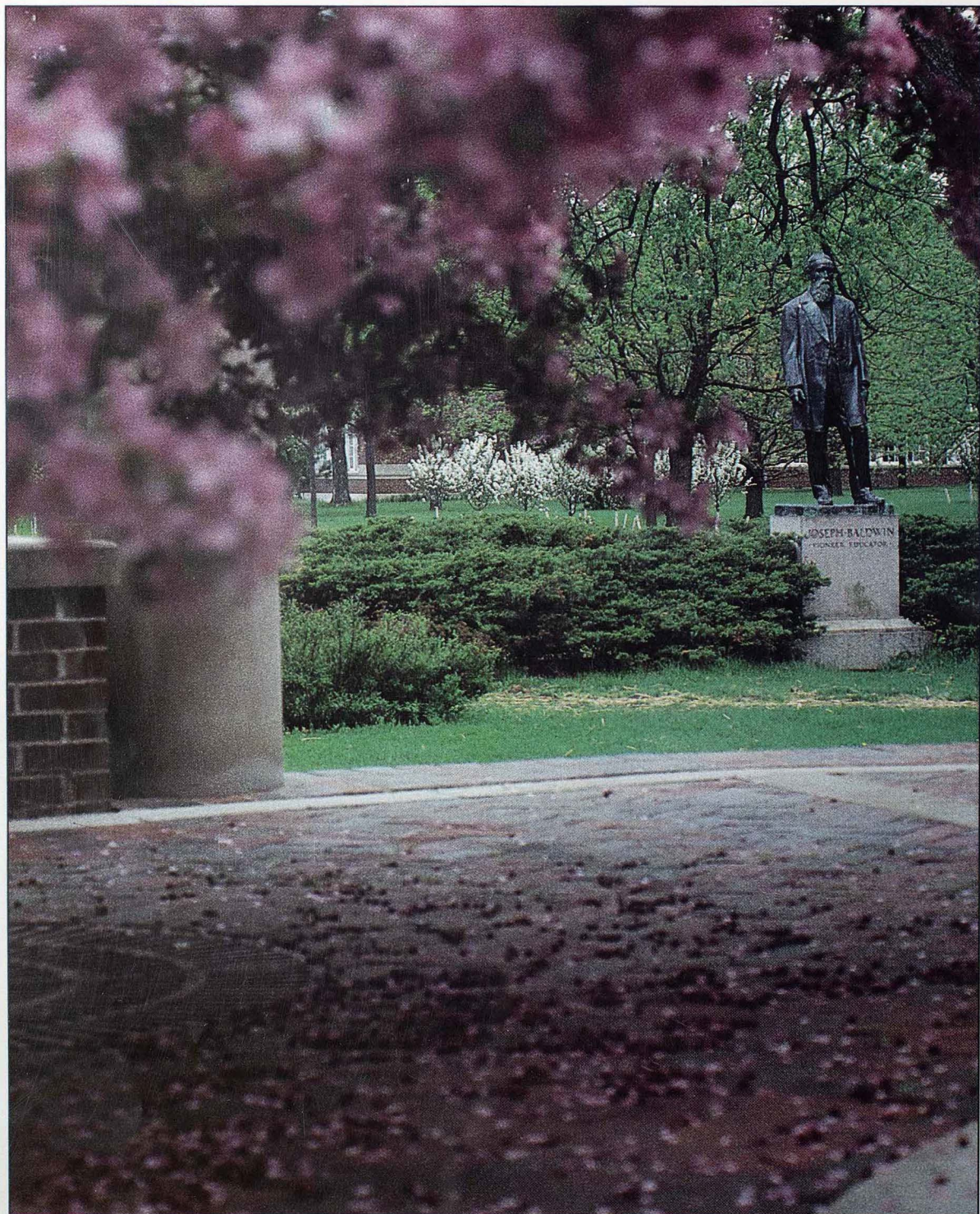

President's Column

Occasionally, it is important for us to step back from the daily routine and reflect on the condition of the University. As I take that backward glance and forward look, I am reminded of the enormous changes that have occurred in the last few years. I have been in higher education long enough to know that every institution must change. Fortunately, we at Northeast have been able to influence the new policies that have been implemented at your school. Our changes are, thus, more visible than those which are occurring at universities without a plan, design or public discussion. Those transitions are often the most insidious and destructive. Even if everyone doesn't agree with all of the changes at Northeast—and everyone doesn't—at least we have them in the open and we have had a public discussion of them. We won't be unpleasantly surprised down the road by the long-term results of a thoughtless alteration.

Numerous alumni have written to me expressing their pride in the national emergence of their alma mater and declaring their pleasure when a present or prospective employer tells them they have heard good things about Northeast. I would imagine that every president at this University during transitions in Northeast's mission received similar letters, and he, too, was warmed by the support of alumni.

Northeast is the new public liberal arts and sciences university for the state of Missouri, but it's a university steeped in a tradition of academic excellence. It was the first state normal school, a forerunner in quality teacher education. Joseph Baldwin's philosophy of teacher education was that "the professional teacher should have scholarship equalling the best that colleges could furnish." This philosophy holds true today, even within the limits of a multipurpose focus. Your University continues to believe in providing its students with a liberal arts and sciences education equaling and rivaling the best colleges and universities in the nation. Your University has refused to gain recognition by growing at the risk of lowering standards. Northeast has chosen to remain small, selective, better.

I'm also delighted to report that the tradition of quality teacher education is being built upon with Northeast's five-year teacher education program, designed to educate master teachers. In the first year under the five-year program, your University will enroll more recipients of this year's \$2,000 state-funded Missouri Teacher Education Scholarships than any other college or university. Thus, the tradition of excellence in teacher education continues.

During a famous Supreme Court case involving his alma mater, Dartmouth College, Daniel Webster said: "Sir, as I have said, it is a small college. And yet there are those who love it!" I know just what he meant.

Enclosed is my check for membership. I have enjoyed receiving the NEMOSCOPE, and especially seeing news of people I knew back in years of long ago.

I have been retired a number of years after having taught and administered in elementary and high schools for some fifty years.

Thanks for helping all of us keep in touch.

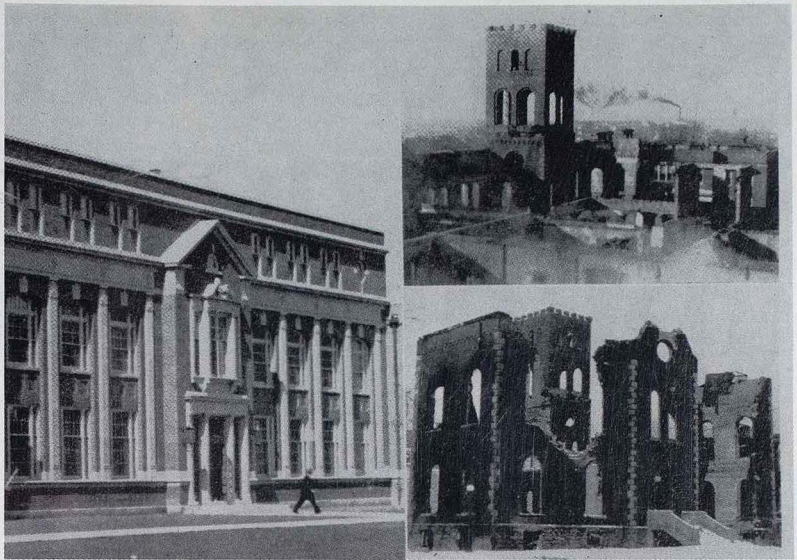

Senate confirms Governor appointments

The Missouri Senate has confirmed Gov. John Ashcroft's appointments of three new Board of Governors members. The appointments fill vacancies left by former President **Robert Fenlon ('65)** and former Vice President William Randolph Weber whose terms expired in January and the vacancy created by the graduation of the former student representative, **Ric Brockmeier ('87)**.

Kimberly Ahrens ('68) of Hannibal, Mo., and Nancy Schneider of St. Charles, Mo., were approved for terms beginning immediately and ending Jan. 1, 1993. NMSU sophomore Michelle Blotevogel of Carrollton, Mo., will serve a one-year term as the student representative.



An honors graduate of Northeast, Ahrens teaches French at Hannibal Senior High School, where she has been employed since 1968. Besides teaching, Ahrens has been a moderator for KHQA-TV's Public Service Program and has taught American literature at Hannibal-LaGrange College. She replaces Fenlon, a 1965 graduate of Northeast.

Ahrens is a 1964 graduate of Hannibal Senior High. In addition to her education degree from NMSU, she has performed graduate work in French at Northeast and at Eastern Connecticut State College in Willimantic. She holds the State of Missouri Public School Teacher's Lifetime Teaching Certificate for French and English, K-12.

Her professional affiliations include the Foreign Language Association of Missouri, the Missouri State Teachers Association and the Hannibal Community Teachers Association. She is a member of the North Central Association Evaluating Team for Rolla (Mo.) High School, was a program presenter at the 1985 Foreign Language Association of Missouri conference, and served as secretary-treasurer for the Hannibal chapter of the American Field Service.

Ahrens is a member of the NMSU Alumni Association. She is involved in several civic activities, including the Hannibal YMCA, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, United Way, the Hannibal Arts Council, the Hannibal High School Booster Club, Holy Family Catholic Church, and the former Ice House Theatre.

Ahrens and her husband, Clifford, are the parents of three children: Todd, age 18; Joey, 14; and Ann, 11.



Schneider is a principal with Hazelwood, Barklage & Barklage Attorneys at Law in St. Charles, as well as a trial lawyer for the St. Charles County Juvenile Office.

Previous to her association with Hazelwood, Barklage & Barklage, Schneider was an associate and partner with Kennedy, Hamilton, Sowers & Schneider, and a legal

research assistant with Rollings, Gearhart & Hazelwood. She also served on the St. Charles County Board of Equalization and was a marketing administrator with ACF Industries' Amcar Division.

Schneider was a Phi Beta Kappa Outstanding Sophomore at the University of Missouri-Columbia. She earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Lindenwood College in St. Charles in 1978 where she was elected to Alpha Sigma Tau honorary scholastic society and graduated with honors. In 1981, Schneider graduated with honors, earning a juris doctoris from St. Louis University Law School where she was the recipient of the Richard J. Childress Academic Scholarship.

Schneider, her husband and two children reside in St. Charles.



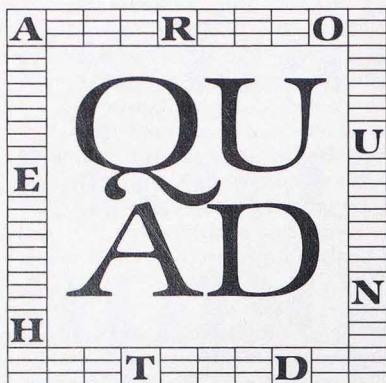

IOTA NU HONORED Northeast's Iota Nu chapter of **Delta Sigma Pi** professional business fraternity became the first chapter in the fraternity's history to win the Most Outstanding Chapter Award twice. Selected for the honor in 1981, Iota Nu again earned the award for 1986, out-performing 16 other regional winners across the country. Criteria for the award includes quality of professional programs, community involvement and evidence of leadership skills of chapter members.

SCEC AWARD The **Student Council for Exceptional Children** chapter at Northeast earned the 1985-86 Council for Exceptional Children Award for Excellence. The

national organization presented the international award to only 14 chapters this year. Northeast's chapter was one of only two student chapters to earn the honor. The chapter was cited for its assistance with the United Cerebral Palsy Telethon and for organizing a Special Olympics basketball competition.

STUDENTS OF SUCCESS Four NMSU students received national recognition during the spring semester. **Angie Woodruff**, a senior special education and elementary education major from Quincy, Ill., is the 1987 recipient of the Special Education Scholarship awarded by the national organization of Alpha Sigma Alpha sorority. ASA awarded only one Special Education Scholarship this year, carrying a \$1,500 stipend.

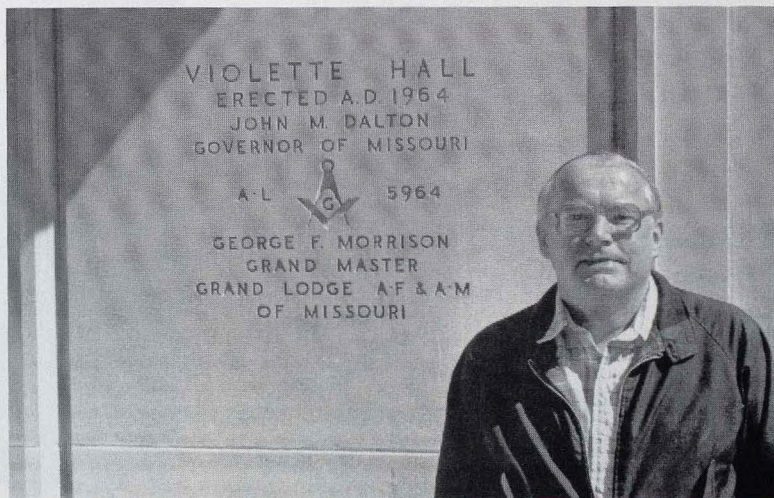
Senior pre-law/history major **Bonnie Neuner ('87)** from Linn, Mo., was selected as one of Good Housekeeping magazine's 100

RACY ART Artist D.R. Shuck donated a series of six of his Indianapolis 500 Race Winner Illustration reproductions to the NMSU Art Gallery during a campus residency, April 1-2. The series is the same as those owned by the Smithsonian Museum of Transportation and Technology in Washington, D.C. Three of the works have also won awards in the National Society of Illustrators Annual Competition in New York.

GRANTING RESEARCH Two professors in the Division of Science received research grants.

Kenneth Fountain, associate professor of chemistry who has been with the University since 1972, received a \$20,000 grant from the Petroleum Research Fund of the American Chemical Society. His study, "Methyl Transfers between Hydroxamic Acids," represents an area of great interest in the field of physical organic chemistry. He will collaborate on the project with scientist Erwin Bunzel of Queens University in Ontario. The ACS funds only about 35 percent of the grant applications it receives.

Robert Cornell, associate professor of physiology, received a \$47,000 grant from the National Science Foundation, bringing the total of Cornell's NSF grant monies to \$133,000. Since 1978, Cornell has been making breakthroughs in the research of liver regeneration

Violette served on the faculty from 1900-23, leaving to accept a position at the University of Louisiana-Baton Rouge. An eminent historian, Violette's diaries and collection of historical objects comprise a major part of the University's archives and the Violette Museum. Campbell's mother is also a major contributor of vintage clothing to the historical costumes collection in the Division of Family Sciences. One observation Violette made in his diaries was that "he found students much more studious here (NMSU) than at LSU," Campbell said.

Women of Promise, Class of '87. The magazine chose to salute the Bicentennial anniversary of the U. S. Constitution by naming 100 American women "of exceptional promise" graduating in 1987 from American colleges and universities.

Presidents of 3,200 colleges and universities were invited to nominate women for the search, conducted by The Washington Center, the nation's largest independent student internship program.

Among the selection criteria were campus and community involvement and "a broad range of outstanding personal endeavor." Neuner has been active as Student Senate president and as a member of the Student Activities Board, Phi Alpha Theta history honorary fraternity and the pre-law advisory committee. She has also served on Kirksville's Save Our Streets committee and worked as an intern in the City Manager's Office.

Jill Benton, a junior business administration major from Sullivan, Mo., was one of 50 students nationwide selected for the first Leadership America, a national leadership development program for college students.

The program consists of a five-week formal session, an internship and a graduation session. Benton will travel from North Carolina to the Rocky Mountains to Dallas for the five-week session. She hopes to intern with Westward Textile Products in St. Louis. Each participant receives a \$3,000 stipend.

Benton, a Pershing Scholar, has also been involved with Student Senate, Student Ambassadors, the Baldwin Academy for Eminent Young Scholars and the Japanese Cultural Studies and Exchange Program. She is now a member of the Student Activities Board, Undergraduate Council, Delta Sigma Pi and a University leadership task force.

Ellen Hoelscher ('87), received a \$25,000 scholarship, the Scholars of Law Award, from Washington University in St. Louis. Hoelscher, who majored in psychol-

ogy and interpersonal communication at the University, said the scholarship will just about cover tuition at Washington University Law School.

The award was based on LSAT scores, GPA, leadership skills and other activities. Hoelscher was a member of Delta Zeta social sorority, Psi Chi honorary psychology fraternity, Alpha Phi Sigma scholastic honorary society, the Residence House Association and the Echo yearbook staff. She graduated summa cum laude.

Hoelscher said she hopes to work in a private law firm or in state government after graduating from Washington University.

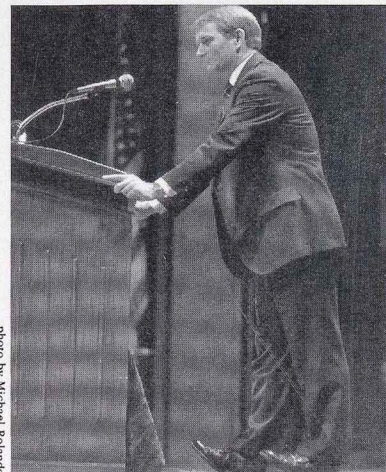

Speaker calls for revival of Jeffersonian ideals

More than 1,000 graduates and an above-capacity crowd of faculty, family and friends listened to Charles Karelis reframe Thomas Jefferson's ideals of public education during his address at spring commencement exercises, May 8, in Stokes Stadium.

In his *Notes on the State of Virginia*, Jefferson emphasized the importance of public education. He wrote that "the ablest and brightest students ought to be sent on to prepare for positions of leadership," Karelis said. "If Jefferson had lived during the past 200 years, I think he would have been disappointed, because during that time, America has wavered between rejection of Jefferson's idea and ambivalence to it. . . we can no longer afford that," Karelis said.

Remarking that "Jefferson's idea is one whose time has come," Karelis said he believes "there are signs of hope. More of us are seeing that our future leaders need not only degrees, but degrees with integrity."

"Good intentions won't make that happen. The faculty, administrators and staff at this university know that. This is a place that Jefferson would approve," Karelis said.

Karelis is the director of the Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE) for the U.S. Department of Education. Karelis received his bachelor's in 1966 from Williams College in Massachusetts. He earned his doctorate at Oxford University in 1972 and returned to Williams College to serve as chairman of the philosophy department, a position he still holds.

In June 1985, Karelis was appointed special assistant to the U.S. Secretary of Education. He assumed the FIPSE directorship in October of that year.

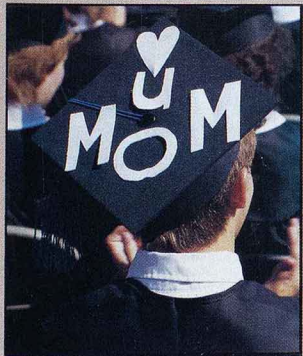
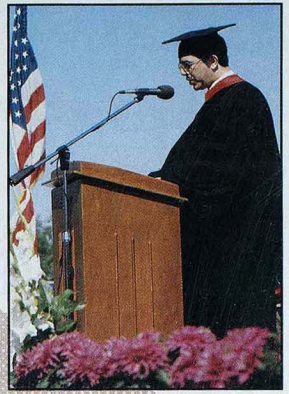
Karelis has authored a variety of books, articles and reviews on issues ranging from sleight-of-hand, to Plato and art, to gun control. He recently completed three articles on higher education, "A Note on Democracy and Liberal Education," "The Limitations of Leadership" and "Financing Higher Education: A Proposal for Reform," to be published in the journal, *Liberal Education*.

Karelis is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, chairman of the Excepted Personnel Advisory Committee for the U.S. Department of Education, a member of the Department's management council in the Office of Postsecondary Education and a member of the advisory panel on postsecondary education for the American Council on Education.

Newman forecasts greater demand for NMSU's leadership

"The reason I am a fan of Northeast Missouri State is very straightforward. I believe institutions in our society must change, must improve."



Frank Newman, best known for the Newman education reports he published in the early 1970s, and president of the Education Commission of the States, delivered the address at the 30th Annual Baldwin Lecture, April 7. Newman discussed the necessary steps toward nationwide educational improvement.

"Really, the theme that I want to argue is that as much as this institution has progressed, what is ahead of you is really increased demand," he said.

Newman suggested a more rigorous American education system that supports critical thinking and teaches international awareness, creativity, self confidence and civic mindedness.

"We're going to have to know something about the results of what we're doing. You happen to be in the peculiar position of having already begun working at this and having made considerable progress," he said.

Comparing the U.S. education system to that of Japan, Newman said that American education has the best chance in the world of changing and improving.

"I have to admit . . . that if you were to ask, 'Is there an institution in the United States that would help lead the way?' I guess I would have to . . . admit that it would be Northeast Missouri State University," he said.

Newman wrote the Newman reports while serving as chairman of two task forces established by secretaries of Health, Education and Welfare, from 1969-73. In 1983, he became a presidential fellow at the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching; in 1985, he published the report, "Higher Education and the American Resurgence." He was president of the University of Rhode Island and director of university relations at Stanford University.

Newman is a trustee of Barnard College and the Academy of Independent Scholars. He is past chairman of the board of trustees of the American Association for Higher Education and on several advisory boards—from the American Association of University Women to the Commission on Minorities in Higher Education.

Newman holds a doctorate in history from Stanford University, a master's in business from Columbia University, and bachelor's degrees in engineering, naval science and economics from Brown University.

GILBERT & MARY JANE



KOHLLENBERG

When Northeast faculty members Gilbert and Mary Jane Kohlenberg came to the University in the '50s, they accepted temporary positions.

"We came here for six months," Mary Jane said.

That six months grew into more than 36 consecutive years of service for Gilbert, professor of history, and Mary Jane, assistant professor of math and computer science.

In 1951, Gilbert accepted a temporary position in the history department. After two quarters, then-president Walter Ryle asked him to fill a permanent teaching position. Mary Jane taught part time for 10 years; she became a full-time faculty member in 1965.

Gilbert earned his bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in European history. During World War II, he served in the European theatre as a medical administrator and as a captain in the Army Air Force. He joined Northeast's faculty in 1951. By 1955, he was not only made full professor, but he also assumed the position as head of the Division of Social Science. Gilbert stepped down from that position in 1979 because, he said, "although I enjoy the administration, teaching is my first love."

President Ryle named Gilbert chairman of the Lyceum Committee when it was formed in 1960. He continues to be instrumental in making the Series the center of cultural performances on the campus.

"I certainly hoped it (the Lyceum Series) would be a big part of the University. I guess you might say it was a long-range goal. It is especially significant now with the new mission," he said.

Mary Jane earned her bachelor's in mathematics with a minor in chemistry/physics. She earned her master's in education at Northeast. She was a lieutenant in the Navy during World War II and a statistician for the Army after the war. Since 1971, Mary Jane has been a corporate representative for Northeast to the American Association of University Women. Her civic affiliations are numerous: the Northeast Missouri Mathematics Association; the Missouri Council of Teachers of Mathematics; the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics; the Mathematical Association of America; Women of Mathematics; Kirksville League of Women Voters; the Adair County Historical Society.

Throughout the course of their tenures at the University,



the Kohlenbergs have seen numerous changes in their divisions.

"I've seen a growth in a small division with primarily history as the major discipline to the present division with a much larger faculty and with a strengthening of existing course offerings. . . and with the addition of two new disciplines, criminal justice and psychology," Gilbert said.

When Mary Jane began teaching, the Division of Mathematics and Computer Science did not exist.

Computers, for that matter, did not exist.

"Math was part of the Science Division, and it had slowly started to die. I was only one of two instructors in math. Slowly, it started to grow, started to get more faculty," Mary Jane said. "I was here even before computers, and I had to teach myself about them."

Both view the success within their divisions as one of the rewarding aspects of their careers here. They say they couldn't have done it, though, without the "great group of people at this University."

"The most beneficial experience, the most rewarding experience, was to work with a great group of people—students, faculty, colleagues and administrators," Gilbert said. Mary Jane echoes his sentiments.

Neither plan to be "sitting around much" during their retirement. Gilbert continues to research the economic relationship between the United States and Russia during World War I. He said he will also remain active within civic organizations.

Mary Jane will remain involved in several civic organizations: as president of the Adair County Library Board, which is now working toward bringing library service to all of Adair County; as an active member of Community Betterment; on the Jail Board of Visitors, which was responsible for the building of the new detention center; as a member of Project 2000; and as a member of Waves National, an organization for women in the Navy. Mary Jane said she also wants to take some University courses just for fun.

Mary Jane said her philosophy on life is the essence of her teaching career.

"Whatever you want to do, you'd better make it meaningful."

RUTH



TOWNE

The dean of graduate studies displays mementos of her grandfather's Civil War days on a wall in her office. She wants to write a biography about him, but she is just too busy. So, Ruth Towne will delay working on the text until her retirement after more than 35 years of teaching at Northeast.

Writing a book sounds more like work than retirement. But the book is only one of several projects Towne has planned. Towne, also a professor of history, is scheduled to teach one class this fall. "Old and retired" are dirty words according to Towne. She claims she ignores both, and it works.

After educating thousands of students during her years at Northeast, it is hard to imagine the University without this Kirksville native. Towne has come to be a symbol of what the school stands for—guiding young people to "think rationally and critically, to question and delve. . . and to teach them to be broadminded." Towne stresses these qualities to all of her students.

Towne attributes much of her inspiration to teachers she had as an undergraduate at Northeast Missouri State Teachers College. Although she continues to uphold her principles of education, Towne believes college was more difficult when she was a student.

"If you tell a class now that they are going to spend all their time in the library, and there is no textbook, you won't have anyone left in your class," Towne said.

Although expectations have changed with advanced technology, Towne's teaching philosophy has remained constant, and she believes that students must work with teachers in order to learn. Towne is pleased that students consider her a tough teacher.



"If the teacher makes you understand that you are going to do it (the work), and if you want (to achieve) the goal, you will do it," she said.

Education has always been a focal point for Towne, both as a student and as a teacher. The valedictorian of her graduating class at Kirksville High School, Towne was also the first honor graduate at Northeast Missouri State Teachers College. She studied under a curator's scholarship and graduate assistantship at the University of Missouri-Columbia where she earned a master's and a doctorate in history. In 1952, Towne returned to Northeast.

Towne was editor of the NEMOSCOPE from 1954-67 at the request of then-president Walter Ryle. Over the years, she has authored several historical pieces, including articles in *A Book of Adair County History* and the *Americana Annual Encyclopedia Year Book*. She has written two books, *A Winner Never Quits: The Life and Times of Walter Harrington Ryle and Senator William J. Stone* and *the Politics of Compromise*. Towne has also been the adviser for Delta Zeta social sorority (formerly Delta Sigma Epsilon) since 1953. Her association with the sorority led her to found its alumni newsletter, *Deltascopes*, which she still edits.

Towne is one of two long-time members of the history faculty who retire this year. In honor of her and of Gilbert Kohlenberg, retiring professor of history, the Social Science Division has set up the Kohlenberg/Towne Lectureship. Contributions to the Lectureship will provide funds to bring distinguished lecturers to campus.

GARDNER

He has been called many things by many people whose lives he has touched.

He has been referred to as a coach, teacher, father, brother and a friend by hundreds of former athletes who have performed for him. And he has been described as a close, loyal friend and colleague by those he has worked with or worked for since he was recruited to play football at Kirksville State Teachers College.

Ken Gardner retired, June 30, after serving NMSU since 1951 as a coach, athletic director and classroom instructor.

He first set foot on the campus now called Northeast Missouri State University in the fall of 1939 as a student. Little did Gardner dream the day he arrived at the Teachers College that his association with the school would encompass more than four decades.

An outstanding high school career at Warsaw, Ill., had focused a lot of attention on the big lineman, who had been contacted by such major colleges as Notre Dame, Missouri and Iowa.

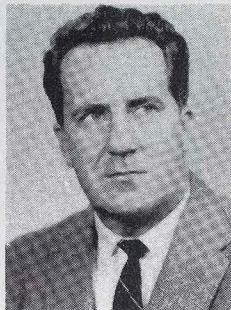
"I couldn't make up my mind where to go to college, but I wasn't interested in those big schools," Gardner recalled. "Eddie Markel (assistant football coach at the Teachers College) convinced me I should come to Kirksville. I always wanted to teach, and I thought it would be a good idea to attend a teachers college."

Gardner didn't disappoint Markel and head coach Mel Eiken. He earned All-Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association football recognition twice and was also a superb track performer.

But his collegiate career was interrupted by military service in World War II. After graduating from Officer Candidates School as a second lieutenant in early 1942, Gardner was stationed in North Africa and the European Theatre, rose to the rank of major and received the Silver Star and Purple Heart. Gardner was discharged from the service in time to return to the Teachers College and compete on the 1946 football team. Again, he was chosen to the All-MIAA list and was selected to perform in the Missouri-Kansas All-Star Game.

Upon graduation in 1947, he was hired as coach at Marceline (Mo.) High School, where he remained for four years. Gardner's 1949 football team tied for the conference championship.

In the spring of 1951, Maurice "Red" Wade was appointed head football coach at the Teachers College. He asked Gardner to serve as his assistant. Gardner also took



over the reins of the Bulldog track program and helped head basketball Coach Boyd King for the next decade.

Gardner's achievements as a track taskmaster speak for themselves. In three decades, his teams won 19 MIAA indoor and 15 outdoor titles, 35 of his thinclads captured Division II All-American accolades, and 11 performers claimed individual national titles.

Many honors have been bestowed on Gardner. He is a member of the Missouri Track and Field Hall of Fame, the NMSU Athletic Hall of Fame, twice named as College Track and Field Coach of the Year by the Missouri Track and Cross-Country Coaches Association, NMSU Outstanding Faculty Member of the Year and numerous other awards.

He served on several event committees for Division II Track and Field Championships, as well as the Drake and Kansas relays. For the past two years, Gardner has been chairman of the Division II Midwest Football Committee, which automatically places him on the four-member national committee.

Whether delivering a lecture at a podium in a classroom, standing on a football field next to a blocking dummy, or encouraging a runner or field performer at a track meet, Gardner said his mission has never changed.

"One of my college instructors, Charles Martin, told me the purpose of a teacher was to make students see through themselves, so they can see themselves through," Gardner said. "I've always tried to apply it (the philosophy). A coach is a teacher in a different type of classroom."

Gardner said he has gained more satisfaction in helping competitors who lacked the physical abilities of the self-made athletes.

"One thing I've refrained from doing through the years is comparing athletes from different eras, because it's like comparing apples and oranges," he pointed out. "I could go on and on in listing all of the tremendous athletes we've had here, but I'm afraid I'd leave out someone."

What are some of the most memorable events he has been involved with at NMSU since joining the athletic staff?

"The truth of the matter is, I've been a part of a lot of exciting moments," he replied.

Gardner recalls several cliffhangers, including a 1961 football game at Southwest Missouri State in which the Bulldogs, trailing by one point, started on their 15-yard line with only 23 seconds left on the clock and drove for a score on the final play.

"Their (Southwest's) band had come on the sidelines, ready to march onto the field for a victory celebration, but you should've seen them scatter when we scored," Gardner said.

"Reminiscing is really my game, and when I do it, I go into triple overtime," he added with a smile.

What does he think has been his biggest accomplishment since assuming the post of athletic director in 1974? Gardner answered that question without hesitation.

"Increasing our women's athletic program from two to 10 sports and seeing women's sports enjoy success," he responded.

In little more than a decade of women's intercollegiate athletics, there have been All-Americans in many of the sports. Last year's Lady Bulldog softball team finished fourth in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

"Another satisfying thing about my job is learning about the successes of our former athletes in their professions," Gardner said.

Sometime after his retirement, Gardner and Ethelyn, his wife of 41 years, want to travel to Europe, which was a pile

of rubble when he was stationed there in the military. The Gardners also plan to visit as many of his former students and athletes as possible.

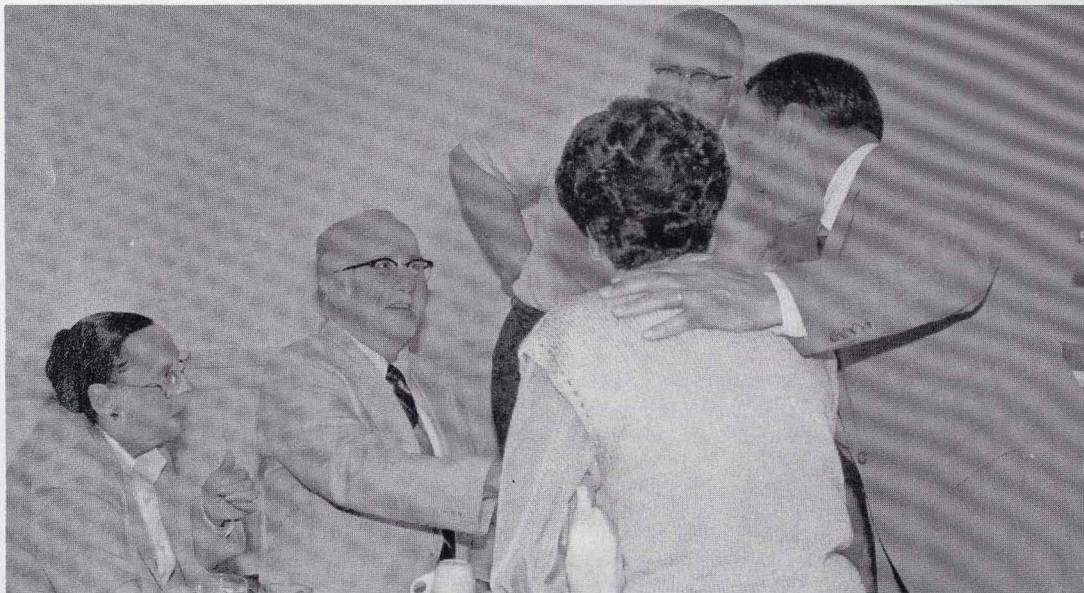
A number of these people made the trip back to Kirksville the weekend of April 25 to pay tribute to the retiring athletic director at a recognition dinner.

Ten people, who were former teammates, athletes and colleagues, stepped to the podium to express their feelings for the man who helped shape their lives.

One common theme repeatedly surfaced that evening: In several different ways, the speakers emphasized how much the man they were honoring cared about other people and was willing to give of himself to others.

As Dave Grant, an All-American football player from the 1960s, put it, "The generation before me had their Knute Rocknes and Bud Wilkersons. The guys who played with me had Coach Gardner. I just hope the next generation has someone like him. In my heart, he's the best."

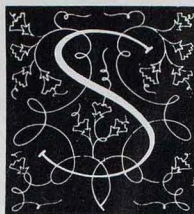

TRICKLER

After more than 40 years and three positions, Kathleen Bohon Strickler retired from her position as director of the Career Planning and Placement Center at Northeast.

Strickler began her career at NMSU in 1942.

"When I first came here to work, I was a G.I. issue clerk for the pilot training program. The old Kirk Gym was set up as barracks for them. Since almost everyone else in town was in the Army, away from their families, I became pretty popular with the girls because I knew all of the pilots," Strickler said.

Not long after her arrival, Strickler became the school's comptroller, a position she held until 1965 when she became an administrative assistant for Extension and Placements. In 1978, Strickler took over as director of CPPC, the tenure she enjoyed more than others she held at the University.

"I pride myself on our excellent placement record. Ninety-seven percent of the available teacher candidates are placed and more than 96 percent of our other candidates are placed. This office was always challenging and rewarding. It made me feel good when those kids got jobs through us," Strickler said.

Strickler's name appears in an edition of Outstanding



Personalities of the West and Midwest, and she was selected one of the Two Thousand Women of Achievement in 1970 for biographical reference works published by Kay, Sons and Daughter Limited of London and New York. In 1968, she was recognized for outstanding ability and service to community, state and nation.

While at NMSU, Strickler was a member of the College Placement Council, Midwest College Placement Association, State Association for Schools, College and University Staffing and Beta Sigma Phi.

Friends of Strickler have started the Kathleen B. Strickler Teacher Education Fund. The fund

will be available to assist upperclass education majors. Strickler, a graduate of Gem City Business College, said she would have liked to have had the chance to earn a bachelor's degree but didn't have the money.

"I want others, who have the desire but not the resources, to earn their teaching degree. Good teachers are finally getting the recognition they deserve again. People are finally realizing the fact that good teachers make a good future," Strickler said.

"Working with young people won't let you get bored. It's been a wonderful 44 years," she said.

It is a voice few on campus fail to recognize. Slow, informal and slightly twanged, the voice has been helping students, faculty and staff for the past 10 years.

Margaret Broseghini is not a familiar face on campus. But, once the University switchboard operator speaks, few fail to recognize her. Her voice represents for many the connection between the University and the outside world. It is the voice of an operator who will greet callers and often call them by name.

Broseghini's voice will not be heard on campus much longer; she retires in October.

To Broseghini, too, people are disembodied voices. She can put names to voices, she said, but unless she hears a person

speak, she cannot put names to faces.

"I can walk into a crowd on campus and be able to name people just by their voice," she said.

The anonymity of the job isn't a big problem for Broseghini. She said that it's all part of serving people. And she has been serving the University well, say co-workers. She always knows the new listings in town and, she said, she doesn't mind when people call for numbers they could easily look up themselves.

"The only thing is, sometimes I'll start telling (co-workers) a story and have to finish it two days later," she said.

The job is hectic, but Broseghini said it's easier now than

when she started. The University installed a more efficient telephone system in 1980, and Broseghini said that students aren't as rude as they used to be.

"She smiles more than she cries," is one way Switchboard Supervisor Maxine Goodwin describes Broseghini.

The 70-year-old operator said she especially likes when her friends use the switchboard.

"It's nice when they call me by name and spend a few moments talking to me," she said.

OLIN JOHNSON

Employees in the Safety and Security Office seem to interact as a family. It's true, and Olin "Swede" Johnson, or as some call him, "old dad," is responsible. Johnson, retiring director of Safety and Security, claims the whole University population as his kids.

"If an individual ever found a slot in life, I did. I have been blessed with a whole group of young people," Johnson said.

Johnson has established strong roots in Kirksville. He graduated from Northeast in 1951 with a bachelor's degree in agriculture and industrial education. Shortly after finishing college, he served as a night sergeant for the Kirksville Police Department for two years. He also served as the Adair County sheriff for eight years and acting city judge for two years. In 1965, Johnson joined the Safety and Security staff.

"I acted as assistant director, then acting director, then assistant director, then acting director, and then director . . . they figured I knew both sides," Johnson said.

One of the major contributions Johnson is glad to have made is seeing Safety and Security become a department of its own in 1970.

Johnson recalls there was a definite need for a separate security department, especially during the late '60s and early



'70s when unrest and revolts against authority were occurring on college campuses nationwide. Today, however, he feels students are not as reactionary.

"Now, students want to achieve; they don't want to be named as somebody trying to upset the apple cart. They want to get an education and get with the work," he said.

The description Johnson gives for today's students is similar to his own philosophy, which has worked for him for the past 22 years. He believes in the golden rule: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. "If you practice that in everything you do, you're going to be a good communication officer," he said.

Johnson teaches his workers that "every law should pertain to everybody else but thee; try to help others in spite of themselves," he said. "If they didn't learn anything other than they didn't want to do it like me, they still learned something," he said.

Although Safety and Security has kept Johnson on the go, retirement will not slow him down completely. He is a member of Northeast Missouri Peace Officers, the Moose Lodge, the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Tel-Alumni Results

NMSU's annual phonathon, Tel-Alumni, concluded the 1987 campaign with \$145,593 in pledges from more than 5,100 alumni and friends. Some 450 volunteers donated more than 1,350 hours of service to this year's campaign.

This year, Tel-Alumni was conducted in two phases. Phase I focused on academic divisional calling and was held Feb. 1-26. Pledges from the first phase raised \$81,693, just short of the \$92,000 goal. The second series of calling followed March 15, concentrating solely on alumni not previously contacted, with an objective of raising \$35,000 in additional pledges. Phase II concluded April 9, with a grand total of \$63,900.

At the conclusion of calling, recognition ceremonies were held to honor individual callers and academic division coordinators. Top awards went to Cindy Eubank, Division of Business and Accountancy, and Peter Holton, Division of Social Science, who raised \$1,680 and \$1,630, respectively. Awards of Merit were presented to the divisions of Health and Exercise Science and Family Sciences and the department of Communication Disorders for averaging more than \$200 in pledges per caller.

In addition to pledges, more than \$125,000 was received through advanced drives prior to this year's Tel-Alumni Campaign. The unofficial total of gifts received for the Development Fund as of May 1, 1987, was \$219,256.

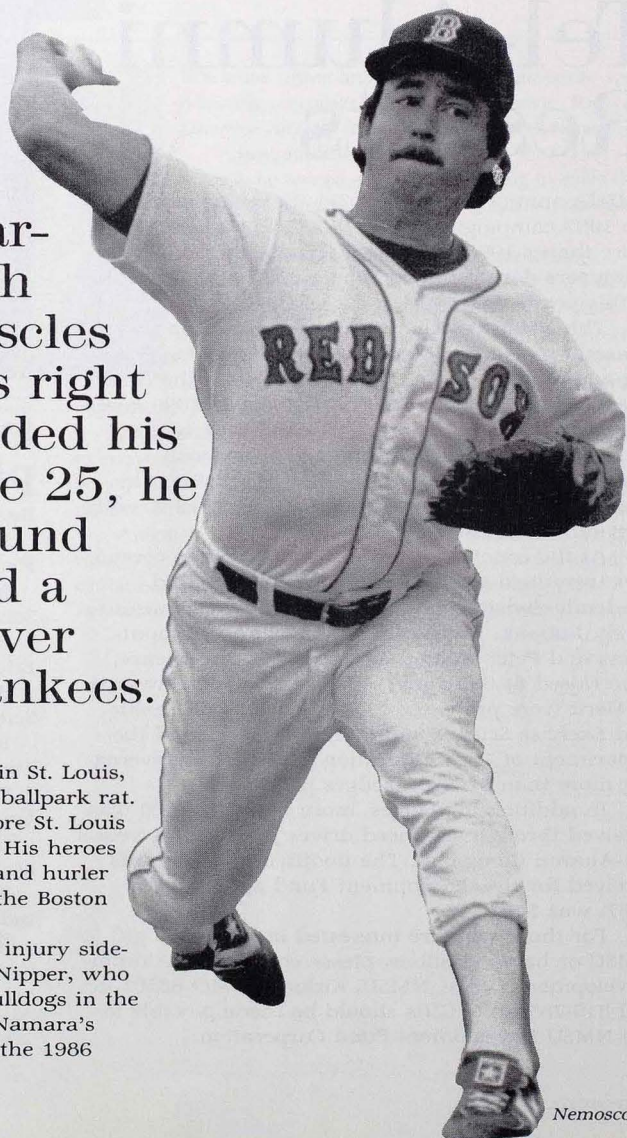

May 18, 1986, while covering home plate, he was spiked by Texas' Lance Parrish. A four-inch gash to the muscles surrounding his right knee almost ended his career. . . . June 25, he returned to mound duty and hurled a gutty 5-4 win over the New York Yankees.

When Al Nipper was growing up in St. Louis, he was what was referred to as a ballpark rat.

Nipper would attend 40 or more St. Louis baseball Cardinal games a season. His heroes were Redbird pitcher Bob Gibson and hurler Tom Seaver, a 1986 teammate on the Boston Red Sox.

And probably because a knee injury sidelined Seaver for the World Series, Nipper, who toiled the mound for the NMSU Bulldogs in the late 1970s, was Manager John McNamara's choice to start the fourth game of the 1986 World Series.



The St. Louis-Hazelwood West product was the losing pitcher in game four, allowing three runs in a six-inning stint. That setback was not devastating to Nipper, but the way Boston lost the Series to the New York Mets, four games to three, indeed was.

"After the Series, I had a tough time dealing with it (the heartbreak)," Nipper recalls. "It was a terrible feeling. We were so close and should've won the sixth game. When I went home, I was in a very bad mood and didn't want to think baseball. But I couldn't dodge the bullet."

Nipper says the pressure to win in Boston is terrific, especially from the press.

"The writers seem to look for negative things to write about," he points out. "Mac (John McNamara) took a lot of heat. He's a sensitive, good man, and he's human like anyone else."

Nipper says it was January when he finally started coming around and began preparing himself for 1987. His approach to the current season is staying healthy, something that has been difficult for him to do in his first three years with the Red Sox.

Since an 11-6 rookie campaign in 1984, the 28-year-old Nipper has been plagued by injuries and illness. In spring training two years ago, he was struck by a mysterious ailment which had doctors baffled for three days.

"I finally asked one of the doctors if I had leukemia and told him not to beat around the bush with me," Nipper remembers. "Finally they found out it was a bleeding ulcer."

In May of that year, he was able to take his turn in the pitching rotation. But then he was beset with back, neck and toe problems in the final four months of the season and finished 1985 with a 9-12 mark.

Last year, he pitched well through the first month. Then, May 18, while covering home plate, he was spiked by Texas' Larry Parrish. A four-inch gash to the muscles surrounding his right knee almost ended his career.

Nipper wasn't expected to be in uniform again until at least late July. However, he started rehabilitation immediately after his release from the hospital, and June 25, he returned to mound duty. That night, he hurled a gutty 5-4 win over the New York Yankees. The Red Sox fought off challengers the remainder of the summer to capture their first Eastern Division title since 1975.

However, it was a roller-coaster type of campaign for Nipper. When he returned to duty after the knee injury, his mechanics were fouled up. He would correct one problem and another one would flare up.

Nipper was signed by Boston in the eighth round of the 1980 free-agent summer draft after three years at NMSU, during which time he led the NCAA Division II in earned run average (0.98).

He progressed steadily through the Red Sox farm system and was called up by the parent club in September 1983. Nipper finished that year with a 1-1 record, logging his first major league victory in a 3-1 conquest of Cleveland in the season finale.

Nipper got his big break in late May of the following year. The Red Sox traded pitcher Dennis Eckersley to the Chicago Cubs for first baseman Bill Buckner, and Nipper was inserted into the Boston starting rotation.

Some major league experts doubted Nipper's ability to become a major leaguer. They said he didn't have enough stuff.

"But now, I know I belong," he says. "I started developing a knuckle ball in college and a screwball in the minors. Now, I throw four basic pitches—fastball, curve, slider and screwball. I'm starting to work on a split-fingered fastball."

Nipper says he'll go more to a knuckle ball, if his other pitches are not as effective, late in his career.

Does Nipper have difficulty dealing with the short left field wall in Boston's Fenway Park, nicknamed the Green Monster?

"It's hard not to look over your shoulder at the Green Monster," he admits. "But my approach is trying to avoid a mistake (with a pitch). In Fenway, you make a mistake with a couple of runners on, and it's three runs. You can pitch away to a batter, but you must come inside. Otherwise, he'll go to right field on you."

His best friend on the club is Roger Clemens, the 1986 American League's Cy Young recipient.

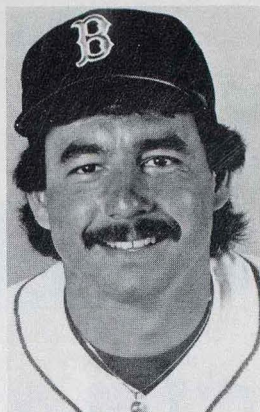
"We run a lot together and have a lot of laughs," says Nipper.

Running the year around, throwing during the winter and just generally working hard are strong characteristics of the former NMSU baseball standout.

Nipper says he doesn't really have set goals for the future.

"I just want to be consistent with my pitching every five days and stay healthy," he replies.

Hopefully, this year, he will realize both objectives.

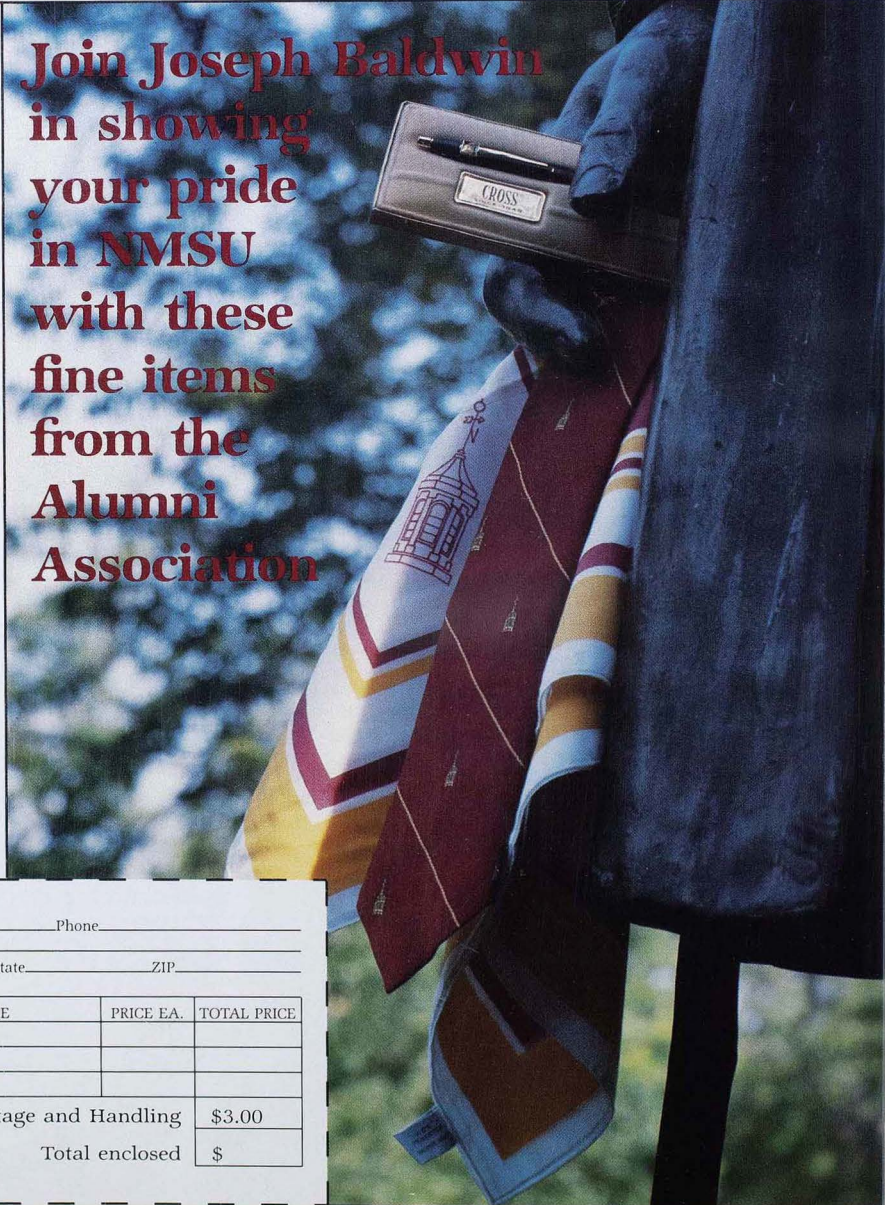
